## UNIVERSAL PAIN DESTROYER.

### VEGETABLE MEDICINE.

Keep it in your house; sickness comes when least expected—every one their own doctor when they have this medicine on hand. Strict attention must be given to the directions for using. Must be poured from the bottle on the affected part.

It is an internal and external medicine, can be used at any time without any possible danger. General directions for taking the medicine internally. Dose for an adult from one teaspoonful to one tablespoonful. Dose for a child 6 years old, half teaspoonful; 3 years old, 20 drops; 13 years old, 10 drops; one month old, 2 drops. Females do not require as much as males.

**Cholera, Diarrhoea, Cholera Morbus, Dysentery and Flux**—Bathe the stomach and bowels freely with the medicine, and take one teaspoonful diluted in water, every half hour, until relieved.

**Colds and Bronchial affections**—Gargle in the throat with one teaspoonful of the medicine. Repeat in 20 minutes if not relieved. Bathe the chest freely with Destroyer of Pain. On going to bed take one teaspoonful in half cup of warm water, well sweetened.

**For Colic, Cramps or Pains in the Stomach**—Bathe the bowels and stomach freely, and take one teaspoonful in half cup of water, every 20 minutes until relieved.

**Rheumatism, Pain in the Back, Side, Shoulders, &c.**—Bathe the parts affected freely, and take one teaspoonful 3 times a day.

**Coughs**—Take 20 drops mixed in molasses every half hour till relieved. Bathe the throat, chest and sides with the medicine.

**Stings of Insects and Bites of Poisons**—Repeller—Take one teaspoonful diluted in water, if not relieved in 30 minutes, repeat. Bind a piece of cotton to the place, wet with the medicine, and repeat every 30 minutes till relieved. The worst cases of rattlesnake bite are soon cured.

**Toothache**—Clean out hollow; wet a piece of cotton and apply it over hollow, keeping lips closed.

**Nervous and Sick Headache**—Take teaspoonful in water, and bathe the temples freely with the medicine.

**Neuralgia**—Teaspoonful in water 3 times a day and bathe affected parts freely.

**Ear ache**—wet a piece of cotton and rub round the ear, and put a piece of cotton in the ear—wet with medicine.

**Palpitation of the Heart and Heart Burn**—Take teaspoonful in wineglass of water 3 times a day.

**Scalds or Burns**—Dilute the medicine half water and apply with a piece of old linen.

**Old Sores and Wounds**—Wash well 3 times a day, using no soap; dilute the medicine one sixth water and apply 3 times a day on cotton, keeping a piece of linen between cotton and sore.

**Chills**—Tablespoonful in half cup of water, commencing 4 hours before chill time.—Juss every hour until chill time has passed; take 3 doses next chill day and 3 doses on third, seventh, fourteenth, twenty-first and twenty-eighth days—sure cure. Use no better milk.

**Cramp**—Give medicine according to age, and bathe breast and throat well with medicine.

**Inflammation of Kidneys**—Take 3 teaspoonful a day, and rub the medicine over the kidneys 3 times a day.

Stops blood by applying and pouring on the place.

The medicine is put up in one and two ounce bottles and sold at 50 cents and 60 cents per bottle. Large size \$6 00 per doz. Small size \$3 00 per doz.
