FOUNDATION FELLOW AVAILABLE FOR TALKS TO CLUBS:

Paul W. Glover, P. O. Box # 3661, University, Alabama, who is a Rotary Foundation Fellow from Coalville, England, is available to the Clubs for an address to those who wish to hear him. I talked to Mr. Glover on October 16, concerning his availability and am pleased to advise you of the following: 1. Mr. Glover has generously agreed to set aside one day each week for visits to Clubs. 2. He will be available on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays until February when he will be available only on Tuesdays and Thursdays. 3. If you are interested in having him visit your Club, write him direct and attempt to get a mutually satisfactory date. If you are able to get together with him on a date, please take cognizance of the following: 1. Mr. Glover's Fellowship contains no allowance for visits to Clubs, and all expenses incidental to his visit should be paid by your Club. 2. Mr. Glover is not familiar with transportation in our District, and besides paying for his ticket, you should also talk him the best way to get to your City. 3. Remember, his visit is for his benefit as well as yours, and he is interested in seeing your City, its industries, and other points of interest. You should be a good host to him and make him happy that he chose Alabama for his studies. It is to be hoped that as many of you as possible will avail yourselves of this opportunity.

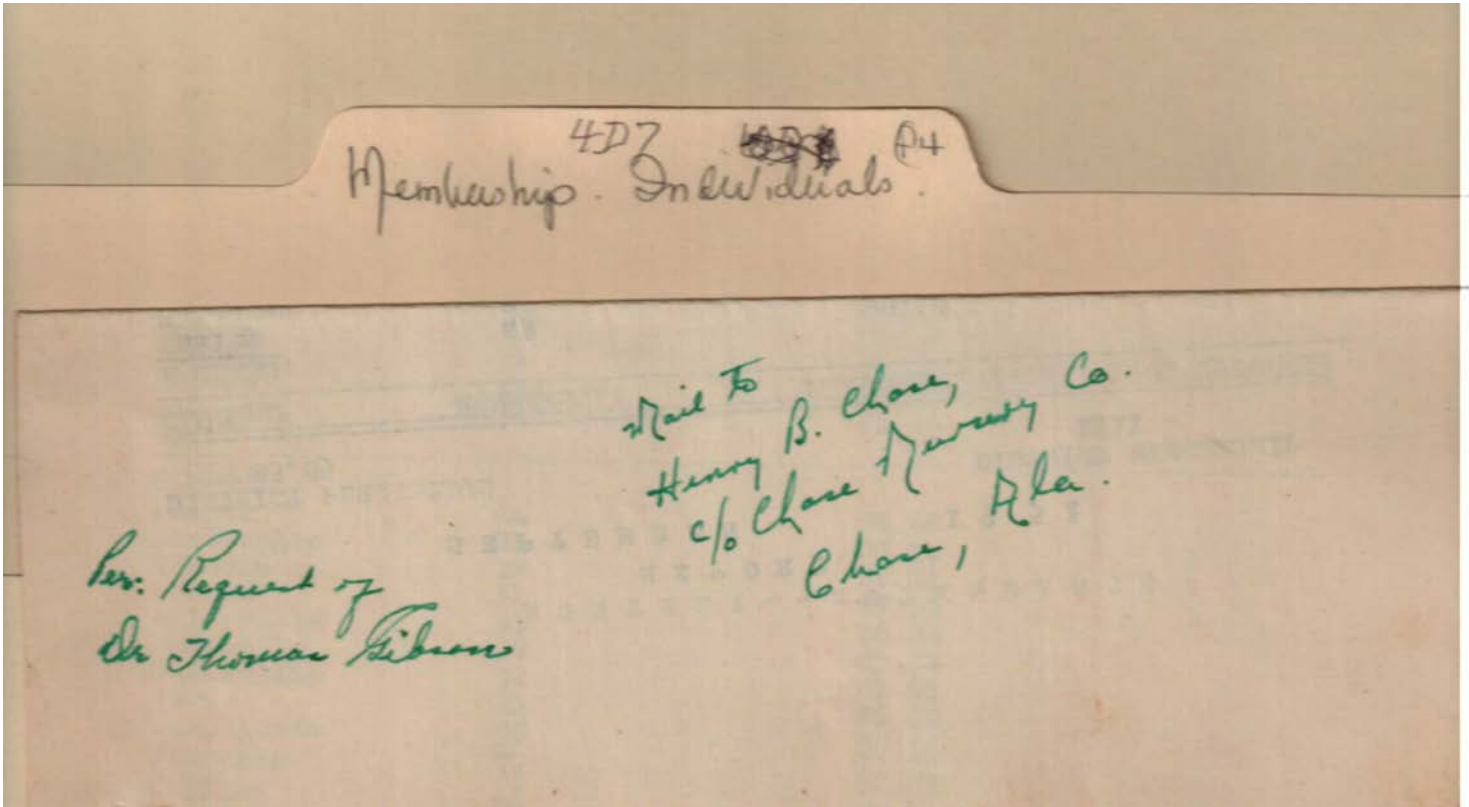

## RELIGION

### Worldly Rotary

Into the international organization of 7,000 businessmen's groups called Rotary, the Vatican last week dropped a stick of ecclesiastical high explosive. No Roman Catholic priest, decreed the Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office, may henceforth be a member of Rotary or attend Rotary meetings. Furthermore, laymen, while not forbidden Rotary membership, were exhorted to bear in mind Article 684 of canon law. Excerpt: "The faithful . . . must guard against associations which are secret, condemned, seditious, suspect, or which try to escape legitimate church vigilance."


The 347,000 Rotarians in 83 lands, who hold luncheon meetings once a week, call each other by their first names and fraternize under the motto *Service Above Self*, are not used to thinking of themselves as secret, seditious or suspect. Founded 45 years ago, Rotary was the brain child of a young Chicago lawyer, Paul P. Harris, who thought of it as a social club of businessmen with "an especial advantage in each member having exclusive representation of his particular trade or profession. The members would be mutually helpful."

**Condemnable Monopoly.** Rotary could take in its stride the lampooning it got in *Rabbit* from the late novelist Sinclair Lewis (see p. 36), but the Vatican's blow was something else. Puzzled Rotarians in the U.S.—Catholic as well as Protestant—reacted with a stunned and unanimous "Why?" Some remembered a campaign against Rotary waged in 1928-29 by Rome's potent Jesuit magazine, *Civiltà Cattolica*. In many countries, the magazine charged, Rotary was altogether too friendly with the Masons, and was dangerously prone to the error of treating all religions as of equal value.

In answer to newsmen's questions, the Vatican last week indicated that the ban did not apply specifically to such other groups as Kiwanis, Lions, and Elks. Priestly membership in such clubs was merely discouraged because they are "worldly" and a possible source of "distraction from the priestly mission."

As for laymen, a Holy Office spokesman noted: "Though in many cases, especially in America, [the clubs] are carrying on the laudable activity of assistance, nevertheless sometimes there is undue devotion to monopolistic capitalism, and monopoly is condemnable, on both Christian and social grounds, as an offence against charity. The fact that non-members of Rotary Clubs are sometimes excluded from the benefits which Providence meant for all men . . . amounts to a condemnable monopoly."


**When the Pope Speaks.** Most U.S. Rotarians felt that there must be some mistake. Said the president of Rotary Inter-

national, Arthur Lagueux, a Quebec investment broker and a Roman Catholic: "Rotary is not a secret organization. It does not seek to supplant or interfere with any religious or political organization. It assumes that its program of service is in accord with all religions, and it does not concern itself with a Rotarian's politics."

Indiana's Bishop John F. Noll, a charter member of the Huntington (Ind.) Rotary Club (whose current president is a priest), said he was certain the Vatican had been misinformed about Rotary in the U.S., and that it would withdraw its ban on ecclesiastical memberships once the

matter had been explained. Father John Fullerton, director of Toronto's Catholic Charities, said he would not drop his membership in Rotary until officially informed of the decree. Father Thomas F. Nenon of Memphis said: "I can't understand it at all. I can't see anything in Rotary contrary to the laws of the church."

Meanwhile, at least one member of the North American hierarchy began to put the new order into effect. Montreal's Archbishop Paul-Emile Léger, said to be slated to be Canada's next cardinal, forbade priests in his archdiocese to participate in any Rotary or "neutral" club, explained: "It is not up to me to interpret the Pope's announcements. When the Pope speaks, Catholics have nothing else to do but accept his directives."

### Trouble in Alton

Ernest John G. Gill looked like just the man to take care of the Unitarian Church in the quiet, well-kept town of Alton, Ill. (pop. 32,000), on the bluffs of the Mississippi River. At Harvard, John Gill had written his Ph.D. thesis on Elijah Parish Lovejoy, the fiery Abolitionist minister and editor who was beaten to death by an Alton mob in 1837.

For six years John Gill and Alton got along, but beneath the tranquil surface, trouble threatened. Like many another small town in southern Illinois, Alton ignores a state law, on the books since the 1880s, and segregates its Negro children in public schools below high-school level.

All went well until last year, when Unitarian Gill began to see local conditions in terms of black & white. The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People was fighting segregation in Alton's schools, and Gill was openly in the anti-segregation fight. One day 175 Negro boys & girls tried to register at five grade schools and two junior high schools. Gill organized his fellow ministers to supervise the demonstration and prevent trouble. When crosses in the Ku Klux Klan tradition were burned on the riverfront to intimidate the Negroes, Gill's pulpit denunciation, and a newspaper statement which 17 other ministers signed, were the only voices in Alton raised publicly in opposition.

Last September the board of his church (one of the few Unitarian congregations which re-elects its ministers each year) voted 40 to 25 not to rehire "trouble-making" Minister Gill. The decision had nothing to do with Gill's outspoken stand on the racial issue, the board explained. But last week, after a stiff letter from the Rev. Robert Raible, president of the Unitarian Ministers' Association, the Alton church board found it advisable to pledge that 1) its ministers would never be required to consult with the church board before taking a stand on anything; 2) the practice of annual re-election (or rejection) of ministers would be discontinued; 3) racial equality was something the board "believed in."

Last week Minister Gill was looking for another parish, and Negro children were still segregated in Alton's elementary schools.

ROTARY REMINDER  
Huntsville, Alabama, June 24th 1941  
Observations Enroute and in Denver.

Got the cash on expense check and off to an early start. Ft. Smith, Ark. the first night. Stopped at Van Duren to see Bob Burns but he wasn't at home. Sign seen in Cafe at Brinkley read: "Its the Fresh Egg That Gets Slapped in the Pan." From central Arkansas west everything is flooded. Oklahoma and Texas suffering great damage to grain. Only two days so far dry enough to harvest. More oil wells in Oklahoma City than job hunters in Alabama after election. Paid 20¢ for gas within 100 feet of producing well. I now know what is meant by "The Great Open Spaces" after crossing Oklahoma - Texas and New Mexico. Outside the towns - its the place where "Men are Men and all Plumbing is Outside". There are still some bulls left in Texas. One stretch of 22 miles between homes in New Mexico. Clayton, New Mexico had signs requesting all Rotarians stop at office when passing thru to or from Denver. A most cordial welcome received there and at Raton, New Mexico. Rained on us every hour for over 100 miles. Spent day and night at Colorado Springs. Temperature Friday morning was 38 degrees. Needed my overcoat and long handles. Went up Pikes Peak but road was blocked with snow last 2000 feet. Snowed 22 inches on the peak Wednesday night. Highway department left snow-plow on Mountain that night and found it buried in 30 foot drift next morning. Had to take up another plow to dig the first one out.

Arrived in Denver Saturday afternoon. Total mileage 1208. Convention officials expected 8,000 but have about 12,000. Rotarians everywhere as thick as termites. Many cannot get rooms and are stopping in nearby cities - some as far away as Boulders and Colorado Springs. Delegates from every state and 30 foreign countries on hand. The city is decorated with Rotary emblems and banners like a Fort of July celebration. Denver is doing a good job in handling the crowds. Thirty special Rotary trains have arrived. Ten gallon hats everywhere. Everybody happy and friendly. Not a grouch in a carload.

If you are not going over a mile - its best to walk. You can get there quicker - and not have your car on hand and no place to park. It took the police three days to catch up with me. Found a courtesy tag on my car this morning for parking over night. The hotel manager said I would probably find one each morning but just bring them all to him - I trust him. If my faith is misplaced, I may be here sometime.

A Militant note was sounded in Rotary International today for the first time in Rotary history. Will R. Manier, Jr. of Nashville, Paul Harris - founder of Rotary, and Tom Warren of London warned of the changes confronting us - domestic and foreign, and urged us to do something about it. President Pereira pleaded with Rotary for a closer relationship and better understanding with Latin America.

Saw "Chubby" Turner of Atlanta today.

Frank Samford has called an Alabama breakfast for tomorrow. The finest group of people I have ever seen together. Every Rotarian should attend one International Convention. I am proud to be a Rotarian.

## Governor Here Tuesday

### ROTARY CLUB TO SPONSOR PEE-WEE FOOTBALL TEAM

Chairman Bill Bigger of the Youth Service Committee has announced that Rotary will field a team in the forthcoming Pee Wee Football league. This league is sponsored by the YMCA and six local service clubs.

The league is designed to give football experience to boys under 15 years of age and there will be six teams in the league.

The Rotary team will come from West Huntsville and will include about 25 or 30 boys who attend West Huntsville school. Each player must be in school, must have his parent's permission, must be under 120 pounds in weight, and must not be 15 years old by November 1st. He must also be physically fit and must have a doctor's examination before he can play.

This is the third year of the Pee Wee football sponsored by the Y. M. C. A. and for the past two years by the Salesmen's Club. There will be six clubs in the league this year. Salesmen's, Kiwanis, Exchange, Optimist, Y's Men and the Rotary and each club will furnish head gear, shoulder pads and jerseys for their boys. A total of \$150 has been approved by the Rotary for this team's expense.

### Governor Jim (and I don't mean Big Jim) Upchurch, Governor of Rotary for the State of Alabama, will pay his official visit to the Club on Tuesday and President Fritz and Chairman Ratio urge that we have a hundred per cent meeting.

Jim is a former president of the Montgomery club and has been active in Alabama Rotary for a long time. He is president of the Upchurch-Wright Oil Company of Montgomery and is the highest elected official of Rotary in our state.

We are all looking forward to his visit here and this would be a good time to invite some guest in for a swell fellowship and fine program. Be there on hand come Tuesday.

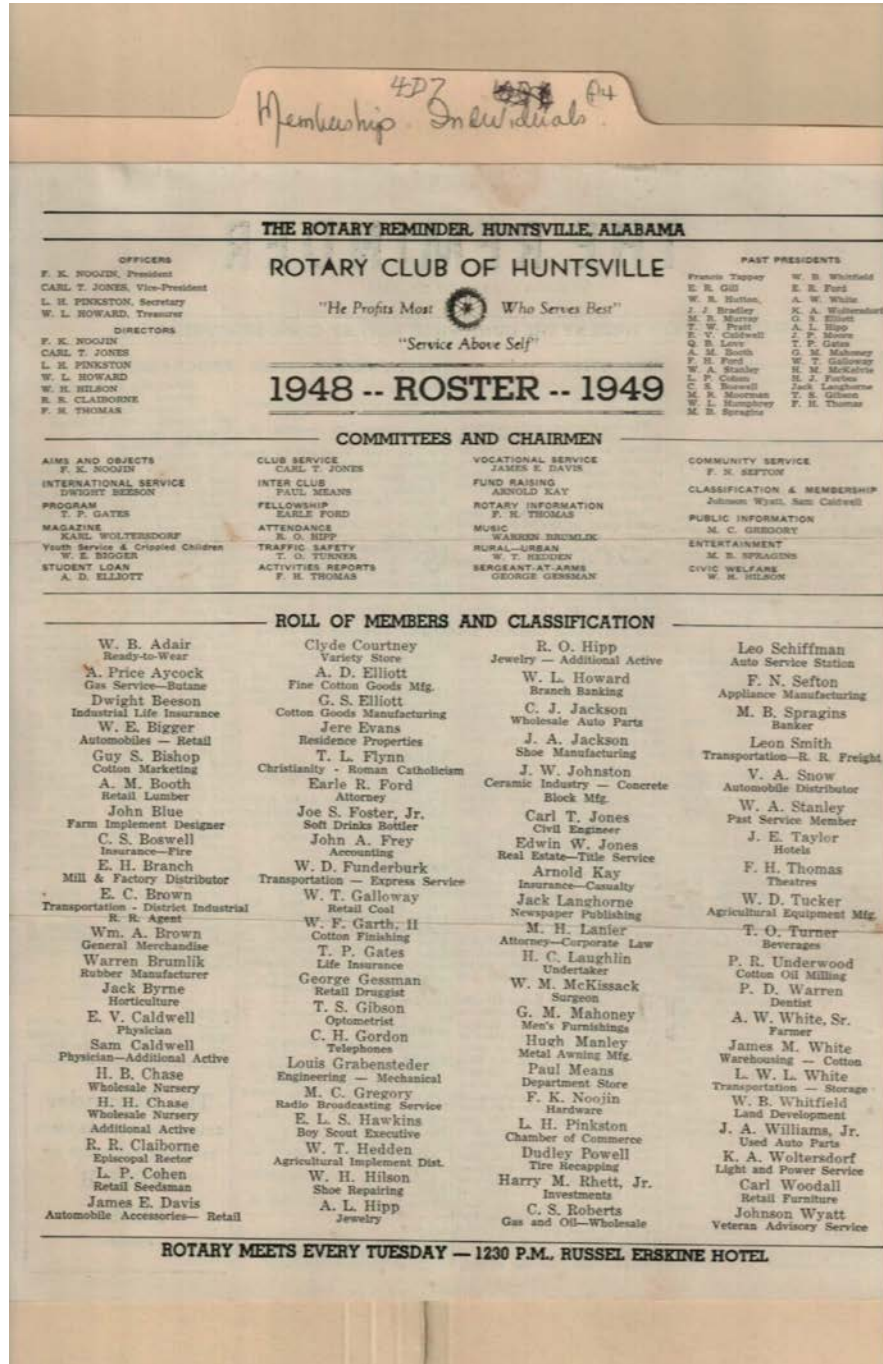

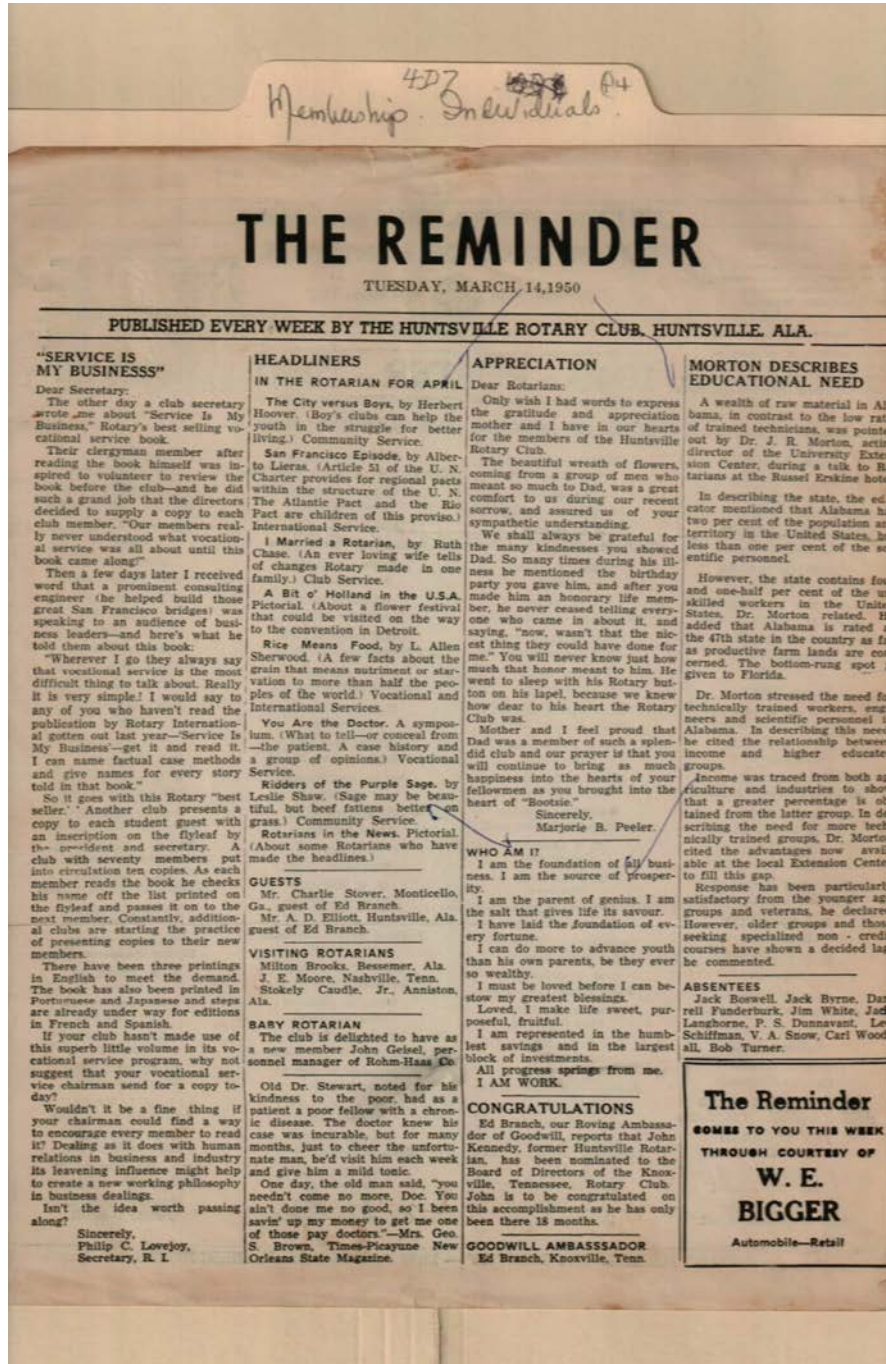

<p>The club is deeply indebted to our fellow Rotarian, E. V. Caldwell who worked so diligently in gathering together facts of importance and interest in the life of our Huntsville Rotary club.</p> <p>Doc did a grand job and entertained the club quite at length while relating the progress of the club since its organization in 1916. Such a good job was done in this presentation during the limited time provided that a great deal of interest was aroused and a desire for a written history was expressed by many. Doc has agreed to write this and Ernest White says he will print it for the club. Since it will be some time before the booklet can be completed I will relate some of the facts from Doc's talk.</p> <p>Rotary came to the South in 1913.</p> <p>Birmingham was the 50th club to be organized.</p> <p>Huntsville club organized in 1916, chartered November 1917.</p> <p>Francis Tappey was first club president.</p> <p>Huntsville was the sixth club in Alabama and third in small towns under 50,000.</p> <p>Four consecutive meetings missed or 60% of a year's meetings missed automatically put a member out of the club. (This regulation still exists today.)</p> <p>Huntsville has had four 100% meetings according to the records. (Three in 1917-18 and one in 1941.)</p> <p>Seven of the 17 charter members are living today. Doc and Hank Chase are still in the club. Bob Murphy, W. L. Halsey, Sr., and LeRoy Lytle are in Huntsville and the others out of town.</p> <p>Bootsie Booth honorary member for life, now deceased, was among the old timers and remained active until less than two years ago.</p> <p>Stan Stanley is also an honorary member for life, and is still living in our city.</p> <p><b>CIVIC AND SERVICE ACCOMPLISHMENTS</b></p> <p>Assisted in organizing the Chamber of Commerce.</p> <p>Assisted in organizing the Tennessee Valley Boy Scout movement.</p> <p>Assisted in organizing the County Fair.</p> <p>Raised \$900 of the \$1500 for the first Community Band.</p> <p>Helped open up local Red Cross office in World War I.</p> <p>Continuous support of the Y. M. C. A.</p> <p>Supported War Bond sales in</p>	<p>The club was distressed to hear that Lillie Spragins, a son of Rotarian M. B. Whitfield.</p> <p>World Wars I and II.</p> <p>Encouraged road improvement and discouraged state income tax.</p> <p>Helped raise \$19,000 Hospital Fund on building program.</p> <p>Helped organize local Girl Scout movement.</p> <p>Helped organize local Community Chest.</p> <p>Helped organize County Health Department 27 years ago.</p> <p>Sponsored the Yorkshire Pig chain now in operation.</p> <p>Sponsored the Hearing Testing clinic now in operation all over the county.</p> <p>Doc also mentioned that we helped organize clubs at Athens, Sheffield, Ardmore and Fayetteville.</p> <p>Numerous international officers have been our guests and for 1951-52 we have Kenneth Noojin of our own club as District Governor of District 238.</p> <p>We have had four district conferences in Huntsville since the date of organization.</p> <p>I have mentioned all of these things concerning the club along with the appreciation expressed to Doc as he seems to have been one of the prime movers in a great many of these club services. He has in turn served on the boards and committees for these organizations and many more. His services have been many and varied in the club. He was the fourth president of Rotary in Huntsville.</p> <p>Doc attended country schools, Alabama Polytechnic Institute and the University of Alabama. He is a member of Kappa Sigma.</p> <p>Our hats are off to this Rotarian and we will be looking forward to a complete history of the club when time permits.</p>	<p>The annual Spring Dinner Dance for our club will be held Thursday, June 7 from 7:30 to 11:30 in the garage of the Russel Erskine Hotel. The entertainment committee announced that up to 330 or 600 reservations will be available which allows each Rotarian to bring up to 5 guests in addition to himself. Dress was decided to be optional for both Rotarians, their ladies and the guests.
