[Invocation by Narrator is followed by
background Indian Music as Narration begins]

Narrator: (1)

The Indians ^{after} express their happiness
and friendliness toward each other with
ceremonial dances this is one of the
special occasions when the women of
the village were allowed to participate.

[First dance of pageant - "Dance of Joy" by
Grade IV - A. Group then returns to everyday tasks of the Indian]

Narrator: (2) [as Narration begins first grade
girls enter for "Butterfly Dance".]

for all things were alive with
the powers of his God and could
convey lessons or warnings
to be heeded by the individual
and by all the people in their
social life.

So it came to pass that as
these ancient people looked about
and thought on what they saw,
they gradually developed
ceremonies and adopted symbols
in order to express what they
came to believe. All of their
rites, their vocations, their pleasures -
were born, practiced, and enjoyed
under the arching skies, and
were guided, as by a vital spirit,
with an unquestioning consciousness
of oneness with nature. (end of one)

As the Indian women busied
themselves with their daily tasks,
their little ones worshipped the
great and good spirit of nature
in their play as they flitted
about as beautiful butterflies.

Narrator: (3) No Indian papoose was too small to hear of the "Great Spirit" for they were put to sleep by their mothers who sang Lullabies to them about their loving watchful care.

[While First Grade Boys Enter, an Indian children sing Lullaby.]

Narrator: (4) Small Indian boys soon learned to play like Indian warriors imitating their fathers. As they played about the village they often sang "I'm an Indian warrior, Big Chief Indian warrior, Hi - Ho Hi Ho! Hi."

[First grade Boys begin "Warrior Dance" while boys outside of stage, narrator continues.]

Narrator: (5) One of the important ceremonies of the village was that of corn grinding. During this ritual uplifted faces offered silent thanksgiving to the "Great Spirit" for the nourishing food in their bodies.

[Corn grinding Ceremony takes place in pantomime as Narrator reads and continues until Grade IV girls enter for dance.]

One of the chief occupations
of the Indians was hunting the
abundant game of the forests.
While the women of the village
awaited the return of their braves
from a hunt, they often engaged
in a square dance offered in
praise of the Great Spirit who
aided their men folk in their
pursuit of wild game.
[Grade IV Girls Dance "Square Dance"
Exit girls after dance]

Narrator: (6) With the coming of eventide
the camp fire was lighted and
the chief of the village came
down to meet with the
returning hunters. In token of
appreciation for the days' hunt
the braves of the village who
had remained behind to repair
their hunting equipment tested their
bows and arrows for the next
days' hunt. [Enter Chief of the Village]
Break was the rejoicing
when the braves returned from
the hunt with many kinds of game.

Narrator: (7) Happy indeed were the

braves as they gave thanks
to the "Great Spirit" for the
successful boys' kill. [Grade IV boys dance
"Hunting Dance", Etc. ^{to} ^{boys}]. For centuries, the
Narrator (S) Indian lived in the midst
of plenty in the valley and grew
in wisdom and strength....
And then the white men came.
By this time, however, the settlement
in the "Land of the Seneca" had
been abandoned, and the area
was used as a "hunting ground"
by the nations known to the
Cherokee, Creeks and Chickasaws.
The land which is now Madison
County was claimed by both the
Cherokee and the Chickasaws. When
the white men of the United States
government employed the Indians
to cede their lands to the government,
they called upon the "Great
Spirit" once again for guidance.
Although it was with grief
that they parted with the
government agents to give up
the lands of their forefathers,
their chief decided that was

best to smoke the pipe of peace
with his white brother and to
allow him to have some of the Indian
hunting grounds.

Narrator: (1) In the Peace Pipe Ceremony
the chieftan seated himself on
the council rock. In front
of him was the council fire, and
facing him in a semi-circle,
were the Indian braves and the
white men.

The chief rose and called to
a member standing near "Pipe
bearer, bring to me our Pipe of
Peace." [Please read as quotation]

The bearer then approached, carrying
the pipe in his outstretched hands.
He placed it in the outstretched
hands of the chief who then
raised it up and lifted his
head saying, "Great Spirit, we
come in peace about the
council fire. We smoke our
pipe with the white man that
there will be more peace." ^{God bless}

The chief raised the fire
reached for a small bank,

and lighted the pipe. He returned to his place, seated himself and smoked as his men sang. He then handed the pipe to the braver on his right, who took a short puff and passed it on.

At the end of the ceremony the chief again arose and repeated in an imploring voice, "Great Spirit we come in peace about the Council fire. We smoke our pipe with the white man that there ^{will} be more peace." [Quoted]

The pipe was returned to the braver by the chief who then folded his arms across his chest as though in solemn resignation. ^{the white men left the scene,} the chief strode away followed by the braver, the Medicine Man, the braver and lastly, the Indian women.
