What is the NATIONAL AERONAUTICS & SPACE ADMINISTRATION?

The United States Congress created the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) in 1958. This was less than a year after man-made satellites orbiting the earth marked the beginning of the Space Age. NASA is responsible for the exploration of space for peaceful purposes for the benefit of all mankind.

NASA headquarters is located in Washington, D. C., but research and development facilities are in many states across the nation.

The George C. Marshall Space Flight Center (MSFC) is the NASA Agency responsible for large space launch vehicles. MSFC officially began operations on July 1, 1960, in Huntsville, Alabama, with a nucleus of rocket experts who had previously worked for the Army Ballistic Missile Agency in Huntsville. The Center was named for the American General who won a Nobel prize for peace.

Marshall Space Flight Center's major task today is to provide the giant Saturn vehicles that will be used for manned exploration of the moon. For this purpose it employs directly about 7,500 men and women, and also contracts many projects to industrial firms and universities.

Historic achievements which qualified our scientists and engineers for their role at MSFC included creation and launching of the first American satellites, accomplishment of the first flight into space and recovery of animal life, and the safe completion of the first manned space flights of the United States.



Inside the Space Orientation Center, films, art, photography, and actual historic space flight hardware help visitors understand the development of rocketry and share in the exploration of space beyond the earth.

Exhibits include the actual firing panel used to launch Explorer I, America's first satellite, and a replica of Explorer I.

Reentry-heat test nosecones indicate the patient experimentation which finally enabled spacecraft to tolerate temperatures of 5000° Fahrenheit or more.

Some of the first American satellites are on display, including some that were on standby and would be orbiting the earth now if their duplicates had not attained orbit.

A Brief History of Huntsville to 1819

By 1819 Huntsville had become a thriving city in the heart of the Tennessee Valley although it had been only fourteen years since its earliest settler, John Hunt, arrived to make his home near the "Big Spring" in 1805. Events moved rapidly after the creation of Madison County by proclamation of Governor Robert Williams of the Mississippi Territory on December 13, 1808.

A survey of the public lands was completed in April of 1809, and in August of the same year they were offered for sale at a public auction by the Federal Land Office in Nashville, Tennessee, which had been created for the purpose of disposing of lands in Madison County. At this time, LeRoy Pope, a Georgia planter, bought much of the land surrounding the "Big Spring" for \$23.50 an acre. On July 5, 1810, the "Big Spring" area which had been platted by John Coffee only a month earlier was chosen as the county seat by a special commission named in an act of the Mississippi Territorial Legislature for this purpose. Although originally the town had been called Huntsville, the act provided that the county seat should be named Twickenham. According to tradition, LeRoy Pope chose to name the town Twickenham after the English home of Alexander Pope, one of his ancestors. Later the name was changed by special act of the territorial legislature on November 25, 1811, to Huntsville in honor of its first settler and incorporated on December 9, 1811.

When first laid out, the town contained sixty acres in blocks of two acres each subdivided into four lots. Half of the lots were sold to the commissioners at \$23.50 an acre, and the remaining portion of the town was retained for sale by LeRoy Pope and his associates. The commissioners then sold their holdings at auction, and the proceeds were used to construct a courthouse and jail on the public square.

So rapid was the influx of people into the area that the federal land office was moved from Nashville to Huntsville in 1811. A newspaper entitled the *Madison Gazette* was established a year later; the *Planters and Merchants Bank* was chartered in 1816; and a wide variety of business firms were established in the community to lend support to a thriving agricultural economy. A number of young lawyers and doctors also migrated to the community to begin their careers.

By 1819 Huntsville's social institutions were well developed. Provisions had been made for education, religious worship, a library, and theatrical and music performances. There was also a thriving Masonic Lodge which had been organized as early as 1811.

With such a background, it is not unusual that Huntsville should be chosen as the temporary capital during the period when Alabama made its transition from territorial status to statehood in 1819. It was here that Alabama's first constitution was drafted between July 3 and August 2; the first governor of the State of Alabama was inaugurated on November 9; and the first session of the state legislature was held from October 25 to December 17. Huntsville furnished many of the state's early political leaders including the president of the first Constitutional Convention, the chairman of the committee which drafted the constitution, the first chief justice of the State Supreme Court, and one of the first two senators from Alabama.

Memories of Huntsville 1987

In 1909 Edward Chambers Betts wrote in his little book **Historic Huntsville**, which covered the years 1804 to 1870:

Much of the wealth, culture, and refinement of the times was to be found here. Expression of the aesthetic in Huntsville's domestic life was given full vent, as is mirrored in the elegant and commodious residences erected in the early days.

Betts noted that "few parts of the State, if any, equalled Huntsville in wealth of handsome homes," and the Alabama Historical Association found this to be still true in 1987.

We visited some of Huntsville's finest antebellum homes, and it was such a pleasure to call at Col. Leroy Pope's house, now the home of the president of the University of Alabama in Huntsville.

Betts wrote that about 1815 Pope was constructing his house on "the eminence of a jagged and picturesque bluff" which was known as Pope's or Echol's Hill. The brick for Pope's house was manufactured in Tennessee and shipped by flat boats down the Tennessee River to Ditto's Landing and then hauled by wagon to Huntsville. Today the house is a center of Huntsville culture just as it was in the days when Col. Pope and Leroy Pope Walker, the first Secretary of War of the Confederate States of America, lived there and held sway over the social, economic, and political life of Huntsville.

The Association's visit to Huntsville is but a memory. Now we have the October pilgrimage to Greensboro and the spring meeting in Montgomery to anticipate.

A Visit to the Black Belt

The Greensboro Pilgrimage

October 17, 1987

The 1987 fall pilgrimage of the Association highlights the historic Black Belt town of Greensboro in Hale County. Visits to antebellum homes will focus the attention of AHA members and guests on the era when cotton was king. A cotton trading center containing no industry, Greensboro escaped the destruction of its fine homes by Wilson's raiders in 1865.

The Association will convene at **St. Paul's Episcopal Church** for coffee, registration, and the general assembly. The first Episcopal service was held in Greensboro in 1830. The present building dates from 1840 and was consecrated in 1843 by Bishop Leonidas Polk, bishop of Louisiana. When the church was enlarged in the 1870s, the style was changed from Greek Revival to Gothic.

Our next stop will be **Magnolia Grove**, a lovely setting for a bring-your-favorite-dish picnic-on-the-ground for members and guests. Now owned and operated as a public museum by the Alabama Historical Commission, Magnolia Grove was built ca. 1842 for Col. Isaac Croom of North Carolina. Croom, from a wealthy and influential North Carolina family, moved into Alabama about 1830 and became one of the state's wealthiest planters and most progressive farmers. Owning hundreds of acres in the canebrake, he chose to build Magnolia Grove as a town home in Greensboro.

Set amid extensive landscaped grounds and splendid magnolia trees, the two-story Greek Revival mansion has a number of interesting features. The twenty-eight inch thick walls are constructed of slave-made brick with masonry.

Hand-carved woodwork is featured throughout the house and an unsupported, winding stairway graces the entrance hall. Early dependencies include the cook house and servants' house. Birthplace and home of Admiral Richmond Pearson Hobson, hero of the Spanish-American War, Magnolia Grove contains a museum room featuring artifacts of the war exploits and later political career of Hobson.

Glencairn will also be open to the Association. The two-story frame home, built in 1837 for Col. John Erwin, an early Alabama lawyer and leader in the secession movement, is still occupied by his descendants. Erwin, born in Virginia of Scotch-Irish descent, moved to Kentucky when he was only seven. After his father's death four years later, Erwin supported himself as a clerk and later studied the law, gaining a reputation for fine scholarship. He and his new bride rode to Alabama on horseback in the early 1820s. After practicing law for a short time in


Marion, Erwin moved to Greensboro.

Although his first Alabama home was a log cabin, the lawyer-planter became a financial success and built Glencairn as a town house with a 180-acre plantation as his backyard. An admirer of Robert Burns, Erwin named his home for the Earl of Glencairn, a patron to the poet.

The Carson-Withers House, now owned by Harriet Privett, is said to be one of the most unusual and interesting homes in the county. Research into deed records reveals that Thomas Kelly Carson bought a house and lot in 1854, but the two-story frame house contained only four rooms. Although the actual date of construction of the original house is unknown, in 1856 the structure underwent a significant remodeling which changed the style and enlarged the home. The original dwelling, of a box-like classical design, faced south; after the remodeling the house faced east and became a rambling cottage, much in vogue at the time, of arabesque design.

The Carson family occupied the house until the 1890s; in 1929 W.R. Withers and his wife purchased and restored the home.

The Association's general assembly for the fall pilgrimage will be held at St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

The oldest home in Greensboro, the **Noel-Ramsey House** (originally known as the French House or Noel-Dorman House), is now owned by the Historic Hale County Preservation Society. The house was built by Jean Baptiste (Thomas) Noel, a French immigrant to the area.

Fleeing the French colony of Santo Domingo after the famous slave insurrection, Noel and his wife, Anne Deolice Hurtel, joined other French refugees in Alabama's Vine and Olive Colony. When the colony failed, the Noel family moved (ca. 1820) to New Troy where Greensboro now stands. The house was under construction by 1821, making it not only one of the oldest homes in Hale County but also one of the oldest in Alabama north of Mobile. In contrast to the Southern tradition of spacious grounds, Noel built his home directly adjacent to the street in a French urban style. In 1834 Noel sold the home to his son-in-law Benjamin Dorman. A large two-story wing was added to the square frame house in the 1880s.

Magnolia Hall, a two-story frame home, is considered to be one of the finest examples of the temple form of Greek Revival architecture in the region and the nation. Six fluted Ionic columns, which rise the full height of the residence on the front and rear, create a striking appearance. Iron grillwork balconies are also repeated front and back.

Now the home of M.D. Baines, Magnolia Hall was built ca. 1855 for David F. McCrary, a prosperous Greensboro businessman. The property, originally containing over six acres, also included such dependencies as a frame servants' house, a smokehouse, and an icehouse.

The Oaks, a lovely home also known as the Happel-Wadsworth-Stickney House, is set among century-old oak trees, supposedly planted by Mrs. Philip Happel. Mr. Happel, a prominent merchant-tailor of Greensboro, bought the property in 1844 and probably built the house in 1845. In 1880 Rev. Edward Wadsworth, a leading Alabama educator who was on the first faculty of Southern University and served as president from 1868 to 1870, bought the home. Mrs. Wadsworth sold the home in 1900 to Joseph B. Stickney. Today The Oaks is owned by J.B. Stickney III.

The front of the two-story frame home is set off by four large square columns rising to decorative capitals at the roof. A second story veranda graces the full width of the house. Double doors flanked by fine glass lead to a large entry hallway and a stairway with magnificent mahogany spindles and rail. Floors throughout the house are of the traditional wide heart pine.

Greensboro: A Proud Heritage

Greensboro, host for the 1987 fall pilgrimage of the Alabama Historical Association, is one of the oldest towns in Alabama. In 1816, three years before Alabama became a state, the first settlements were made in and around what is now known as Greensboro. The pioneers came from Georgia, Tennessee, Kentucky, North and South Carolina. Choctaw Indians still lived in the area. The town was first known as Troy and continued to be known by that name until 1823 when it was renamed Greensboro and incorporated.

Subsequently, French settlers came from the Vine and Olive Colony in Marengo County to lend their influence. When the attempt at raising olives and grapes failed, some of the Frenchmen, refugees from Napoleon's defeated army after the Battle of Waterloo, moved to Greensboro. The oldest house in Greensboro, the Noel-Ramsey House, was built by one of these citizens.

In the period 1826-1845, when Tuscaloosa was the state capital,

nearby Greensboro was very active politically. It was the home of three Alabama governors—Governor Israel Pickens, third governor of the state; Governor John Gayle, whose daughter Amelia married Josiah Gorgas, president of The University of Alabama, and whose son, William Crawford Gorgas, became famous for conquering yellow fever; and Governor Thomas Seay whose descendants still live in the town.

The many antebellum homes that make the town distinctive give evidence of Greensboro's long and proud heritage. Among the remaining structures are Magnolia Grove, the Noel-Ramsey House, Japonica Path, Magnolia Hall, Greenwood, Sunset Hill, Multiflora, Glencairn, and Brick Spring.

Greensboro is also the location of many interesting churches—two of which, the Presbyterian and the Episcopal, are antebellum structures. St. Paul's Episcopal Church is the third oldest Episcopal church in the state (the oldest being in Mobile and Tuscaloosa). The first

bishop of Alabama, Rt. Rev. Nicholas Hamner Cobbs, was ordained in Greensboro by the bishop of Louisiana, Leonidas Polk, later a Confederate general. Many of Bishop Cobbs' descendants still live in Greensboro.

Greensboro has special significance for other denominations as well. Alabama Baptists organized their state convention in Greensboro in 1823. The Greensboro Presbyterian Church is an interesting Neo-Gothic structure of hand-made brick made by slave labor, containing a gallery where slaves sat and worshipped in the same church with their masters. The history of the First United Methodist Church and the old Southern University (which later merged with Birmingham College to become Birmingham-Southern College in Birmingham) were closely mingled. Many of the early pastors of the church were professors and graduates of the Southern University.

Most of the business section of Greensboro is listed on the Na-

tional Register of Historic Places. The buildings are, for the most part, Victorian architecture with beautiful brickwork which has become a lost art in these busy times. Magnolia Grove, maintained by the State of Alabama as a museum, is also on the National Register. The home of Admiral Richmond Pearson Hobson, the Spanish-American War hero, Magnolia Grove stands at the end of Main Street.

Located in West Central Alabama, Greensboro is 90 miles northwest of Montgomery, 175 miles north of Mobile, 90 miles southeast of Birmingham, 35 miles south of Tuscaloosa, and 50 miles west of Selma. The town has a population of 3,172.



Greensboro lies between two distinct geological areas of the state. The town is situated exactly at the last foothills of the Appalachian Mountains. South of Greensboro is the Black Belt or Canebrake region. Covered by rich black soil, this section was heavily forested when the first settlers arrived. An impenetrable growth of cane beneath the first cover required a large labor force to clear; therefore, the early settlement of the canebrake area was done by wealthy planters coming from Virginia and the Carolinas with caravans of slaves. It is claimed that nowhere else in America was such a combination of labor, capital, and intelligence used to subdue a dense wilderness. Between 1830 and 1860, the Canebrake, with the highest type of agrarian civilization, had a promising future for culture, education, wealth, and happiness. Cotton was king, and great plantation homes dotted the kingdom.

But through the years cotton as the main crop of the area gave way to timber, beef and dairy cattle, chickens, soybeans, and now catfish. Greensboro has two catfish processing plants which contribute significantly to the economy. The largest catfish producing area in the state, Greensboro is also one of the largest in the nation. Catfish are shipped to the entire United States. Greensboro and Hale County constitute one of the most significant agricultural areas in the state of Alabama with about 20 million dollars per year in agriculturally related industries.

Many illustrious Alabamians named Greensboro as home: the Tutwiler family, who contributed so much to education in the state; Admiral Richmond Pearson Hobson; Congressman Armistead I. Selden who was later ambassador to New Zealand; and the current president of Auburn University, Dr. James E. Martin.

Today Greensboro is a lovely town in which to live and an historic setting for the 1987 pilgrimage of the Alabama Historical Association.

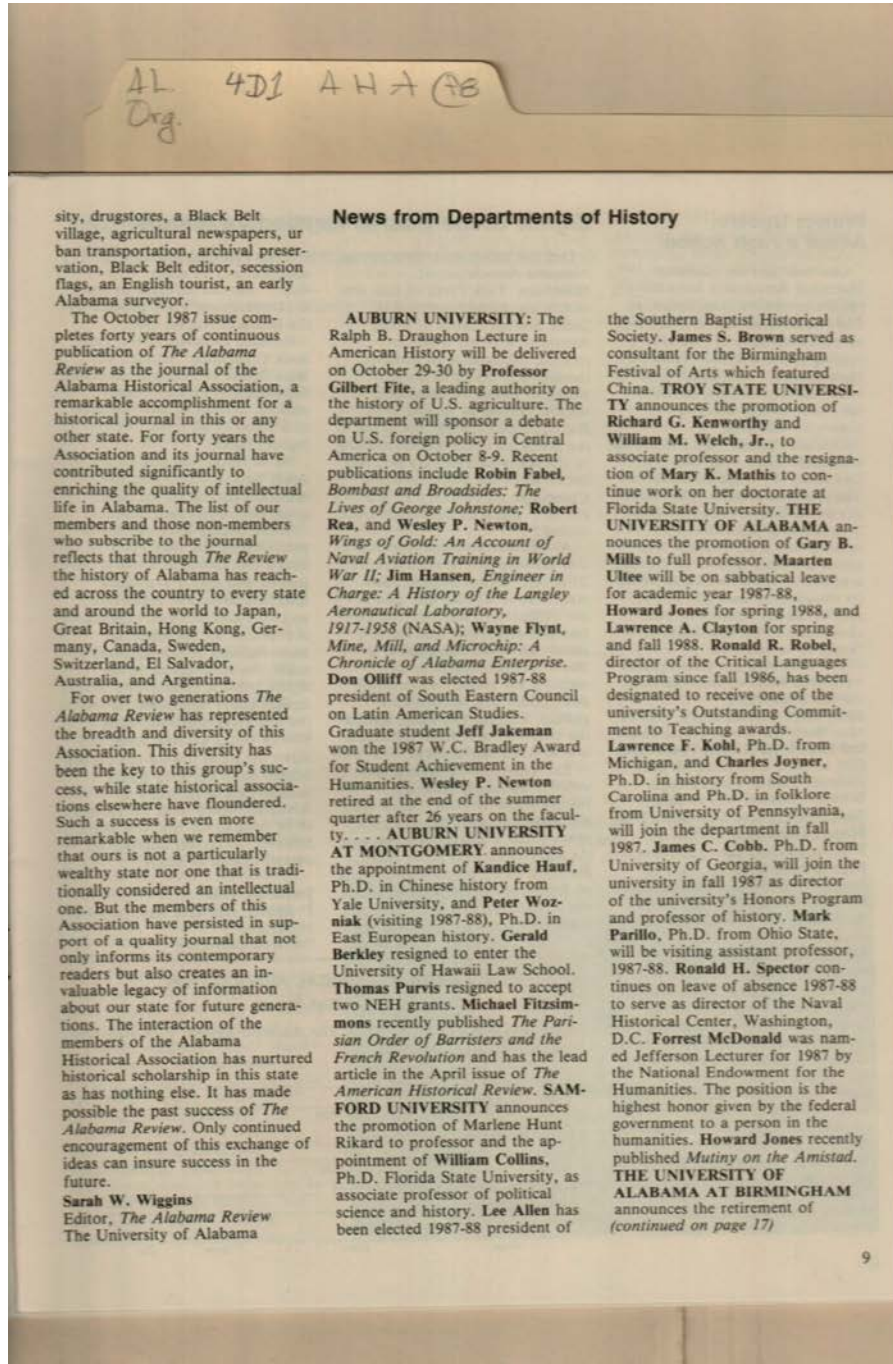

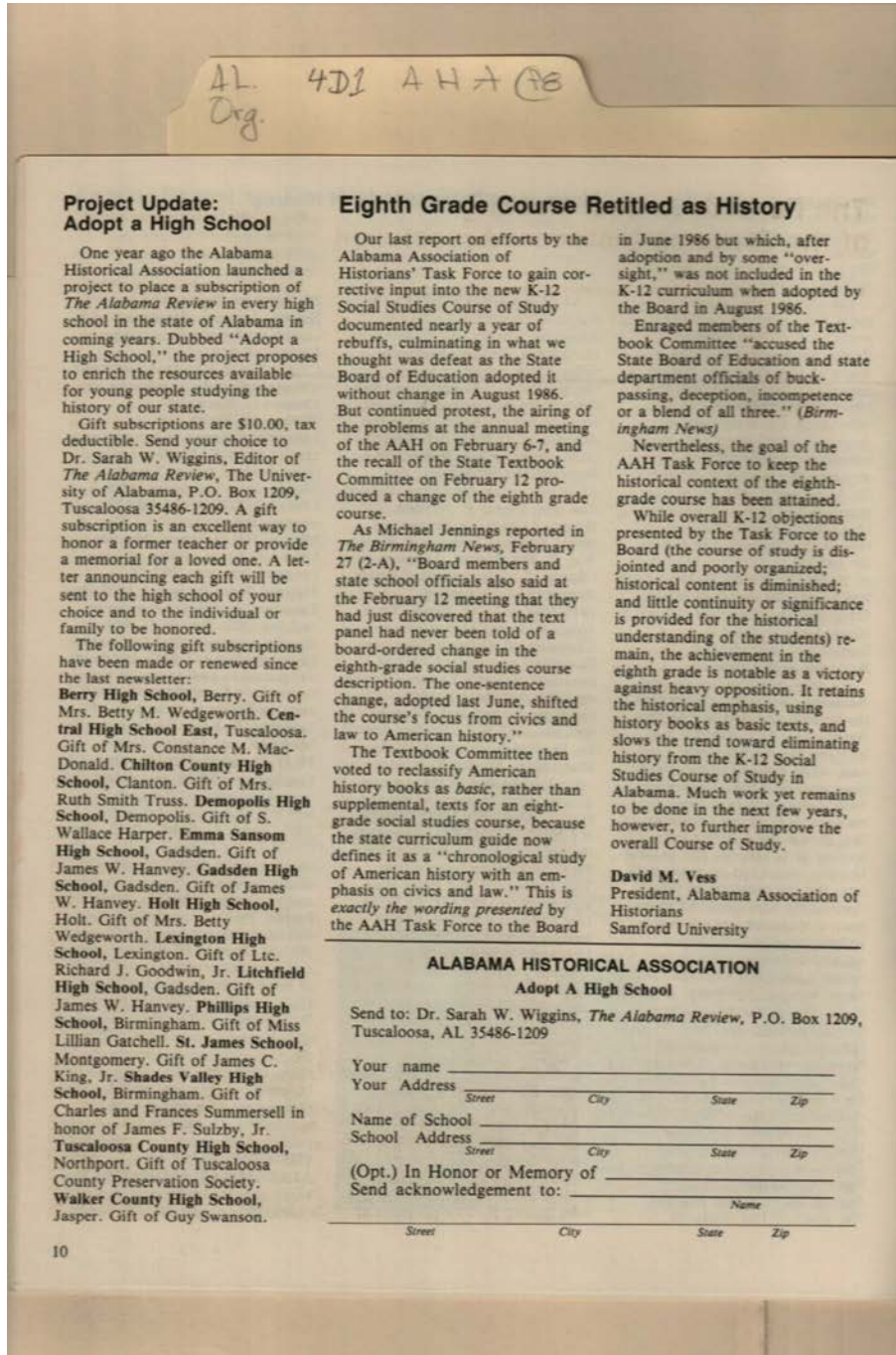

Eighth Grade Course Retitled as History

Our last report on efforts by the Alabama Association of Historians' Task Force to gain corrective input into the new K-12 Social Studies Course of Study documented nearly a year of rebuffs, culminating in what we thought was defeat as the State Board of Education adopted it without change in August 1986. But continued protest, the airing of the problems at the annual meeting of the AAH on February 6-7, and the recall of the State Textbook Committee on February 12 produced a change of the eighth grade course.

As Michael Jennings reported in *The Birmingham News*, February 27 (2-A), "Board members and state school officials also said at the February 12 meeting that they had just discovered that the text panel had never been told of a board-ordered change in the eighth-grade social studies course description. The one-sentence change, adopted last June, shifted the course's focus from civics and law to American history."

The Textbook Committee then voted to reclassify American history books as *basic*, rather than supplemental, texts for an eighth-grade social studies course, because the state curriculum guide now defines it as a "chronological study of American history with an emphasis on civics and law." This is *exactly the wording presented by the AAH Task Force to the Board*

in June 1986 but which, after adoption and by some "oversight," was not included in the K-12 curriculum when adopted by the Board in August 1986.

Enraged members of the Textbook Committee "accused the State Board of Education and state department officials of buck-passing, deception, incompetence or a blend of all three." (*Birmingham News*)

Nevertheless, the goal of the AAH Task Force to keep the historical context of the eighth-grade course has been attained.

While overall K-12 objections presented by the Task Force to the Board (the course of study is disjointed and poorly organized; historical content is diminished; and little continuity or significance is provided for the historical understanding of the students) remain, the achievement in the eighth grade is notable as a victory against heavy opposition. It retains the historical emphasis, using history books as basic texts, and slows the trend toward eliminating history from the K-12 Social Studies Course of Study in Alabama. Much work yet remains to be done in the next few years, however, to further improve the overall Course of Study.

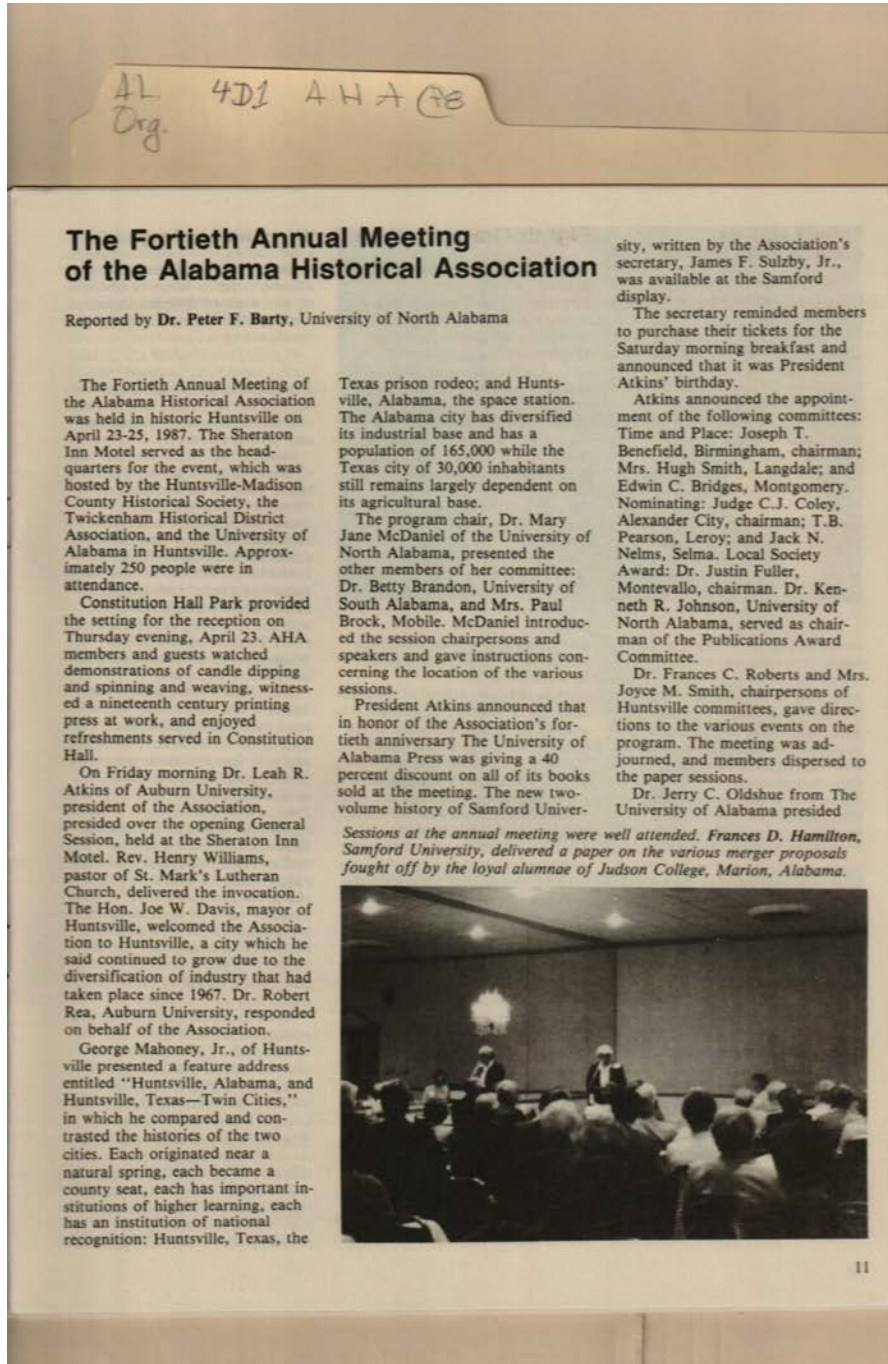

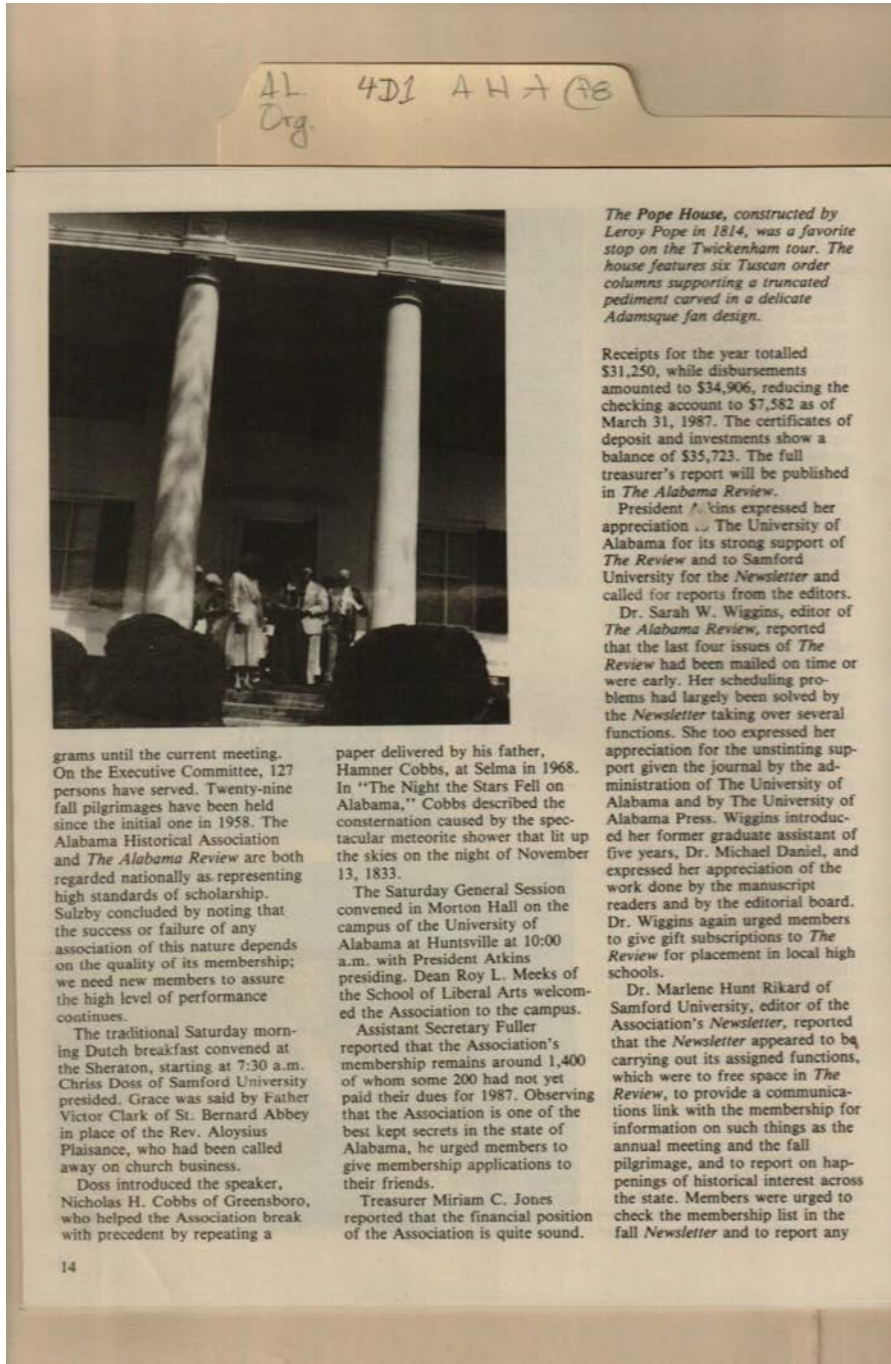

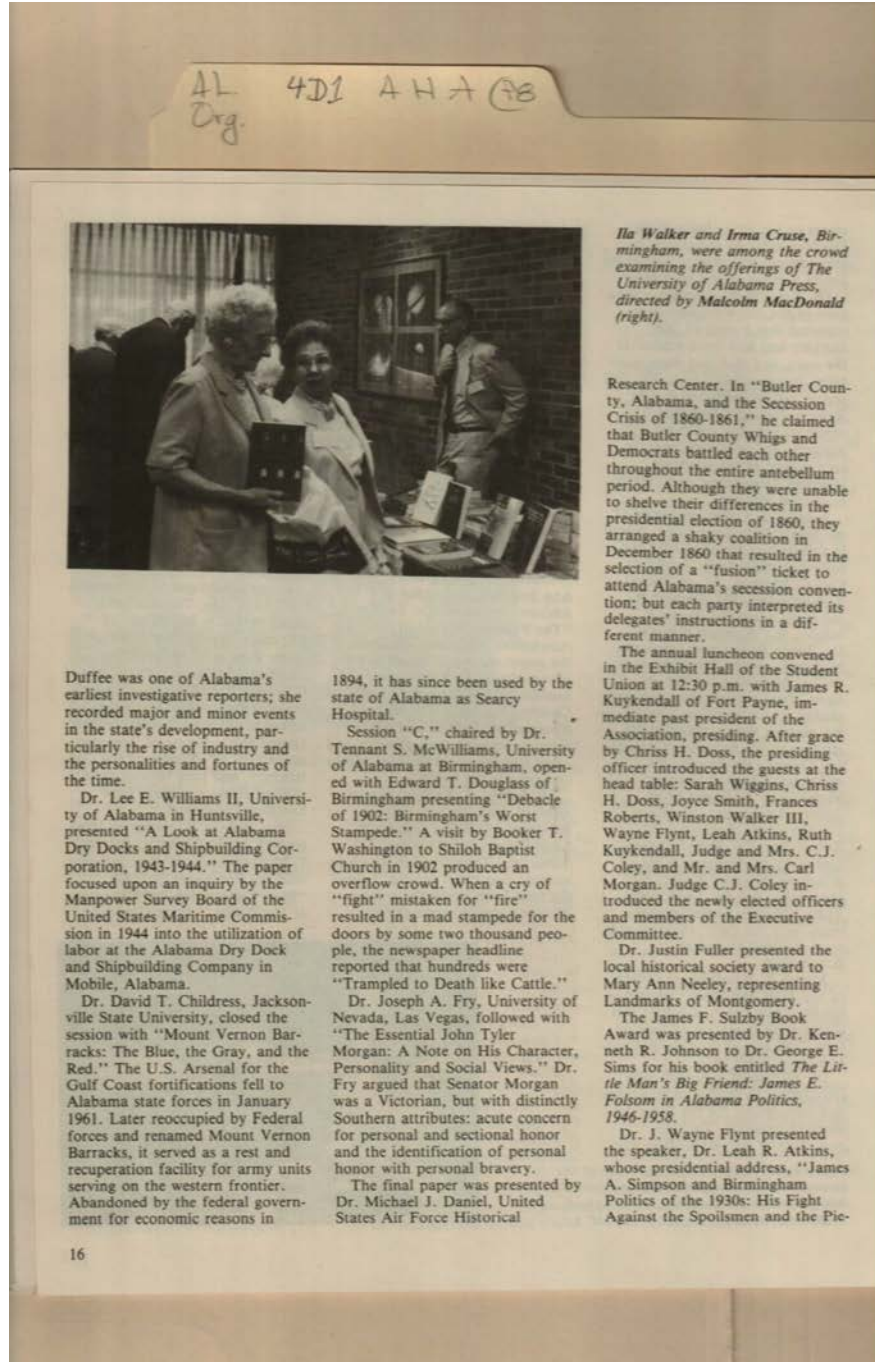

Duffee was one of Alabama's earliest investigative reporters; she recorded major and minor events in the state's development, particularly the rise of industry and the personalities and fortunes of the time.

Dr. Lee E. Williams II, University of Alabama in Huntsville, presented "A Look at Alabama Dry Docks and Shipbuilding Corporation, 1943-1944." The paper focused upon an inquiry by the Manpower Survey Board of the United States Maritime Commission in 1944 into the utilization of labor at the Alabama Dry Dock and Shipbuilding Company in Mobile, Alabama.

Dr. David T. Childress, Jacksonville State University, closed the session with "Mount Vernon Barracks: The Blue, the Gray, and the Red." The U.S. Arsenal for the Gulf Coast fortifications fell to Alabama state forces in January 1961. Later reoccupied by Federal forces and renamed Mount Vernon Barracks, it served as a rest and recuperation facility for army units serving on the western frontier. Abandoned by the federal government for economic reasons in

1894, it has since been used by the state of Alabama as Searcy Hospital.

Session "C," chaired by Dr. Tennant S. McWilliams, University of Alabama at Birmingham, opened with Edward T. Douglass of Birmingham presenting "Debate of 1902: Birmingham's Worst Stampede." A visit by Booker T. Washington to Shiloh Baptist Church in 1902 produced an overflow crowd. When a cry of "fight" mistaken for "fire" resulted in a mad stampede for the doors by some two thousand people, the newspaper headline reported that hundreds were "Trampled to Death like Cattle."

Dr. Joseph A. Fry, University of Nevada, Las Vegas, followed with "The Essential John Tyler Morgan: A Note on His Character, Personality and Social Views." Dr. Fry argued that Senator Morgan was a Victorian, but with distinctly Southern attributes: acute concern for personal and sectional honor and the identification of personal honor with personal bravery.

The final paper was presented by Dr. Michael J. Daniel, United States Air Force Historical

Research Center. In "Butler County, Alabama, and the Secession Crisis of 1860-1861," he claimed that Butler County Whigs and Democrats battled each other throughout the entire antebellum period. Although they were unable to shelve their differences in the presidential election of 1860, they arranged a shaky coalition in December 1860 that resulted in the selection of a "fusion" ticket to attend Alabama's secession convention; but each party interpreted its delegates' instructions in a different manner.

The annual luncheon convened in the Exhibit Hall of the Student Union at 12:30 p.m. with James R. Kuykendall of Fort Payne, immediate past president of the Association, presiding. After grace by Chriss H. Doss, the presiding officer introduced the guests at the head table: Sarah Wiggins, Chriss H. Doss, Joyce Smith, Frances Roberts, Winston Walker III, Wayne Flynt, Leah Atkins, Ruth Kuykendall, Judge and Mrs. C.J. Coley, and Mr. and Mrs. Carl Morgan. Judge C.J. Coley introduced the newly elected officers and members of the Executive Committee.

Dr. Justin Fuller presented the local historical society award to Mary Ann Neeley, representing Landmarks of Montgomery.

The James F. Sulzby Book Award was presented by Dr. Kenneth R. Johnson to Dr. George E. Sims for his book entitled *The Little Man's Big Friend: James E. Folsom in Alabama Politics, 1946-1958*.

Dr. J. Wayne Flynt presented the speaker, Dr. Leah R. Atkins, whose presidential address, "James A. Simpson and Birmingham Politics of the 1930s: His Fight Against the Spoilsmen and the Pie-
