Commission first appointed, except the Director of the City Planning Commission, the City Building Inspector and the member of the city governing body, who shall all serve by virtue of, and whose terms shall correspond with the terms of their respective offices, shall serve for terms of one, two, three, four, five and six years, respectively as shall be specified by the mayor at the time of their appointment. Thereafter the members of the Commission, except the ex officio members, shall serve for terms of six years. At the expiration of the term or the death or resignation of any member the resulting vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term of such member in the same manner as provided above. No distinction shall be made between the ex officio and other members of the Commission.

B. (1) The Commission shall meet regularly at an established time and place at least once in each month and specially upon call by the Chairman or Secretary and forty-eight hours notice to each member for purposes specified in the notice of call only. A chairman elected by the Commission from its membership shall preside at its meetings, or in his absence a chairman pro tempore likewise elected. Minutes of its meeting shall be kept by the Director of the City Planning Commission, who shall be the Secretary of the Commission, or by a stenographer or reporter designated by him and under his direction. Such minutes shall be signed by the Secretary of the Commission, and shall accurately reflect all matters brought before the Commission, its proceedings and determination thereon, including the votes of its members, and shall be permanently retained as official records of the city. Five members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business at its meetings. All meetings of the Commission shall be open to the public. Its proceedings shall be governed by such reasonable rules and regulations as it shall adopt, consistent with law and accepted parliamentary procedure. (2) Members of the Commission shall

affix the seal of the city, upon the authority of a resolution duly adopted by the Commission. (3) All funds of the Commission shall be held, administered and accounted by the city clerk-treasurer in like manner as other city funds and likewise disbursed upon the authority of a resolution duly adopted by the Commission. (4) (a) The Commission may provide for the public showing of buildings and structures within Historic Preservation Districts to interested persons, groups and organizations within Historic Preservation Districts to interested persons, groups and organizations under such agreements as the owners thereof shall deem proper. (4) (b) Subject to the availability of funds therefore, the Commission may cause suitable markers to be posted at, upon or adjacent to Historic Preservation Districts or the entrances thereto and sites, buildings and structures therein situated and may accord such priorities therein as it deems proper, provided that markers shall be placed on private property only upon approval of the owner or owners. (4) (c) Subject to the availability of funds therefore, with the prior approval of the governing body, may acquire by lease, purchase, or gift, buildings or real estate within the boundaries of the historic preservation districts, provided, however, that such property will be held in the name of the City. FRAMEWORK FOR DEFINING HISTORIC CONTEXTS

The Alabama Historical Commission examined the plans of several states in order to develop a model for Alabama. Alabama's model lists a number of general themes, such as transportation, economy, politics, religion, etc., and extends these over a temporal frame. The time frame is based on broad periods that are relevant to Alabama's historical development. For example, there is a period from 1540 to 1780 when the area that is now defined by Alabama's state boundaries was occupied by three different nations for roughly eighty years each. Increments become smaller as specific events shape the history of the state.

Special topics are assigned to each theme according to time period. The economy theme might yield topics like trading, real estate speculation, and commercial development over an eighty year period. Associated sites and buildings are then identified for each topic. These would include housing types, commercial structures, and various institutions.

The framework can be applied to any scale of development--community, city, county, or region. The AHC core staff will, with the assistance of preservationists around the state, develop priorities based on settlement types that share similar problems in the management of resources. The major breakdown of settlement types is by population. Hence, large- and medium-sized cities, small towns, crossroad communities, and rural areas will be treated differently in the planning process.

This philosophy is based on the strong feeling by the AHC that the strategies for implementing preservation options will vary from one settlement type to the next. For both long- and short-range planning it is more useful to address and prioritize problems for specific areas than for broad regions. At the same time, if the resolution of a large scale impact must be planned for, various settlements can be considered together regardless of type.
