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LOCAL PLANS FOR SESQUICENTENNIAL RELATED EVENTS DURING 1969

May 2 and 3
(Friday, Saturday)

The Huntsville Historical Society and the University of Alabama in Huntsville will be joint hosts to the Alabama Historical Association in Huntsville. This meeting, which has been planned for five years, will highlight and inaugurate Alabama's Sesquicentennial.

May 3
(Saturday)

The original document of the Alabama Constitution will be placed on exhibit in a specially built unbreakable case in the lobby of the Madison County courthouse. Many important documents and interesting items relating to the period will also be included in this exhibit, which will continue throughout the Sesquicentennial year.

July 5
(Saturday)

(150th anniversary of the day the Constitutional Convention convened in Huntsville)

The restoration of Constitution Hall should be completed and a celebration held on this date. Since this comes the day after the Fourth of July, this celebration holds great attraction.

On this date The Huntsville Times will issue a special "Sesquicentennial Edition." Through the year, they will continue to publish items which reflect events of one hundred fifty years before, which led to statehood.

August 3
(Sunday)

(150th anniversary of the signing of Alabama's Constitution)

The Huntsville Historical Society will sponsor a special program to be participated in by other groups and recognizing descendants of the signers of Alabama's Constitution.

October 25
(Saturday)

(150th anniversary of the opening session of the First General Assembly of the State of Alabama, in Huntsville, the Temporary Capital) *

November 9
(Sunday)

(150th Anniversary of the Inauguration of Alabama's First Governor, William Wyatt Bibb, in Huntsville, at the courthouse) *

December 14
(Sunday)

"Alabama Day"

(150th anniversary of Alabama's entry into the Union)

Major celebration to be held in Huntsville on the preceding day, Saturday, December 13. On this date the postage stamp commemorating Alabama's Sesquicentennial should be issued in Huntsville.
