In the fall of 180%, just about a year before the Indians gave up their title to "Old Madison County", John Munt and David Bean came ing to the area in search of a big spring which they had heard about from the Indians and other white men. They probably followed the "Morth-South Trail" later known as the Winchester Road, and when they received the northeastern part of the county, they spent the night with the Joseph Griner. At this time Isaac Crimer, brother of Joseph, and Samuel Davis were also settled in the same area. (Enter John Munt and David Dean who are searching for the "Big Spring".)

The next morning as John Bunt and his companion set out for the spring, Mrs. Criner gave them broad which she had baked for them to

Upon reaching the spring, John Hunt was not disappointed in what he found. Indeed the large stream flowing from the base of a high rock bluff was of such beauty and purity that he knew he had found the place he wanted to make his home. After exploring the surrounding area, he and David Dean built a cabin on the bank near the spring and roturn to Tennessee.

When the leaves came out on the trees and the warm sun shown down once again in the spring of 1805, John Nunt brought his family to their new home in what is now Madison County. Thus, was founded a settle ment which was soon to bear his name.

(Anter other settlers who greet each other - drink from the spring gather about the camp fire - clean their guns - cook - etc.)

Nows of the rich lands in the "Bend of the Tennossee" traveled fast and soon many settlers came to live near Munt's Spring. By 1808 there were ever three hundred people living around the "Big Spring" and more than 3k000 settlers were to be found in the county. On December 13, 1808 the county was escated by proclamation of Governor Robert Williams of the Mississippi territory and given the name Madison, in honor of James Madison, who was soon to become president of the United States.

In August of 1809 the United States government sold the lands of the county to the settlers so that they might have clear title to the forms which they cultivated.

As life settled down in the new settlements, more time could be biven to social gatherings. At get-togethers on the benks of the "Bis Spring" the older folks often enjoyed watching their children join in dancing to the old folk tunes brought ever by their English ancestors. "Fush the Business On" was favorite of these little folks as they joined hands and sang together "I buy a horse and bring a gis, and all the world can dance the mig, and I'll do all I can to push the business on." (Second grades dance and exit) (Grade V returns to pandors

As an educational conter, Hambeville beasted the beat institution for the training of youth in the state of Alabama. Forhaps a typical scene on the laim of Green Academy, the area which we now occupy at the East Clinton School, was a lively spring featival. On such occasions the pirls of the Huntaville Formale Seminary, located on Randelph Street, came over to enjoy traditional denses much as the Haypole. Not only did they like the footivities, but also the association with the opposite son. Here the young pentlumn of the Academy paid special attention to the manners and proming in order to impress his fair lady. The young lady too, was dressed in her best "bill and tucker" in order to eatch the attention of the handscapist lad on the green. (Here Maypole dance takes place) by Grades III-C and D - Exit third grades - Maypoles are removed as narrator continues)

After the formal part of the program was ended, the young gentlemen escorted their ladies to the school parlors where punch and cockies were served in abundance. Light and gay was the laughter, lively was the conversation, and sad was parting which ended so joyous a time in May of 1838.


