(1) Hot Colors Border The Hot Colors Border features plants in shades of red, orange and yellow. Large red hibscus tower over drifts of black-eyed Susans, golden yarrow, orange butterfly weed and cloads of lemon yellow thread-leaf coreopsis. The margins of the border we corrected with verbera red and are carpeted with verbena, red and yellow blanket flowers and Imperata, a Japanese blood grass.

12 Pink, Blue and Silver Border This pleasing border demonstrates plants which provide pink, blue and silver colors for all seasons. Spring features phlox, columbine, coral bell, candycutf and ins, summer displays include phlox, pink hythrum. Stoke's asters, balloon flowers and verbena. Arremisis and Russian sage provide silver foliage, while hydrangea, buddleia, caryopteris and moses are the framework. plantings. oluntines.

13 Shade Border This border is especially colorful in the spring when the columbines, bleeding hearts, pink and white lamiums, and spring phlox are in bloom. Astibles and begonia grandis provide the major summer display. In the fall anemones wave delicately fall anemones wave delicately above their foliage in shades of pink and white.



 The Cottage Garden is The Cottage Garden is an intimately scaled dooryard garden. The "cottage" is the aquatic partition. The garden's main entrance moves straight to the garden's main entrance moves straight to the pavilion while the primary cross paths terminate at abor-covered benches and urns set amongst mixed plantings. The tangled, romantic feeling is enhanced with vines climbing over gate posts, arbors, and into trees. Fragmant roses and peonies, clouds of gaura, Brazilian verbena and pattinia float above climps of phlox and asters. Herbs such as sages, bronze fennel, lavender and rue mis urch sensats such as old-fishiomed fragmath mix with annuals such as old-fashioned fragrant nicotiana and cleome.

8 Butterfly Garden The Butterfly Garden caters to the require-ments of butterflies. It is situated in a sunny, open spot and features the colors, flower shapes, and nextar sources preferred by its various clients. The planting includes butterfly bush and likase, the backbone of any classic butterfly garden. Perennials such as joe-pye weed, berga-mot, butterfly weed, goldenrod, dasises, asters and phlots join the grouping. Clematis and honeysuckle vie for the butterflies' attention.

9 Foliage Garden gasses which are generating interest and ques-tions by gardeners. This collection explores texture by interplanting grasses with coarse-leaved cannas and sedums. This garden exploits the range of foliage colors from blue greens to yellow greens, purples and silvers. Interesting combinations might be tall stately clumps of miscanthus and hair grass underplanted with a carreet of blue fescue. carpet of blue fescue.



Aquatic Garden

The Aquatic Garden contains a collection of tropical plants, including water lilies and hardy water-odge perennials. It is a formal circular garden, with its main focus being a round pool bisected by the Water Pavilion.

22 Water Lily Pool The Water Lily Pool is a 110-foot-wide semi-circle with lotus, tropical water lilies and other tropical water plants such as water cannas and papyrus situated in a tranquil setting. Along the north edge of the pool the pavilion steps down into the water

26 Weeping Willow Grove Willows frame a long view out to the south and to the hills beyond. The grove's border includes groups of long-edge shnubs such as winterberry, summersweet and swamp azalea, as well as perennials and ground covers.

27 Water Lily Collection The major feature of this garden is an outstanding collection of tropical water lilies. The blooms in shades of blue, yellow, pink and white are sweetly fragrant.

Annual Garden

The Annual Garden is designed to display a wide range of tender plants and bulbs suited to the Tennessee Valley area. This is one of the major color attractions of the Garden, and the emphasis is on display. The garden also explores different forms of annuals including vines, tender shrubs and alternative growing techniques such as toniar. as topiary.

33 thm 46 Ribbon Garden This garden consists of curving beds swirling down the hillside from the Summer House which overlooks them. These beds contain flowering shrubs which provide appealing displays in all seasons: pansies in winter; tulips, delphiniums and poppies in spring; marigolds and lantanas in summer; and chrysanthemums in fall.
