LESSONS LEARNED FROM THE
1991 HUNTSVILLE EDUCATION SUMMIT FOR POTENTIAL APPLICATION
TO FUTURE SUMMITS

An early start is imperative. Since the '91 Summit was the first, more time was necessary than will be essential for subsequent sessions. Early reservation of the Civic Center is also imperative. The von Braun Civic Center is an excellent site for a Summit. There is no obvious reason to consider a different location for any future Summit.

The Executive Committee/Program Manager is a reasonable approach. The program manager should be selected as early as practical and his/her responsibilities clearly defined. (In the case of the '91 Summit, there was initial uncertainty on my part and some wasted effort.) For continuity, the immediate past Program Manager should serve on the Executive Committee or as an advisor.

The concept of Executive Committee and Steering Council is good. Determination of Steering Council membership by the Executive Committee is appropriate. Selection of Workshop Chairmen and Committee Chairmen from Steering Council membership is a good approach -- if necessary to get the right people, the Steering Council should be increased to include someone not initially included, but who could serve well as a workshop chairman or committee chairman. Creation of committees from Steering Council membership worked well and is the recommended approach. Selection of the majority of committee and workshop chairmen from the business/industry sector is recommended. Assignment of a major role to the chairman of the City Council PTAs is recommended.

The Executive Committee should be kept to 10 or 12 members, including the program manager. Participation by the Mayor and staff should be no less than for the '91 Summit. The City School Superintendent should be an active member.

The Executive Committee and Steering Council should meet regularly at a routine time and place. Monthly for Steering Council is adequate. Bi-weekly in early stages reducing to weekly for the last few weeks (3 or 4) before the Summit is reasonable for the Executive Committee.

Workshop Chairmen and Committee Chairmen should meet for coordination/status/problem resolution sessions at least monthly.

Acquisition of primary speakers should begin very early.


For a workshop format such as the '91 Summit, experienced facilitators and subject matter experts in each topic area should be selected early in the preparation phase and should work closely with the Workshop Chairman in preparing activities.


FUNDING
As of FY90, the Huntsville City Schools operated with a level of per student funding which was \$1000 above the Alabama average, equaled the southeastern norm, and was approximately \$700 below the national average. In view of the city's tax base, the economic development objectives of business and governmental leadership, and parental expectations regarding the quality of educational services, the community should strive to achieve by the year 2000 a level of per student funding which is the highest in Alabama and at least 10 percent above the national average.

Attainment of this funding goal will necessitate political will among elected officials, substantially more taxpayer confidence in the utilization of current and prospective school monies, and the adoption of new and creative funding sources. Efforts to pursue new revenues and to engender greater public confidence should be undertaken or "tracked" simultaneously.

Specific recommendations include an increase in property taxes, the possible adoption of an occupational tax, an aggressive and highly publicized fund-raising program by the HCS Foundation, voluntary waiver of homestead exemptions, widespread citizen purchase of the "HS" automobile license plates, creation of a public information office for the school system, a substantial decentralization in the financial management of schools, creation of an advisory committee for the school system's financial officer, and empowerment of the city school board to call property tax referenda.
