5. A sense of personal competence	Aid students in making choices and decisions. Provide encouragement and support. Aid students in self-evaluation. Provide recognition and rewards.

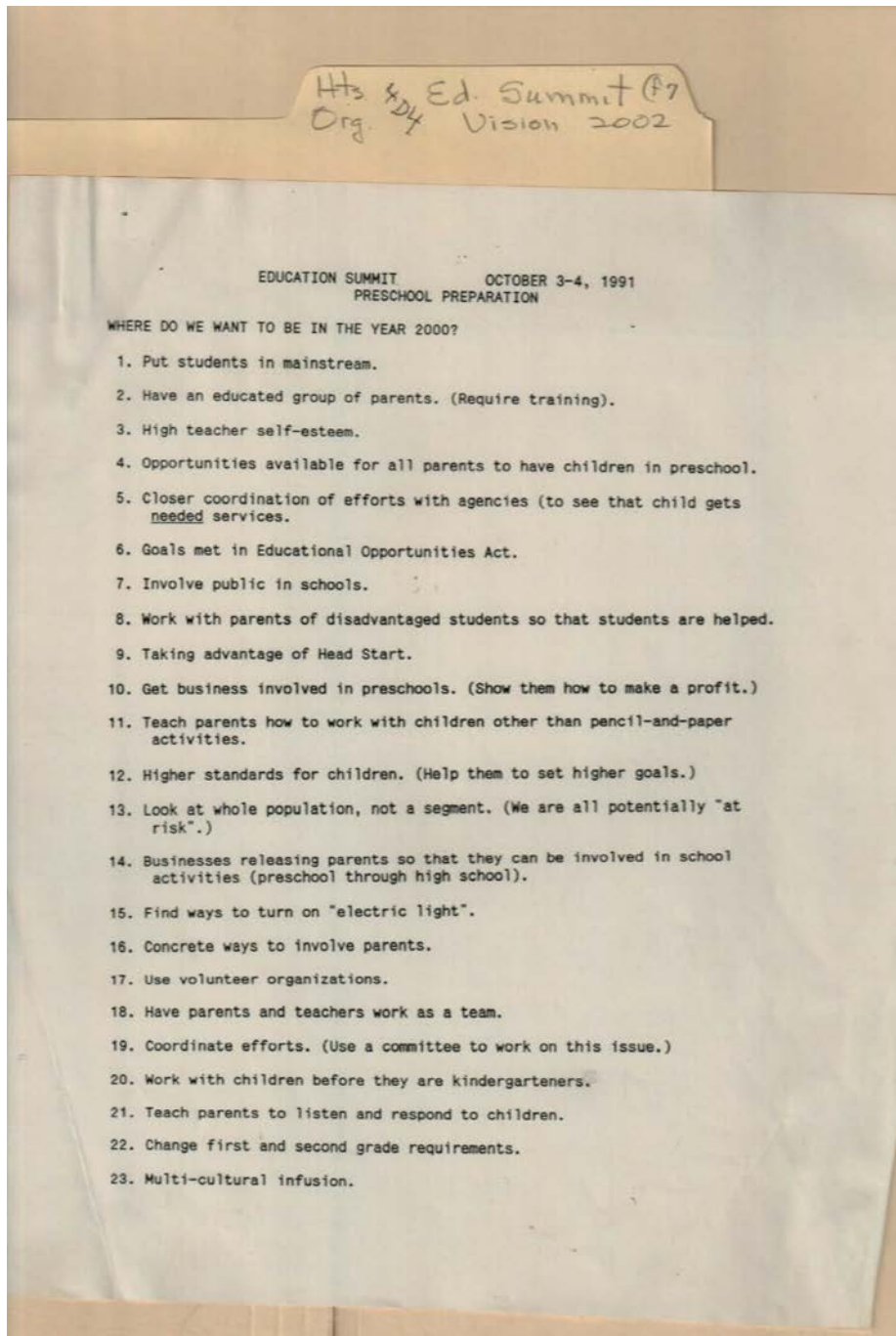

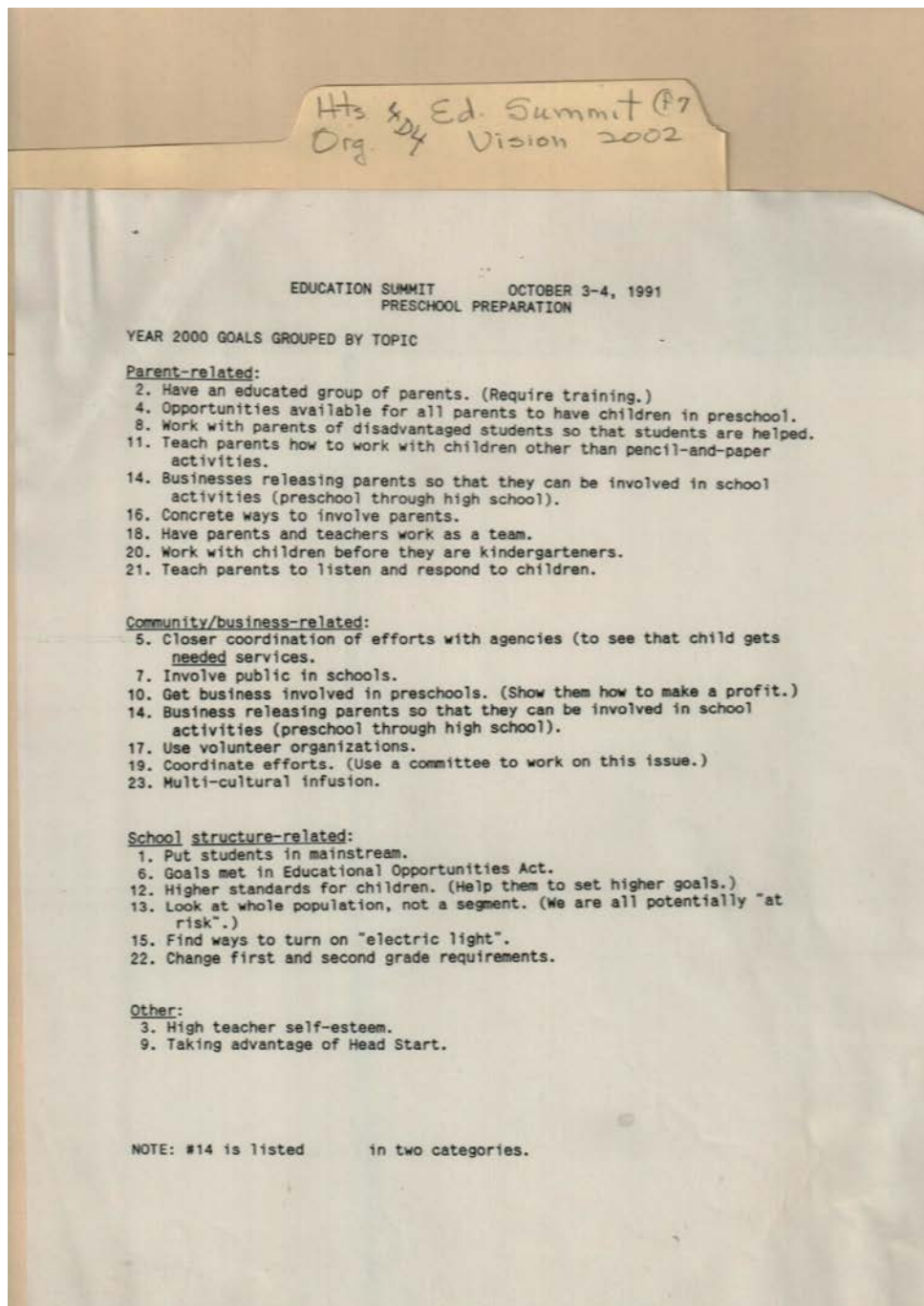

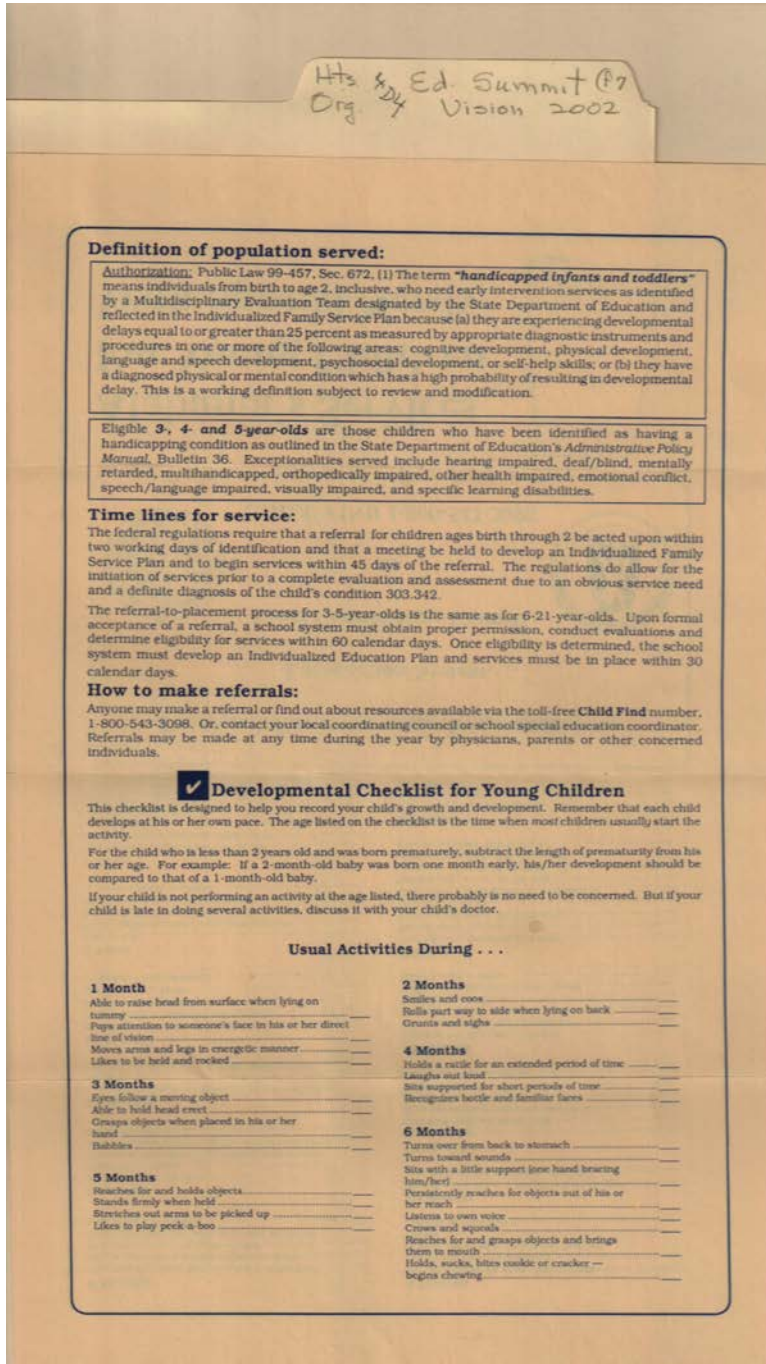

The Education of the Handicapped Act Amendments of 1986 established a national agenda for comprehensive care for young handicapped children and their families. The law calls for the development and timely implementation of an interagency system of early intervention for all handicapped children from birth to age five years.

One component of Alabama's response to meeting this goal is the establishment of a statewide system of local coordinating councils consisting of a coalition of educational, health and human service agencies, private providers, and families of special-needs children. Huntsville's local council, the Comprehensive Early Intervention Services Council (CEISC), is dedicated to meeting the needs of handicapped infants, toddlers, and preschoolers through coordinated efforts at the community level.

C Comprehensive services are available to meet the needs of handicapped infants and preschoolers.


E Early detection and habilitation are critical for optimum development.

I Intervention can "narrow the gap" for a handicapped child.

Services available include: audiology, speech pathology, occupational and physical therapy, psychology, social services, educational programs, parent training and counseling, and certain medical services.

S

C The Council is a coalition of agencies dedicated to improving the lives of special needs or at-risk children.



Early intervention may take many forms.

For a child with hearing or vision impairment, it may mean special training and aids to prepare for public school placement. For a child with cerebral palsy, it may mean working with a team of therapists to promote motor development, speech, and feeding skills. For medically fragile infants, it may mean health care to prevent potential complications or lessen the severity of existing problems.

For families who are experiencing difficulty in coping with their children's handicaps, early intervention may mean the emotional support of a counselor or a support group where parents reach out to other parents.

COMPREHENSIVE EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICES COUNCIL

The Comprehensive Early Intervention Services Council is composed of parents and staff members from most of the programs in Madison County which serve young handicapped children and their families. It was established in 1987 by the Alabama Department of Education to help develop and implement a state-wide program of services to handicapped and developmentally delayed children, from birth through age five, and their families.

The goals of the CEISC are to:

- Determine the availability of evaluation and service resources in this region
- Establish an interdisciplinary exchange

process for evaluation and placement of these children

- Increase public awareness about Public Law 99-457 and the needs of families with young handicapped children
- Actively support efforts to fully fund a state-wide program of early intervention services.

The CEISC meets monthly at the Huntsville-Madison County Public Library. For more information on CEISC activities and meeting dates, contact the Early Intervention Coordinator at 536-6621.
