Athens comprises the urban population of Limestone County. In Madison County in 1950, Huntsville and its surrounding fringe (the old mill villages) made up this category. In 1970, Huntsville plus the city of Madison provides the urban population. In Marshall County, the four largest cities combined are the urban population in 1960 and 1970. In 1950, Arab was below the 2,500 population level so the three remaining cities in Marshall made up the urban population.

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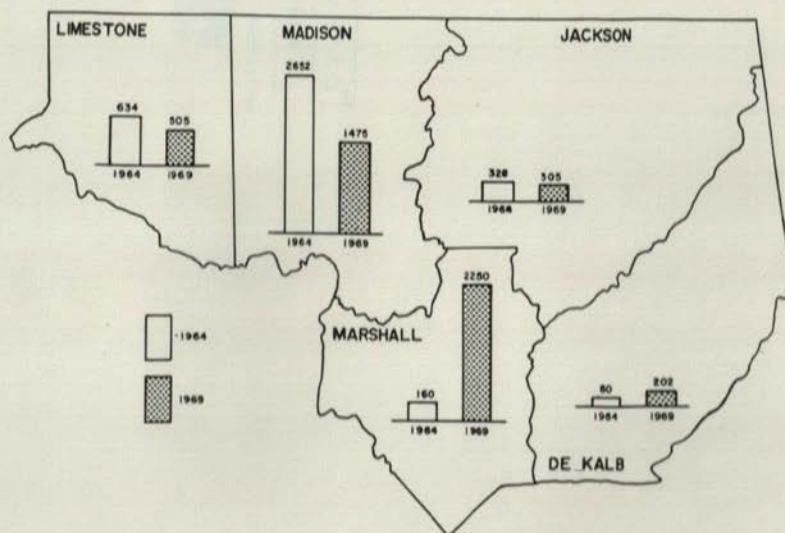
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Fig. 5-9. Jobs Added by New and Expanded Industry,

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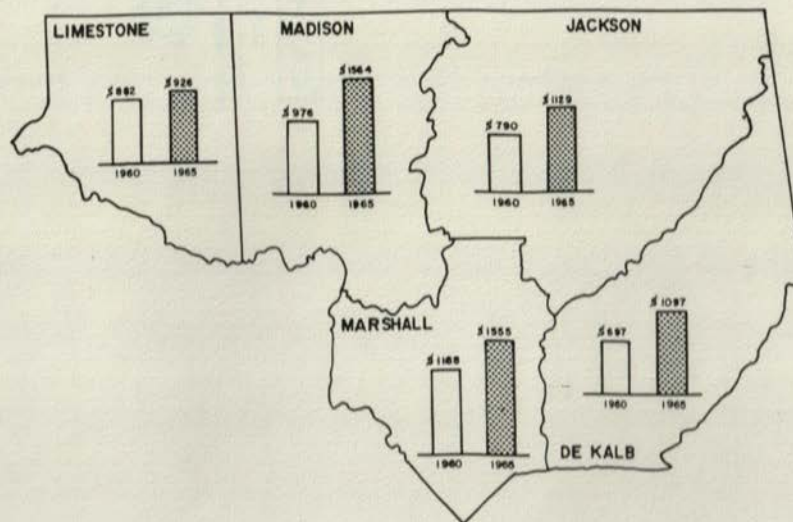
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Fig. 5-10. Per Capita Sales at Retail, by County, 1960 and 1965
