the Four Winds, and Winter. Trees are on either side of the throne, while the Grasses crouch in sleep.

Spirit of Alabama enters dancing joyously and joining the group at the invitation of Spirit of the South who is moved by her loveliness.

The Sun and her Sunbeams are sent forth to announce Spring. The Grasses move rapidly in dance while the Trees sway in time with them.

Spring lightly follows with her Wild Flowers, who in turn are followed by the Animals and Birds of the Forests.

Spring then summons Summer and her Roses. Fall and Winter attempt to drive Summer back. Winter comes to her rescue, but Summer triumphs and Winter is driven from the field.

Spirit of Alabama exultant over Summer's victory joins her in a dance.

An Indian call is suddenly heard. The dancing ceases. An Indian Maid and Brave appear. Spirit of Alabama beckons them forward where they dance.

At the command of Spirit of the South Summer brings forth Corn who dance around the Indian Maid and Brave. The dancing figures move towards the Indian Hut and Campfire. Another Brave and Maid enter, passing in wonderment.

Spirit of Alabama welcomes them, one of the Braves following her while the other Brave and two Maids seat themselves before the Hut. The deserted Maid rises to her feet and sings the "Call" from "Indian Love Call."

Spirit of the South is enraptured by the love call and moves slowly towards the Indians. Chivalry enters and advancing reverently, sinking upon one knee, kisses her hand. Graciously she receives him and embraced by his arm they wander forward.

EPISODE II

"DE SOTO VISITS ECONCHATE (1540)"

PAST—

First of the European expeditions,
In 1540 comes the Spanish army,
(Astride strange beasts the Indians call the "big elk").
Led by ruthless Fernando De Soto
In search of gold; and, also, to establish
The Catholic Church along the Alabama.
Weighted with chains, five hundred Indians follow.
Proud Tuscaloosa, Chief of the Mobilians,
(In temporary camp at Econchate,
Where later stands the capital Montgomery),
Receives the armored host; and journeys with them
Southward, to wage a most unequal conflict;
Lay low the Indian capital, Mobilia;
Ev'ns, with his kindred, face annihilation,
Rather than bow, submissive, to the Spaniard.

Tuscaloosa (the Mobilian Chief) and his Braves are seated around the great fire while the squaws are busily engaged in taking down the huts preparatory to the day's march. The Indian boys are shooting at targets while the Indian maidens sit humbly by and watch.

Suddenly two Indian runners enter in alarm, displaying to Tuscaloosa their broken arrows, and telling of armored strangers who invade the camp ground. Tuscaloosa rises and withdraws to his throne accompanied by his Braves. The Indian maidens rush to the huts where the squaws await them, but the Indian boys stand fearlessly by.

DeSoto enters with his company of mounted Spaniards, including two priests, and followed by Indian slaves in chains and heavily laden.

Tuscaloosa remains seated until DeSoto alights and pays him recognition. A brief religious service ensues, the priests planting a Cross, DeSoto and his men kneeling in prayer. Chests are then brought forward and trinkets are delivered to the Indians. Tuscaloosa receives a scarlet cape and cap which he dons. At the request of DeSoto he mounts and he and his braves lead the cavalcade. The remaining braves and squaws gather the trinkets, move curiously around the Cross and then march towards the river.

teenth in a class of sixty, he requested to be put back in order that he might better fit himself. He was graduated June, 1822, and was immediately commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the Sixth Infantry, United States Army, but after a short service resigned. He married a cousin of Osceola, who was born in Macon county, (Alabama), and later became Seminole by choice, in Florida. From the luxurious life of a cotton planter on August 17, 1836, Manac volunteered for service in the Army in the Florida War of 1837. He was made a Captain of mounted volunteers. Promoted to Major, November 15, he was killed in the Battle of Wahoo

A marker erected by the Alabama Anthropological Society stands at his birth place on the Old Federal Road in western Montgomery county. His home, built when he left the Academy, 1822, and furnished from the McGillivray ancestral estate at Douglas, Scotland, with furniture brought back by his uncle, David Tate, 1792, still stands near Little River, in Baldwin county, on a part of the lands of that older uncle, Alexander McGillivray.

YANCEY HOUSE

A modest little frame structure back from the roadway now being paved between the city of Montgomery and Judkins Ferry bridge on the Tallapoosa, marks the place where the last earthly hours of that great Southern orator, William Lowndes Yancey, were spent.

Returning from Europe where he had been sent by President Jefferson Davis, as a Commissioner to enlist the aid of Great Britain and France in the cause of the Southland, he realized the failure of his mission, and strived to serve his people further as a Confederate States Senator. Heart broken, realizing that the cause of the South was wanting, he returned from Richmond, and after a short illness passed away. His plantation home, then four long miles from the city of Montgomery, is today hardly more than a like number of

minutes drive by present day auto from the State Capitol which had known those stirring addresses which fired his countrymen in the cause so dear to them at that time.

SEQUOYAH

Col. Blount's journal begins with a rather characteristic statement "Tuesday, 26th of June, 1826, attended a tariff or rather an anti-tariff meeting in the Court House—and started on to Fort Mitchell as a Commissioner to superintend the running of the State line between Alabama and Georgia." He says: "We began at the mouth of Uchee below Fort Mitchell and ran No. 10 and struck the Tennessee River two and a half miles east of Nickajack—then ran to Nickajack and finally put up a square stone at the Tennessee line—to divide Georgia and Alabama where I would go into those three States by going around the stone in less than three minutes." Apparently writing under date of Monday, September 25th, the line having been run, he says, "I wrote to

siderable Creek—or next above a considerable creek or stream, from whence a line to Nick will not intersect the Chattahoochee River."

The phraseology of this sentence settles the line. Starting from the next great bend above the Uchee Creek, a line must be run straight, to the Nick WITHOUT intersecting the stream. Therefore, the instruments must be pointed to the known location of the Nick and lines run upstream, surveys made, and observations taken, until a point on the bank of the stream is reached where the line when run straight to the Nick will not cross the stream. With this knowledge, the reason for the straight line, forming an irregular angle nearly 35 miles east of a north-and-south one, touching the River about Lanett, is shown. Note should be made that the line was re-run from the Nickajack southeast, after the positive corner boundary had been fixed.

Writing at Hebron in Washington County, Georgia, on Sunday, June 10, 1849, he sets down some things which "it will be pleasant to remember hereafter," among them that "we ran No. 10 and struck the Chattahoochee at a white oak on the west bank where there is a good natural dam 100 or 150 yards long, between a small stream and a river. Retired back a little to a post oak Gravelly Knob—took the observation at night for latitude by the stars and crossed the river next morning for home—I being the only Commissioner at the close." The one statement made Monday, September 25, 1826, and the other made June 10, 1849, may refer to the same point on the Chattahoochee.

Entries in the Journal of the House of Representatives of the State of Alabama for the 1826 session, would indicate that Alabama was not satisfied with the line as run. Under date of November 26, John Murphy, our Governor, transmitted to the House the Report of the Commissioners on the part of the State of Alabama, and the report of Major Lewis, who, it seems, was directed to survey that section between the Flat Shoals and the Great Bend. The Flat Shoals it is assumed, is the point near Lanett of the present time, the Great Bend, that point opposite Fort Mitchell. Governor Murphy

CHEROKEE BLUFFS DAM

This power dam, thirty miles above Montgomery, harnesses the waters of the Tallapoosa River and its larger streams. It is about 10 miles north of Talladega.

POWER DEVELOPMENT IN ALABAMA

Those cliffs through which rush the waters of the Tallapoosa River furnished Alabama's aboriginal people with the materials of which were made those practical utensils in which to grind their corn. Today those same cliffs form the foundations to which have been joined by the hand of man, that artificially manufactured material which stores those same waters to produce power to be transmitted as electrical current far from this scene.

The valleys of the Coosa and the Tombigbee in which these aboriginal people lived are today the sites of those manufacturing establishments which by the conception of man's more developed brain has transformed those natural stones therein to a crushed powder which we call cement. This same material mixed with those natural pebbles out of which aboriginal man fashioned his instruments of war, and

moulded with those waters, produces that material—concrete—out of which modern commerce erects those permanent fixtures which only the hand of God can destroy.

That great industrial project at Cherokee Bluffs, less than 35 miles northeast of Montgomery, which will impound a body of water whose shore line is longer than the entire coast of Florida, and which will cover more than 40,000 acres, is developing power sufficient to furnish not only the State of Alabama but those industries many miles out of its bounds. One of the largest gravel producing corporations within the State washes its product on the site of Sawonogi, where Tecumseh's mother was born and from which place she left for the home of her Shawnee husband less than two months prior to her celebrated son's birth. This product is furnished and makes the base of that material which Talladega,

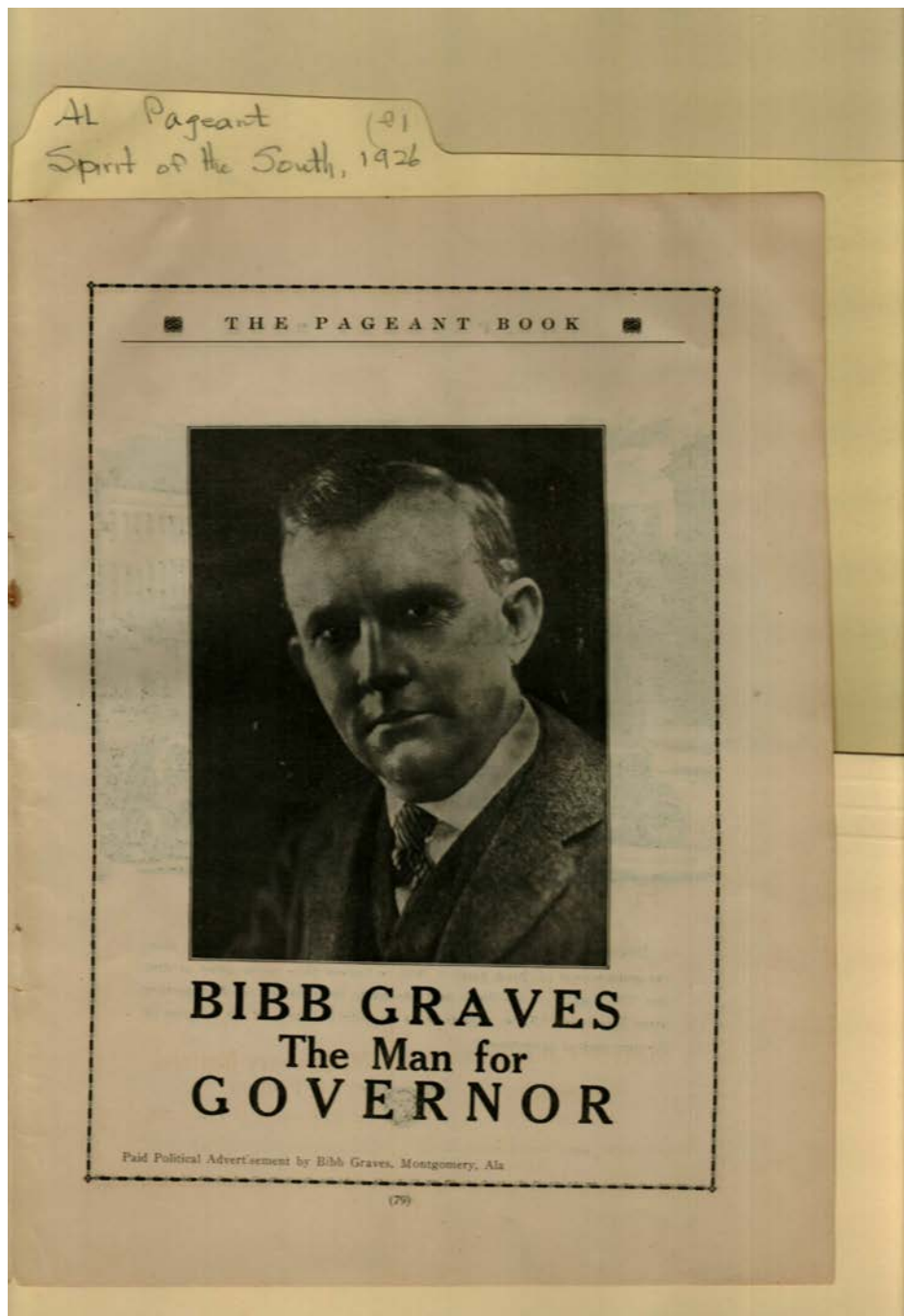
