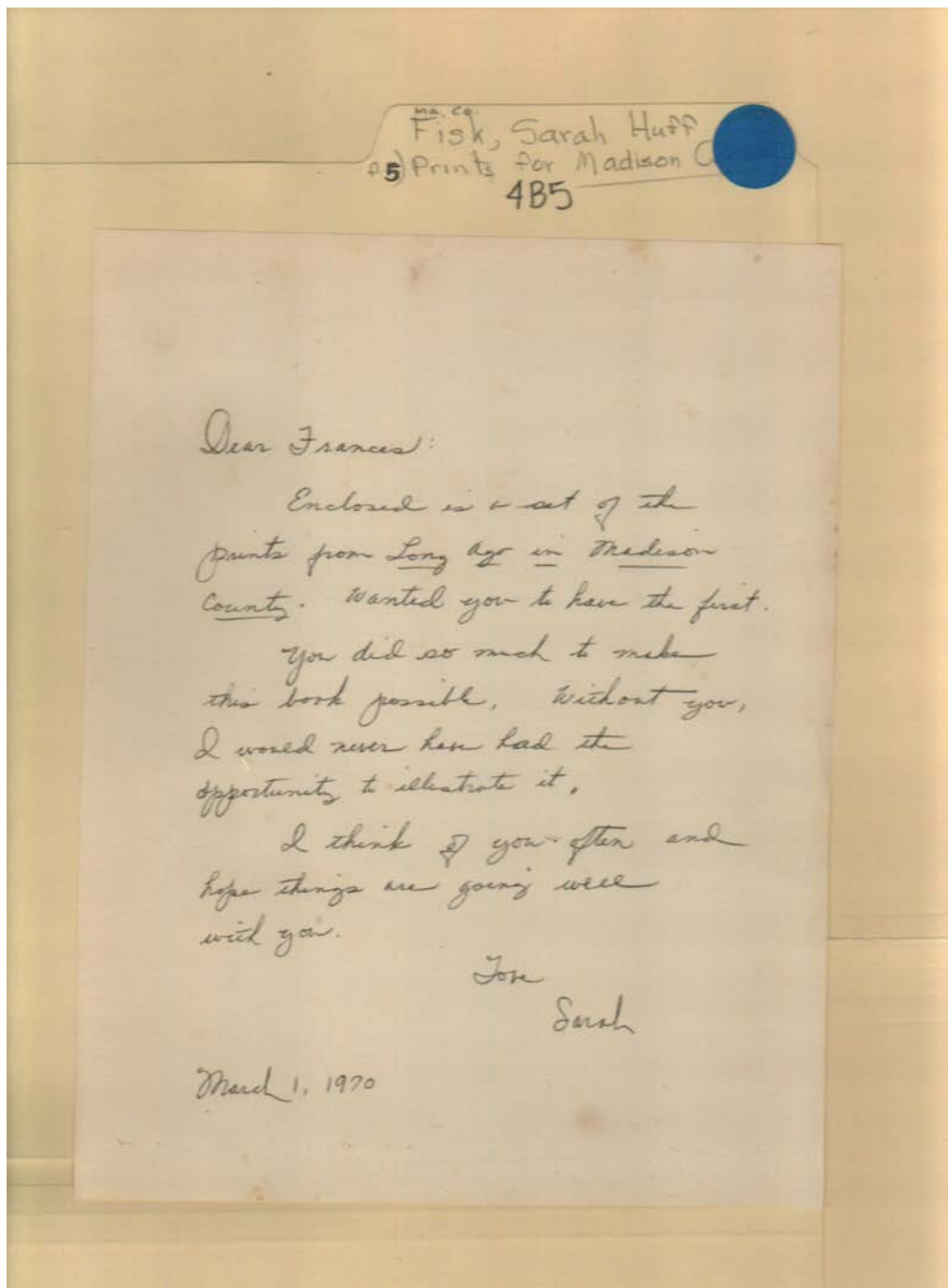

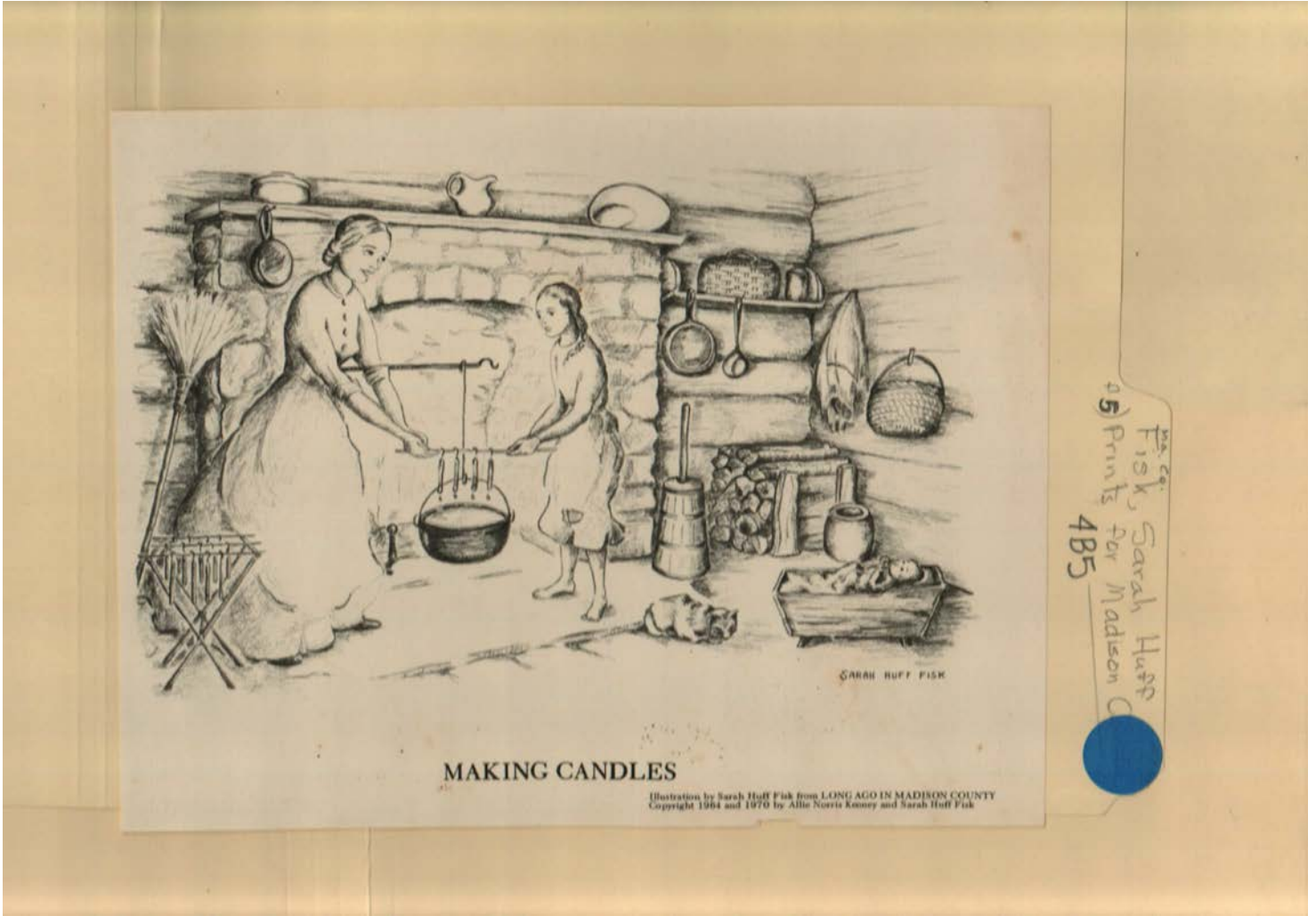

The story is based on the family of Levi Hinds, who migrated from the Knoxville area south across the Tennessee line and settled in the valley west of Berry Mountain, where they were living when Madison County was created on December 13, 1808.

Through the eyes of Milly and Daniel, two of twelve children in the Hinds family, the reader is able to imagine the trip in the ox-drawn covered wagon down the wilderness trail from Tennessee. Details of pioneer life unfold as the cabin is built on the mountain slope and fields are cleared for planting. Milly and Daniel take part in a number of pioneer tasks, such as, planting corn, making soap, and dipping candles.

This is a warm and appealing story that easily captures the imagination of the reader. From her experience as a teacher in the primary grades, the author is able to express ideas that interest the child and relate them in words that he can read. At the same time, she is successful in maintaining a delightful adventurous tone throughout the story.

LONG AGO IN MADISON COUNTY has seventeen illustrations, depicting activities of pioneer life. The drawings are lively, with a charm and simplicity that quickly engage the interest of the child. Five of the pictures are offered as separate prints. These are suitable for framing and are also excellent for school bulletin board display. Enclosed is a gift print, MAKING CANDLES.

This unique book is an outgrowth of in-service education for teachers in the Madison County school system and was created to give children an understanding of life in the county in pioneer days. The first edition was published in 1964 by the Madison County Board of Education as a social studies textbook for the primary grades. The book is used in the Educational Television series, "Huntsville, Then and Now."

Allie Norris Kenney is a graduate of Athens College, cum laude, and also attended Hofstra University, Long Island, New York. She is a member of Kappa Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma and Huntsville Historical Society. Mrs. Kenney teaches first grade at Hazel Green School. She is a native of Madison County and descendant of two of its pioneer families.

Sarah Huff Fisk has illustrated several books used in Alabama schools. She is co-author with Dr. Frances C. Roberts of "Shadows on the Wall, The Life and Works of Howard Weeden." Mrs. Fisk is chairman of the Research Committee of Huntsville Historical Society and a past president of that organization. She is also a native and descendant of a pioneer Madison County family.

The author and artist are collaborating on a sequel to LONG AGO IN MADISON COUNTY. The second book will relate further experiences in pioneer living centered around the Hinds family and will be for intermediate reading level.

LONG AGO IN MADISON COUNTY is bound in green cloth, stamped in gold, size 7x9, 48 pages. It is sturdily constructed, side sewn, and printed on excellent paper in 14 pt. type. This is a beautiful book that a child will enjoy and treasure.

Then he jumped on top of the banjo.

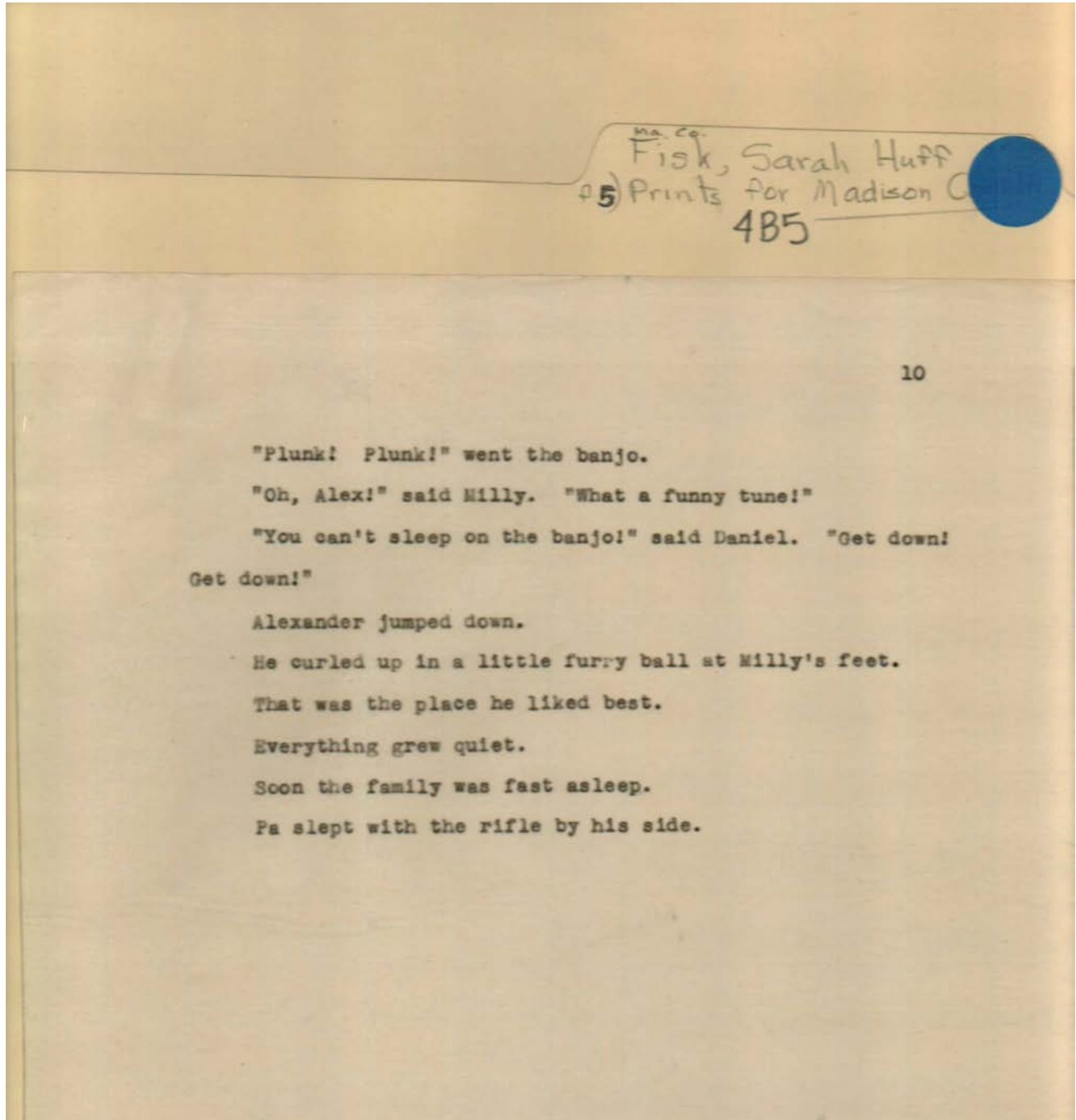
