 Central incisors... 5th to 8th month
 Lateral incisors... 7th to 10th month
 First molars... 12th to 14th month
 Canines... 16th to 20th month
 Second molars... 20th to 30th month

SECOND DENTITION

First molars... 5th to 7th year
 Central incisors... 7th to 8th year
 Lateral incisors... 8th to 9th year
 First bicuspid... 9th to 10th year
 Second bicuspid... 10th to 11th year
 Canines... 11th to 12th year
 Second molars... 12th to 13th year
 Third molars... 17th to 21st year

We do not know who Grandma Crowwell's father was. She was Peninah Little. Her brothers were William, Gray, Blake, Seth and perhaps others.

In 1835, these brothers came to Sumpter County, Alabama with our grandparents, your great-grandparents.

Your grandfather once told me that his mother's family was very aristocratic. It seems we should be able to get this line at D.A.R. Headquarters.

I was told our line did not come from Chief Justice Little, but from William Little of Beaufort County, North Carolina.

His will is in Old's Abstract of Wills of North Carolina.

He had a son, Isaac, and so did the Chief Justice, so I am of the opinion our family came from this brother Isaac.

Charles Ellis' grandson, Powhatan Ellis, came from Richmond, Va. to Natchez, Miss. the year Mississippi was admitted as a state, and was one of the first three judges appointed, was elected to the U.S. Senate, and appointed Ambassador to Mexico by President Jackson. The town of Ellisville, Mississippi is named for him. His brother Richard Ellis was one of the first judges appointed in Alabama, and later Sherman, Texas.

(A grandson of Charles Ellis, Charles Ellis married Margaret Nimmo, a direct descendant of Sir George Yeardley. Jane Shelton Ellis married Dandridge Tucker, had sons Randolph Tucker and St. George Tucker. A granddaughter, Mary Ellis Montgomery married Champe Carter, son of Edward Hill Carter. A number of the Ellises married Carters, and it is more than probable that it is the same family as Robert E. Lee's mother, whose name was Ann Hill Carter. I have never looked into this one. One grandson married daughter of Lawrence Washington, of Mt. Vernon.)

RED HILL

"The first house which Charles Ellis built in Amherst was of logs. It must have been of ample size for the accommodation of his family, for eight of his children were born prior to his removal from Henrico. At this time he did not know of a neighbor nearer than eighteen miles off. It is related that for the sake of companionship he sold a tract containing two hundred acres or more to a friend whom he had known in the lower country, William Floyd, ancestor of two Governor Floyds of Virginia, for the consideration of a gun. I think it is very probable I saw this very gun, among half a dozen other pieces, deer guns, turkey guns and rifles, old and well worn, at Red Hill when I was a boy. At a later day he, or his son Josiah after him, built a long, two-story frame house. My uncle Richard Ellis built a spacious and fine brick house, beautifully situated and, I believe, in good order. Unfortunately my Uncle Richard's estate became so involved the Red Hill property had to be sold. It was purchased by Professor Robert L. Dabney, of Hampton-Sidney College, who afterwards removed to Texas, I believe. The last time I saw my college friend, Professor John B. Minor, of the University of Virginia, he told me that the most beautiful floors he had ever seen were in the Red Hill house, occupied by his brother Lucius. The family burying ground at Red Hill was reserved in the deed to Professor Dabney, with the right of way to and from it. There lie the remains of many of our ancestors, all of whom, both men and women, so far as I know, are worthy to be held in remembrance."

(Letter of Thomas Harding Ellis, April 7, 1896. He was the son of Charles Ellis and Margaret Nimmo, and brother of Mrs. Beverly Tucker of Washington, D.C., and Mrs. George Wythe Mumford of Richmond. In 1849 he compiled "A Memorandum of the Ellis Family" a copy of which is in the State Library at Richmond. This line brought their records to date in 1907. His brother, Powhatan Ellis, was a prominent Judge of Richmond.)

Samuel Hindman and Sarah Carmichael were married in St. James Church at Lancaster, Pa., on December 13, 1791. Their son, James Henderson Hindman was born in Lancaster on November 29, 1792, served honorably under Gen. Jackson in 1812, and died unmarried in New Orleans September, 1819.

They moved to Knoxville, Tennessee, about 1792. Their younger son, Thomas Carmichael Hindman, was the first male child born in Knoxville, November 10, 1793. Samuel Hindman died on June 2, 1805, and Sarah died September 5, 1832, both in Knoxville. Their son Thomas Carmichael Hindman was a young officer in the war of 1812-1815. On June 30, 1816, he resigned his commission in the regular army and returned to Knoxville, where on January 21, 1819, he married Sallie Holt, daughter of Robert Holt and Mildred Stanfield.

In 1830 Thomas C. Hindman joined Lewis Ross (married Fannie Holt) at Knoxville in the work of peaceably removing the Cherokee Indians from Tennessee to Arkansas. They had been selected for this work by President Jackson, under whom Hindman, as a young lieutenant, had served in the Battle of New Orleans. When war with Mexico was declared Thomas Carmichael Hindman went to the front as Colonel of a Mississippi regiment. His elder son, Robert Holt Hindman, served first in the infantry and then in the calvary. Thomas C. Hindman Jr. raised a company in Tippah County, Miss. for the 2nd Mississippi Regiment under Col. Clark, and fought to the end of the war, first as lieutenant and later as captain. He was elected to the 36th Congress and served from December 5, 1859 to March 3, 1861. Was re-elected to the 37th Congress, but resigned to enter the Confederate Army. Was promoted to Major General, Arkansas division.

Mary Lyon Hindman, daughter of Thomas C. Hindman and Sallie Holt, was born in Knox County, Tennessee in 1823. Married James Baxter Ellis January 7, 1846.
