Contributor will surely want an appraisal for Income Tax deduction purposes. Who would be a person well qualified for this? b. When furniture donations are offered, I might suggest that the following method could be followed: (1) Use Inventory Card (sample attached) to record description of the furniture. Also make photos and attach. (This is the Inventory Gard used at Old Salem, with some revisions that I believe will suit it to owneeds.) (2) Ask the owner of the furniture to keep it until the building is ready, unless repairs are needed to be made to the item. c. Will we acknowledge the contributor with a small plaque on the item or by some other method? d. We have already had some offers of furniture that are not suitable for the buildings we have. It is most likely that most contributions will be of furniture for a home, much of which we could not use since we do not have the Neal house. I am wondering if we could work out an exchange arrangement with the Weeden House Restoration that would work to our mutual advantage? Does anyone know what period furnishings are to be used there? B. FURNISHINGS REQUIRED The attached furniture listings by rooms are taken mostly from our past work.
 In some of the areas I have suggested a group or organization that might be persuaded to sponsor that area. This seems like a good solution, if we can work it. The hitch, I guess, would be in trying to get the sponsoring group to be content with the decisions of the Screening Committee for rurnishings. 2. I think we are generally agreed that all the buildings should be furnished in 1819, or earlier, period furnishings. It seems to me very important that we stick to this and do not allow an other of some time piece of furniture from a later date to cause us to deviate from our period setting. 3. Since we are doing a reconstruction (and not a restoration, like the Weeden House), is it not appropriate and "good sense" to use reproductions of 1819 period, or earlier, furniture and articles when we cannot get originals? I am thinking of the sheet iron stoves, and all the many many chairs and benches. Good reproductions, of course! It seems to me that our purpose in this reconstruction is to portray an important era in our history in a manner as vivid and meaningful and as true to the life or the times as we can. If we manage to spark a feeling for the era and for the great event held there, we will have succeeded, whether we used originals are confess. used originals or copies. h. Is it possible that the Printing Shop or some part or the building will be finished to the extent that the walls could be covered with lanolized blow-ups of articles and ads from the 1819 Huntsville newspapers and used as a place to sell souvenirs for the purpose of raising money to complete th Printing Shop?
