The Story of Constitution Hall Park

Unique and significant in the history of Alabama...one of only fifty similar sites in the United States...a faithful representation of Huntsville life in 1819...all of these phrases aptly describe Constitution Hall Park, the museum complex established to commemorate Alabama's entry into the Union in 1819.

entry into the Union in 1819.

The possibility of creating such a memorial on the site where the Constitutional Convention met to organize the state was first envisioned in 1969 during Alabama's sesquicentennial year. The site was then vacant, all the old 1819 buildings having long since been demolished or moved, with a proposal to use the site for a parking garage under serious study. This idea generated strong protest from those who recognized the value of preserving for future generations this special segment of Alabama's heritage. A plan to save the site and reconstruct the historic 1819 buildings was initiated and through the efforts of the State of Alabama, the City of Huntsville, and other groups, will finally be realized when the park opens in May, 1982.

Park development received its initial impetus in 1970, when Governor Brewer's administration authorized purchase of the property by the state. In 1975, Governor Walless exercised serviced services of the property by the state. In 1975.

In 1975, Governor Wallace committed \$500,000 of revenue sharing funds for the first reconstruction phase while turning ownership of the property to the city. In 1980, the city secured an Economic Development Grant to finish reconstruction, then appointed a board to develop and manage the property. Constitution Hall Park occupies a half block site

Constitution Hall Park occupies a half block site south of the public square, being located on two of the original seventy-two town lots. Each of the four main buildings now reconstructed in the Park was originally built by a different owner for his own purpose and has its individual history. Yet, their combination provides a superb cross-section of early Alabama life and history. The original structures were erected very soon after the town was incorporated in 1811. Judged by the architecture of the day, the buildings ranged from plain to moderately elaborate. Reconstruction of the Park was done under the supervision of Harvie Jones, one of Alabama's Foremost historical architects and his careful research and supervision of details, from the most minute section of molding to the last handforged hinge, bought about as authentic a reproduction of the 1819 buildings as possible.

The focal structure of the Park, designated as Constitution Hall, could only be termed a plain

The focal structure of the Park, designated as Constitution Hall, could only be termed a plain commercial building. Its owner, Walker Allen, a cabinetmaker, was among the many craftsmen who migrated to the new town early in its history. He bought Lot No. 52 and probably erected his building around 1813. Its ample size attests to his need for shop space with adjacent warehouse area to show his completed furniture and to store lumber. After Allen's death in 1818, his vacant building was rented, and it appears that late that year a traveling theatrical group used the upstairs to stage the first professional dramatic performances in Alabama history. In November, 1819, the Huntsville Thespian Society opened its first season in this makeshift theater with the "much admired comedy", "Speed the Plough," followed by the farce, "Raising the Wind." When the Constitutional Convention gathered in Huntsville in the summer of 1819, the delegates found a crowded town, but found the warehouse of Walker Allen to be a large and suitable hall for their deliberations. These forty-four representatives from twenty-two counties in the Alabama Territory began their meetings on July 5, 1819, approving the completed constitution on August 2nd. The remaining history of the building is brief. It was razed in early 1821 to make way for a real theater, a grand edifice, which in turn burned to the ground before a single performance could be held. In the reconstructed Constitution Hall, it is the intent to depict the meeting place of the convention

The building will also contain a typical cabinetmaker's shop of the period, to be used as a demonstration area. The small two-story Clay Building has an entirely different history. Its brick construction appears more sturdy and its details more refined, befitting the office of a rising young lawyer. Clement Comer Clay, a member of the Alabama territorial legislature and delegate to the 1819 convention, chaired the important Committee of Fifteen that drafted the Constitution and later served as Alabama's Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Governor, and United States Senator. This building housed the newspaper offices of the Alabama Republican that printed the "Journal of the Convention of Alabama Territory Begun July 5, 1819," of which only three copies are known to exist, one in the British Museum. The first complete printing of the Alabama Constitution also ran in the newspaper's issue of August 3, 1819. Plans call for the eventual re-creation of the newspaper printing shop as an actual working model. The small room on the south side of the Boardman House memorializes the site of Alabama's first incorporated library. Here, in the law office of John N.S. Jones, the Huntsville Library Company's books were first offered to its subscribers in October, 1819. Many of Institution Hall Park P.O. Box 1819 swille, Alabama 35807	the original books will be returning to the room for exhibit. The only reconstructed residence in the Park is that of the Stephen Neal family. Built before 1816, it stood upon the site for more than one hundred years. On December 13, 1808, Neal was appointed as the first sheriff of Madison County by the Mississippi territorial legislature, thus becoming its chief organizing official. He would serve in this post until 1822. Reconstruction includes the kitchen, service quarters, well house, carriage house, "necessary" house, garden, and dairy. Furnishings will reflect urban life in 1819 in the home of a moderately well-to-do family. The project now nears completion, and when the Park's doors open in May of 1982, it will present the story of the birth of Alabama to thousands of visitors each year. It is a historic complex from which Alabamians can all learn and of which they can all be proud. SARAH HUFF FISK





The Alabama Constitution

Constitution Hall Park Architectural Notes

Constitution Hall Park is a reconstruction of seven buildings (and their outbuildings - 16 structures in all) of the period 1805-1819 in downtown Huntsville, Alabama, located on a half-block site north of Gates Avenue between Franklin and Madison Streets, one-half block south of the Madison County Courthouse and adjacent to the Twickenham Historic District. The buildings are reconstructed as accurately as historical information, architectural research, present-day technology, and economics allow. The purpose of the park is to commemorate the 1819 Constitutional Convention on this site, at which Alabama entered the Union. There being only 50 such locations in the United States, this site is therefore of State and National significance. By visiting these diverse types of early 19th century structures, which are accurately reconstructed and furnished, the visitor will gain an insight to the times and events of 1819 that no amount of reading or lecturing can impart.

All of the reconstructed buildings existed on this site in 1819, and together they present a wide variety: cabinet-makers shop (Constitution Hall), two lawyers' offices, library, newspaper office, Sheriff's office, residence, service rooms, carriage house, stables, and "necessary". All of the structures except the Sheriff Neal house and office and the library had a direct relationship to the Constitutional Convention.

Much research on the Constitutional Convention and its site was done in the late 1960's by Sarah Huff Fisk, Dr. Frances Roberts and others of the Huntsville-Madison County Historical Society. This research established the size, plan shape and location of the various structures, and whether they were of brick or frame construction. In the mid 1970's, the discovery of an 1871 'birds' eye view' drawing of Huntsville (misfiled in the Library of Congress) by James Record confirmed the 3-dimensional shapes of the buildings fronting Madison Street. These shapes had been correctly deduced by the architects' research in 1970, and it was gratifying to find that the correct conclusions had been drawn.

was gratifying to find that the correct conclusions had been drawn.

The architects, (Jones & Herrin, Architects, AIA, Huntsville) spent several thousand hours in the eleven-year period of 1970-1981 researching and documenting Federal period buildings here and elsewhere. Dozens of Federal Period buildings were visited, photographed in great detail (usually 40 to 60 photographs per structure), moulding profiles measured, and original paint colors sampled and noted. A library of several thousands bound and notated photographs of these Federal Period structures is now contained in the architects' library. The value of this library can be realized by the fact that six Madison County Federal Period structures that six Madison County Federal Period structures that were studied here have been lost in just the past

six years. A seventh is to be demolished in 1982 by its

owner.

The architects have also collected and studied a library of several hundred books and articles on the Federal Period, including such details as masonry construction methods, hardware, timber framing

construction methods, hardware, tumber framing-joinery, sawing methods, nail manufacture, etc.

The architects' collection also includes several hundred Federal Period building components such as mouldings, shingles, timber mortise-&-tenon joints, paint chips, etc. In 1981 the American Institute of Architects Alabama Council presented an Award to the Constitution Hall Park project for the thoroughness of its research and accuracy of execution. The City of Huntaville presented a similar Resolution in the same year. In January 1982, Constitution Hall Park received a third award, from

Constitution Hall Park received a third award, from the North Alabama Chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

There are still some dozens of Federal Period structures in Madison County and Limestone County and although they are altered in varying degrees, they constitute the best research resource. A third purpose of Constitution Hall Park is to encourage the preservation of these Federal Period structures that remain.

The objective adopted by the architects in the reconstruction was that a local historic source be used for every architectural detail. For example, while research indicated the size, location, shape and material of the Neal House, nothing is known of the details of its stair. Therefore the Neal House stair details have been carefully reproduced from the Federal Period stair in the rear original section of the details have been carefully reproduced from the Federal Period stair in the rear original section of the Mastin House at 516 Franklin St. This same technique has been followed throughout, down to the smallest mouldings or sash-muntin profiles, and even to the spacing and types of nails. A source-building similar to the type being reproduced is utilized; Service buildings are the source for reconstructed service buildings, etc.

A second part of the philosophy for reconstruction was that the buildings be frankly presented as reconstructions; that there would be no attempt to

was that the buildings be frankly presented as reconstructions; that there would be no attempt to delude visitors into thinking these were genuine Federal Period structures. Therefore no age or wear effects are included. All concealed work is modern. A sign at the entrance announces that the buildings are reconstructions. However, a genuine 1819 house museum is only one block away - the 1819 Maria Howard Weeden House Museum. Visitors can readily visit the Weeden House from Constitution Hall Park, and vice-versa.

Research on building placement has been followed with some exceptions dictated by site restrictions.

The plant material as selected by Harvilee Harbarger, Landscape Architect, are plant types found in 1819 Huntsville. In a few cases, hybrids which have the same appearance as the native plants have been used. Heavy "foundation plantings", an invention of the 1920's - are not used. The plan, material and form of the Boardman


