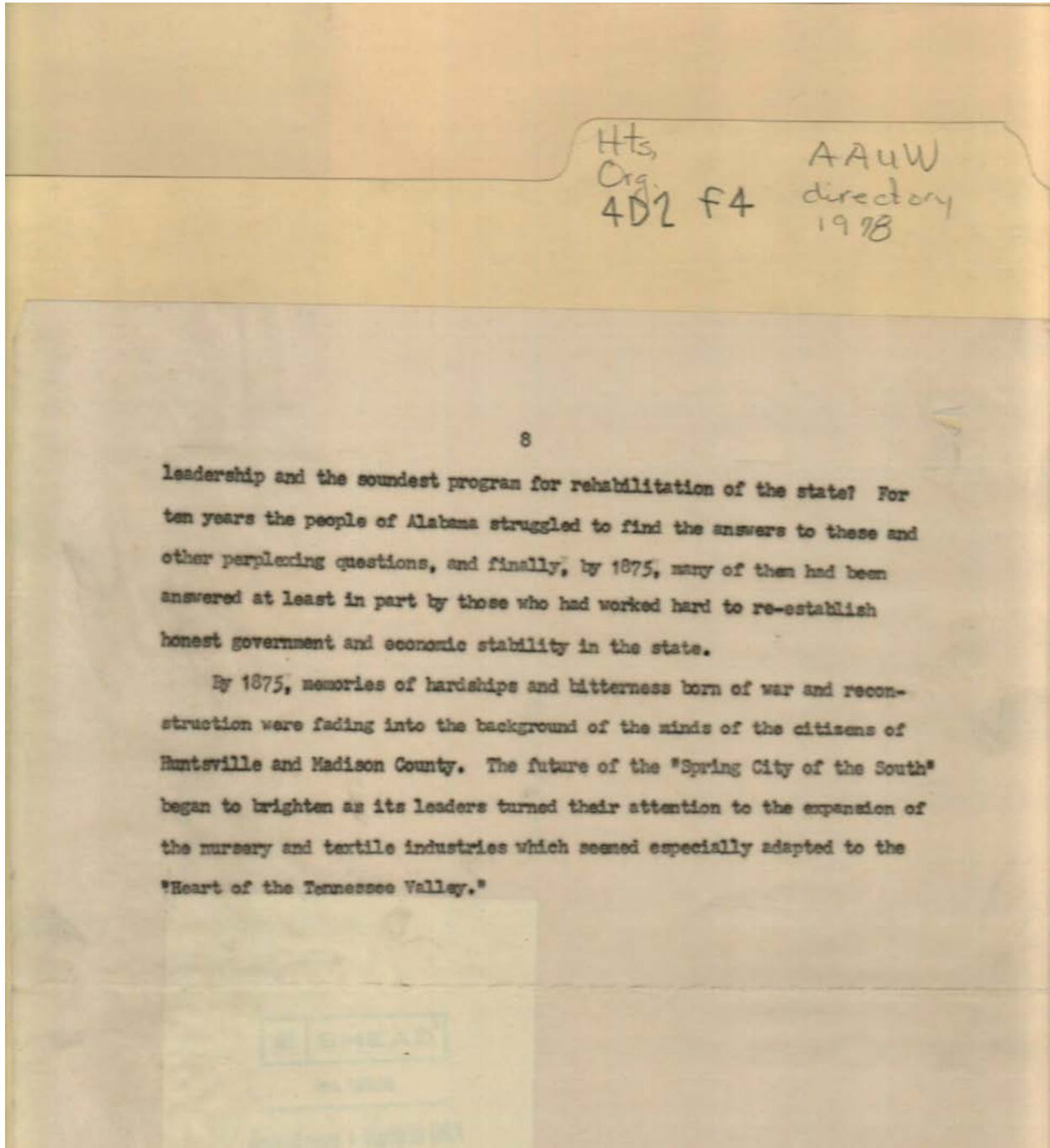
As the last year of the war approached, "loyalty oaths" were exacted of the people of Huntsville and Madison County by the federals. These oaths had to be taken when travelers went in and out of the town, when provisions were bought at the commissaries, and when special protection was asked of Union troops.

Leaders of the "Peace Movement" in north Alabama were in direct negotiation with Washington officials during the winter of 1864-1865 to try to establish a satisfactory way whereby Alabama could be readmitted to the Union. Loyal Confederates, in an effort to counteract the effects of these "Peace groups," called a meeting at the Courthouse on December 19, 1864. The notice of the meeting, circulated as a small handbill, stated that accurate information concerning the Confederacy and its laws would be given to the people.

In spite of the discontent of many of its people, in spite of the increasing hardships and privations caused by war and occupation, a majority of the citizens of Huntsville and Madison County carried on the fight until the surrender of their soldiers on the battlefield brought what they felt to be a legitimate basis for peace.

Once the questions of secession and Civil War had been settled by the sword, new and more difficult questions faced the people of Huntsville and Madison County. What was the best method of dealing with the freedman? How was money to be obtained for buying seeds and supplies to plant crops? How were businesses to be refinanced? How could debts and taxes be paid? Should the "amnesty oath" be taken? What political group offered the best

established in permanent quarters on this site in 1855. When the town was occupied, this building was used as a hospital.

17. College President's Home - Here lived the president of the Huntsville Female College. From time to time this residence was taken over by federal officers to house wounded soldiers. The two houses next to this home, occupied by the Farris and Cooper families, were also partly occupied by Union forces.

18. Mayhew Home - Built by Sidney J. Mayhew in 1843, this home figured in several interesting incidents which occurred during the Civil War. Since the basement of the home was well protected, it was often used as a hide-out for Confederates who came home on leave and were in danger of being captured by federals. According to tradition, this famous cellar was also used to conceal a Union officer, Captain Samuel Fordyce. While Miss Sue Chadick, daughter of Mrs. W. D. Chadick, was visiting the Mayhews, Captain Fordyce came to see her. Several Confederates temporarily located in Huntsville got word of Captain Fordyce's visit and attempted to capture him. So well was he concealed in the basement, that the Confederates failed to find the Captain. After the war Fordyce returned to Huntsville and married Miss Chadick. He and W. R. Rison formed the Fordyce and Rison Banking Company in 1866. After several years, Captain Fordyce moved to Arkansas where he was instrumental in establishing the town of Hot Springs.

19. The Thomas White Home - During the war Thomas White's family used the basement of their home to conceal many Confederate soldiers who came home on leave. When the local men were able to slip by federal troops who guarded the roads leading into town, they were hidden in the White basement until it was safe for them to go to their own homes. Several times the ground floor was occupied by Union troops and the family was forced to move upstairs. Thomas White also helped organize an informal local militia to aid in protecting the lives and possessions of many

(Marker) Morgan-Neal Home - Here John Hunt Morgan, Confederate Raider, was born in 1826. Later his family went to live in Lexington, Kentucky, where he was residing when the war began. The Stephen Neal family was living here when federal troops took it over for officers' quarters. The Bassett Home next door and the Hale Home across the street were also occupied.

27. The Barnard Home - Constructed in the 1820's this home became the residence of Mrs. Harriet Moore Barnard in the 1850's. After the war, Mrs. Barnard married Col. Robert Barnwell Rhett, Jr., editor, legislator, and Confederate soldier. This house, the Brickell Home across the street and the Gus L. Mastin Home that stood beside it, were all occupied by federal officers. Gus L. Mastin was one of the twelve citizens placed in prison by General Mitchell.

28. The Samuel Cruse Home - Built in the 1820's this was the home of Samuel Cruse, head of the public land office and prominent civic leader in Huntsville. Mr. Cruse was one of the twelve citizens imprisoned by General Mitchell. His home and all those south of it on Adams Street were occupied by federal officers.

29. The Watkins Home - Built in the late 1850's by the James L. Watkins family, this home was taken over by General Mitchell to house part of his headquarters staff. The young Mrs. Watkins had just given birth to a ~~son~~ baby when the federals occupied the area, and she became so concerned that it is reported she died of fright. In 1864, this home was chosen by General John Logan as his headquarters.

30. The McDowell Home - Built in 1848, this was the home of William McDowell, one of the twelve citizens imprisoned by General Mitchell. In 1862, General Mitchell chose this house for his main headquarters. He set up his desk in the large front parlor and from there sent out his orders. One of the most dramatic events of the war was scheduled to have ended in this room when the

Mayhew - Connor - Balch - Home

THE Mayhew home with its sweeping lawn and stately pine trees, sits back from Eustis Street in a picturesque setting. It was built by Sidney J. Mayhew about 1843, and remained in his family for seventy-six years.

Since Mayhew was a contractor and lumberman by trade, he selected and used only the finest of materials for the construction of his home. The red brick house has walnut woodwork and doors, as well as a walnut stairway which features a special stoop for the candlelight used in antebellum days.

Mr. Mayhew was active in the civic and religious life of Huntsville, serving as trustee for the Huntsville Female Seminary and as an elder in the First Presbyterian Church. Mrs. Mayhew's chief interest appears to have been in her beautiful flowers which she generously shared with the sick of Huntsville.

It is said that Huntsville's "real love story of the War Between the States" was centered in this house, for it was when Miss Sue Chadick, of near Hobbs Island, was visiting in the Mayhew home that she concealed Captain Samuel Fordyce, a Federal officer, in the cellar of the house. Captain Fordyce, because of her help, escaped being taken prisoner and at the end of the war returned to Huntsville and married Miss Chadick. It was then that the banking institution known as the

Rison Bank was formed by Captain Fordyce and W. R. Rison. After living here for a number of years, Captain Fordyce went to Arkansas and was instrumental in establishing the town of Hot Springs.

At the time of the death of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney J. Mayhew, the property came into the possession of their son, James H. Mayhew and remained until 1919 when it was sold to W. A. Connor.

Mr. and Mrs. Henry H. Balch were next to occupy the house. Many of the lovely furnishings in the home today were brought by them from the old world. Upon Mr. Balch's retirement from the American Foreign Service they returned to Huntsville and purchased the house from the Connors. Among the furnishings of interest are a hand carved mantel from Italy and a ~~chest~~ chest made in Nuremberg, Germany in 1722. Mrs. Balch, the former Miss Josephine McCaleb, died in 1963. Mr. Balch ~~was living in the home.~~ died in

1989. ~~She~~ house is now occupied by their daughter and son in law Mr. and Mrs. Ronald Bernard Thomas.

Amending the tenure law to provide that a teacher on tenure who is promoted to the position of principal or supervisor be required to serve a trial period of three years and be re-elected for the fourth year as principal or supervisor before gaining tenure in the new position; provided, however, that such promotion would in no sense jeopardize the tenure of the promoted teacher as a teacher; and provided further that should the promoted teacher not be retained in the new position as principal or supervisor, his salary would be reduced to the salary attached to the position held before promotion.				
2. Amending existing statutes to provide for appointment of all county superintendents of education by the respective county boards of education.				
3. Amending the constitution to provide for appointment of the State Superintendent of Education by the State Board of Education, said board to be elected on a district basis by popular vote for long, overlapping terms. This board would determine the superintendent's term and salary.				
4. Opposing appropriations of public funds to private schools.				
5. Providing that non-professional employees on 12-month employment who are now eligible for vacation of two weeks with pay be given this vacation at a time most suitable for the local board of education regardless of whether this is at a time when schools are in session.				
II. MORE ADEQUATE HOUSING OF CHILDREN				
Through a bond issue or some other continuing plan for financing a school building program under which buildings and equipment may be provided for the growing enrollments expected during the next decade. Alabama must replace many obsolete, unsafe, temporary, and unfit buildings now in use; it must relieve overcrowded conditions in many modern buildings; it must provide for the unprecedented enrollments predicted by national and state authorities.
