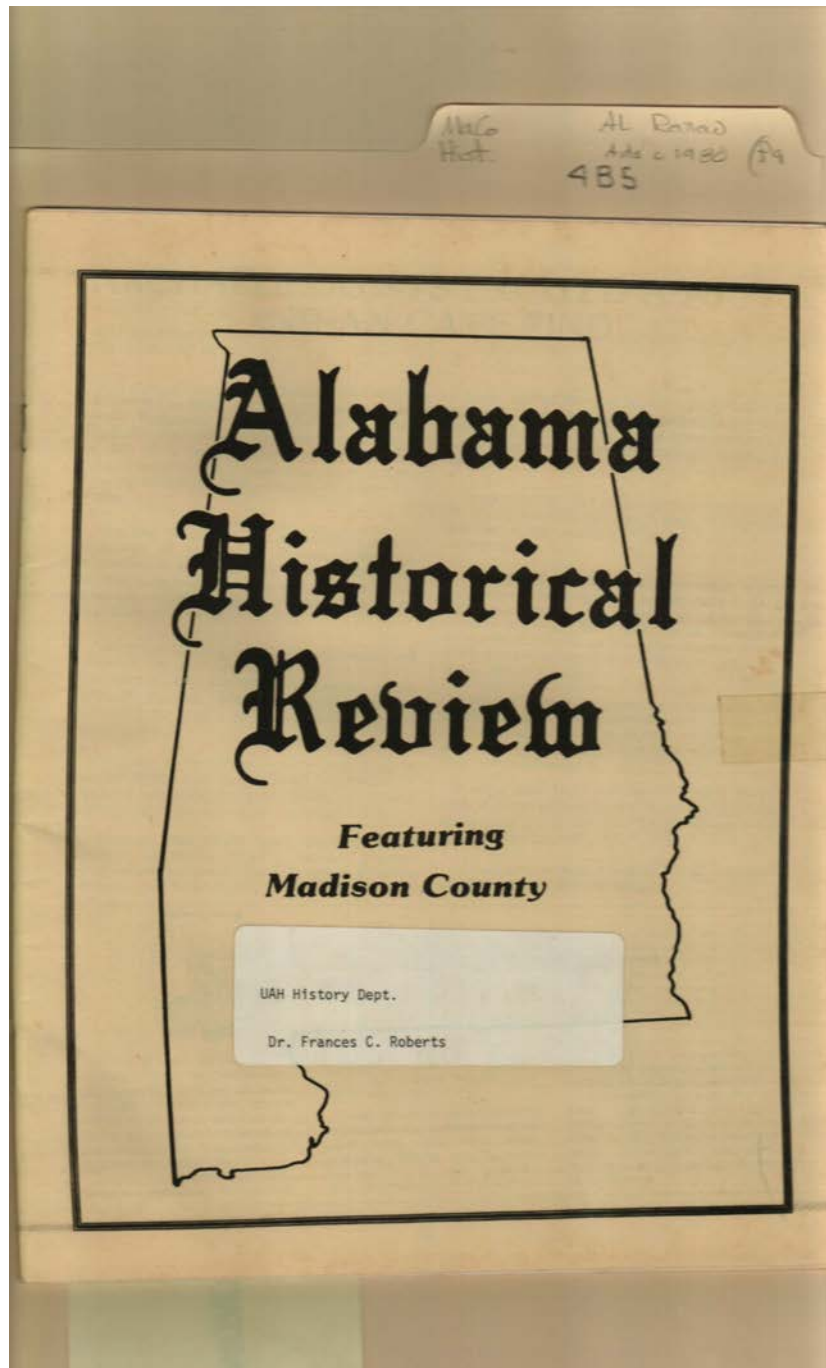

ARCHAEOLOGISTS EXCITED ABOUT INDIAN CAVE FIND

The chance discovery of an ancient cave littered with what has been identified as human bones inside Redstone Arsenal may be a major discovery of an extinct Indian culture dating back to 300 A.D., a thousand years before the Cherokees and other Indian tribes inhabited the Tennessee Valley, archaeologists have told *The Times*.

The find may rival the significance of the discovery of well-known Russell Cave and, according to archaeologists called in for expert advice, may lead to future excavations in the swamps of the sprawling arsenal to seek skeletons of pre-historic beasts.

Carey Oakley Jr., director of archaeological research at the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, and Lawrence Alexander, a UA graduate student, have examined the find and identified the bones as human dating back to about 300 A.D.

Officials at Redstone Arsenal and experts examining the site have declined to disclose the location in an effort to prevent looting and protect relics until a full examination can be set in motion.

Officials said David Cass, Ed Peters and Auburn University forestry student Randall Blackwood discovered the cave March 25 while exploring an isolated area of the arsenal.

They reached the cave by pushing feet-first into a muddy, man-sized hole, rappelled 10 feet to a rock shelf then down 40 feet of sheer rock into a moist, cool chamber 15 feet wide and a curving 40 feet deep.


Blackwood found a dark stick-like object lying in a rivulet. Course and brown, Blackwood decided it was a piece of wood, but he kept scanning.

The trio surveyed the cave with hardhat lamps for an hour, checking for other entrances. Cass, a Grissom High School student, and Ed Peters, a civilian employee for the Army at Redstone, turned to scale back up the wall on a cable ladder while Blackwood remained for one last look at the lower end of the cave.

That led to the discovery of what was later identified as a pelvic section and a human kneecap. No skulls were visible. The three left what they found and climbed up the cable after their March adventure.

A week later Blackwood and Richard Sears, both of whom are members of Huntsville Grotto, a spelunking group, returned for the bones. They took six, leaving many more undisturbed.

A Redstone arsenal radiologist later identified them as human, Blackwood said.

Blackwood planned to show them to the local archaeological society. Arsenal officials, however, were already in touch with archaeologists at the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, who made an early visit to the arsenal to see the bones for themselves.

Blackwood and Cass delayed a weekend camping trip in early June to meet Oakley, UA director of archaeological research, and Alexander, the UA graduate student, to discuss the find.

Blackwood said he no more than pulled the bones from a sack when Oakley said, "They're human." Oakley estimated the remains dated from about 300 A.D., and a UA anthropologist later said they were from two persons, an adult woman and an adolescent male.

Oakley hesitated to say the newly-discovered cave in the southern section of the arsenal was an actual burial cave. That may be proven, he said, by a closer study of the chamber and its bones.

The remains, Oakley said, are from Copenas, a prehistoric Indian culture that roamed into the Tennessee Valley and as far south as Jefferson County between the first and sixth centuries A.D., a thousand years before the Cherokee and other well-defined Indian tribes formed.

Burial caves and mounds are trademarks of the Copenas, Oakley said. Another, from which their name is drawn is the presence of copper artifacts and lumps of galena (lead ore) at burial sites.

"Copenas apparently had an aversion to death," Oakley said. "Their mounds and villages are never close together, the mounds are always somewhere else. A number of their burial caves are difficult to get to."

Oakley and other experts are planning to enter the cave later this summer.

Alexander and his crew are scouting likely spots for arrowheads, grinding stones and other surface indications of Indian villages or campsites.

They have recorded about 40 sites, some of them apparently ancient.

Mixed among the loose rocks of one low gully Alexander found a mortar stone, another stone possibly used with a bow drill, a flint cutting flake, a small arrow point and a flat, triangular spear point.

The spear point, he said, may be 5,000 years old. The "woodland point" is about 1,500 years old.

It all suggests the site was a fairly permanent settlement at one time, Oakley said, though others were probably no more than encampments, a place where a fire was built.

"The Tennessee Valley was a well-settled area," he said. "There was the water supply, and fish and other food."

Oakley is as excited about what may turn up in the Huntsville area as he is about the already-discovered cave.

A mastodon? A mammoth?

"If there is anywhere in Alabama that something like a mastodon site can be found, it's in the Huntsville area," Oakley said.

"Depressions, the swampy areas near the river, and the fact that the arsenal has protected the land could have preserved the bones at a site."

One design of a fluted flint spearhead point used by Paleolithic men (15,000 to 20,000 B.C.) is so distinctive to the area it is named the "Redstone point," he said, and points of the same age have been found elsewhere buried within the fossil bones of mammoths.

THE NIGHT STARS 'FELL' ON ALABAMA

DECATUR—It was a warmer and milder autumn night 143 years ago when meteors blazed Earthward across the state's Tennessee Valley—an event that would be remembered as the night "stars fell on Alabama."
It was 1833 in the Deep South with light and scattered showers followed by Indian summer weather.
Five hours after sunset, a few shooting stars danced across the skies and by midnight they were falling with regularity.
Thousands of persons milled outside their homes, watching in awe and wonder until the rising sun outshone the spectacular display.
Meteors were literally raining from the sky, first hundreds and then thousands.
It was a Nov. 12 night that stars fell on the state. The Huntsville Democrat reported that most of the 2,000 Huntsville residents ran into the streets to watch.
"It was the incessant falling of meteors, in such vast numbers as to illuminate the heavens for more than two hours previous to daybreak. We (the editor) were up and had a full view of this most awful and sublime appearance, which continued until obscured by the light of the sun," the paper said.
"For several hours, thousands and even

millions of these meteors, appeared in every direction to be in constant motion—all taking the direction of the Earth but ranging from the east. They presented exactly the same appearance which is exhibited by the shooting of the meteors which we occasionally see almost every night. Our town was the scene of great commotion, particularly among the blacks, who were praying and shouting that the Day of Judgment had come. In one or two instances we noticed meteors of extraordinary size, which left, for five or ten minutes, serpentine appearance of great length and size."

Later editions of the newspaper said a lot of people were in Huntsville for the horse races. There seemed to be a larger group of these "supporting characters" than ever before, the editor stated. The gaming tables were well attended, but when the meteors appeared, there was "consternation" and many of the strangers fled town on their horses.

Others simply confessed their sins and asked for forgiveness. One man acknowledged that he had stolen a number of horses in his day, and that even at that moment he was engaged in a plot to rob the bank at Decatur.

It wasn't until several weeks later that Alabamians learned that the shooting stars were not purely local phenomena that, in fact, the heavenly display was seen from Texas to Pennsylvania.

But the celebrated book, "Stars Fell on Alabama," published in 1934, and later the song of the same name, linked the vent to this state.

What caused the stars to "fall?"

The editor of the Greensboro Watchman, Hammer Cobbs, read a paper before the Alabama Historical Association in 1968 which discounted early belief that it was triggered by the unusually warm weather. According to Cobbs several astronomers noted that this 1833 shower of stars seemed to radiate from a certain fixed point, namely the area surrounding the constellation Leo. This point became known as the radiant, and the meteors as leonites.

It was later found that the leonites revolved around the sun in periods of 33 years and a search of ancient records showed that showers of meteorites had occurred periodically in October and November all the way back to the year 902.

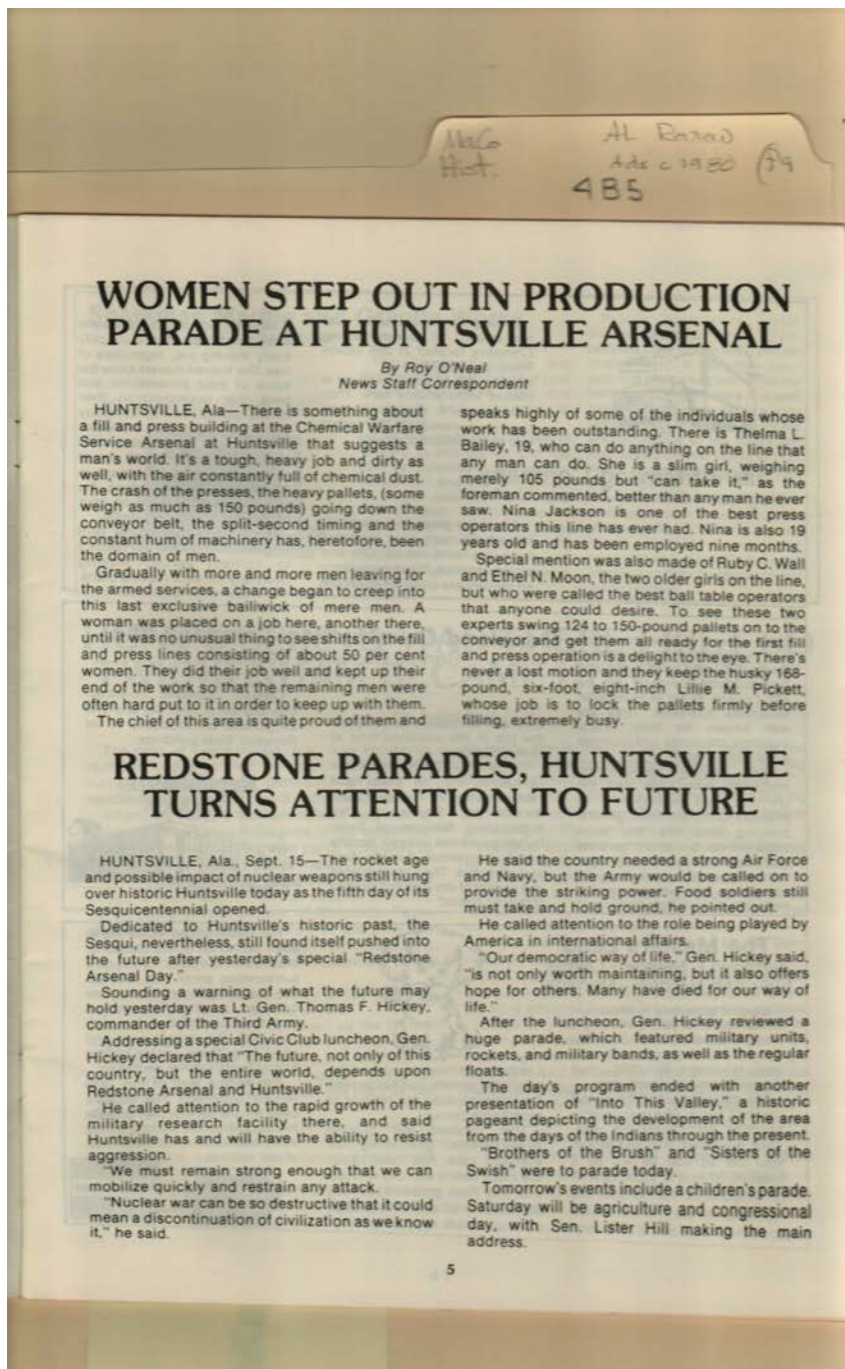

HUNT'S SPRING WAS THERE FIRST SO TWICKENHAM BECAME HUNTSVILLE

The case of Twickenham, Ala., now known as Huntsville, proves that no community can be named arbitrarily and permanently when its residents persist in calling it something else.

When, in 1809, a settlement was laid out at Hunt's Spring, Leroy Pope, one of the wealthiest and most influential in those parts, connived to have the place called Twickenham.

Twickenham was the birthplace of Alexander Pope, English master of the couplet in verse, although he was not a relative of the poet. So Twickenham it became, though few of locality's rugged pioneers knew what Twickenham stood for.

And they did not care, for they called the place Hunt's Spring, or Big Spring anyway.

Within a few months, however, as the British started stirring up trouble among the Creek Indians in what later developed into the War of 1812, such a distinctly English name as Twickenham grated harshly on the ears of the citizenry.

So on Nov. 25, 1811, the young community of between 200 and 300 persons, incorporated itself as Huntsville, in honor of its first resident, John Hunt.

Visitors to Huntsville are attracted today to Big Spring, from whence 24,000,000 gallons of water flows daily, just as John Hunt was in 1805. Today,

as every day in the 130 years that have passed since Hunt brought his family to live close by, Big Spring supplies water for the entire district.

The fact that wild animals came to Big Spring for water doubtless simplified John Hunt's task of providing for the family smokehouse.

A casual stroller might easily miss Big Spring, for it is some 60 feet below the level of the plateau upon which downtown Huntsville lies.

None but the blind, however, could fail to see Monte Sano, the 2,000-foot mountain that dominates the surrounding country.

There are two legends as to how Monte Sano received its name.

One concerns Dr. Thomas Fearn, revered pioneer resident credited with discovery of the curative effects of quinine in combating malaria.

When a young patient failed to respond to treatment of a serious ailment, the story goes, Dr. Fearn carried him in his arms to the top of the mountain and tended the sick one carefully for many days. Soon the pure mountain air made the young man strong and well again. In gratitude, Dr. Fearn named the natural benefactor "Monte Sano," the Spanish term for "Mountain of Health."

The other version has a beautiful Indian princess, Monte, beloved by Teeceeteska, a strong young brave, long before white men came to Alabama.

As Teeceeteska had been a constant

"Chinabee, my answer is 'yes,'" says she. Whereupon Teeceeteska huris himself from a nearby precipice and is crushed to death on the rocks hundreds of feet below. Even in death, his lips, to Monte looking down from above, seem to phrase "Monte, say no. Monte, say no." For days the princess broods over the sudden sad turn of events. Somehow she cannot marry Chinabee. One night she climbs the mountain and leaps from the same precipice to the same life-taking rocks below.

Alabama's oldest church, the First Baptist of Huntsville, was founded in 1809 on the banks of Flint River at Enon, 12 miles northwest of the city. Presbyterian, Methodist, Cumberland Presbyterian and Episcopal churches were flourishing by 1835.

For years after the War Between the States rails could be seen curled around trees in and near Huntsville. This was a reminder of the Union raid on April 11, 1862, in which practically all of the rolling stock of the Memphis and Charleston Railroad was destroyed.

All bridges in the district were burned. Tracks were torn up; rails heated and curled around trees.

REDSTONE ARSENAL IS PROTECTED BY LAND, BY WATER AND BY AIR

HUNTSVILLE, Ala., Aug. 15—Here in the former watercross and cotton country in north Alabama is one of the most heavily guarded defense plants in the world.

By land, ship and air a 250-man security force guards the sensitive nerve center of the Army Ordnance guided missile and rocket projects.

The 7,000 technicians, scientists, military personnel and engineers located here are responsible for the continuing research and development of the U.S. Army's rockets and guided missiles.

Secret and top-secret work is carried out here at Redstone Arsenal by skilled missile people recruited from all 48 states and several foreign countries. Among them are about 100 German-born scientists.

The security force responsible for the safety of the complex defense works is made up of both civilians and military personnel.

A vast area composed of 40,000 sprawling acres, three minor mountains, and 16 miles of river front must be guarded day and night.

Also to be guarded are 87 miles of railroads, 93 miles of paved roads and more than 1,400 buildings.

Four busy ammunition lines—that are working three shifts a day to produce 50 types of explosive items—must also be protected.

To guard all these important defense functions, Redstone Arsenal has about 150 civilian guards, 100 military police, a few clerks, and an undisclosed number of confidential agents.

All are under the control of Redstone's provost marshal, Maj. James F. Fail.

The provost marshal, along with other Military Police Corps personnel at Redstone and elsewhere, is now celebrating the 12th anniversary of the corps.

Maj. Fail works hand in hand with the Redstone Intelligence Officer, James Lynch.

Fail is responsible for the physical security of the arsenal, and Lynch is responsible for the security of information.

Helping Lynch keep secret information out of the hands of potential subversives are some 60 part-time deputy security officers and an administrative office staff of eight.

Redstone Arsenal's southern boundary is the Tennessee River. Fail and his 'Redstone Navy' guard the 16 miles of winding coast line. Two river craft each with a crew of two men, patrol the densely clothed river banks on constant lookout for unauthorized visitors and miscellaneous bootleggers.

They also keep watch over the modern boat docks and giant machinery that serve the arsenal.

At frequent intervals, Fail flies in a light plane or a helicopter at low altitudes over the far-flung reaches of the arsenal searching for whatever he may find.

Although the arsenal has a flying strip and a hanger, no plane is assigned through the TVA and Mr. James McAllister, manager of the Huntsville airport.

Some 21 radio patrol cars and a half-a-dozen motorcycles are also a part of the arsenal security system. The control point for the complicated business of guarding the rocket and guided missile center is in the operations and radio room in the provost marshal's office.

Here in the operations room, the network of patrol cars, ships, motorcycles and aircraft are guided 24 hours a day in their job of maintaining the security of one of the nation's most vital defense bastions.

ALABAMA COMBINES SPACE TECHNOLOGY WITH OLD-FASHIONED SOUTHERN CHARM

Alabama—Heart of Dixie—occupies a central place in the history of the South.

The constitution of the Confederacy was drawn up in Montgomery, the state capital.

Long before the Civil War, the territory was the domain of another nation, the Creek Confederacy. The powerful Creek Indians fiercely resisted intrusion by white settlers.

First settlers were the French—at Mobile in 1702—although Spanish explorers had been in the region around the early 1500s.

The French lost their territory to the British in 1763. At the close of the American Revolution it was ceded to the United States.

The long troubles with the Indians were ended when U.S. forces under Gen. Andrew Jackson decisively defeated the Creeks at the Battle of Horseshoe Bend in March, 1814.

Peace brought pioneers streaming from the eastern seaboard to claim the fertile Alabama land. Navigable rivers transported crops to the port of Mobile. Great plantations were established and worked by slaves to produce cotton for world markets.

Alabama joined the Union Dec. 4, 1819, as the 22nd state, but broke away Jan. 11, 1861. The Confederacy government was formed at Montgomery on Feb. 4, 1861.

One of the great naval battles of the Civil War was won for the Union by Adm. David G. Farragut in Mobile Bay in 1864. Most of the state was not occupied in force, however, until 1865.

Alabama was readmitted to the Union June 25, 1868.

One of the state's many historic sites is the White House of the Confederacy, the residence of President Jefferson Davis, near the state Capitol in Montgomery.

Other famous monuments, imposing antebellum houses and old forts dot the countryside.

The world's only monument to an insect pest stands at Enterprise. When the boll weevil invaded cotton fields, farmers turned to peanuts and other crops. Diversification proved so successful, that a marble shaft was erected "in grateful appreciation to the boll weevil, whose ravages forced farmers to abandon the one-crop cotton system."

ALABAMA: THE HEART OF DIXIE

Confederacy's Seat Now Nation's Rocket Center

Called the Heart of Dixie, both because of its heritage and its geographical location in the middle of the Deep South states, Alabama was the seat of the Confederacy.

Jefferson Davis was sworn in as president of the Confederate States of America on the front portico of the state capitol in Montgomery, which served as the first Confederate capital.

In contrast today, Huntsville, another major Alabama city, is called Rocket City, U.S.A., because the army's Redstone Arsenal and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Marshall Space Flight Center are there. Scientists at Huntsville developed many important ballistic and space-flight rockets, including the Mercury-Redstone rocket system that carried the first U.S. astronaut into space.

Mainly an agrarian region, the South did not become industrialized until the 1900's, but Alabama was an exception, mainly because of its rich mineral resources. Northern Alabama is one of the few areas in the world that have all three minerals needed to make Mobile Bay and the Gulf of Mexico.

Mobile, at the mouth of the Mobile River, is a busy seaport. Oceaongoing ships that bring in

bananas, crude rubber, and other imports carry away such Alabama products as chemicals, iron and steel, textiles, processed foods, and auto tires.

Alabama is governed by a two-chamber legislature and by a governor and his cabinet. Its court system, topped by the supreme court, also consists of a court of appeals, circuit courts, county courts, and numerous law and equity courts. Each of its 67 counties is governed by a board of commissioners. Other top county officials are the solicitor, sheriff, superintendent of education, engineer, tax collector, and tax assessor.


Alabama has many fine cultural facilities, one of the most noted being the State Library in Montgomery. In 1901 the state legislature declared it the Department of Archives and History of the state government.

The Birmingham Public Library owns the Rucker Agee collection of rare maps and atlases. The University of Alabama's Amelia Gayle Gorgas Library, one of the largest in the South, has a large collection of materials on the history of the Southwest.


The George Washington Carver Museum at Tuskegee Institute at Tuskegee has exhibits illustrating Negro contributions to the United States as well as paintings and sculpture by African and American Negro artists.

Carver, a brilliant agricultural scientist, joined with Booker T. Washington at the institute to teach poor Negro farmers how to laposa, and the Weiss, on the Coosa.

As evidenced by the many Indian place names in the state, Alabama is rich in Indian heritage. Excavations indicate that cliff-dwelling Indians lived in Alabama 8,000 years ago. Later Cherokee.

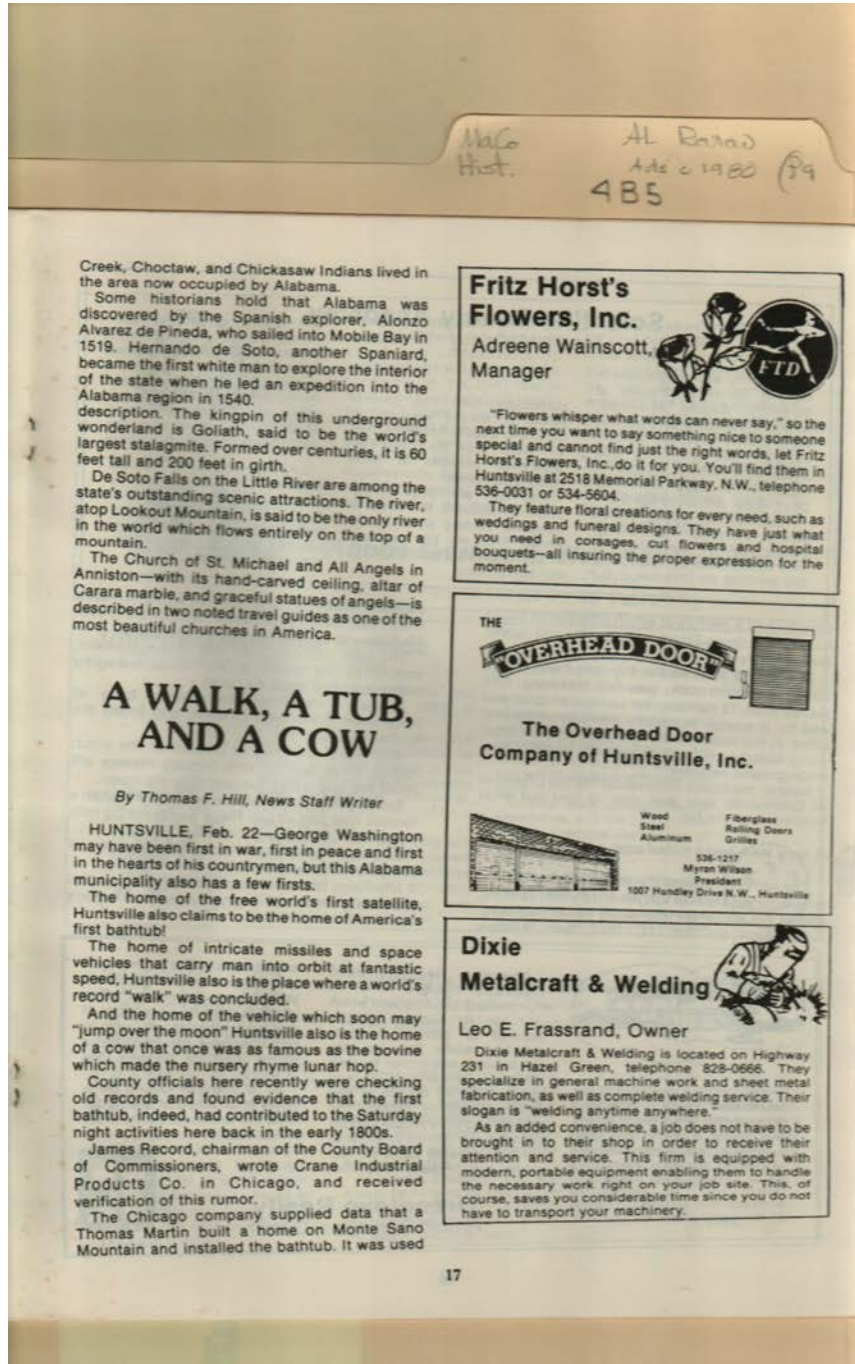

here for half a century at which time Martin built a house on Holmes Street in Huntsville and moved the tub there.

The record showed the tub was hewn out of native limestone rock, was five feet long, 19 1/2 inches wide, 12 inches deep and had a hole at one end for drainage. Huntsville was one of the first cities in the nation to have a water system also, using bored cedar logs as far back as 1818 in an underground network.

Neither the Board of Revenue nor the Chamber of Commerce ever was able to find out what happened to the tub.

Jackson moved on to greater fame at Horseshoe Bend, New Orleans, and finally the White House!

And historians then will recall the time when a famous cow named Lily Flagg was breaking milk production records right and left.

In fact, she was so famous that a dance and reception once was held in her honor.


Lily Flagg later became a championship cotton producing area, and a gin bearing that famous name still stands there.

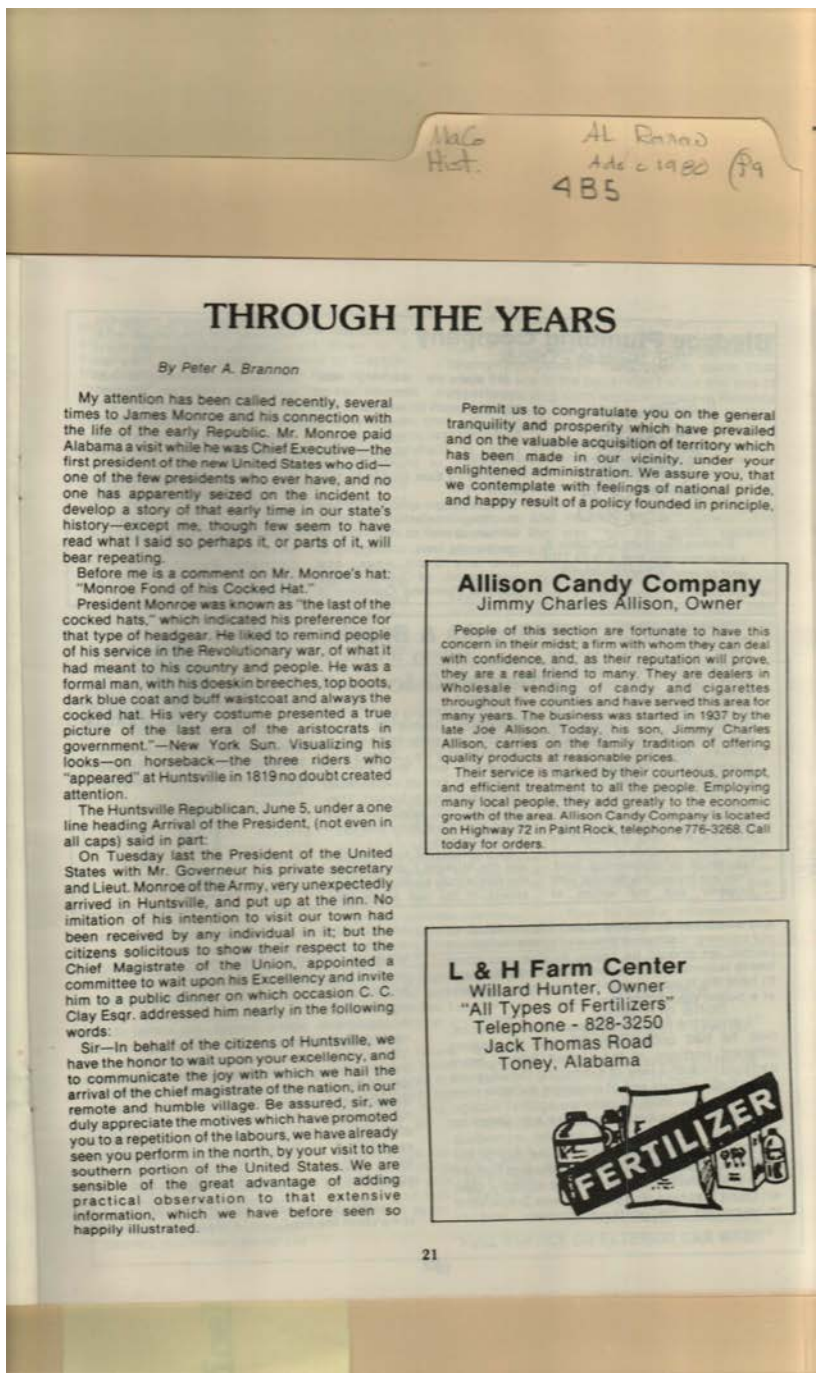

To which the President answered in substance, that, he had undertaken the task of visiting different portions of the United States, more particularly with a view of examining the situation of the fortifications and of selecting suitable sites to be put in a state of defense against foreign aggression, in the event of a future war, which he was happy to say, there was no immediate prospect of that he conceived it the duty of the chief magistrate of the Union to acquaint himself with a knowledge of the interior country over which he presided, and as far as was predictable to ascertain the state of society, and of improvement in agriculture, manufactures, etc., and also to inquire into the condition of the Indian tribes which are dispersed through the western portion of the Union. 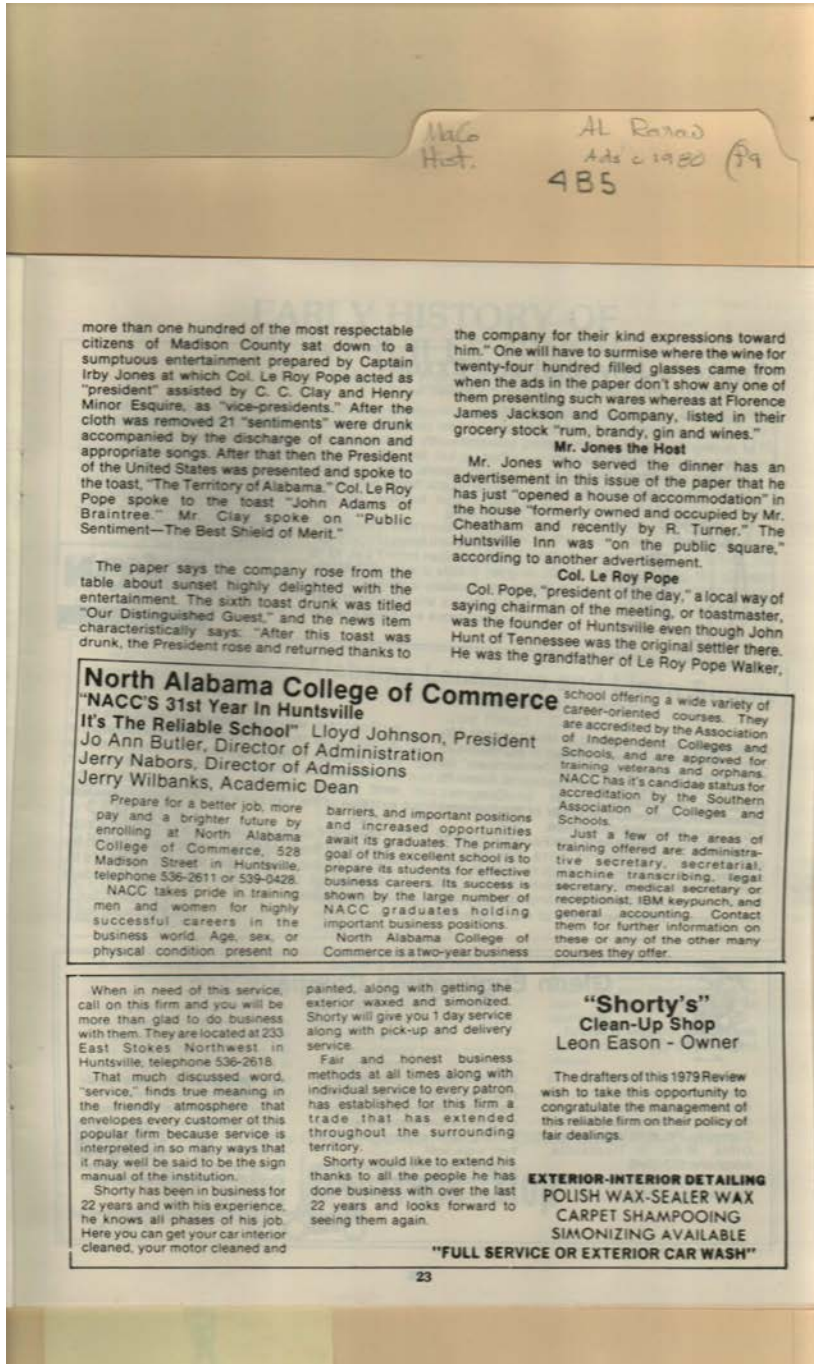

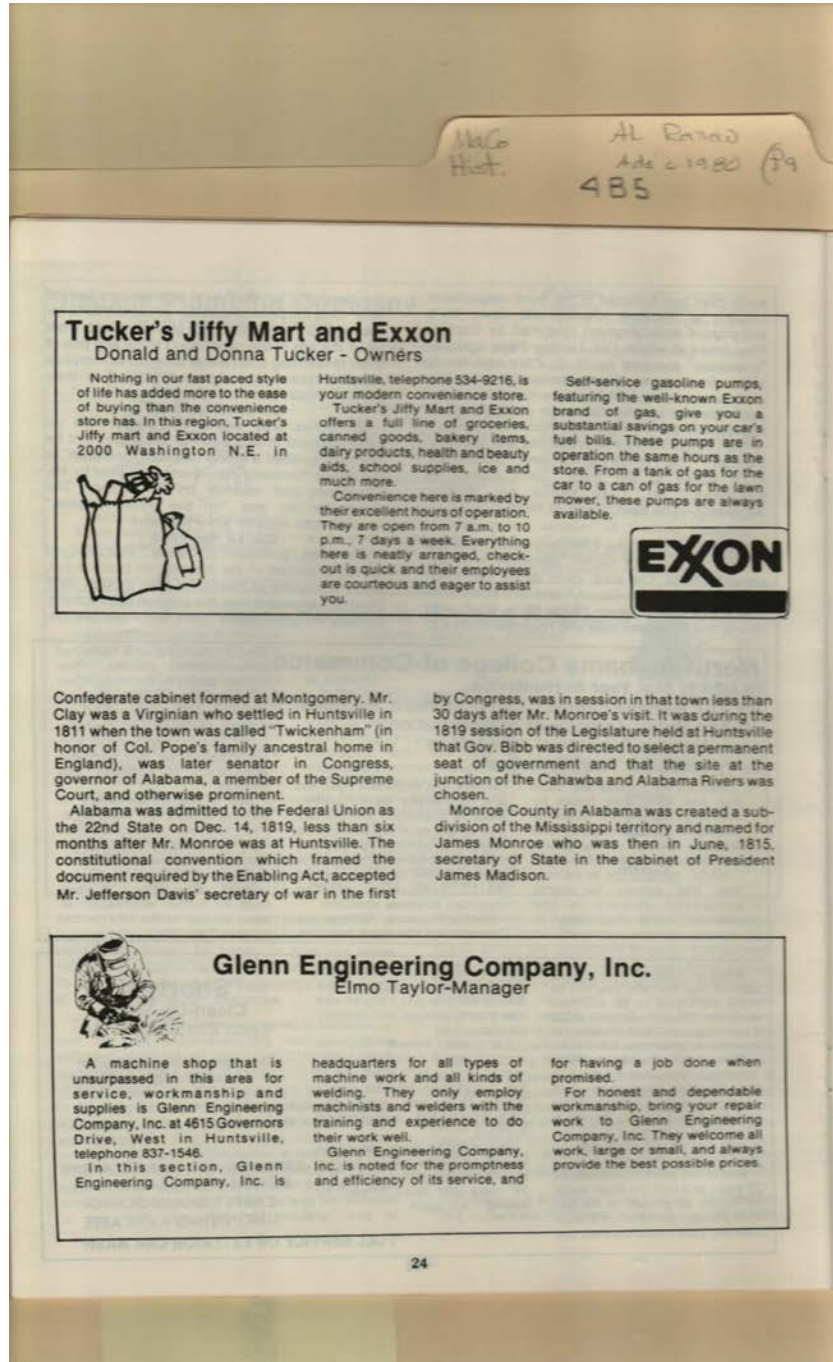

EARLY HISTORY OF HUNTSVILLE GIVEN

Addison White Tells Rotarians of Stirring Old Time Events

The period from 1817 to 1821 was one of the most prosperous that Huntsville has enjoyed, the population of the county at that time increasing from 15,000 to 20,000 according to the Hon. Addison White who addressed the Rotary Club today on the early history of the city.

Mr. White's address held the interest of the Rotes during the session of that body at the Russel Erskine hotel, being very entertaining.

Some of the items of greatest interest brought out by the speaker were the land sales held in Huntsville, first authorized by the government by the government in 1809, at which time land sold for \$2 an acre. Later, in 1810 the land was sold for the erection of public buildings, \$10,000 being raised for the erection of the first court house which was completed by John Hickman in 1816.

It was about this time that the first newspaper was established, it being the Madison Gazette, a Mr. Parham being the publisher. In 1816 this sheet was merged with the Huntsville Republican which had arisen later than the first.

Huntsville at this time was known as a great educational center, according to Mr. White, the most famous of its schools being the Greene Academy which was established in 1812. Young people from all over the Southern states attended this institution.



The first visit of a president of the United States was described by the speaker who told of the visit made by President Monroe. The first gentlemen of the land arrived on horseback, accompanied by two aides and was registered at the hotel before the townspeople had any idea of the celebrity in their midst.

Of chief political importance was the fact, as brought out by Mr. White, that it was in Huntsville that the first convention was assembled at which time the state's constitution was framed and Alabama entered the Union. The scene of this important event is known to all Huntsvillians, a tablet on Franklin street where Alabama entered the Union.

The city boasted among its first industries, a brewery, a boot and shoe factory, a hat factory, a cotton mill, and candle, pump, plow and coach manufactories. The feature that held the greatest promise at that time was the canal running to the Tennessee river and it is stated that in 1823 a boat made the voyage from the town to the river. The future of the canal, however, was blasted by the inception of the railroad.

When the first boat made its way down the Spring Branch to the Tennessee it passed Huntsville's rival—Triana. Triana at one time gave great promise, histories relate, occupying a strategic position as a harbor and at the time of its ascendancy raised \$90,000 through the sale of its land.

Mr. White's sketch was necessarily brief but proved a great source of information and entertainment to his hearers.

Huntsville, the site of Alabama's first capital, was born in 1804 beside a crystal-clear spring, cradled between majestic mountains. It was named by John Hunt, one of the early settlers. In addition to the beautiful scenery, the fertility of the soil quickly attracted many colonists.

Within a period of four years Madison County, with Huntsville as county seat, was created by the governor of Mississippi Territory. The population had reached 5,000.

Gen Jackson Liked It.

So great was Gen. Andrew Jackson's belief in the future of this city, that he brought large tracts of land, and frequented Green Bottom Inn, famous racing center, where now stands the A and M Institute at Normal.

The next 10 years saw the appearance in Huntsville of Alabama's first bank, first newspaper and first cotton gin.

The important role which Hunt's City was to play in the history of Alabama was forecast, when it was chosen as a meeting place for the Territorial Constitutional Convention. To visit a city of such importance came President Monroe, who was feted in true Southern style. Here Alabama entered the Union in 1819. Here her first governor was inaugurated. From this city came Alabama's first congressman, William Kelley.

During the years that followed, commercial development added to Huntsville's agricultural prosperity. The most famous industrial enterprise was the "Bell Factory," located on Flint River. This

mill, which manufactured cotton cloth, marked a new era for Alabama and the South.

Transportation kept pace with manufacturing. The Flint and Paint Rock Rivers were alive with cotton-loaded barges en route to New Orleans by way of the Tennessee and Mississippi Rivers.

Religion and Education

Religious and educational advantages were not lacking in Huntsville. By 1835, Presbyterian, Methodist, Cumberland Presbyterian and Episcopalian churches had been erected. Reading, writing and arithmetic were taught by the Green Academy, Huntsville Military, Scientific and Classical School, Female Boarding School, Huntsville Female Academy and the Huntsville Seminary.

Secession, War and Reconstruction brought untold suffering and hardship to Huntsville. The Bell Battery so-named because the churches had their bells smelted and cast into cannon for its use, served the Confederate cause.

Great destruction and loss of property attended the capture by the Federals in 1862.

With the passage of years arose a new Huntsville, typical of the New South. Returning prosperity brought greater industrialization. Steady growth, interrupted only by the World War, to which Huntsville contributed generously in both men and money brought this city into the present era.

Dreams Fulfilled
