BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Huntsville, Alabama, that Resolution No. 93-805 is hereby amended to read as follows:

WHEREAS, the Huntsville City Council desires to place historic markers at various sites within the City of Huntsville to reflect the historic significance of these areas in the community; and,

WHEREAS, during the last 20 years of the nineteenth-century Dallas Manufacturing Company and Merrimack Manufacturing Company transformed Huntsville into the leading cotton manufacturing center of the State; and,

WHEREAS, the Old Town Historic District is listed in the National Register of Historic Places and contains nineteenth-and early twentieth-century homes; and,

WHEREAS, Optimist Park was the neutral site of the Negro Baseball League in the 1940s and 1950s which was an important stop on the road that led to the Hall of Fame in Cooperstown for many of the Negro team legends, and is the only park remaining that served the Negro League; and,

WHEREAS, William Hooper Councill School was built in 1892 as the first public school for African American students in the City of Huntsville; and,

WHEREAS, the Weeden House is the birthplace of nineteenthcentury poet and artist Maria Howard Weeden, and built in 1819, this restored house-museum reflects Federal-period styling in architecture.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Huntsville City Council requests the Huntsville-Madison County Historical Society to coordinate with the City of Huntsville Department of Urban Development designee and other organizations in placing historic markers at Dallas Manufacturing Company, Merrimack Manufacturing Company, Old Town Historic District, Optimist Park, William Hooper Councill School, and the Weeden House if such locations are eligible according to standards established by the United States Department of Interior.

ARTICLE VI -- NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1. Officers shall be elected at the Annual Meeting in June of odd-numbered years for a term of two years or until their successors are elected. They shall assume their duties on July 1 following the election. Election shall be by ballot if there is more than one candidate for an office. A majority of the votes cast shall elect.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall be elected at the Annual June meeting to serve two years (see Article VI, Section 5), two board members being elected each year thereby providing continuity with officer-board relationships.

Section 3. A nominating committee consisting of at least three members appointed by the president shall meet prior to the June meeting for the purpose of preparing a proposed slate of new officers and board members.

Section 4. The nominating committee shall present its proposed slate of new officers and board members to the membership at the annual June meeting.

Section 5. Annually, two board members will be elected, biennially, officers and two board members will be elected.

Section 6. Any member may submit additional nominees for any office by nominations from the floor during the June meeting at which the nominating committee presents its proposed slate of officers. Any such nominations will be contingent upon the consent of the nominee.

Section 7. Vacancies occurring office, except the office of president, shall be filled by the board of directors. Vacancy of the presidency shall be filled by the first vice president.

ARTICLE VII -- DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. President. The president shall preside at all meetings of the society and of the board of directors, shall call special meetings of the society and of the board of directors when necessary, and shall be the ex-officio member of all committees except the nominating committee. The president shall appoint, after consultation with appropriate chairmen, members of standing committees, shall appoint members of special committees, and shall perform all other duties specified in the parliamentary authority.

Section 2. Parliamentarian. At the discretion of the president, he shall appoint a parliamentarian to serve in an advisory capacity during the president's term of office at all meetings of the society and at meetings of the board of directors when requested. The parliamentarian shall render an opinion, based on Robert's Rules of Order, when requested to do so by an officer or member.

REOPENING AND REORGANIZING:

FEDERAL LAND OFFICES IN RECONSTRUCTION ALABAMA

On June 21, 1866, the Southern Homestead Act became law. That significant piece of Reconstruction legislation furnished the means of providing small farms to the recently emancipated slaves. It opened forty-six million acres of the federal lands in Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Louisiana, and Mississippi to homesteading. But before it could be implemented, the federal land offices in the Southern states, which had been closed with the coming of the Civil War, had to be reopened. The reopening process, which would otherwise remain a mere footnote in history, acquires special significance in the Reconstruction setting because land was seen at the time as the sine qua non of freedom in a democratic republic. And, after all other attempts failed, the Southern Homestead Act remained the only means by which the government effectively assisted freedmen to acquire land.

Reopening the land offices and setting them up to conduct business proved no easy matter. Problems abounded. Each land office required two officials—a Register, who took applications, and a Receiver, who collected fees—and both had to be in service for the office to operate. Both, moreover, had to be appointed by the president, a slow and often cumbersome process. And once appointed, officers tended not to remain in the job long.

And shifts in population since 1860 forced the General

Land Office (GLO) in Washington to redraw land district boundaries, create some new offices, and consolidate some old ones, all time-consuming delays.

Local offices, once they reopened, also often faced difficult if not impossible problems. Records—tractbooks, where applications were recorded, township plats, and copies of receipts—often had not survived the war, or if they had, were out of date. Organization and training of office staffs, duplication of missing records, and correction of existing ones, along with a flood of new applications, all taxed local land officers, many of whom did not prove equal to the demands.

Alabama provided an excellent example of the difficulties involved in reopening Southern land offices. It was the first state in which Andrew Johnson took any actions relative to land offices. A few months before the Southern Homestead Act passed, he consolidated six old districts into three, at St. Stephens (an office later moved to Mobile), at Montgomery, and at Huntsville. But he failed to appoint any land officers at that point, and Alabama's offices all remained closed for the rest of the year. 1

Indeed, the Mobile office remained closed, or at least only illegally open, throughout Johnson's term. The president had difficulty finding officials to fill the posts, and his appointees turned out to be embarrassments. The Senate confirmed Johnson's appointment of Salmon Dutton, a Vermonter, as Register at Mobile on July 13, 1866. But without a Receiver, the office could not open. People in the area wanted to file

applications, and as Alabama's U.S. Senators-elect told the Secretary of the Interior at the end of January, 1867, "It is an injury to them and to the government to have the office continued closed." Finally, the president nominated one Angus Vaughan as Receiver, but no one could find him to tell him of his appointment. Register Dutton reported that he was still looking for him as late as the spring of 1868.²

Dutton, in the meantime, was conducting a profitable, and altogether illegal, business at the land office. In the summer of 1868, James Tharp, a clerk in the Mobile land office, reported that Dutton ran the "closed" bureau as a "private office," charging from twelve to fifty dollars per filing fee and approving obviously fraudulent homestead claims for even higher prices. For example, the Register, in return for one thousand dollars, allowed a lumber man to enter ninety-three claims on timber lands. The Southern Homestead Act restricted claims solely to homesteading, thus disallowing applications from businessmen, speculators, and corporations.

Dutton also charged black homesteaders higher fees than white ones. And he sometimes allowed whites to pay cash for claims, which was strictly illegal, while discouraging applications from blacks. When James Gillette, who was with the Freedmen's Bureau in Mobile, challenged Dutton for such discrimination, the Register retorted that it "is optional with me if a man [sic] can enter at all... If he does so it is because I allow him not that I am in duty bound." 3

By June 1868 the president gave up hope of finding the missing Receiver Angus Vaughan and appointed William L. Howard in

his place. But Dutton had already resigned as Register, and the office still could not officially open. Not until Ulysses S. Grant made appointments in April 1869, was the Mobile office properly opened for business. And it processed its first applications only in 1870, four years after the Southern Homestead Act went into effect.⁴

The Montgomery office fared somewhat better than that at Mobile, although condition of records and problems of appointments also caused troubles there. Abraham Edwards was appointed Register in July, 1865. The Montgomery office absorbed the old Demopolis, Greenville, and Tuscaloosa offices, and Edwards spent most of his early months locating and transferring records, some of which he found in "the debris of the State Deptmt that was hidden away in a garret in Eufaula." 5

Even after he got the records together Edwards could not open the Montgomery office because it had no Receiver. At the end of December 1866, Johnson appointed Pelham J. Anderson, and he assumed office even though the Senate had adjourned before taking action on his nomination. When it reconvened, the Senate declined to consider Anderson, so Johnson nominated Thomas Tarleton instead. He was confirmed but declined to serve. Johnson unsuccessfully proposed three more candidates before Alex L. Buffington was finally approved in July, 1868, and the office opened for business. 6

The Huntsville office escaped many of the personnel problems that plagued the Mobile and Montgomery offices. In the summer of 1866 Johnson appointed Ezra Hatten as Register and



Daniel M. Bradford as Receiver at Huntsville, and they were processing applications by 1868. Both served until Grant replaced them.⁷

But the consolidation of local offices and the redrawing of land district boundaries created special problems for Huntsville. After the war the GLO abolished the old Centre district and placed the lands it had administered under the Huntsville office. 8 But then in May 1866, it removed the old Centre office's lands from Huntsville's administration and placed them under the Montgomery office. That meant that lands in several counties in the northeastern corner of the state, almost bordering on the town of Hunstville, were now under Montgomery's jurisdiction. Would-be settlers in northeastern Alabama were understandably upset. Citizens of Guntersville in Marshall County, for example, complained about the long "and tedious" trip to Montgomery, about 200 miles away. Governor Lewis Parsons supported their complaint as did Judge Lewis Wyeth, who noted that few people from the northeastern counties had applied for lands because of the long trip required to make an application.

Ezra Hatten, the Register at Huntsville, also joined in the chorus of complaints. In arguing for reattaching the old Centre district lands to his office, he gave a poignant description of Alabama homesteaders in his part of the state:

You have no conception of the squalid poverty and ignorance of this people—the class who enter Land under the Homestead Law—scores of them, gray with years, never saw a church with a spire or steeple, untill they came here within the past year to enter Land, and some of them past middle age never saw a Brick building until they were out in the Rebel army, and their Poverty has kept pace with their ignorance. It is common for haggard and coarse looking old females to walk 40 or 50 miles to get to the Land office—and lie down

with their little squad by the road size or in the woods when night overtakes them.

But the GLO did not make the transfer until January, 1872.9

In the opposite, southwestern, corner of the state, the old St. Stephens office reopened for a short time after the war, but in early 1867 it was moved downriver to Mobile. Three years later the General Land Office enlarged this district by joining to it some of the more Southern lands that had been under the jurisdiction of the Montgomery office. In addition to convenience for would-be settlers, a major reason for this change was to protect the valuable timber lands in the southern part of the state. They could be patrolled more effectively from the Mobile office than they could from Montgomery. 10

Hardly less of a problem than office staffing and district consolidations were the land records themselves. When Salmon Dutton became Register at Mobile, he discovered that several record books were missing, including the "Register of Entries," which he believed the former Receiver had taken with him when he left office during the war. That register, which recorded applications, changes in applications, transfers, and other such dispositions, was vital. It alone indicated which tracts of land were open for homesteading and which already had claims on them. Dutton also found conflicts and confusion in an array of French, English, Spanish, and Indian land grants and titles, many of which had not yet been confirmed. 11

Similarly, an 1868 fire in the building housing the Montgomery office resulted in the loss of a tractbook. The GLO in Washington promised to duplicate the missing book from its own

records, but that overburdened office took over a year to do so.

In February 1869, Monroe Donoho of Tuscaloosa complained that
many "poor persons, heads of families, white and black" who
wanted land could not get it because of the missing records. And
T. F. Samuel of Northport urged quick replacement because "there
are a great many persons who wish to secure homesteads." 12

Though the GLO promised to replace destroyed books and to help straighten out conflicting claims and inaccurate records, the task proved formidable. In 1867 the Commissioner of the GLO wrote that the "whole available force of the Draughtsman's division of this office has been engaged for nearly two years in duplicating the lost plats of the several Districts in Arkansas, Alabama, Florida, Missouri, Mississippi, and Louisiana." 13

Registers often requested money for additional clerical workers to help in sorting out claims and getting offices in order. But GLO regulations allowed such additional help only under certain specific circumstances, circumstances which most local offices did not meet. Otherwise more funding was simply not unavailable. Montgomery Register Edwards pleaded with the Commissioner to send reimbursements for expenses he incurred while collecting the records of the former land districts. He was, he wrote, "out of pocket" \$1900 and could not even afford to have his wife and daughter, who were in Philadelphia, to join him in Montgomery. Mrs. Edwards herself begged the Commissioner to increase her husband's salary so the family could be brought together. She blamed the Southern Homestead Act for their hardships because, she argued, it withdrew the Southern public lands from the market and turned them over free to homesteaders.





BChanges in district boundaries after the war usually began with the recommendation to consolidate all offices into one central office. Alabama followed this pattern. 




