Letter from J. L. Davis, 107 W. Waco, Ennis, Tex. Born in Ga. Dec. 14, 1852; left Madison Co. 1872.

Oct. 10, 1953

Dear Mrs. Criner:

I just can't muster words sufficient to tell you how glad I was when I read your letter and knew it was from a Descendant of Col. W. B. Jones that I use to visit often. He was a leading citizen; a man whose advice was considered Tops. His Daughter was the wife of W. J. Berry, the man I worked for one summer for \$10.00 a month and board. He couldn't have found a better woman for a Wife than she was. She took care of my clothes and I milked the cows for her. She had a little girl named Corra Bell. One day, a few days before I left, Mrs. Berry said to me "Fayette, I want you to wait for Corra Bell." I didn't intend to wait 10 years before I got a mate, besides there was a family by the name of Campbell living about a half mile of Mrs. Berry, that had a Daughter, 14 years old, that was one of the best looking girls I had ever seen, and the family was among the first class, but I wasn't ready to marry.

I had a Brother living in Ark. who wrote me to come out there, so I went and after I had been there two years a family by name of Chastian from near Huntsville, Ala. moved into the neighborhood; they had 2 girls and I soon got acquainted with them. The oldest one was 19 and her looks and ways suited me, so we got married. I was 21 at the time. I had 40 Dollars cash, a cow and calf, a horse and feed and one of the best women living. No job, only as I found one at a Dollar a day. We lived happily together for 52 years then she died. During our sojourn her we raised 12 children, 4 boys and 8 girls, 9 are still living and all have good homes. I have bought and sold several homes, have lived in several states; half my children live in California and half in Texas. I am living with a widowed Daughter, have a reasonable appetite, eat 2 meals a day.

I use a Walking stick & walk 5 blocks to the business part of Town. I don't take Doctors medicine, don't smoke nor drink Liquor or Beer. I try to live by the Golden Rule. I sure thank you for the congratulations you sent.

I rememberwell J. A. R. Jones who made Doctor; he was about my age and we chummed together a lot; George was older and made a lawyer. Lev was younger.

I was at a play party one night with J. A. R. at a Mr. Walkers who ma married one of Col. Jones Daughters, there was a house full of young folks and we sure had a juball time, but now we can only think back of the joyful times during the bygone days that can never return. We One thing we can do is look ahead and hope.

Col. Jones was a member of the Presbyterian Church in New Porte; was well to do, owned slaves before the Civil War; had 3 boys and 2 girls that I know of, all first class, their mother's given name was Jane, a noble woman but a little contencious. She smoked a pipe, & had been using home made tobacco, raised on Mr. Berry's farm; one day she told her husband she didn't like the home made tobacco; he said " Well all right Jane, I'll bring you some from town, so he got the saddle bags like people used in those days, and while Jane wasn't looking he put some of the tobacco Jane had left in the saddle bags, and took it to Huntsville. When he got back he was careful to let Jane see him take the saddle bags off the saddle and take the tobacco out. Then he said, here Jane is tobacco I brought from Huntsville but I don't think it is any better than the kind you have been using, but when she smoked some of it she said it was better, so the Col. didn't dispute her word, but the rough place they had bumped up against on their journey Thru life, was made smooth...during all the time I was with them no cross words were spoken. And now I trust they are together enjoying the Bliss of never ending Eternity.

Dear Mrs. Walker:

This came today, so I pass it along to you, as you were interested.

He is a little confused in a few things, but is wonderful. I told him my husband was a great grandson of Col. Bill's brother G. W. Jones, who was dead in 1867, so he didn't know him. And I signed my name Mrs. H. Howard Criner Jones.

When I checked the Jones book, I found little Corra Bell Berry and her mother both died May 31, 1861, ~~so he didn't~~ (I'll bet they had typhoid) and that Dr. J. A. R. was born July 20, 1852, the same year as this Mr. Davis.

Col. Bill's wife was Martha Jane Erwin, and evidently was called by her middle name. The "play party" must have been at Arabella's (Mrs James M. Walker) as from what I've heard of "Preacher Walker" he wouldn't have apt. to have allowed any such at his house.

Col. Bill's son G. W. is the one who lived at Guntersville and was father of Elisabeth Jones the pianist. Lev was "ooz Gyp's" husband.

of his will, it apparently seems that the first occupants of the Chapman home were members of the family of Allen Christian who must have constructed it sometime prior to his death in 1836.

Today the floor plan of this Colonial type cottage remains in tact as it was originally constructed. There are four large rectangular rooms on the first floor opening into a wide central hallway. These serve as a parlor, dining room, and two bedrooms. In the rear part of the hall a winding stairway leads to a half story above containing two bedrooms, a hall and a large closet.

Originally at the back entrance of the hall there was a small square porch with a brick walk leading to the kitchen which stood alone.

Today this room is connected ⁽⁵⁾ with the main portion of the house where a bath and sleeping porch have been added.

The furnishings of the house include many interesting family pieces. The interior shutters at the windows date back to an early period when they were as popular and useful as they are at the present time.

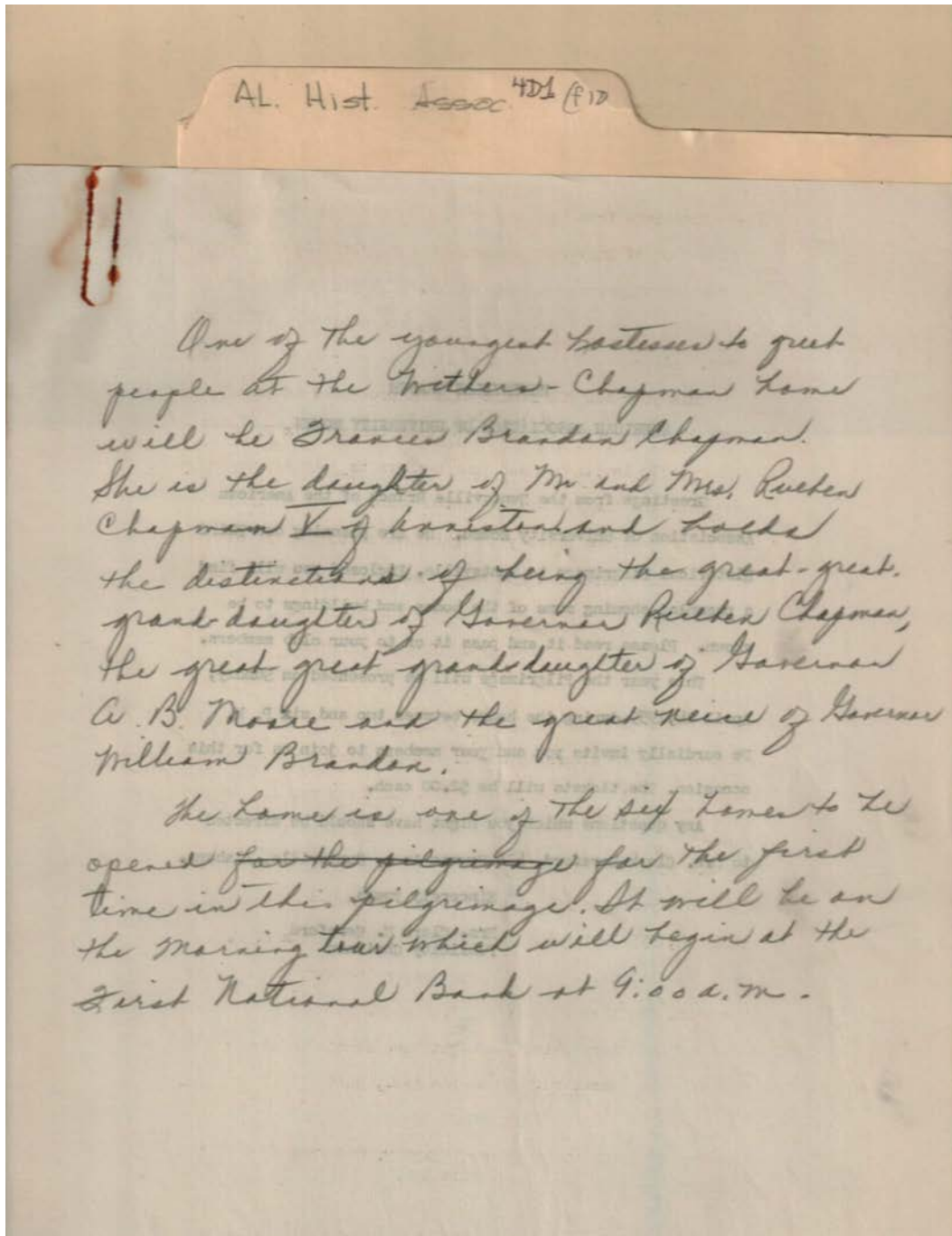

The land on which the Mastin - Thomas
 Country Home stands was first entered
 by John M. Leake, August 24, 1809. Later
 it passed to John Blevins who in turn
 sold it ^{in 1833} to Francis J. Mastin II. From
 this date to 1922, the property remained in
 the hands of some of the Mastin descendants.
 Dr. J. E. Whitaker purchased the property in
 1941 and later in 1949 sold it to Carl
 Thomas.

Francis J. Mastin II came to Alabama
 as a volunteer aid to Andrew Jackson, returning
 to Madison County shortly after the War of
 1812. He located in Montevalle where he
 spent the remainder of his life. His son,
 Francis J. Mastin III, who was a plaster, is
 believed to have constructed the Mastin - Thomas
 Home shortly after his marriage to Eliza Jane
 Pope on March 31, 1936. The architecture of this
 two story structure is almost identical with the
 home residence of his brother, James H. Mastin

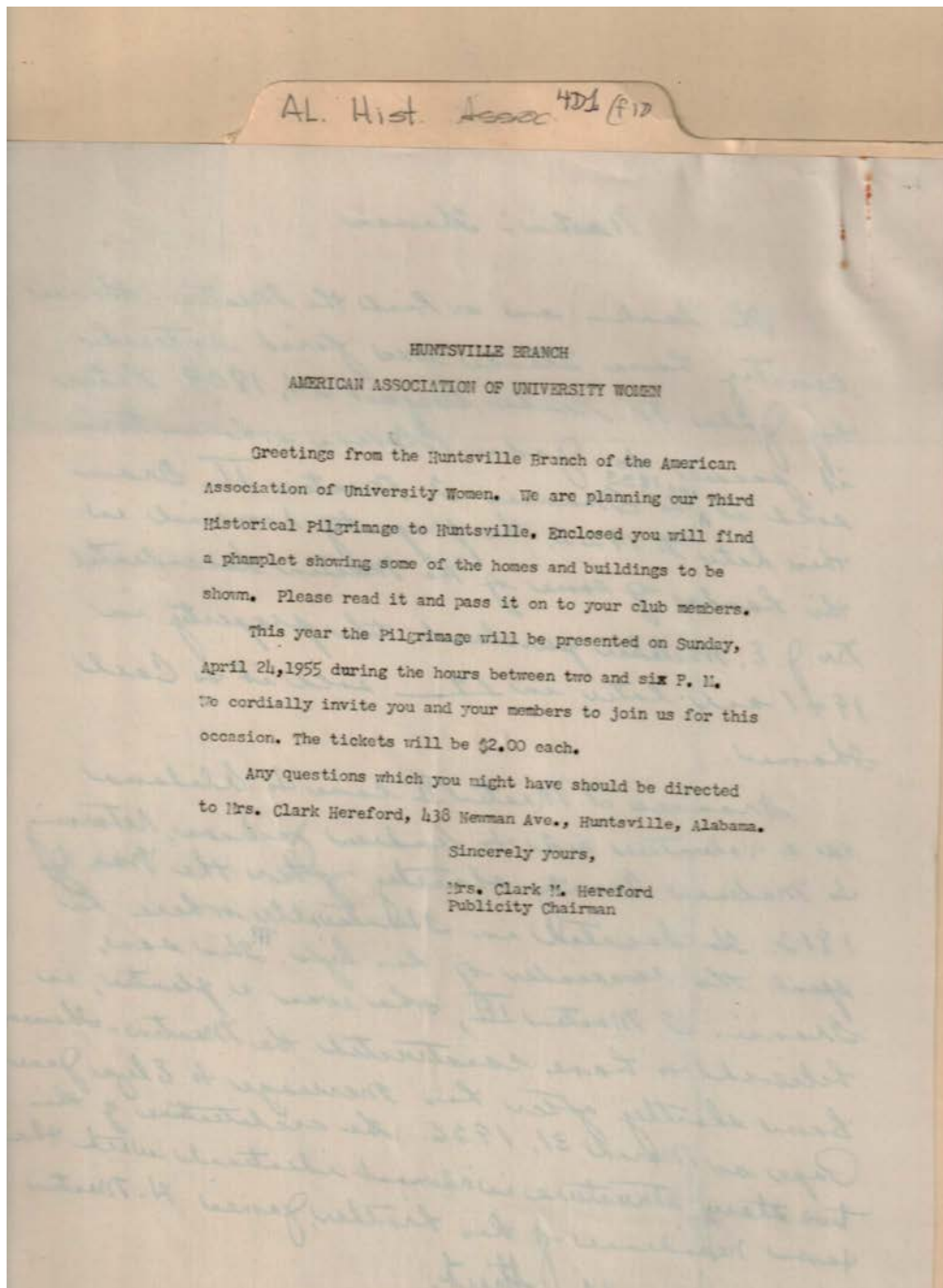

The original floor plan contained eight rooms, four downstairs connected by a wide, full-length hall with the same plan repeated in the second story. Originally the kitchen and servants quarters were in the back yard. Of especial interest are the transomed door-ways which contain lead blown glass panels.

To the right of the front hallway is the parlor, connected with the dining room by wide folding doors. The moldings, floor and window framings and beautifully inlaid mantels in these rooms show the work of a master craftsman. From the dining room one passes to the back hallway. Here a stairway, interesting because of the beautiful cherry rail and trim or the design in a leaf design, ascends to the four bedrooms found on the second floor.

In the front downstairs bedroom and the four upstairs bedrooms the mantels and woodwork are very similar in design to that found in the First National Bank Building indicating, perhaps, the influence of George Steele, local architect and builder of many fine homes.

Modern conveniences were not unknown at this plantation home, for at an early date, it

3. I contained a bathroom with running water. A dug well and an old fashioned cistern served to complement each other so as to make the source of water supply a continuous one.

Today, with a ~~few~~ modification of the two bathrooms at the first and second floors, so as to have bathrooms and a modern kitchen, the home is restored to its original beauty - charm -

The home is beautifully furnished in period pieces which are in keeping with the gracefulness of the first here.

At least one interesting mystery is attached to this residence. In 19 when the Thomas enlarged the basement to house a new heating system, an unmarked grave was unearthed. Since Indian arrow heads are found in the area, it has been speculated that it was an Indian burial. At any rate, whatever might have been the fate of this person, he has now laid peacefully beneath a spreading magnolia tree on the lower part of the lawn.
