CITY OF MADISON

Established in 1856 as a shipping station on the Memphis and Charleston R.R., the town was platted on land owned by James Clemens and incorporated by vote of its citizens in 1869.

First officials included William R. Johnston, mayor, and five aldermen, William B. Dunn, first depot agent; Thomas J. Clay, first postmaster; George W. Martin, first merchant; James H. Bibb, planter and Dr. George R. Sullivan.

The community remained small until the growth of industries associated with Redstone Arsenal and the Jetport in the 1950's and 1960's transformed Madison into a thriving city.

HOTEL MONTE SANO

January 17, 1886, the North Alabama Improvement Company was organized to promote the sale of real estate and induce business. Two wealthy New Yorkers, James F. O'Shaughnessy and Major Michael J. O'Shaughnessy, provided needed capital.

Officers of the company were:

Michael J. O'Shaughnessy, President
Samuel H. Buck, Vice President and General Manager
John L. Rison, Secretary
James F. O'Shaughnessy, Milton Humes, William P. Newman and George M. Harris

Through the efforts of the O'Shaughnessy brothers the NAIC established the Hotel Monte Sano. The hotel was a three-story wooden structure of Queen Anne architecture. John Rea, architect and L. S. Melbourn, contractor chose a spot half way between Ella's Rock and the C.C. Clay home looking directly down upon Huntsville.

One entered the main lobby through double doors of colored glass. The lobby featured a series of pigeonholes for mail and a call board for 233 rooms. On the left was the ladies' reception room and the next the 40 foot x 60 foot ballroom. On the right was the stairway and immense dining room. Plush furniture was everywhere. The ground floor had a continuous, wrap-around porch with decorative woodwork. The South wing divided into baths, barber shop, saloon, and pool room. Two bowling alleys were in a separate building. The upstairs had long hallways. There were gas lights and steam heat in each room. There were no back or inside rooms.

A double-decked bell-roofed observatory extended above the third story.

Memphis Row, a separate building on the edge of the bluff to the north of the hotel, was intended as a dance hall and pool room but during the crowded times was used for adult guests. "Memphis Row" was named for the numerous guests from Memphis who came to Monte Sano to escape yellow fever and malaria prevalent along the Mississippi River.

A walkway led from the front steps to a board walk along the edge of the cliff.

A pump was installed at the Big Spring so that water could be forced up the side of the mountain to a reservoir dug out of the side of the plateau in front of the hotel. At the side of the basin was located another pump, which drove the water up into an 8,000 gallon tank. By using a steam pump water for drinking purposes was obtained from Cold Spring and distributed to all parts of the hotel.

A laundry and servant's quarters were placed at a convenient distance from the hotel.

On May 25 the announcement came from the manager S. E. Bates that the hotel was ready for its opening on June 1, 1887. A grand ball was to follow the next night.

On July 1, a concert was given followed by a second ball. Four hundred guests came to the ball. Among the visitors to the hotel were friends of the O'Shaughnessy brothers, the industrial giants Vanderbilts, Astors, and Jay Gould. Other notable visitors were Helen Keller and Mrs. Virginia Clay-Clopton.

The hotel closed in 1900. Nine years later Miss Lena Garth purchased the abandoned hotel, fully equipped, along with twenty-seven acres of land, for \$20,000. The Garth family occupied the hotel as their private residence for several years. The building was sold in 1944 by the executors of the Garth estate for salvage purposes for \$9,000.

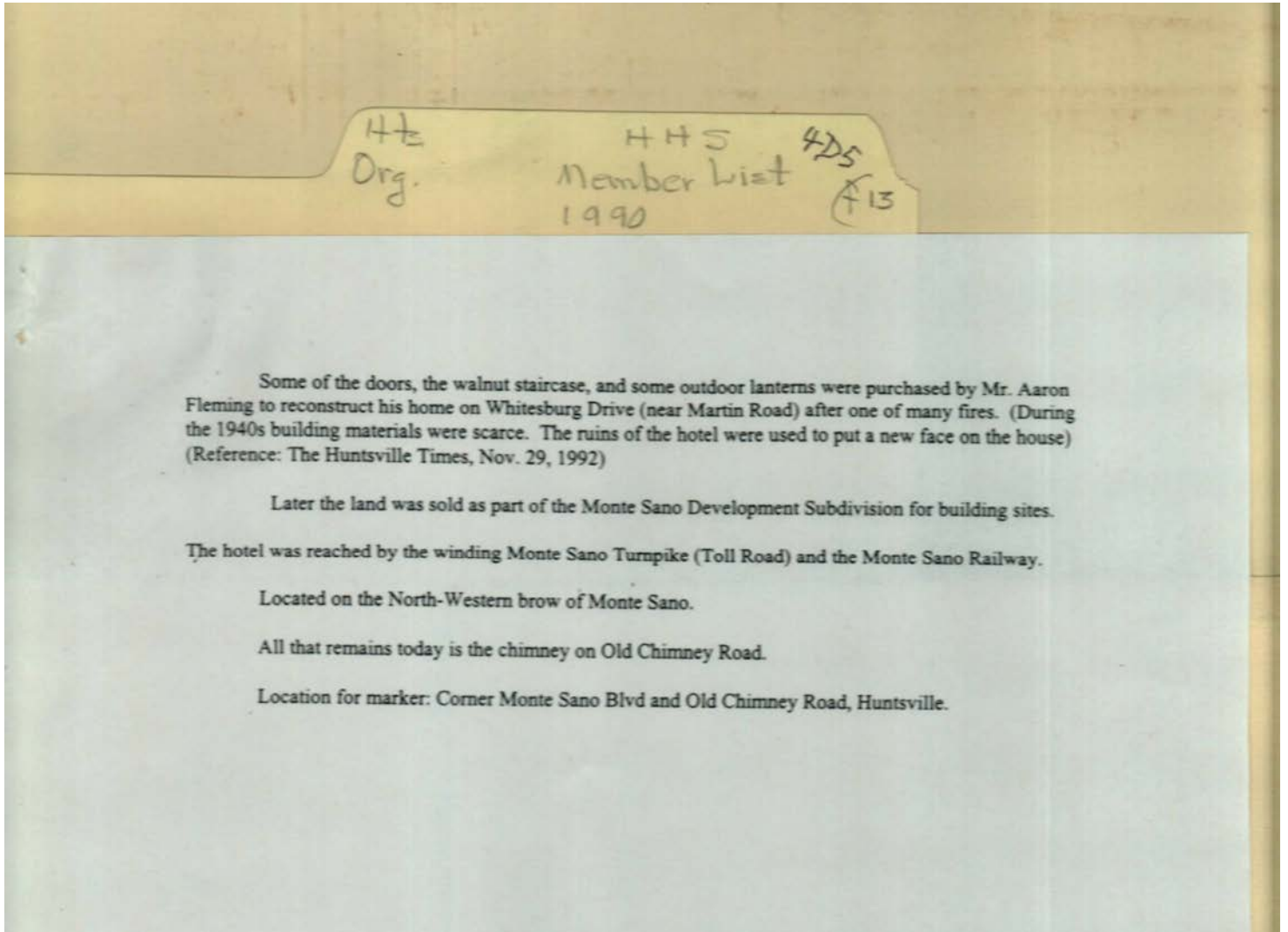

Fleming farm true reflection of Huntsville's historical past

In its heyday, the 4,000-acre Fleming farm bustled with the activity of 130 workers who helped make a crop of cotton, wheat, corn and hay and raised hogs, cattle and sheep.

The self-sufficient farm stretched north to Airport Road, east almost to Bailey Cove Road, south to Lily Flagg Station and west onto land now part of Redstone Arsenal, producing a harvest from 1914 to the mid-1960s.

"Mr. Aaron" Fleming, as he was called, owned the farm in those years, and he housed all the workers on his property. His efforts drew national attention in 1937 when he was named by *Progressive Farmer* as one of the best farmers in the country for his introduction of hybrid seed, crop rotation, new fertilizers and power terracing using heavy equipment to help stop soil erosion.

Valley View Farm, as it is called, was a test demonstration project for state and county agencies.

Each winter, more than 500 hogs were killed, with enough for each working family to have two or three. Each summer, "Mr. Aaron" and his family hosted a big barbecue. "Everyone in town came," says Sally Fleming Walker, who now lives in the home with her husband, Ben.

A quieter place now, the house on Whitesburg Drive near Martin Road has four acres surrounding it which the Walkers own. Whitesburg Baptist Church holds the surrounding acres which are currently a sod farm.

Today, guests attend smaller parties, parties like the Historic Huntsville Foundation tea from 2 to 4 p.m. on Dec. 13. This occasion is the annual membership tea. The group has 1,100 members, says Gerald Patterson, who is co-chairman of the event with Sybil Wilkinson.

Guests will see the first floor of the house during the tea, including the doors and walnut staircase from

the old Monte Sano Hotel and lanterns from the same hotel.

the old Monte Sano Hotel and lanterns from the same hotel. The hotel, in its short 14-year life during the Gay Nineties and the first few years of this century, numbered among its guests the Vanderbilts, the Astors and Helen Keller.

A number of fires are part of the history of the house. Aaron Fleming's reconstruction of the house after one such blaze was made in wartime from 1942 to 1944, so building materials were scarce. The ruins of the hotel were used to put a new face on the house.

As they enter the home, guests will stride across bricks that flanked the old courthouse when the trolley was running early this century.

Mrs. Walker says her husband has made most of the changes to the farmhouse since they moved in the dwelling in 1966. In the kitchen, for example, he laid the brick, built the cabinets and re-decorated the walls. A kitchen beam and the den mantel are made of wood from the original barn. The tile over the fireplace is just a few years old.

The sunroom on the back of the house is on the site of the original smokehouse, says Mrs. Walker. Pointing proudly to a white wicker baby buggy, she says that she "pushes my grandbaby Mary Jane in it."

Most of the furniture in the house comes from her family, she says, including a massive bed which once held a trundle bed underneath. A large map chest in the den was passed on through his family.

The Walkers are fond of talking about the history of the place and the influence of "Mr. Aaron" and

A CIVIL WAR MEMORY

"I'll never fight against the South", he said with some heat. "Never, even if I have to play the coward," he added, with a few of his customary cuss words to impress his hearers with the truth of what he was saying.

The faces of his companions showed no enthusiasm. Instead, they feared he might be apprehended any day and probably be handled rough.

They had known him from the first day he arrived, just one year ago, and so far had found no fault with him. He himself claimed to be just a plain Tennessee Hill Billy and a loyal lover of the South and all its traditions.

A broad macadamized highway extended from the outskirts of St. Louis, Mo. for about twelve miles, ending abruptly at the quaint little village of Music's Ferry, which was perched just above the bank of the Missouri River. The highway resembled a long white ribbon under the sun's ray. Here is where Brown, his pretty seventeen year old wife and infant daughter lived.

Near the end of the highway stood a two story rock house appearing very much like an old fortress. Here was where Convey and family lived. Nearby stood a long frame building which housed a grocery store, saloon and dance hall. Dances were held here once a month. Men with their families came from distant farms for an evening's enjoyment and put in a stock of groceries. A jug of liquor was generally included to have on hand in case of emergency.

A few hundred feet beyond stood Brown's house. It was a two story
