The program, attended by more than 300 persons, got under way with a cannon salute by Mobile representatives of Lumsden's famous battery, music by the Alexandria High School Band, and remarks by Mr. Paul J. Anderson, President of the Pelham Memorial Foundation. Lieut. Governor James B. Allen, the main speaker, delivered an eloquent and informative address on the character and military achievements of Major Pelham, who was undoubtedly one of the most dashing and romantic young soldiers of all times and all places. A historical marker in his honor was unveiled by three young latter generation Pelhams.

The Anniston Star, which has actively supported the centennial commemoration of the Civil War from Its inception, fully covered the Felham memorial exercises. Likewise, it published a report on the meeting of the John H. Forney Historical Society at Jacksonville on March 28. This meeting at Jacksonville, the home of Generals John H. Forney and William H. Forney, and the burial place of Major Pelham, operated in a strong Civil War atmosphere. Several historical markers in honor of Confederate generals have been rected on the public square at Jacksonville by the Alabama Historical Association and others have been planned.

CHAMMERS COUNTY: This county has made an outstanding record in the centennial commemoration of the Civil War, as revealed in this and previous News Letters. Its leaders have worked through the Chattahoochee Valley Historical Society of which they are active members. The Society embraces the towns of West Foint, Georgia, and Lenett, Shawmut, Langdale, Fairfax, Riverview, and Lafayette, Alabama.

On March 28, 1963, Mr. Milliam H. Davidson presented a program to the Chattahoochee Valley Ristorical Society called "Pine Log and Greek Revival" which was dedicated to the Confederate soldiers. Mr. Davidson and Miss Katherine Hyde had over a period of several months made 800 color slides of ante-bellum homes and buildings for this occasion. During the showing of the slides Mr. Davidson commented on historical facts commected with the slides being shown. One of the slides exhibited the beautifacts commected with the slides being shown. There was an essay contest on historical subjects with information on the Confederacy in the high schools of Chambers County. A cash award was given to the first place winner, and copies of the Chattahoochse Valley Historical Society's book, 'War Was the Place', were given to the school libraries in the name of the essay writer from the school. All of the contestants were interviewed on NEWL Radio with the winning essay being read by its author. Copies of all the essays have been deposited in the Pilot Club Library in Lafayette and in the local Society files. The essay project will be continued in 1963-6h and will be named in honor of the late Robert Gibson who originated it.

In commemoration of National Library Week the Lafayette Pilot Club held Open House with many historical exhibite including Basil McCinty's History of Anticch Church. The same author has completed a "History of the East Liberty Association." These books contain Confederate history items, including the names of soldiers and their place of burial. The latter also contains an account of the "split" in the Baytist Church over slavery, and missionary work done by the Association in Confederate camps and hospitals.

On Confederate Memorial Day, April 26, the West Point Pilot Glub repeated its annual ceremony in the Confederate Cemetery in West Point. The cemetery was cleaned up, the graves of both Confederate and Union soldiers were decorated with wreaths of flowers furnished by the Garden Glubs of the Valley, and small flags were placed on the graves. The speaker for the occasion was Mark Fretwell a charter member of the Chattahoochee Valley Historical Society.

The project of locating graves of Confederate soldiers and procuring markers for them is continuing. The commemoration in honor of the "Gallant Pelham" in Anniston, March 17, was tape recorded and broadcast over WFMX.
