NEW MEMBERS ELECTED TO CHA

The Committee for the Humanities in Alabama is pleased to announce the recent election of eight new members to its governing board. Each year approximately one-third of the members completes its term and is replaced by new members chosen through a public nominations process. The following Alabama citizens began their terms on November 1, 1982:

**James K. Baker** is the city attorney for Birmingham. A graduate of Cornell University, he has practiced law in Pennsylvania and Alabama. A charter member and former chairperson of the CHA, Baker served as the executive director of the American Society of African Culture from 1961 to 1967. He is the co-editor of *Southern Africa in Transition*.

**Marilyn Clark Beck** is dean of academic affairs at Lurleen B. Wallace State Junior College where she taught mathematics before assuming her present position. Active in a number of professional associations, she is a regular speaker for local civic groups. Beck has chaired the local community arts council and is currently serving on the board of directors of the Andalusia Area Chamber of Commerce.

**Ellwood B. Hannum** is associate professor of history at the University of South Alabama where he has taught since 1970. He is a specialist in modern British history, and his research interests include the development of the criminal justice system in England and America. Hannum is a member of the Franklin Society, the English-Speaking Union and the Mobile Community Organization.

**Dora Gene Hill** is chairperson of the Foreign Languages Department at Gadsden High School where she teaches Spanish, Russian and Latin. Among her many honors, Hill was named Alabama Teacher of the Year for 1975-76 and was the first secondary school teacher inducted into the Alabama Teacher Hall of Fame.

**Kenneth R. Johnson** is professor of history at the University of North Alabama. A specialist in Southern history, he

organized and published the *Journal of Muscle Shoals History* from 1973 to 1980. Active in the Alabama Historical Association and the Civitan Club, Johnson has participated in CHA-supported activities as a Traveling Humanist and as a project director.

**John E. Kelly** is president and owner of Kelly Supply Company, a building materials firm in Anniston. He has served on the boards of the Anniston Council on the Arts and Humanities, the Alabama Shakespeare Festival, the Calhoun County Chamber of Commerce and the United Way of Calhoun County. A resident of Anniston since 1946, Kelly has been active in the Anniston Community Theater and the Friends of the Library.

**Roy L. Meek** is dean of the School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences at the University of Alabama in Huntsville. Previously he taught political science in Colorado and Texas. Meek's research interests include environmental issues and American democracy. He received the University Distinguished Service Award at Colorado State University.

**Edward Wegener** is a programming specialist for Auburn Educational Television. He founded the Auburn ETV production center in 1954 and served as the general manager of Alabama Public Television Network until 1982. Wegener produced a series of programs on American literature which won two awards for excellence from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting.

Selecting new members was a difficult process for the Committee with over 150 persons nominated to fill only eight vacancies. The Committee seeks to maintain a membership drawn equally from the academic community and the public sector. Also, they consider such factors as geography, race and gender in order to build a membership that is representative of the entire state. The CHA is extremely fortunate to have attracted so many talented and dedicated individuals who are willing to undertake the demanding work of the Committee.

At the October 1982 meeting, the Committee bid farewell to the departing members, praising them for their service to the CHA. Completing three year terms on November 1, 1982 were Chairperson **Elizabeth Thompson** (Gadsden), **John P. Adams** (Birmingham), **Thelma Robinson** (Florence), **Elizabeth Rodgers** (Montevallo), **David M. Voss** (Birmingham) and **John C. White** (Huntsville). The Committee also expressed its thanks to **Josephine E. Ayers** (Anniston) and **Jean McCrady** (Dothan) who resigned last year.

More farewells were in store at the January 1983 meeting of the Committee as Chairperson **Harold Dickerson** and the members commended the outgoing gubernatorial appointees for their service to CHA. Ending four-year terms after the January meeting were **Judith Hand** (Birmingham), **Marilyn Isay** (Opelika), **Robert Lager** (Mobile) and **Susan Miller** (Mobile). Governor Wallace will be asked to appoint four new members this year.

NOMINATIONS FOR NEW MEMBERS REQUESTED

The Committee for the Humanities in Alabama invites nominations of prospective members to the governing board of the CHA. Any Alabama citizen with an interest in the humanities may be considered for membership. Members serve three year terms during which they meet three times a year to make decisions on grant applications. Also, they serve on subcommittees, help evaluate CHA-funded projects and often advise applicants seeking grants.

If you wish to submit a nomination, send the person's name and address, a detailed resume or biographical sketch, and a letter of nomination to the Nominations and Membership Subcommittee, CHA, Box A-40, Birmingham-Southern College, Birmingham, AL 35254. The deadline for nominations is June 1, 1983.

## HISTORIANS AND ANTIQUARIANS

A certain degree of discipline is required in the history projects which state humanities councils fund. Giving people money to get together and talk about the past does not necessarily result in a "history" project. And any council which does not retain an active sense, during review of proposals, of the difference between history and antiquarianism is likely to spend tax dollars in ways the law governing NEH does not authorize.

Antiquarianism is the term generally used to describe random, indiscriminating collection of facts about the past. It is what the "buff" does when he or she memorizes the costumes and battle plans of all regiments of the Civil War or buys every book on Churchill because "I'm a fan of Churchill and Churchill is my hobby." No attempt is made to ask why the information is important, either to the antiquarian or anyone else. The unexamined emotional satisfaction of the activity is its own justification. Antiquarianism can be a worthwhile activity, like all recreation, but the money spent by state councils must not be used simply to support history buffs. Our job is to communicate the essence of a number of scholarly disciplines.

One begins to practice the discipline of history, as opposed to antiquarianism, when one asks questions in two categories, **quality of information and significance of information.**

Questions in the first category involve determining the degree of truth in any bit of information encountered. Is this a fact? How do we know it's a fact? Is it a rumor or myth or error passed down over the years that bears some degree of correspondence to events that actually happened? Do the chroniclers or eye-witnesses who tell me these things have blind spots or important motives? Are the documents I'm using authentic or forged? These and similar questions all lead one into the

elaborate process of verification of evidence that is one characteristic of the discipline of history. A council-funded program may not have time to give the audience an advanced course in parchment dating, but it should help participants to understand that our "facts" about the past are not always simple or absolute, based as they are on the use we make of millions of documents and artifacts of varying degrees of reliability.

As an intellectual discipline, history also differs from antiquarianism in its quest for a hierarchy of facts. To the antiquarian, all facts are equally interesting and important. The historian, on the other hand, attempts to find the relative degree of significance in the pieces of information he or she has available. For example, it is interesting to note that a number of British ships anchored briefly at the Galapagos Islands in the nineteenth century, but much more interesting to note that one of those ships carried Charles Darwin as a passenger. In explaining and debating why the second fact seems to possess greater importance than the first, we use a balanced combination of logic and subjectivity to analyze the nature of society and the meaning of life as disclosed by past human experience. The result is a disciplined interpretation based on more than ignorance, conjecture, and bias. Here again, state council projects need not be as sophisticated as Toybee, but the audience should obtain some feeling for the way various interpretations of the past are constructed.

Lots of books address these differences in method. Three that I'd recommend are Wood Gray, ed., *Historian's Handbook* (1964); Louis Gottschalk, *Understanding History* (1960); and Frank Freidel, ed., *Harvard Guide to American History* (Rev. ed., 1974).

Most state councils have historians as members, so the points I have emphasized can be injected into proposal review easily enough. Historians who do not speak about these matters during proposal review are not doing their duty. Finally, councils

without historians as members should teach themselves the basics or make certain that each proposal is reviewed by a scholarly consultant.

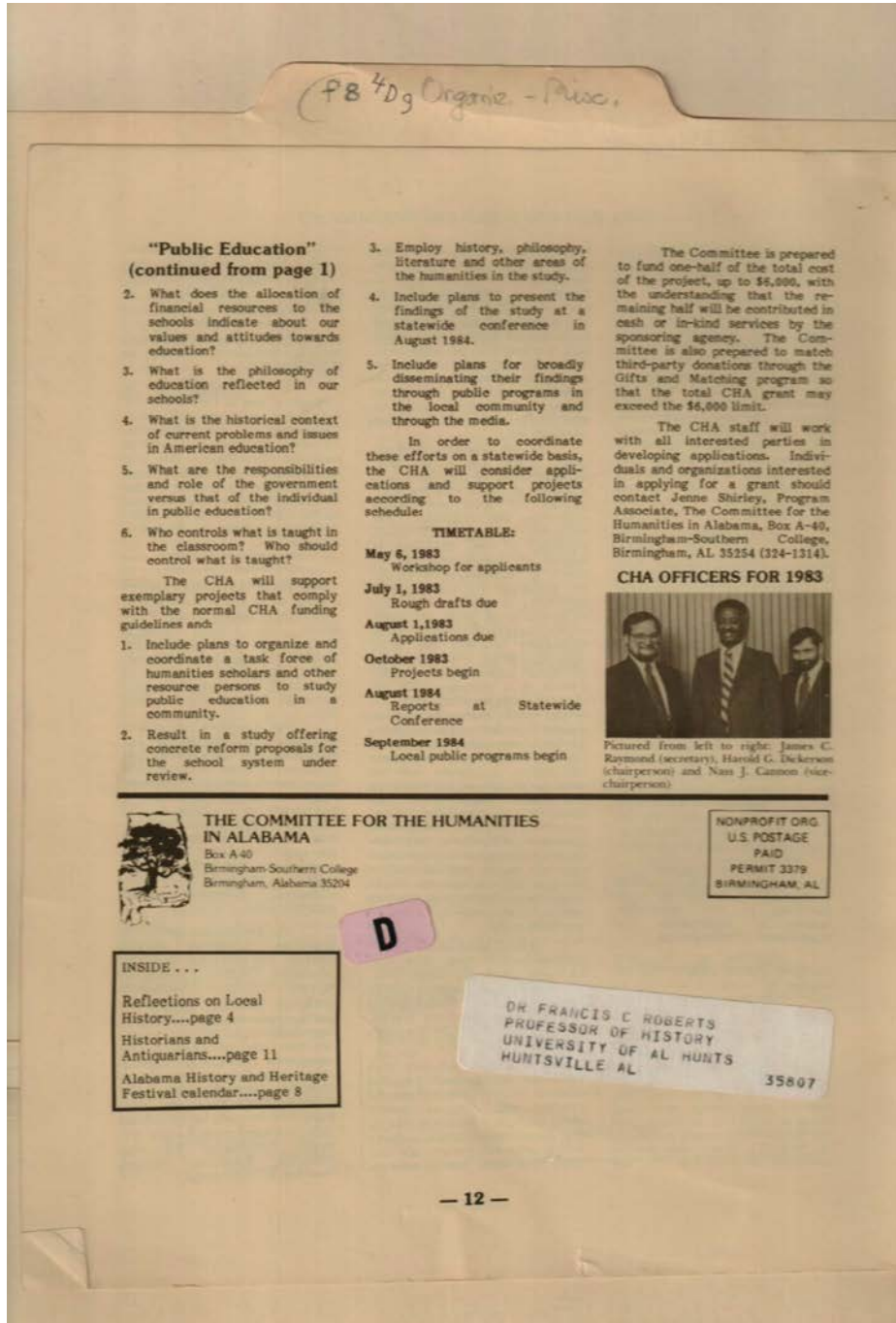

16. Summary of Project:

The program is a slide/tape production designed to interpret the early history of Alabama, focusing on its political, economic, and social development through 1819 when it became a state. Secondly, it traces the vital role of Huntsville in achieving statehood. Approximately eighteen minutes in length, the program serves as an introductory presentation to visitors of Constitution Hall Park, giving them the historic background to the birth of Alabama and preparing them to ask pertinent humanities questions as they view the physical historic evidence of the Park. The Park is a complex of buildings which interprets life in 1819 Huntsville, and includes the site where the Alabama Constitutional Convention met.

of UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT and ECONOMICS. At present the white senior high schools of Dallas County are as follows in alphabetical order: CARLOWVILLE, D. C. H. C. (PLANTERSVILLE), ORRIVILLE, AND ALBERT G. PARRISH. At the end of 9 months of study of the regular school term of the Junior year the respective teachers of UNITED STATES HISTORY (or UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT and ECONOMICS) will submit the names of the top 10% scholastically to their school principal. The principals will promptly forward these names to a representative of the Civil War Centennial Committee in Selma. These students thereby become nominees for six (6) very appropriate Honor Awards to be given to the six (6) winners. The awards will have a value of approximately \$50 each and will honor the following great men -- whose courage, heroism, and self denial won the admiration of the world: ROBERT E. LEE, NATHAN B. FORREST, JAMES L. WHITE, JEFFERSON DAVIS, CATSBY ap R. JONES, and ARTHUR M. SMALL."

"(2) DETERMINATION OF 6 WINNERS: The nominees constituting the top 10% scholastically will be given a written objective type examination in Selma. The questions will come from the book entitled "THE STORY OF SELMA" and written by the late scholarly and efficient Selma School Superintendent, Mr. Walter M. Jackson. The winners for the completed school year 1961-62 will be given the examination on Saturday, March 23, 1963, at the Court House in Selma on the 3rd floor. The authors of the best 6 examination papers will receive the six "WAR BETWEEN THE STATES" Memorial Honor Awards. In case of a tie for the 6 Honor Awards, the ones concerned will be given an additional oral quiz on places of Historical interest in Selma and Dallas County and thereby break the tie. It is suggested that representatives of the COUNTY COMMITTEE present these awards at a regular school assembly as near as possible on April 2nd each year to commemorate the anniversary of "THE BATTLE OF SELMA", which was fought on April 2, 1865."

The Chairman and Co-Chairman of the Dallas County Civil War Centennial Committee have expressed themselves as being well pleased with the results of this plan.

**JEFFERSON COUNTY:** The Civil War Roundtable of Birmingham has continued to hold regular meetings for the discussion of Civil War subjects. On March 16, 1963, the Joe Wheeler Post of the Sons of Confederate Veterans held a dinner meeting in honor of the memory of Major John Pelham. The meeting was addressed by Thomas Morrill, who is well known for his talks on "When Brothers Fought."

The Birmingham News and the Birmingham Post-Herald have continued to support the centennial commemoration of the Civil War by the publication of significant articles on Civil War subjects.

**LOWNDES COUNTY:** A historic marker was dedicated at Lowndesboro April 7, 1963, in commemoration of the skirmish at that place between the Wilson Raiders and some of Forrest's troops. The marker was erected under the auspices of the Alabama Historical Association, and accepted for the town by Mayor Crowell A. Fate, Jr.

**MOBILE COUNTY:** The City Commission has agreed to appoint a Civil War Centennial Committee to prepare plans for the commemoration of the famous Battle of Mobile Bay which was fought August 5, 1864. Caldwell Delaney, who is a member of the Alabama Civil War Centennial Commission, has been named to help to develop plans for the commemoration and to co-ordinate all efforts.

**PERRY COUNTY:** On April 27, 1963, the "Morgan Raiders", the honorary military society of Marion Institute, held their annual "Old South Day" -- sometimes called "Morgan Raiders Day." The high spots of the morning program were the reading of a secession proclamation and the hoisting of the Stars and Bars to the top of the flag pole, accompanied by piercing Rebel yells; and a parade of 550 cadets with the Raiders in authentic Confederate uniforms and a mounted color guard. Immediately after the parade a new archives room in the library, a gift from the Raiders, was dedicated.
