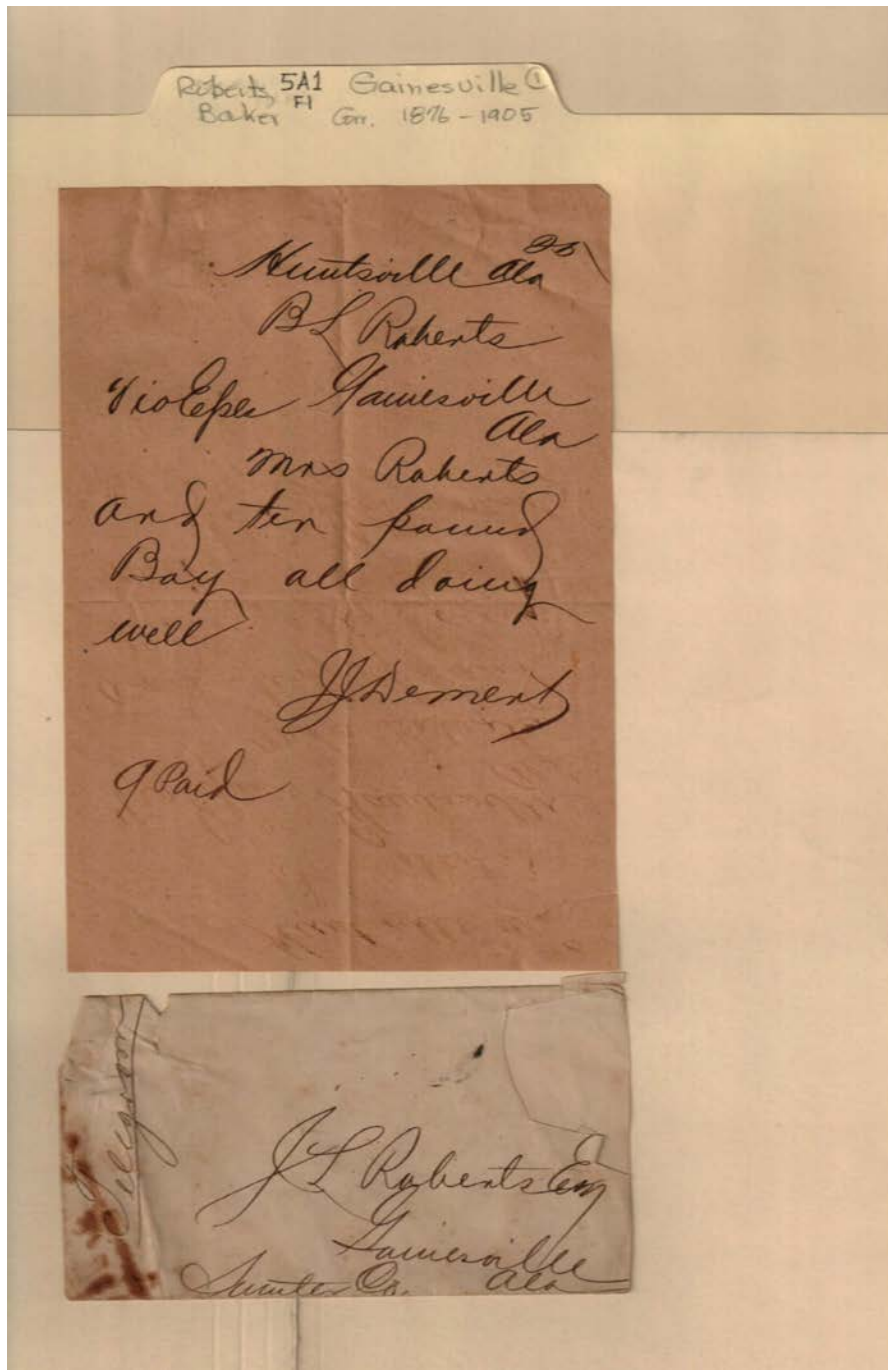

Your of the 2nd Inst is just hand  
and contents strictly noticed, I was glad to hear from  
you; and to learn you were all in about usual health;  
my health is still bad, and precarious.

I was surprised to learn the course the steps that  
Snedecor had taken, I think he has acted in  
very bad faith, from what he told you last spring  
or summer, as you wrote me, that when you  
mentioned to him, that I thought he ought to charge  
some of his fees having lost two years next my place, he  
neglected; you said he neglected, he would go to court  
to the clerk's office and examine the papers and get  
a statement, and would do what was right in  
matter, there was not any judgement against the  
Land, but what had been paid off, except the  
Case of Sally Pearson, for three hundred dollars and  
Oct, from the time due which he put down in his statement  
Rendered me at \$416. - also a part of an invoice of  
Must Hooker's fine & that put down at \$174.10 -  
These were all that was against the Land except  
what had been paid off, according to the statement Rend-  
er me by Bliss Snedecor. The bal of amt of \$1265.38 was  
made up from their fees which they charged, and

Dear Mr Roberts

You will pardon me for addressing to you this letter - ~~but~~ My interest in you is <sup>only</sup> an apology - ~~I~~ Not being able to see you under such circumstances as I preferred I thought you would have more time to think of the important truths contained therein, and better opportunity - to meditate upon the texts of scripture, by this writing.
