R. B. THOMAS of Fort Payne

Robert Blaine Thomas of Fort Payne, retired last year after an extraordinarily varied, colorful and long career -- at the age of 87. The reason he finally stopped working was an accidental on-the-job injury.

For 71 years, beginning in a local brick factory at the age of 16, at \$3.10 per hour for an eight-hour day, Thomas worked at many jobs, including delivering groceries, railway flagman, locomotive hostler, wood craftsman in a wagon and carriage shop, movie operator and various electrical positions. He also owned a drug sundries business and several other shops. But, as evidence that he could stick with a job he liked, he was employed by the Alabama Power Company for 25 years and by the Sand Mountain Electric Cooperative for 27½. He retired from the latter in 1973.

Having little to do this year other than sort through the many scrapbooks and files stored in his basement office, tend his yard and plant his garden, this fascinating octogenarian prepared for us a brief story of his childhood, including his very interesting firsthand account of Fort Payne's boom period and its aftermath.

We think our readers will enjoy his story of what a young boy's life was like in this area in the last part of the previous century. And perhaps we can all understand the sentiment behind the last sentence which abruptly ends his story.

Evidently Bob Thomas' typing had been laboriously and painstakingly done by untrained hands and it was accompanied by the notation to "Excuse typographical errors."

We are pleased to present "Mr. Bob's" story in his own words and -- with only very minor changes and corrections of those typographical errors -- just as he wrote it.

The Ventress Family of Collinsville



Steel bridge built around turn of century upriver and around the bend from present bridge on Highway 35. The ford on Little River had been just at the end of the island shown under the bridge.



G.E. Hill stands on bridge named in his honor because of his efforts toward the development of the Little River area. Representative Excell Baker introduced the resolution in the state legislature naming the bridge crossing Little River on state highway 35 after Hill.


Among the first settlers in the Collinsville area was the Ventress family. Aaron Ventress and his mother moved from Fayetteville, Tennessee to a farm three miles south of Collinsville soon after the Civil War. Sand Mountain at this time, according to Ventress, was a wilderness, with only trees and wild animals.

Aaron's father was Lem Ventress and his mother was the former Mary Ellen Parker, a first cousin to Daniel Boone. Aaron was married to Sarah E. Reed on February 18, 1875. (See page 29, Vol. 11 of LEGEND for picture of family and old homeplace.) Sallie Reed's mother was Sallie C. Reed (1813-1893) and her father was James Reed (1809-1850). They are buried at Rocky Mount, south of Collinsville.


Aaron was a farmer and horse breeder. Their children were James, Nora and Thomas. James Lemuel Ventress was born June 15, 1876. He was a school teacher and married Lulu Doris, who was also a teacher. They had no children. James died in 1909 and Lulu Doris died in 1939.

Susan Nora Ventress, born on September 20, 1878, married John Cunningham and they had two children. Clarence was born on September 8, 1900 and Doris on November 19, 1912.

Thomas Aaron Ventress was born June 21, 1881. He taught school for some time and then became a farmer. He was very active in church affairs and served as clerk of the DeKalb Baptist Association for 26 years. On September 26, 1906, he married Virginia Petty of Lime Rock in Jackson County, Virginia, the daughter of Felix Grundy Petty and Ary Adiline Adkins, attended Athens College and became a teacher. Thomas and Virginia had seven children.

Letter to Editor

Fort Payne, Route 5, April 19, 1915

Dear Sir -- will drop you a few lines about the 79 years I've been in DeKalb. I am 82 years, two months and five days old. I was born in Dahlonega, Ga., in 1833 the 14th of February. I came to DeKalb when I was three years old. My father settled the land at Lebanon. The first court was held at Bootsville, then they began to try to locate a county site. They ran Bootsville, Rawlinsville, Camden and Lebanon. In order to get it at Lebanon my father gave every other lot to be sold proceeds to go to build court and jail house.

My mother was the first one buried at Lebanon graveyard. Now it is three acres big.

This court house was a log house about 20 feet square with one window without glass. The seats were split logs and only enough for the jurors. All the spectators sat on the floor or stood up. The most people did in those days

were horse race, gander pull, drink and gamble. I was in the war from the beginning to the end.

Well, filling off. If you want to know any more I'll tell you something about dried pumpkin, grated bread and johnycakes.

Dr. J. Thomas Gaines

Dr. James Thomas Gaines was born in 1889 at Crossville, the son of James and Lula Kerr Gaines. He attended Collinsville High School, the University of Alabama, and the Medical College in Mobile, graduating from the latter in 1914. The loss of a leg from osteomyelitis interfered with his ambition to become a surgeon.

Dr. Gaines married Lela Margaret Justice, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. G.W. Justice, of Crossville, in 1914 and they had three children, Rhoadelle, Georgia (who died in infancy), and Lorraine.


For 29 years, Dr. Gaines treated patients in the Crossville area, conscientiously rushing over dirt roads to make house calls either day or night. A compassionate man, the hard-working physician was kind of people and disliked by no one, unless it was a person who was unkind to another, or someone who refused to work, when physically able to do so. For seven years before his death in 1943, Dr. Gaines

suffered from a serious heart ailment, but refused to get adequate rest, especially after the younger doctors were drafted during World War II.

Also interested in community affairs, Dr. Gaines worked hard to secure a paved road across Sand Mountain through Crossville and sought improvements for Crossville School. He died at the early age of 54, but he had already done much in his lifetime toward fulfilling his slogan, "Work to make the world a better place in which to live."

Dr. Moore's Death

Dr. Wiley Evans Moore, a prominent physician of Lebanon, died at his home on February 4, 1914 of pneumonia at age 67. He had moved from Shelby county to Lebanon 22 years before. Dr. Moore graduated from Atlanta Medical College in 1890.

RUHAMA STUDENTS
Write History of Area

Mrs. Jo Ann Bayne's social studies class of Ruhama has not only studied history this year, but has written it as well. With much enthusiasm and interest, the students have done extensive research in compiling histories of Ruhama and surrounding Lookout Mountain communities. Relying mainly upon interviews with older citizens, they have obtained much information which might never have been recorded had it not been for their efforts. In addition to the historical data about the development of various communities, these young people also learned much about the hardships of pioneer life, the frugality of depression days and the relative ease and convenience of modern-day living. Probably the most important and enduring result of their research project is their new appreciation of historical records and information and an increasing awareness of the importance of the past.

RUHAMA
According to the young historians, the land in the area where Ruhama is located was granted to the Alabama Land Company in 1856. Abraham Dutton purchased one-fourth section in 1884 and sold it to J.L. Cagle. Two acres of land were set aside by Cagle to be used for building a church, and as the community grew, it took the name of Cagle's Crossroads.

CALLED "DOG TOWN"
Though the church and school are named Ruhama, the community is known to most people as "Dogtown." The students' explanations of this name vary as to details. But it is generally agreed that at some time or other someone passing through inquired as to the name of the place. There were many dogs around, especially hunting dogs, and someone is said to have glanced around at all the dogs and to have arrived at the seemingly appropriate answer, "This is Dogtown." Mark Plunkett attributes the role of name christener to Rufus Griggs, who bought most of Cagle's land in 1906. However, arrived at, the name stuck, and efforts to change it permanently to Ruhama have apparently been in vain.

Ruhama Baptist Church was organized in 1900 and the first building was constructed in 1902. The first pastor, J.R. Akins, came here from Birmingham. The students believe his former church was named Ruhama and that he gave that name to his new church. Mark notes that Ruhama was the name of Hester's daughter and means "mercy obtained."

The first school in the community was Old Bethel, with grades one through eight. According to Carol Graham, two of the first teachers were

Miss Lora Anderson and the singing teacher, Luther Lowery, with Wallace King as principal. (Miss Anderson later married Dr. Claud Killian. They had one son, Dr. Edward Killian, who lives in Anniston.)

In 1905 or 1906, Ruhama School was built near the present location of the church, the labor being done by the men of the community. Miss Ida McInerny was the first teacher. In 1910 the school was blown down by a tornado, which also destroyed the church. School was held at various places until another building was constructed in 1912 at the present site. In 1935 this wood structure burned and the W.P.A. built the main part of the present stone school. Ken Griggs, who also helped build the church, did most of the rock work. The gym was added about 10 years later and the lunchroom was built in 1971. The first school bus was a truck with a body built on the back, which was driven by W.A. Akins in the 1930's.

People all over the state have heard of Akins' Furniture Store at Dogtown. According to information compiled by the Ruhama students, the grocery store, with which the Akins started, belonged at various times to Dave Whaley, Elijah Burt, George Johnson, Luther Lowery, Rufus Griggs and Tom Fox, before being bought by Arthur Akins in 1922.

During World War II the store began selling used furniture, the first step

toward becoming one of north Alabama's largest furniture stores. A 20 by 40 foot furniture store was added. In 1962 the store was incorporated as W.A. Akins & Sons. It now covers 14,765 square feet and has a 7,000 square foot warehouse.

LICK SKILLET

Another community with an unusual name is Lick Skillet. The older residents said that S.D. Wells and Henry Burt, who ran a store there, were nicknamed "S.D. Lick Skillet" and "Double O. Potleg" respectively, by Newt Bowman. When Burt sold out his share of the business the place was then called Lick Skillet.

SIGSBEE

The students have been told that one of the oldest settlements around is Sigsbee and that it was named after an ambassador to Mexico. At one time the only store in the area was located there and was owned by George Jennings, who operated it for approximately 40 years. Jennings also ran a post office and rode horseback to Calhoun twice a week to get the mail. A telephone switchboard, installed about 1915 at Sigsbee was operated by Andrew Casey and Tom Watts. There were also a gristmill, cotton gin and saw mill at Sigsbee.

WALKER'S CHAPEL
Walker's Chapel was found to have the oldest cemetery in the area. This church is said to have been named after a Mr. Walker who moved from Georgia to a sparsely settled community near what is now called the Granny Webb Spring. There was not a church or a school within miles and this early settler persuaded his few neighbors to help build what was to be known as Walker's Chapel Church. After worshipping for a time in the first small church, the people built a larger log church up the hill from the first. The Reverend Millard McNutt began preaching there every second Sunday. (He married Minerva Kilian and they had 15 children. McNutt Church is named after this family.) A third church was later built and the Methodist Conference sent a minister out every first Sunday of the month, though the Reverend McNutt continued to preach on the second Sundays. Finally a fourth building, the present rock church, was constructed.

DAVIS - NEWMAN WEDDING
Attorney John A. Davis and Miss Julia Newman were married on January 27, 1894, at the home of the Reverend J.B. Appleton, near Collinsville. Davis was a member of the law firm of Davis and Haralson.

SANTILEON CITY
You may never have heard of Santileon City, DeKalb County, Alabama. There was a big sales promotion of city lots there in 1914. The town was located about 30 miles north of Boaz, and said to be in the center of one of the best farm regions in north Alabama. It was thought that a railroad would soon be built and that industry and trade would increase property values tremendously in the next few years. Dixie Lookout Realty Company advertised sales and auctions. Subdivisions were laid out and land was sold, with deeds describing lots in Santileon City. But the name never quite caught on. Local citizens preferred to call the place Rainsville.

HORSES CRASH INTO MONUMENT
A team of horses belonging to a Collinsville livery stable were frightened by the road roller being used on Gault Avenue in January of 1914 and caused a rather novel accident. Turning northward at what was then Main Street, the crazed horses galloped straight toward the Confederate Monument, smashing the buggy into the concrete base and leaving a damaged buggy wheel and a badly bruised traveling salesman named Lane at the foot of the monument.

Dr. John E. Hall was born in DeKalb County in 1869. He attended school at Collinsville and received his M.D. degree from the Atlanta Medical College in 1892. He and Mrs. Hall, the former Belle Marshall, reared eleven children. Dr. Hall practiced in Chavies, Selevania and neighboring communities for more than 40 years. He was very interested in public education and served as president of the DeKalb County Board of Education during the 1920's.

VANCE LARMORE

Builder of Early DeKalb County Homes

BY

(GREAT-GRANDDAUGHTER)

About 1836, a Virginian came by barge down the Tennessee River with his bride, their household furnishings, fifty slaves, and lumber to help build his new home. He landed in Stevenson, Alabama, crossed Sand Mountain, and settled in the north-eastern part of DeKalb County in Big Wills Valley four miles south of Valley Head.

On the unsettled land Vance Cummings Larmore began to build his homestead with the aid of his slaves, for whom he constructed quarters nearby. One cabin remains today.

The house which he built for his family was of English-style architecture, a two-story wooden structure with a foundation of natural rock columns several feet high, and chimneys made of the same. The upper story contained three bedrooms, reached by a winding stairway, and a front porch with banisters. The lower floor consisted of a "parlor," a front hall, from which the stairway led to the second story, one bedroom, a large dining area in which were a large dining table and a china closet made of walnut, (now in the possession of a granddaughter, Mrs. W.K. Griffin, of Dallas, Texas), a kitchen with a large fireplace, and a convenient side porch. There were fireplaces in all of the rooms.

Across the front of the house was a porch, enclosed by banisters. Dark green shutters shaded the windows of the structure. A rock path led from a side porch to a large spring where water was secured for cooking and drinking purposes. Today the house stands intact and is owned by his youngest son, C.T. Larmore's grandson, Carl Jordan of Columbia, South Carolina.

Vance Larmore loved to build. As he gradually amassed hundreds of acres of land, he began to build, as his sons grew to manhood, a home for each. Using a part of the lumber he had brought on the barge from Virginia, he built for his oldest son, Thomas J., a house styled after his own on what is today Highway 11, north of the White Hall Methodist Church. It is still standing, with some changes having been made. It is known as the J.C. Larmore home and is owned by his daughter, Lilla L. Larmore.

There were other houses built on other farms owned by and bequeathed to sons in the White Hall area, as well as the White Hall Academy, an early school in the community.

Vance Larmore was not only a builder; he was an owner of some of the first equipment used on the early farms of DeKalb County. The first cradle for harvesting grain was used on his own farms and on his neighbors' farms as well. For his wife, the former Margaret Lyle McSpadden, he is reported to have purchased the first cook stove in the county and the first sewing machine, which is owned today by a great, great granddaughter, Mrs. C.H. McKee of Dallas, Texas, who uses it for a table.

To quote from Larmore's obituary, published in the Bristol, Tennessee newspaper, The COURIER on February 11, 1886, he "was a public spirited man. In every enterprise which had for its object the building up and improvement of his country, he always took a leading part, and for this purpose devoted his means and influence freely."

Vance Larmore's death was caused by an accident -- that of a falling tree. His work as a builder of homes was at an end; but he seems to have had an influence on his descendants, even, to the present, to build -- as evidenced by the contemporary house recently erected by his great, great grandson, Larry Longshore, on a part of the old estate.

OPERA HOUSE

J.A. Long leased the Opera House in June, 1926, but planned to keep it closed until the middle of July because of a revival service in progress at the court house and another one scheduled to begin at the Methodist Church on July 4.

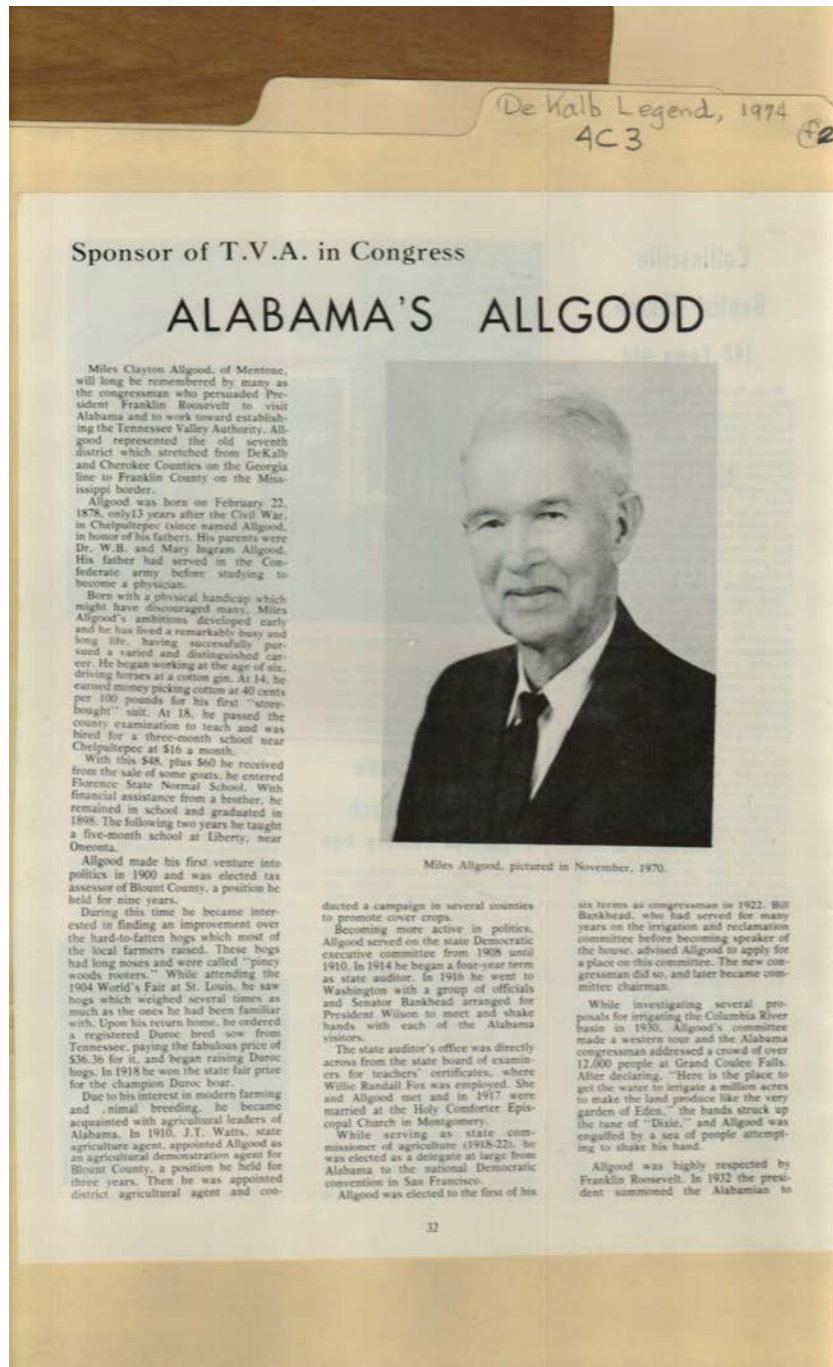

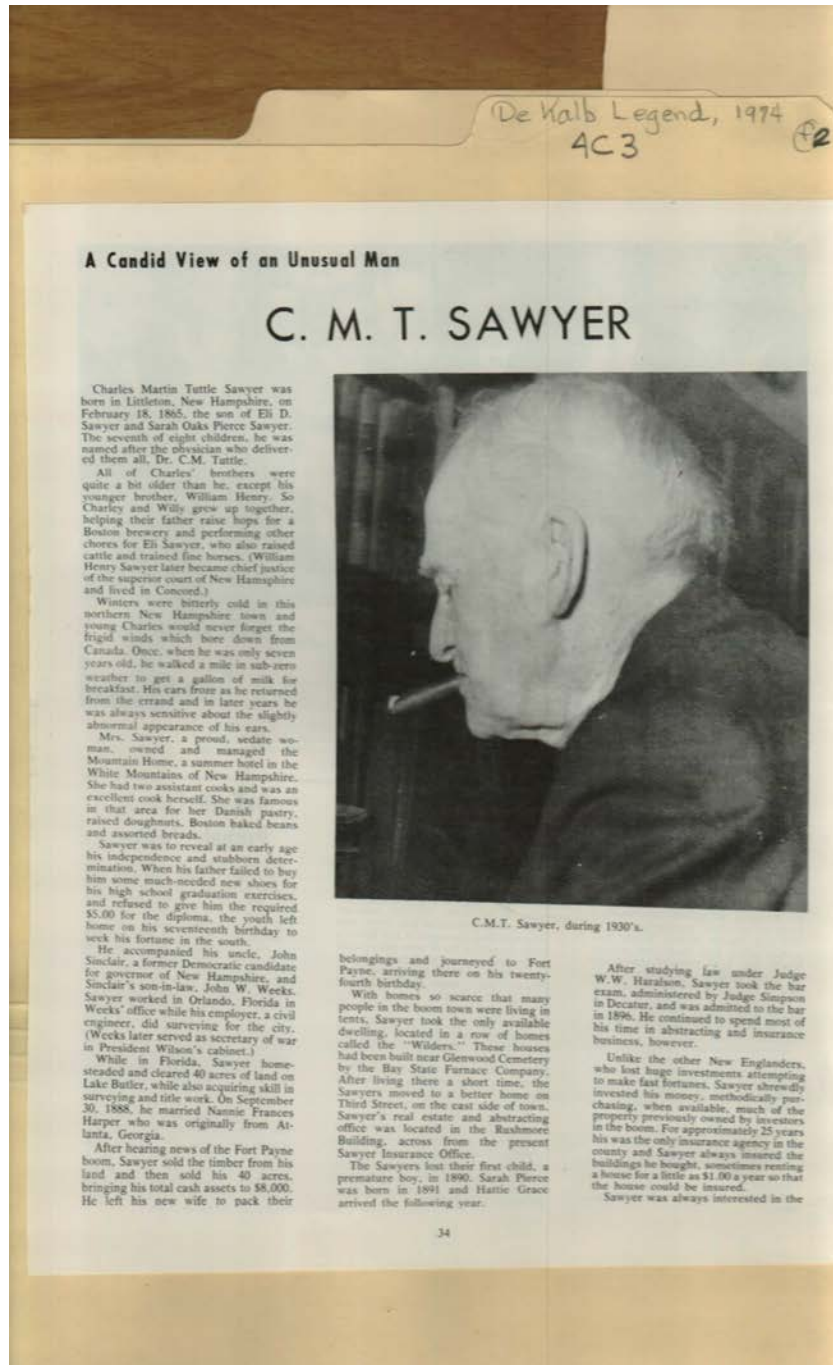

civic and political affairs of his community. He donated land for Forest Avenue School and DeKalb County High School and for Saint Paul Methodist Church. He served as mayor of Fort Payne for a total of 26 years, a longer period of service than that of any other mayor.

Sawyer was a practical joker and enjoyed teasing others. Once, when a pushy woman reporter proceeded to interview him before either obtaining his permission or offering an adequate explanation, he answered her questions concerning his family tree deftly and with great imagination. A shocked interviewer was soon wondering whether to write down the ridiculously humorous answers she was getting from her unfathomable subject.

Although he adored his wife, he enjoyed teasing her most of all and often initiated petty arguments. She, in turn, thought him the wisest of men, but rarely failed to offer instant rebuttal to her argumentative husband. It is said that the obstinate New Hampshire gentleman and his spunky Atlanta-born lass refought the Civil War on an average of twice a week.

In addition to being rigidly obstinate, Sawyer was often unpredictable. On his fiftieth birthday, his wife and daughters bought him a \$50 gold piece and planned a party. It was to be a stag party, to make the guest of honor more willing to attend. The guests included Judge J.A. Croley and all former mayors of Fort Payne. The guests arrived and Mrs. Sawyer called her husband to dinner. When he didn't open his door, she pleaded with him to come out, but he answered that he was too ill to eat. Mrs. Sawyer finally marched back to the banquet table and announced, "Gentlemen, be seated." And turning to her daughters, she murmured disgustedly, "I can't get the old jackass in here!"

He never did come to his party. C.M.T. Sawyer was a highly individualistic self-made man, unpretentious, but certainly opinionated. He had no hobbies except reading, preferring history and biographies. His favorite vice must have been his ever-present cigar. A wealthy man, he never owned a car. In the early days, when he used a buggy, it was rented from the livery stable. But he preferred walking over riding. A favorite pastime was to carry a lunch and spend the day in the woods with the county surveyor, L.N. Christenson. He made frequent visits back to his old home town in New Hampshire and to Boston. He enjoyed walking around the city of Boston and knew much about its historic past.

Perhaps the most widespread misconception about Sawyer was the belief that he lacked religious convictions. But, though he did not attend church, he was deeply religious and was an avid student of the Bible. He did attend church in Florida, with his daughter Sarah, and considered joining the Episcopal Church, his preference, and a denomination not represented in Fort Payne at that time. He was a kind man and mellowed with age.

INDEPENDENT FORT PAYNE BAND

A band which furnished free music for special events was organized in Fort Payne around 1940. The band had no sponsoring group and expenses were paid by the members themselves. Organized by former students of Professor F.S. Thacker, the band had many members not pictured above, including Glenn Gravitt, Floyd Abbott, Will Rush and I.E. Farmer.

Thacker had come to Fort Payne after World War I to teach a group of veterans who belonged to the American Legion. He also taught a group of DeKalb County High School students. But these bands were discontinued during the depression and it was only through the initiative and determination of this small independent band that there was any music available for public events for some time.

The young musicians started meeting

in the court room of the court house on First Street each Wednesday night, with A.R. Kilburn directing. Later Glenn Gravitt directed the group, which grew in number and included a wider range of ages. Most of the group worked and their practicing time was limited. But they all loved music and willingly cooperated in furnishing music for all requests.

One member of the band had never had any lessons other than a correspondence course, but walked many miles from his home to practice with the group each week. Later, during World War II, his patience and fortitude paid off when he was accepted in the prestigious Navy Band in Washington, D.C. Two members, Rhonald Cagle and Van H. Hamilton, became band directors for a time.

Confederate Reunion

Judge L.L. Cochran and A.P. McCartney were among those attending the sixth Confederate reunion, held in Richmond, Virginia in July, 1896. Over 100,000 veterans attended the meeting.

Truly C.M.T. Sawyer was one of our county's most unusual characters, as well as a very successful and outstanding businessman. He died on February 12, 1950, four days short of his eighty-fifth birthday.

Cemetery to be Enlarged

The FORT PAYNE JOURNAL announced on September 22, 1915 that the Fort Payne Company had donated land for the expansion of the old cemetery. It would be enlarged so as to make it extend to Grand Avenue on the east and Grand would be straightened and graded where it passed in front of the cemetery. Part of the road which at that time passed through the cemetery would be included in the new limits. This was expected to make the old cemetery "amply commodious" for years to come.
