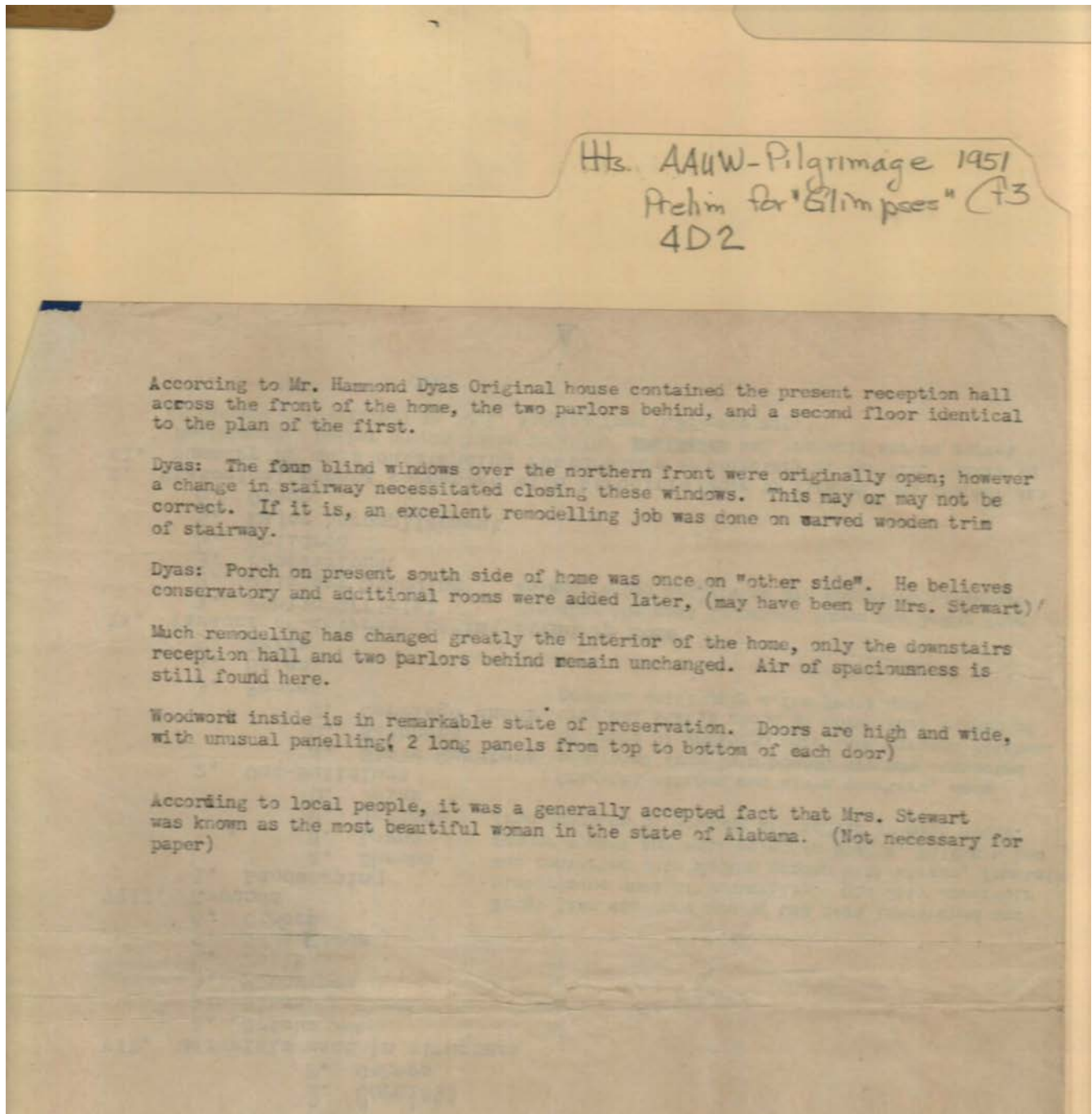

Certificate of Purchase issued to LeRoy Pope from United States August 25, 1809. Included in tract of LAND later mortgaged by Pope to Dr. Rene La Roche

Deeded to William H. Pope by LeRoy Pope, March 31, 1836 for 15,000. Was included in large tract of land on which located present Watts home and much of south east Huntsville. (Walter in "My (2. P.) Mother's "Paradise")

Deeded to Le Roy Pope, Jr. by William H. Pope, deed dated October 28, 1837, but not recorded until January 7, 1841, for 30,000

Deeded to William H. Pope by LeRoy Pope, Jr. July 16, 1841, for 30,000

Deeded to Samuel Breck by William H. Pope, deed dated October 15, 1846, but recorded June 22, 1847, for 1,600. Here, apparently property became separated from larger property having belonged to LeRoy Pope. Deduction made from amount of money involved. (See conditions for sale of this or other LeRoy Pope's property)

Samuel Breck to Archibald E. Mills, dated June 9, 1848, for one dollar. This deed carries first mention in abstract that house was on this property: "house and lot where Samuel Breck now resides". Judging from this, latest possible date of construction would be 1848 (See additional information)

Archibald E. Mills as trustee to James J. Donegan, March 9, 1850, for 4,500. This property was sold at public auction as specified in deed of Breck.

Samuel Breck and wife Mary to James J. Donegan to Samuel Matthews, February 10, 1857, for 8,000.

Samuel Matthews to Sarah E. Matthews, (wife), Sallie S. Matthews (daughter) and Luke Matthews (son) dated November 21, 1860 for 5.00 and love and affection

Samuel E. Matthews, Luke Matthews, Jr. and Lucie his wife, J. E. Fletcher and Sallie H. his wife to LeRoy Pope Walker, dated November 7, 1870, for 18,000

By will of LeRoy Pope Walker to widow Elisa D. Walker, September 15, 1884, date will was probated. Only other heir was son L. P. Walker, Jr.

By will of Elisa D. Walker (Mrs. LeRoy Pope Walker) to son Dr. L. P. Walker. Will probated December 14, 1885. 1,000 left for monument to husband's grave. Inlaid writing desk in room she used as chamber to Dr. W. D. Allen. Can this be located? Her portrait at age of 4 to Dr. Allen left to Dr. Allen for his lifetime, then to her son if he would care for it.

LeRoy Pope Walker, Jr. to John A. Faust, dated 7/16/1886; probated August 4, 1886, for 7,000; also "certain personal property stored in buildings."

Quit Claim Deed to John H. Sheffy Agent & Attorney, by John A. Faust & wife Susie H., dated October 4, 1892, but not recorded until July 18, 1901. (Subsequent pages of abstract show that John H. Sheffy was acting as agent for Milton Humes)

LeRoy Pope Walker to John H. Sheffy as agent & attorney, dated August 8, 1892, but not recorded until July 18, 1901, for 4500.

John H. Sheffy, Unmarried, individually and as agent and attorney, and Milton Humes and wife, Ellelee C. Humes to George W. Stegall, recorded July 20, 1901, for 7500

Lane Home Small, Plan Interesting
Republican Political Figure Among Family Of Long-Time Owners

Politicians and journalists dating since before the Civil War have woven into the family history connected with the Lane home, on Adams avenue, one of a number of historical places in the city to be visited in the city during the pilgrimage May 6.

The home is owned by Mr. and Mrs. J. Frank Walker.

One of its former owners was three times a candidate for governor on the Republican ticket. Information on the Lane home, as compiled by Mrs. I. B. Miller, follows:

One of the oldest and most attractive of Huntsville's smaller homes is that presently owned by Mr. and Mrs. J. Frank Walker. Although this house has changed hands many times, court records show that it is known as the Lane home, for the Lanes were its occupants for several generations. The house, built prior to 1837, was purchased by the Walkers in 1923.

Charles Paul Lane, son of George Washington Lane, was a prominent figure in the history of Huntsville. He was born in this house on May 23, 1854. He was educated at the University of Alabama and was three times nominated as candidate for governor of Alabama by the Republican party.

He established and founded two republican newspapers, The New South and The Tribune, the only Republican newspapers in Madison county at that time.

A son, Charles D. Lane, followed in his father's footsteps in journalism, and was later to become sheriff of the county.

Located at 211 Adams avenue the house sits high above the street with many steps leading to the front porch and entrance. Originally built, the main floor consisted of the living room, very large entrance hall, and the bedroom.

The kitchen and dining room were on the basement level. At the house is now arranged, all of the rooms to see are on the first floor.

During the pre-Civil War days, the slave quarters were in the rear of the main house, the stables at the left, and the gardens at the right.

One of the early occupants of this home saved the square corners from every man's hand, evidently to prevent people from knocking their heads. To this day, it is a noticeable feature of the home.

Mrs. A. W. McAllister, wife of the present mayor, and daughter of the late Charles Paul Lane and Eleanor Abercrombie Lane, was born in this house and lived there for a number of years.

William Russ Lane, 690 Frank-lyn street, is also a son of the photographs and dating about 1923.

Oaklawn Plantation One Of Homes In Pilgrimage

Architecture Of Note; Luthers Also Opening Stables For Visitors

A little extra driving will be required of those in the home pilgrimage, May 6, to see "Oaklawn Plantation" on Meridian pike, but the trip will be rewarding for those who see the Max Luther residence, about two miles north from the Square on Highway 241, north.

The stables there will be opened to visitors, as well as the home. They reflect the hobby of the present owner, and are reminiscent of the days when the Robinson home was at the height of its splendor before the Civil War.

Information on Oaklawn, as prepared by Mrs. John Lary, follows:

One of the most beautiful homes in Huntsville or Madison county is the Max Luther residence, "Oaklawn Plantation".

Its spacious rooms, halls nearly 50 feet long, and its superb view of Huntsville give it a place among the outstanding homes in the

county.

John Robinson is given credit for building the mansion sometime around 1844, though the building may have been started at an earlier date by John F. Newman, William Fleming or Lemuel Mead, each of whom owned the plantation prior to John Robinson.

The property was first deeded to Judge Robert W. Walker, president of the Constitutional Convention, which met in Huntsville in 1819. The house was built of the finest materials, and the bricks for it are believed to have been made in a pit nearby. The floors are of wide boards, and the doors are more than five feet in width.

After John Robinson moved into the home with his wife, Caroline J. Otey, he landscaped the grounds with boxwood, holly and other shrubs. He built slave quarters, stables and carriage sheds, and lived there as one of the wealthiest plantation owners of the county.

"Oaklawn" escaped hardship during the Civil War, being used as officers' quarters, while John Rob-

inson's brother, Jim Robinson, lost his home, "Forest Field", due to fire.

Robert Bentley, author of "Forest Field," used a picture of "Oaklawn" in his book, since the two houses were so similar in design.

At the time of the death of John Robinson and his wife, the property went to their children, John J. and Carrie Robinson, who lived on the plantation until the end of the last century. At that time, the property went to Mary L. Windham. The house was then vacant for a number of years, but was used as a hospital during the Spanish-American War.

Since 1908, the property has been in the possession of Mrs. Alberta C. Taylor, Mrs. Elizabeth C. Newman, Mr. and Mrs. W. P. Dilworth and Mr. and Mrs. Luther.

When it was deeded to the Dilworths around 1912, the house was in need of repairs, since it had been vacant over a long period of time. It was redecorated by the Dilworths, and again took on the splendor of its former days.

In 1941, Mr. and Mrs. Luther purchased "Oaklawn Plantation" from Mr. and Mrs. Dilworth. During the past 18 years, the present owners have transformed the 175-acre estate into a stock farm, in keeping with Mr. Luther's hobby of training and showing five and three-

gated saddle horses. Many improvements have been made to the plantation, including the building of a very fine stable for horses.

The house, as it stands today, is appropriately furnished with period pieces, and is decorated throughout in keeping with its age and beauty.

In 1933, Secretary of Interior Harold L. Ickes conducted a survey
