

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE TWICKENHAM HISTORIC PRESERVATION DISTRICT

It has been thirty years since the Twickenham Historic Preservation District was organized in July of 1965. For this reason, it is important that those who live in the District review what has been accomplished in preserving and protecting significant historic structures in the city. Continued active support and vigilance on the part of residents of the District are necessary ingredients in resisting the ever-increasing pressures of physical changes in the city in the name of progress.

Back in the 1950s, during early phases of urban renewal (a federal program designed to aid in revitalizing deteriorating inner cores of cities) in Huntsville, plans were made which endangered many historic structures and streets in the original center of town. As part of a movement to prevent the loss of original residential sections of the city, members of the Huntsville Madison County Historical Society and the Antiquarian Society conducted a survey to identify structures worthy of preservation. They drew up a plan to create a historic district which would encompass many of the early architectural treasures and reflect the architectural history of the community.

In 1965 the Twickenham Historic Preservation District Association (THPDA) was organized to promote the creation of the District and to aid the city in acquiring the necessary legislation at the state level to provide a commission empowered to enforce the regulations needed for securing and maintaining its integrity. After considerable opposition from some who disliked the idea of enforced regulation, the state legislature in 1970 passed an act which provided that as soon as sixty percent of the property owners within the proposed boundaries of the District petitioned the city for its creation, then the Twickenham Historic District could become a reality. On May 22, 1972, the City Council passed an ordinance which gave legal status to the District and provided for a commission of nine members charged with its oversight.

Since its creation in 1972, the THPDA has developed and supported a number of projects which help to emphasize the importance of historic preservation in Huntsville. After a fire occurred in the Weeden home in 1972 and its demolition appeared imminent, the THPDA explored the possibility of purchasing the 1819 structure and converting it into a house museum which would be open to the public. On January 4, 1973, a deed was signed and plans were instituted to raise funds from the private sector of the community to restore the house. In 1975 the Huntsville Housing Authority agreed to purchase the Weeden property from the THPDA in order to qualify the project for a federal HUD grant of \$90,000 which would provide a major portion of the cost of restoration. Between 1975 and 1979 the THPDA continued to support the city's efforts, and in 1979, with the help of the Cosmopolitan Club, they raised \$10,000 in order to secure a matching grant from the Alabama Historic Commission.

During the period of restoration of the Weeden House, the Housing Authority used an advisory committee made up of members of the Huntsville Historic Commission.

the THPDA, the Huntsville Garden Club, the Cosmopolitan Club, and the Beautification Board. This committee advised on the proper restoration of the house. Finally, in 1980 the THPDA leased the Weeden House from the city and opened it to the public in September of 1981. Since that time, the THPDA has continued to support and develop the museum in many ways--acquiring furniture for the downstairs rooms, modifying the building, and developing the grounds. Support from the Antiquarian Society made possible the restoration and furnishing of an upstairs bedroom. Contributions ranging from furniture to landscaping have come from the private sector. The Huntsville Garden Club has assumed responsibility for special decorations at Christmas time, and they provided plantings for the garden. Other garden clubs made contributions for special events.

The purpose of the Weeden House Museum is to provide a private, non-profit, educational institution dedicated to the preservation of the Weeden home and grounds, to the interpretation of the lifetstyle of the Weeden family before the Civil War, and to the presentation of the artistic works of Maria Howard Weeden. This purpose is carried out by a Weeden House Museum Committee chosen from the THPDA Board of Directors and a number of dedicated docents who have supported the development of the museum. Approximately forty volunteers from the THPDA as well as from the community at large contribute their time to interpret the museum to visitors who come from across the United States and throughout the world. Since the Weeden House Museum is the only historic structure open to the public in the District, these docents interpret the significance of historic preservation as carried on in the City of Huntsville. They also distribute materials describing other historic points of interest in the city. The only paid employee on the museum staff is a part-time director who is responsible for opening and closing coordinating the work of the volunteers, and managing the fiscal affairs of the museum. Since March of 1995 Mrs. Ivy Barber has served in this capacity.

In the spring each year the District conducts an antique show and sale, and at Christmas time there is the annual tour of homes. At the same time candlelit luminaries line the streets of Twickenham Historic District and Old Town Historic District, bringing thousands of people to downtown Huntsville to enjoy the spirit of times past. Profits from these two events produce the funds that support the budget of the Weeden House Museum. In 1994-95 this contribution amounted to \$15,012.50. Although the Weeden House Museum continues to be a major project of the THPDA, association funds are also used for the planting of trees in the district where and when replacements are needed.

In the past, street fairs on Randolph, Eustis, Franklin, and Adams have helped to pay for underground electrical work and special lighting for some areas of the District. Proceeds from the Eustis Avenue Fair provided funds for the purchase of an original Weeden painting collection from a Nashville family. The District has published two cookbooks detailing historic facts about the District and featuring excellent local, proven recipes, some dating back to the early nineteenth century. Proceeds from the sale of these books go to fund the projects of the THPDA.

B. Election of Members. Persons who meet the qualifications of membership shall become members of the corporation upon payment of annual dues into the treasury. The Treasurer shall certify the list of members to the Secretary immediately prior to each meeting of the membership of the corporation. Honorary Members shall not have the privilege of voting at any meeting of the membership of the corporation.

C. <u>Dues.</u> Dues shall be five dollars per year, and shall be payable upon qualifying for membership in this corporation. Failure to pay dues before the annual meeting each year shall terminate membership and no person whose dues are in arrears shall have the privilege of voting at any meeting of the membership of the corporation.

ARTICLE IV.

Officers.

A. Officers of this corporation shall consist of a president, a vice president, a secretary, and a treasurer, who shall each serve for a term of one year, and until their successors have been elected and installed. Officers can succeed themselves for a maximum of five successive terms.

B. Duties of Officers.

- The president shall be the chief executive officer of this corporation. He shall preside at all meetings, and shall serve as an ex officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee.
- The vice president shall assume all the duties of the president in the absence of the president.
- The secretary shall keep the minutes and the roll of the membership of the corporation and shall perform such other duties as usually pertain to the office.

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

The treasurer shall keep accounts of the assets, liabilities, receipts and expenditures of the corporation, perform all the duties that usually pertain to the office, and present a written report at the annual meeting. The treasurer shall be bonded at the expense of the corporation. C. Vacancies. A vacancy in any office resulting from the death, resignation or disqualification of any officer shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term of such officer by the Board of Directors. D. Qualifications of Officers. Every officer must be a qualified voting member of the corporation. E. Election of Officers. The officers shall be elected by the membership of the corporation at the annual meeting, at which time a single slate of officers shall be presented by the nominating committee. Voting by proxy is not permissible. Installation of the duly elected officers shall take place immediately following their election. ARTICLE V. Meetings. A. A meeting of the membership shall be called annually by the President at a public meeting place on the first Tuesday night in June, or as soon thereafter as possible. At this time written reports of officers and committees shall be presented and incorporated into the minutes, election of officers shall take place, and such other business as is necessary shall be conducted. B. Special meetings may be called by the president with the concurrence of the Board of Directors. C. Written or printed notice of every annual and special meeting shall be given to every member of the corporation either personally or by mail not less

F. Notice of meetings may be given to the members of the Board of Directors verbally, in person or by telephone, or in writing, either personally delivered or mailed to the last address of such member shown upon the records of the corporation and, if mailed, shall be deemed given twenty-four hours after deposited in the United States mails, so addressed and bearing sufficient first-class postage.

ARTICLE VII.

Committees.

A. Standing Committees.

- 1. A legislative committee, composed of such number of members of the corporation as the President shall appoint annually, shall examine all local, state, and federal legislation which might pertain to the interests of or affect the Twickenham Historic Preservation District in any way. It shall notify the Board of Directors of such impending legislation, with recommendations for action by the Board in relation thereto. This committee may from time to time initiate the study of needed legislation, and submit written recommendations to the Board of Directors for action relating thereto. The Chairman of the Legislative Committee shall be an attorney at law and shall, upon request, attend meetings of the Board of Directors and advise them and the officers of the corporation upon legal questions of concern to the corporation.
- 2. A nominating committee, composed of such number of members of the corporation as the President shall appoint annually, shall nominate a single slate of officers and directors to be elected at each annual meeting of the membership of the corporation. Prior consent of each person nominated shall be secured by the Nominating Committee.

- B. Other Committees. The President, with the approval of the Board of Directors, may appoint from time to time such other committees as may be deemed by them to be necessary.

The parliamentary authority for the conduct of all meetings of the membership and of the Board of Directors of this corporation shall be Robert's Rules of Order Revised."

Amendments to the By-Laws.


