specified that the Director shall issue an Official and Statistical Register, not only to include sketches of the members of the House and Senate, the Congress of the United States and the several State officials but to officially fix the population of all Counties, to officially record the election statistics and to publish miscellaneous statistics that appear to be of interest. Particular detail was set out as to the duties of the Department in collecting military archives and records, census data as applied to the State of Alabama from the beginning, records, documents, newspaper files and such from the County subdivisions of the State.

The Department since its creation has brought together by deposit from the several County officials, through gifts of the various newspapers in the State and through individuals, the largest collection of newspapers applicable to the particular State, in the hands of any other institution of the kind in America. Thousands of bound volumes of newspapers are available in our collections and students make liberal use of this rich store of material. Since the creation of the Department the library has grown very substantially from year to year and now embodies a large group of material covering the field of early pioneer emigration into this new country, the biographies of original settlers, compiled lists of all members of the Legislature, the militia lists of all who were required to perform duty from the period of 1819 down to date and in addition to those things the library has brought together rich collections of material on the families and the background history of most of our early settlers when the family was seated in the other Southern States. More than 250,000 volumes are on our shelves.

The Department has built up a large collection of aboriginal and pioneer material of an illustrative class, this now housed in museum display cases. This in itself serves to show the activities of the people of the region from prehistoric days down to the present time.

In the more than fifty years of the life of the Department several thousand manuscripts and documents have been added to the collections. These are in addition to the archival material which in-

cludes all of the civil, political and military records of Alabama from the creation of the Territory down to the present. These manuscript records include the family papers of many of the State's representative men and women. Thousands of letters written home from the Confederate Army are in the collections. The Department also has numbers of letters from men who participated in the Mexican War, Spanish-American War and material relative to the history of World War I and II, is included. Obviously, all official records of a military character are a part of our collection.

The Department has more than 350 portraits of representative Alabama men and women. Thousands of pictures, illustrations, and the like are in our collections. The art collections include many representative pieces of valuable items. Sections of the museum are set apart to illustrate the French period of Alabama, including the Vine and Olive Colony effort of 1818, the Mobile Colonial period and the French military connection with the early settlement dates. Modern art, the work of Alabamians, is well represented and aboriginal art forms a very representative collection.

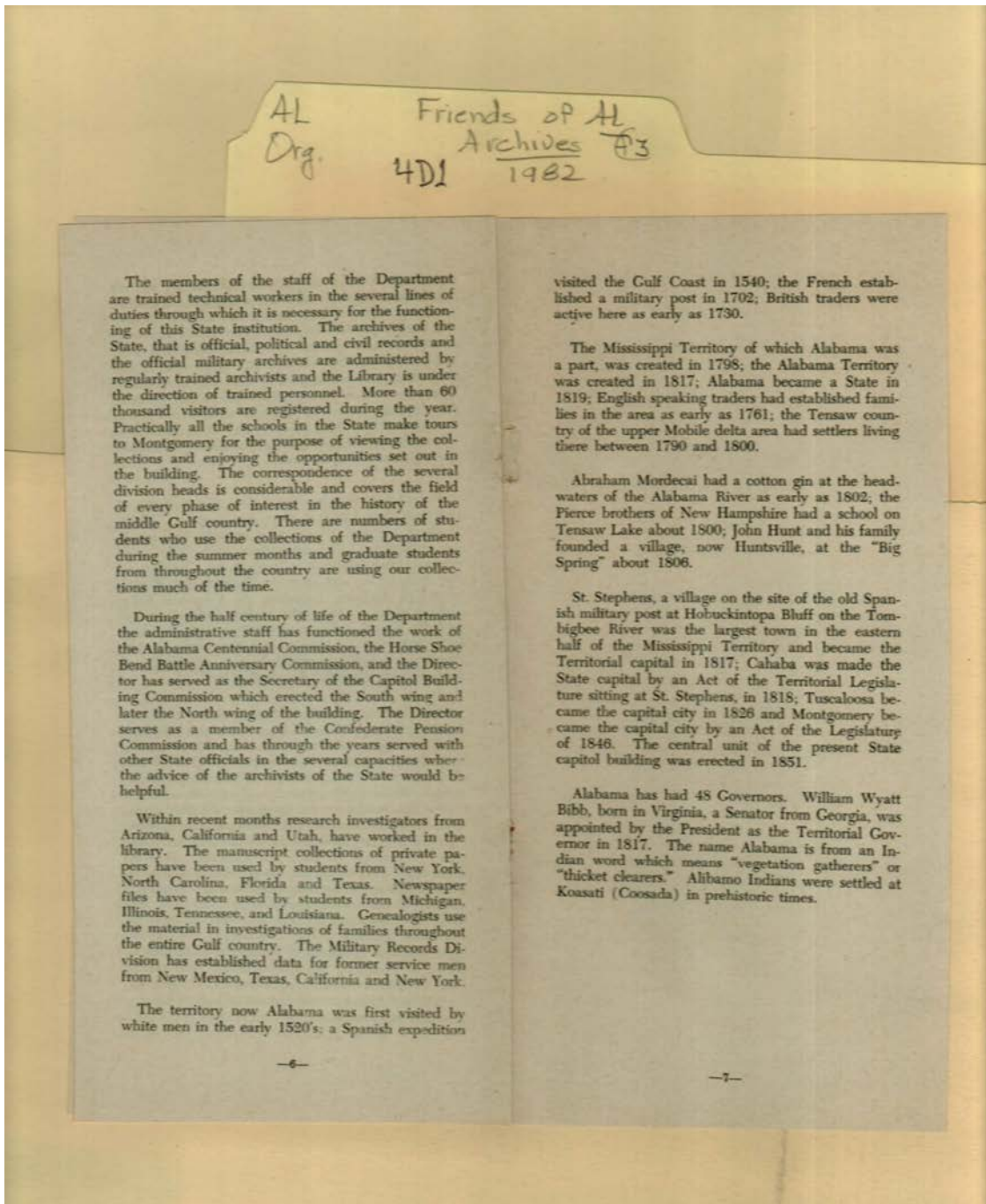
The Department of Archives and History is housed in the Alabama World War Memorial Building which was completed in 1940. This building is in itself a very representative demonstration of the life of Alabama. It is a monolith of two floors underground, three above ground and an attic and the usable floor space covers more than 92,000 square feet. Alabama marble has been effectively used throughout and practically all of the structural materials which go to make the building are from Alabama. The iron and the steel are from the Birmingham district, the marble from the Sylacauga quarries, the sand and gravel from the upper Alabama River area and the lime and cement from east and west Alabama. The structure is one of the most beautiful examples of utilitarian memorials in America. Funds for the construction of the building were derived from a combination of Federal aid through the W.P.A., contributions of individual citizens and State monies.

Hamilton is Howard Lecturer for Annual Meeting

Dr. Virginia Van der Veer Hamilton, professor of history at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, will deliver the fourth annual Milo B. Howard, Jr. Lecture on Saturday, February 21, 1987. "Good Times, Bad Times: Lister Hill and His Montgomery Constituents" will be the title of her talk which is scheduled to begin at 1:30 p.m. in the Howard Auditorium. The Howard Lecture is presented as part of the annual meeting of the Friends of the Alabama Archives.

Dr. Hamilton received her A.B. and M.A. degrees from Birmingham-Southern College and her Ph.D. from the University of Alabama. Hamilton joined the University of Alabama faculty in 1965. She is the author of five books. These are the official Bicentennial history of Alabama, part of a 51-state series sponsored by the American Association for State and Local History and the National Endowment for the Humanities and published by W.W. Norton; two officially adopted Alabama history textbooks, one for ninth grades and one for fourth grades; a guidebook to the state's historical sites; and a study of the Alabama political career of Hugo L. Black. She is also the editor of the book, *Hugo Black and the Bill of Rights*. She is currently completing a companion study of Black's successor in the U.S. Senate entitled *Lister Hill: Statesman from the South* which will be published in the Fall of 1987 by the University of North Carolina Press.

Hamilton has also published a number of articles in scholarly journals and *American Heritage Magazine*.

Professor Hamilton has won a number of awards for her writings, including the 1982 James Harvey Robinson Prize awarded by the American Historical Association to recognize her textbooks as the best teaching aids in

the field of history produced in the nation during the period 1978-1981; awards of merit from the American Association for State and Local History and the Alabama Historical Commission; and an author award from the Alabama Library Association for the best non-fiction book published in 1973. She has also been elected to the Society of American Historians which limits its membership to 220 historians who write with literary distinction.

We Regretfully Note —
Mrs. Frances Frazer Brannon, widow of former Director Peter A. Brannon, passed away on Saturday, January 10, 1987, at the age of 102. Plans are underway to dedicate the re-designed Indian exhibit gallery in memory of Peter Brannon for his lifelong work documenting Alabama's Indians. Contributions made to the Friends of the Alabama Archives Memorial Fund in the name of Frances or Peter Brannon will be used to purchase a plaque to identify this room and to enhance exhibits in the refurbished gallery.

Friends Annual Meeting To Feature Recently Discovered Silent Film

Last spring, staff members in the State Treasurer's Office came across a reel of silent film. Upon examination it was discovered that the film had probably been produced in the early part of 1911 and that it included the Archives' first director, Thomas M. Owen. The film could be dated by the several reenactments commemorating the fiftieth anniversary of Alabama's secession from the United States recorded in the footage. In addition, there is a scene of Governor Emmett O'Neal making a speech, as well as assorted views of Montgomery.

To properly preserve the film, the Arrangement and Description staff of the Archives contracted to have a 35mm and two 16mm prints made from the original 35mm print.

The Friends of the Alabama Archives will be treated to the premiere viewing of this film during the annual meeting.

Tips from the INSIDE

The Social Census

The Social Census, along with the Agriculture Census, Manufacturers Census, and Mortality Schedule, was one of the non-population censuses taken for the years ending June 1st, 1850, 1860, 1870, and 1880. Information was compiled from public records and reports, from officers of state and local government, and also from private individuals. The Alabama Department of Archives and History has the Social Census for the years 1860 and 1870 in manuscript form and on microfilm. Persons writing county or local histories, as well as historians doing socio-economic studies of Alabama's counties during the middle decades of the nineteenth century, might find the Social Census a useful and interesting research source.

The schedule is arranged alphabetically by county. The U.S. Marshal and his assistants who gathered the information were supplied with folio sheets which contained the following questions. 1. Aggregate value of real and personal estate (how valued; true valuation in dollars); 2. Aggregate amount of taxes assessed annually (state, county, parish, town, road tax; how paid); 3. Schools (colleges, academies, free schools, private schools; number of schoolhouses; amount of money raised by tax and other ways for schools during the last year); 4. Seasons and crops (main crops raised; length of production for each crop; average crop); 5. Libraries (social — such as gentlemen's clubs and Masonic organizations, colleges, academies and public schools, Sunday Schools, etc.); 6. Newspapers and periodicals (titles; character or political alignment; how often published; circulation); 7. Religion (number of churches; names and/or denominations; number each church will accommodate; value of the church property); 8. Paupers (number of paupers supported during the past year; native or foreign; cost of supporting paupers during the last year); 9. Criminals (number convicted of crime during year ending June 1st; number in prison on June 1st; annual cost of support); 10. Wages (average monthly wages to a farmhand with board and without board; average day wages to a day laborer with board; average day wages to a carpenter without board; weekly wages to a female domestic with board; and price of board to laboring men per week).

In 1860, items of taxable personal property included: gold and silver watches and gold fob chains, clocks, Bowie knives, cigars, race horses and stud horses, playing cards, money loaned and money hoarded, jewelry, plate, steamboats and other water craft, and slaves under 60 years of age.

The valuation of real and personal estates and the amount of taxes paid annually, as well as the statistics on agriculture and the number of poor, reveal the financial condition of a county to the researcher. The number of schools, libraries, and newspapers published indicate the number of citizens who regarded education as very important, and the number of churches suggests the number of persons who considered religious values and worship important.

By comparing the social statistics recorded for one county with those of other counties, the researcher could determine the degree of social, economic, cultural, educational and financial health and development of a geographic area.

Indeed, the Social Census can be regarded as a kind of socio-economic balance sheet for a county which delineates the overall quality of life of its citizens.

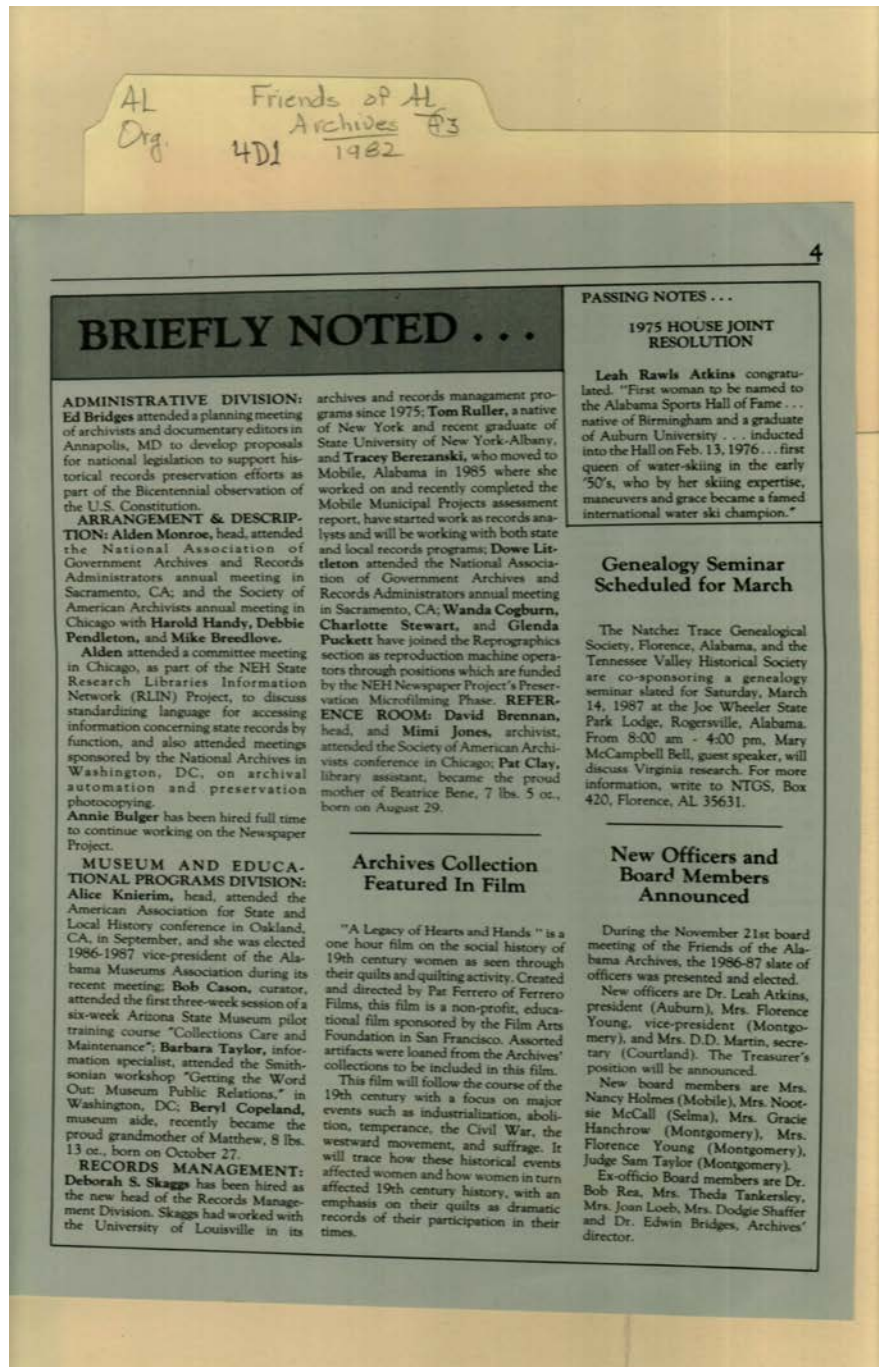

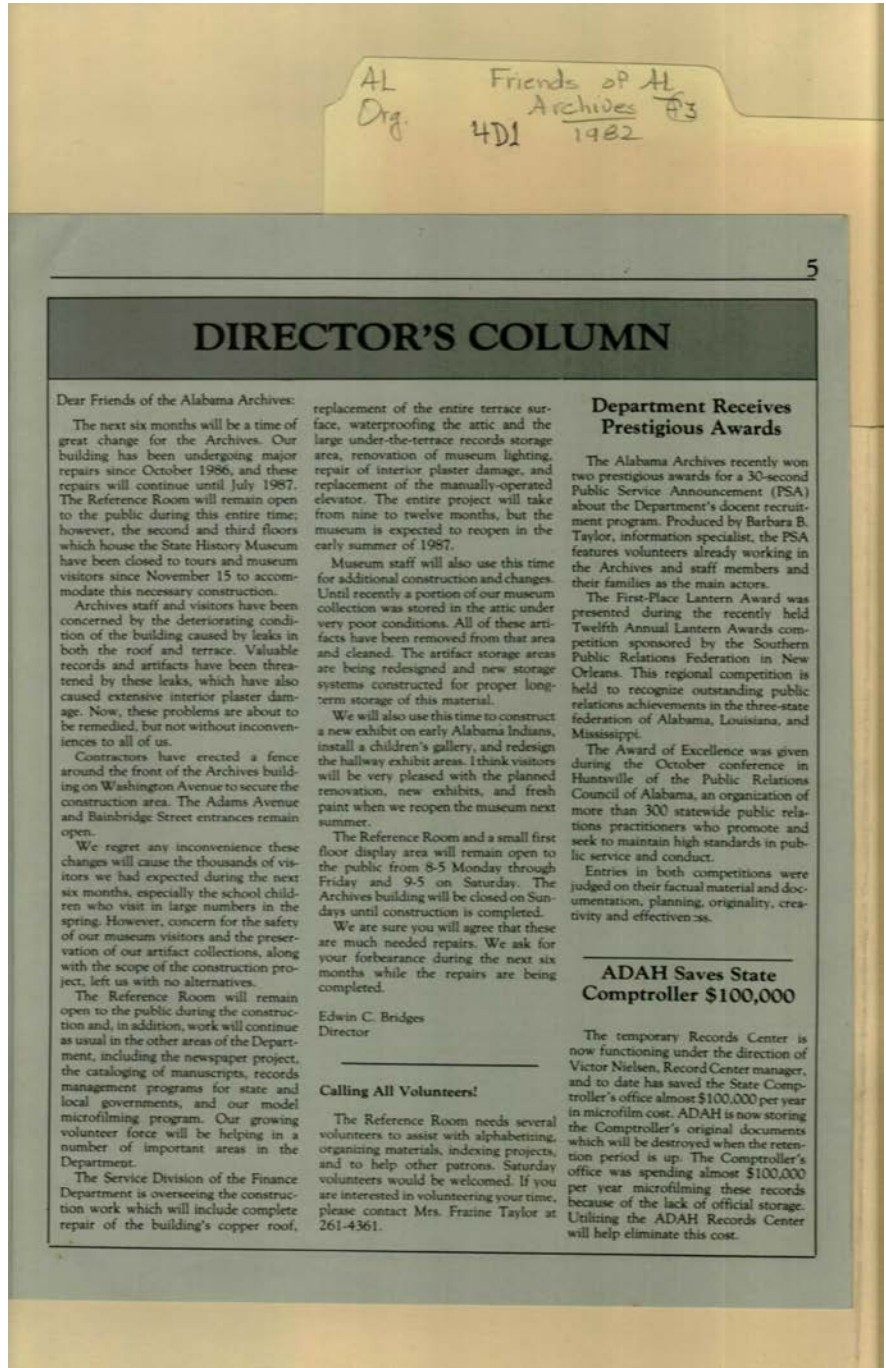

Archives Theft Emphasizes Security Needs

In spite of increased security efforts, theft has long been a problem in almost every major archives, museum, and library in the world. The April discovery of a theft of materials from the Alabama Archives has triggered an extensive analysis of the condition and needs of the Department.

During this analysis, the problems of inadequate space, lack of proper storage environments for historical materials, the massive size of the collections, and the huge backlog of uncataloged and unprocessed materials were all identified as major problems which will require a substantially expanded and sustained commitment over a period of years to resolve.

In the last few years, however, the Archives has taken a number of major steps to improve security for its holdings of records and artifacts:

1. A formal registration system has been initiated for researchers, and all research has been centralized in one area to improve surveillance and control of the use of archival materials.
2. A written checkout system has been established to create an audit trail for all original records or rare artifacts that are used by researchers.
3. A centralized inventory control system has been instituted to log in and track all materials.
4. Formal procedures have been established for approving and monitoring all loaned items.
5. The microfilm program has been expanded to provide greater physical security for fragile or valuable collections and to provide backup security copies.
6. Staff members have begun developing a computerized catalog of the Archives' entire holdings.
7. New key control systems and access restrictions have been placed on record and artifact storage areas. Access is now limited to staff members who are authorized to work with those materials. (The building itself, with its numerous storage areas and inadequate space, makes control over our storage areas a continuing problem despite these efforts to be more restrictive.)
8. A twenty-four hour electronic monitoring system has been installed to detect any building break-ins that may occur during hours when staff members are not present.

October 22 marked the first meeting of the Alabama Chapter of the Association for Information and Image Management (AIIM) at the Archives.

A large audience of fifteen members and forty-six guests listened to Kim Connolly Sackett, chapter coordinator from the national AIIM headquarters in Silver Springs, Maryland, speak about the benefits of joining AIIM and watched a newly developed video on recent advancements in the information technology field.
