Recently, the center section of that block, from which the old tracks were removed, was paved with concrete, without further participation of the property owners, to conform to the paving that was applied some time ago.

There are some three or four reasons that such a low rate for concrete paving is possible at this time.

First, the street improvement program is set up under a WPA project, with the city as sponsor. And under the project, which is classified as a \$50,000 job, much of the cost is lowered by using WPA labor and supervision.

Second, the city is salvaging the old brick that are being removed from the street, giving the property owners the salvage benefit.

Third, the city can offer the property owners a lower rate than normally, because of the salvage value of the old street car rails that have been removed. The cost of paving the center section of the streets, from which the rails were

taken up, is an obligation of the city. It was paid \$22,500 by the Alabama Power Co., more than a year ago, by an agreement that the power company would not be responsible for maintenance of the street car sections any longer. The power company previously had been bound to keep the street car sections in as good a condition as the streets on either side of the sections.

The city has indicated it will go along with the property owners in helping pay for any kind of paving they are willing to share in on streets that formerly had car tracks.

When the paving is completed on East Clinton Street, WPA workers will continue on Washington Street to the square. After concrete has been poured on this block, work will begin on the other Washington Street block, from Clinton to Holmes Street.

The cost per block to the city, on a cash basis, is about \$475. This is not the actual cost to the city, but

accounts for the salvaging of the old bricks and street car rails!

At a cost of \$1.50 per front foot, property owners are required to put up about \$900 in each block, since the blocks measure 300 feet in length.

The old rails have been sold to the Tennessee Poultry and Hide Co. at \$14.15 per ton.

On a completely different project, East and West Holmes Street, Fifth Street, and one block on Jefferson Street, the west side of the square and Madison Street are to be improved.

The application calls for a \$56,000 project. If finally approved by the WPA, it provides for black-top paving on East and West Holmes Street, and possibly the same improvement for Madison and other streets in the state system.

Just what participation, if any, will be asked of property owners on these streets has not been determined.

Neither has the type paving to be used around the square been determined.

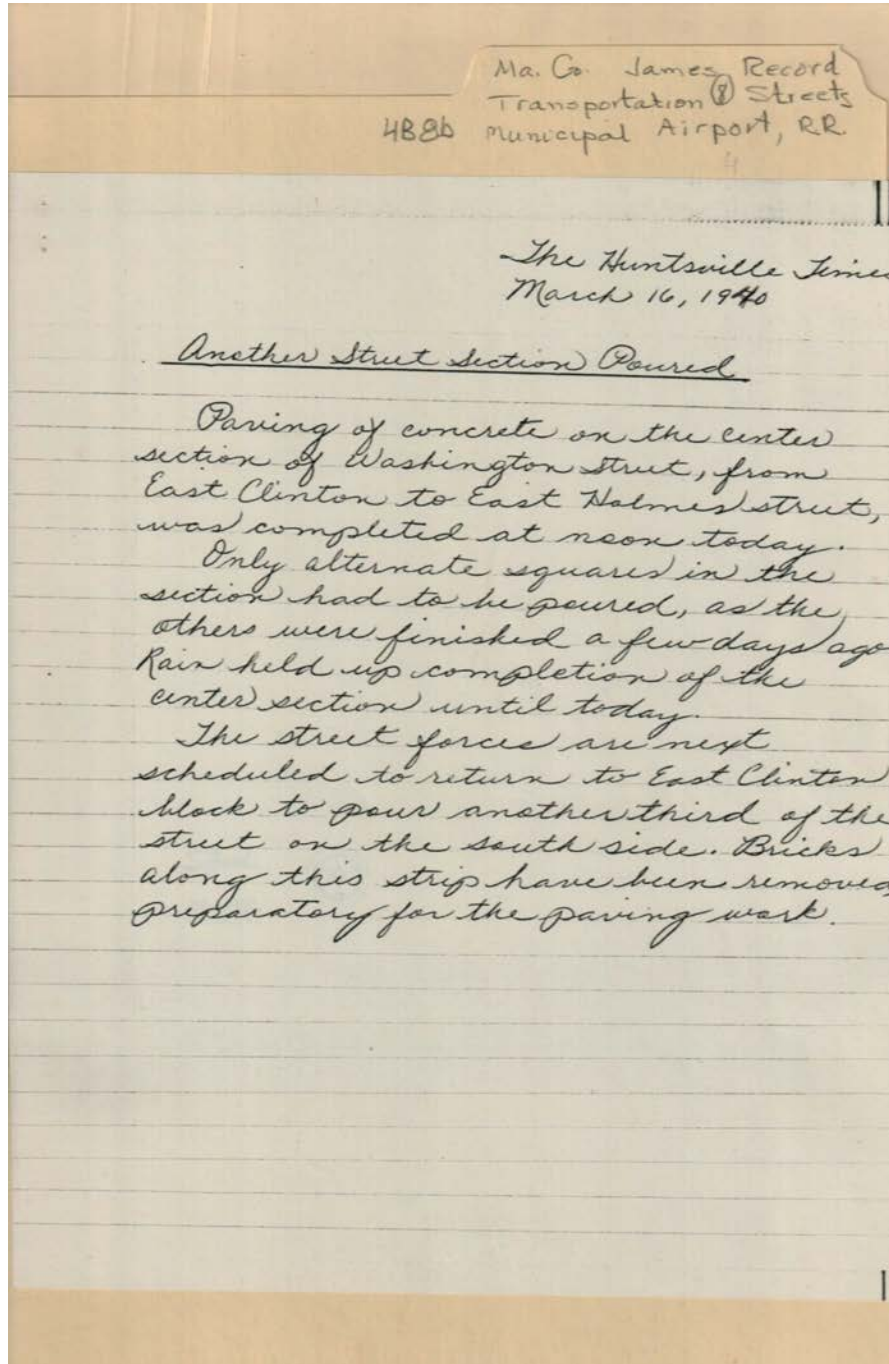
