Areas of Significance: Stevenson was a strategic location for both the north and the south in the Civil War because of her access to the railroad, just as Bridgeport was important because of her access to the Tennessee River. There are numerous references to Stevenson in the Civil War in various volumes of "WAR OF THE REBELLION, Official Documents, etc." (as per Christine Sumner. 11. Architectural Description: Has several old appearing building along main street but corner stone shows dated 1917 for main shop area. Main areas of interest are depot, Coffey House and street. Porches are visible through pavement indicating new stone were once brick. Stevenson Auto Parts, vacant building next door and several other appear to be of same brick as depot. Very difficult to obtain data from residents, contacted Police, owner of depot restaurant, and Drug store but none knew anything. 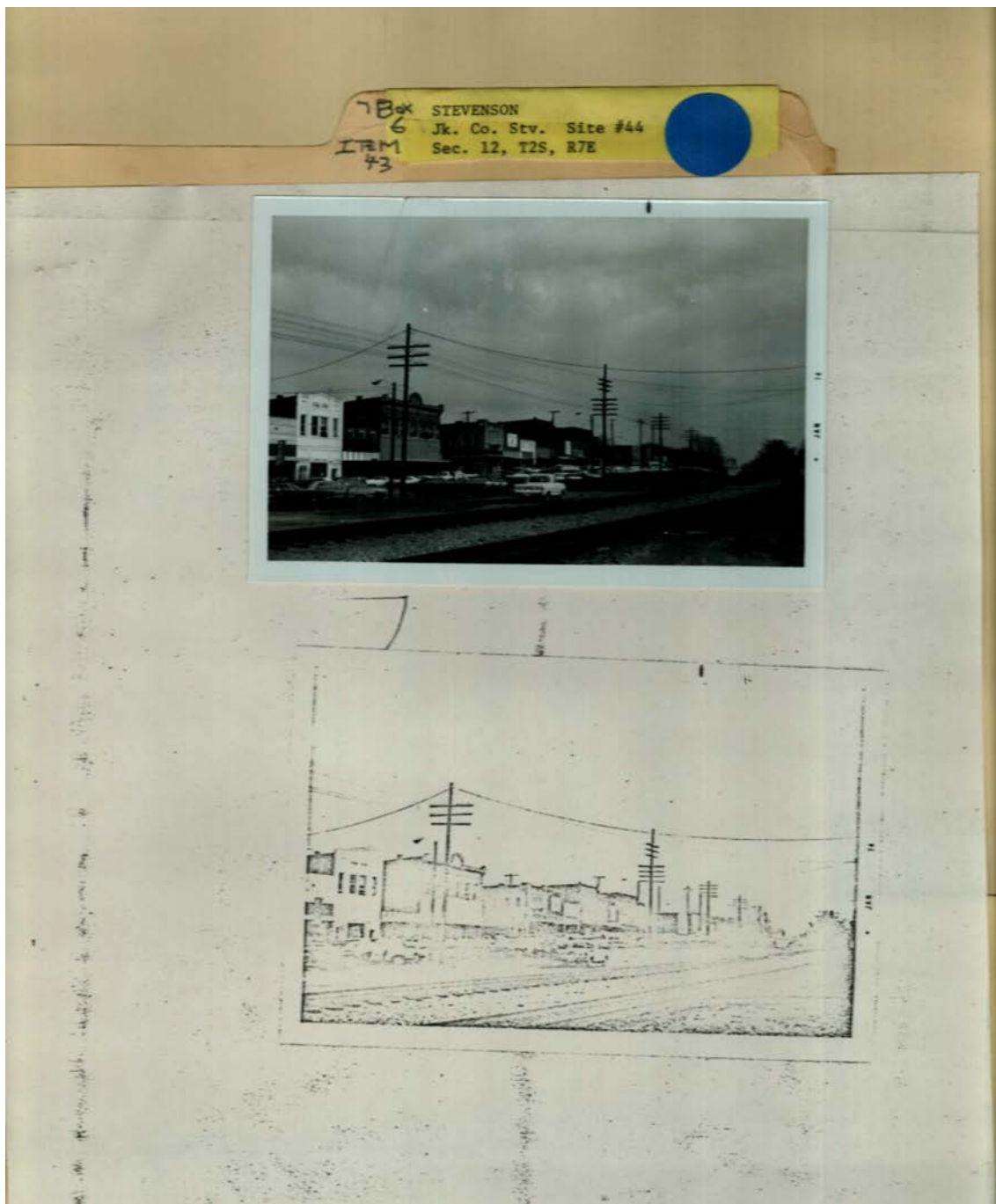

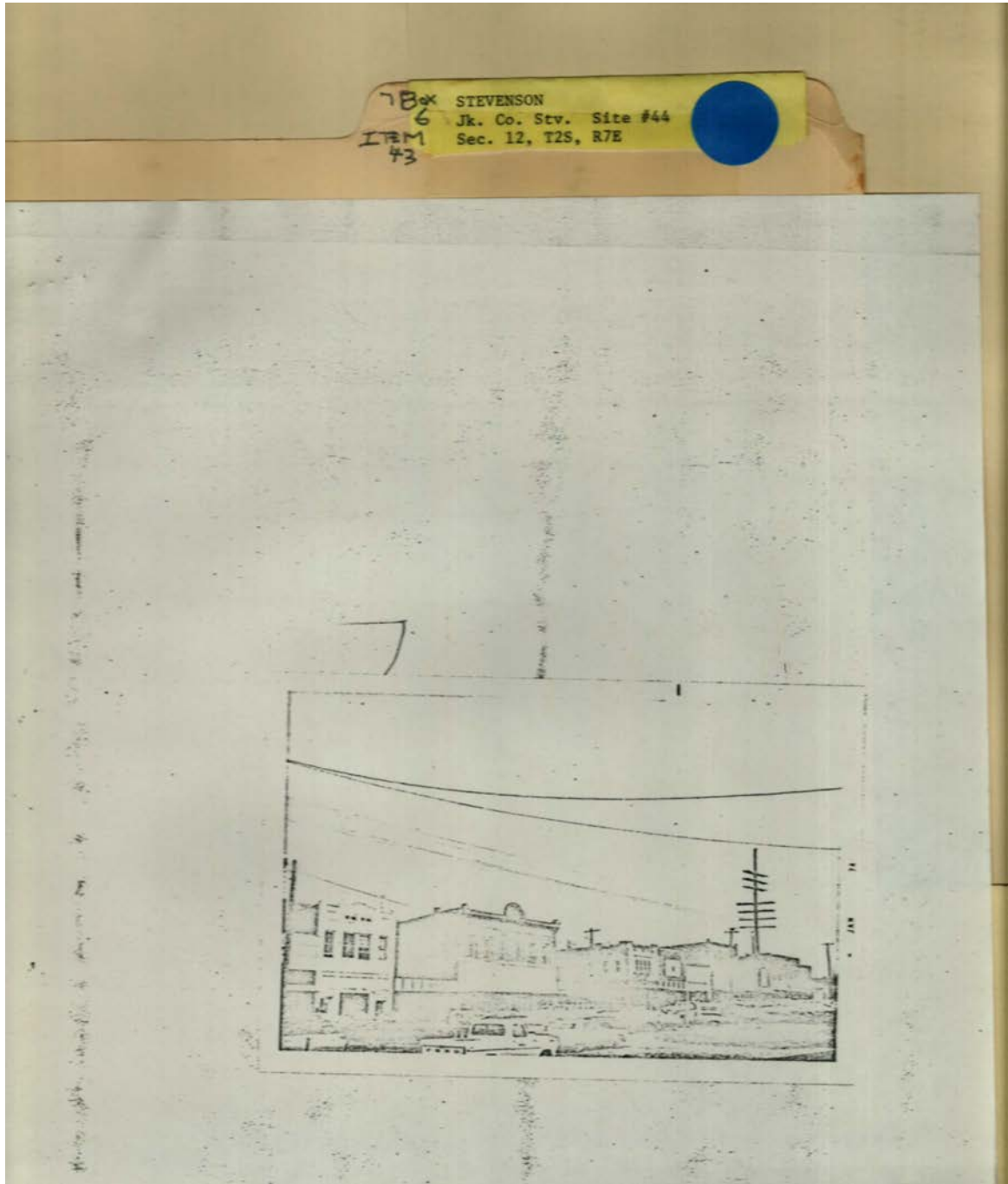
