HISTORIC SOUTH

Tryon Palace
 Historic Tryon Palace, built 1767-70
 in New Bern, North Carolina, has been

 ing in the Colonial America." It was
 built by Thomas Tryon and his wife,
 Elizabeth Tryon and Joseph Martin. The building later
 became the first state capitol. Renovation of the palace
 was completed in 1959.

 of Point Cruz, Alabama was used to house wounded
 Confederate soldiers. In 1864, the building was shelled
 by the U.S. fleet. A brass plate bearing the inscription
 "Compliments of Admiral Farragut" was placed on the
 building during the bombardment. After the war,
 Guntion House became a gambling casino. It now is
 a private dwelling.

←The Hellee trailer has a spacious interior for the mother and her family. On both, you can pitch a tent over it and tie four coils inside. Make the canvas and coils, you have a spacious camp shelter.

The versatile Trail-Craft is proving useful to Civil Defense groups and in disaster areas, as well as to vacationing families. It is made by Trail-Craft Corporation, Phillips, West Virginia.

Traveling along the highway, the Hellee trailer shown on page 20 appears to be an innocent one-wheel cargo trailer. At the campsite it converts into a tent with a fully made-up bed, floor space for several cots, storage shelf for luggage, and cooking counter. It's made of riveted aluminum and has telescoping legs in the corners. The manufacturer is Hellee Trailers, Ltd., California, and the unit shown here was demonstrated for Four Trues editors by Kaupp Trailer Sales, 2700 North-western Highway, Birmingham, Michigan.

If you're one who doesn't like sleeping on or even near the ground, ingenious devices are happy to provide you with beds that rest on top of your station wagon. The Sky-Vee Sleepers, shown top of page 22, can be erected in about a minute when you know how. Set it up, and the mattress, which you can unzip the cover, will lift the lightweight frame, and insert two upright rods. Put the two canopy rods in place and you're done. The bed inside is already made up, and the ventilator window opens and closes from the inside. This handy camp shelter is made by Blake C. Leggett, 22800 Farmington, Dearborn, Michigan.

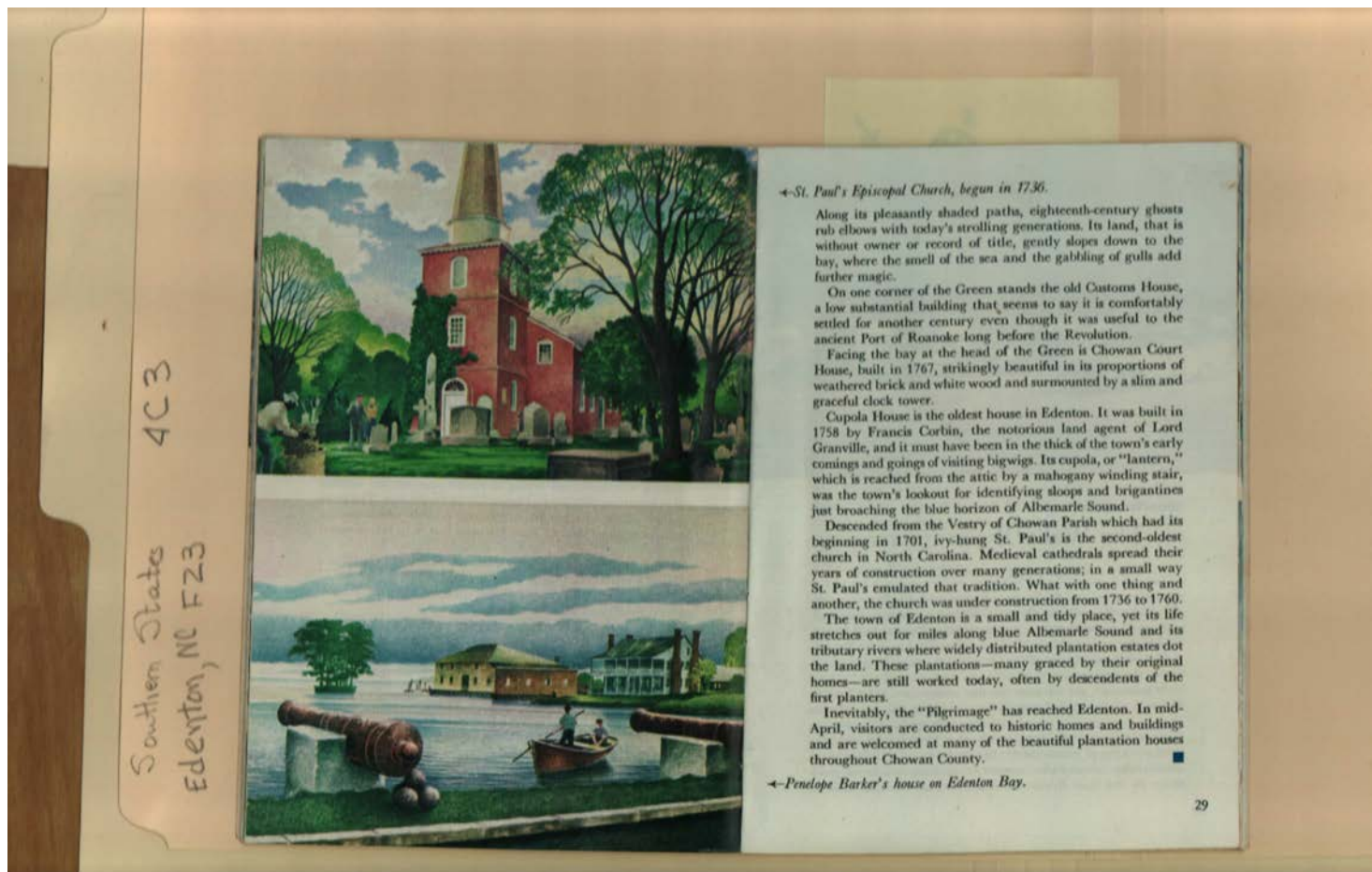

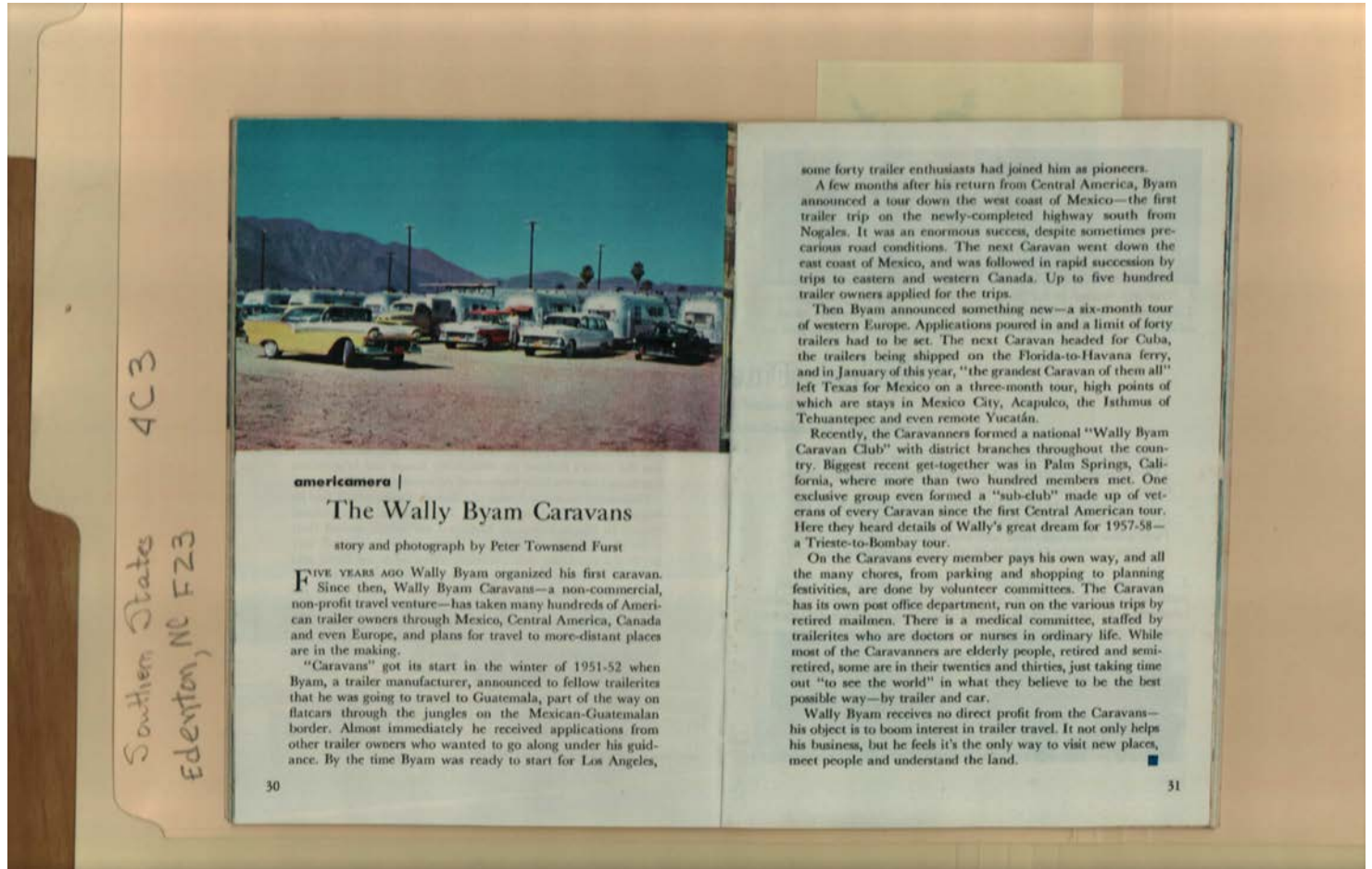

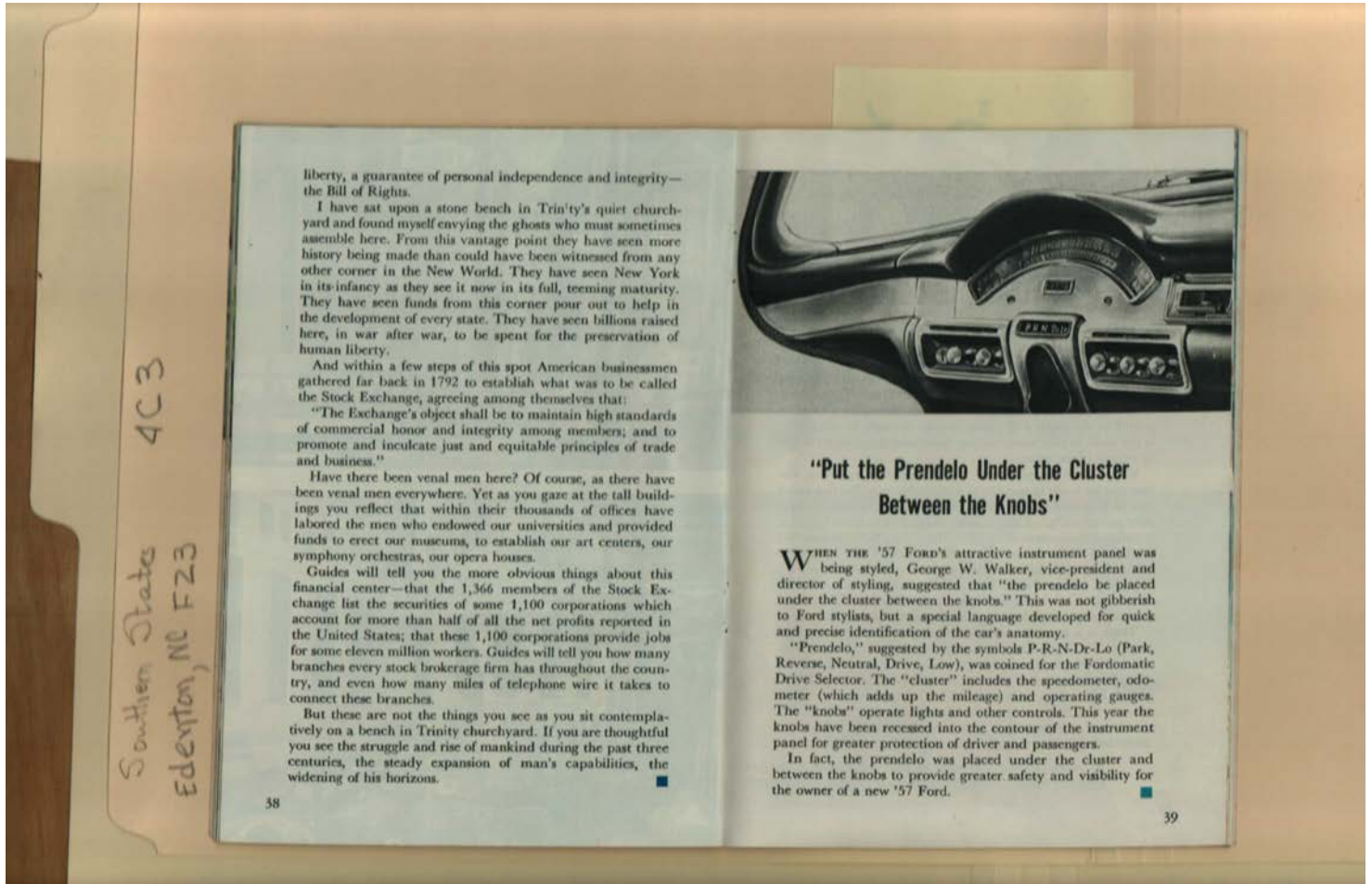

Dip Net Fishing—
Roanoke Style
story and paintings by William G. Ewing

FISHERMEN on North Carolina's Roanoke River have no doubts that their special sport—dip net fishing—is the country's most unusual type of angling.

They practice it in the spring when rockfish, or stripers, leave the brackish waters of Albemarle Sound and swarm up the swollen river to spawn. Aboard long, slender skiffs, the fishermen drift down the Roanoke with their long-handled, wide-mouthed nets stuck deep in the water, and they say that when a rockfish strikes the net it equals the delight of a rainbow rising to a well-cast fly.

The center of Carolina dip net fishing is Weldon, a little town on U.S. 301 (the Tobacco Trail) about twenty-five miles south of the Virginia state line. The sport has developed a small fishing village on the river at the outskirts of town, and a hatchery there aids in keeping the rockfish plentiful.

The dip nets are the same, in principle, as ones used by the Indians 350 years ago, and are also called "sets." A set consists of three parts: a bow-shaped frame measuring about four by five feet, the four-foot-deep net, and a fifteen-foot handle.

Guides are available to handle the skiff, leaving the fishermen free to dip their nets and wait for the jolting wrench that means a big rockfish is enmeshed below. The pole is then pulled up hand over hand until the net breaks water and the fish is skillfully flipped out of the net and into the boat.

The best ending to a dip net fishing expedition is the famous "muddle," a savory rockfish stew, cooked in an iron kettle over an outdoor fire, and relished by the fishermen, the guides, and perhaps a bystander or two.
