

It has a beautiful winding staircase. John Snodgrass built the house and his daughter, Elizabeth Sanders, now deceased, said the wood for the curved part of the staircase had to be soaked in hot boiling water for three weeks (keeping the water at a boiling temp.sil the while) in order to get it to bend to the proper proportions. The first two pieces of wood broke and a third time was successful but the soaking process stretched into 9 weeks. John Snodgrass was a Colonel in the Civil war and was almost captured by the Union soldiers while visiting his wife and new baby in this house during the war. He escaped through a secret door into the attic(2). This old house is one of the very few ante-bellum homes of it's type left in Jackson County and is the most commanding of them all.
