STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Built about 1850(1), this house, according to architectural review, is an excellent apparent Victorian period interpretation of the Greek Revival motif; appears to be the work of a skilled architect and should be restored. It has a beautiful winding staircase. John Snodgrass built the house and his daughter, Elizabeth Sanders, now deceased, said the wood for the curved part of the staircase had to be soaked in hot boiling water for three weeks (keeping the water at a boiling temp. all the while) in order to get it to bend to the proper proportions. The first two pieces of wood broke and a third time was successful but the soaking process stretched into 9 weeks. John Snodgrass was a Colonel in the Civil War and was almost captured by the Union soldiers while visiting his wife and new baby in this house during the war. He escaped through a secret door into the attic(2).

This old house is one of the very few ante-bellum homes of its type left in Jackson County and is the most commanding of them all.

(1) Interview by Mrs. H.O. Weeks with her cousin, Elizabeth (Snodgrass) Sanders, on Christmas Day, 1925. Mrs. Sanders was the daughter of Col. John Snodgrass and was reared in this house and knew well the origin of the old house.

(2) An undated newspaper clipping from the Scottsboro newspaper, The Progressive Age, about 1927, owned by Mrs. H. O. Weeks. The article was written by Minnie (Snodgrass) Hodgson.

Mrs. Elizabeth Snodgrass Sanders told Mrs. H.O. Weeks, in the above interview, that the house was built "about 15 years before the Civil War."

From an interview with Mrs. H. O. Weeks, Scottsboro, May 16, 1974: The house was built about 1850 by Col. John Snodgrass. Col. Snodgrass' daughter, Mrs. Elizabeth Sanders of Decatur, Ala. told Mrs. Weeks on December 25, 1925, that her father built the house "about 15 years before the Civil War." Mrs. Sanders said they soaked the winding staircase (the curved parts of the wood) in boiling water for three weeks, keeping the water not all that time, to get the wood to bend. The first 2 pieces of wood broke and the soaking method had to be applied again and again, a total of 9 weeks. The house was later sold to Mrs. SALLY Adkins and Mrs. H. O. Weeks father, Thomas Edward Morgan, bought it from Mrs. Adkins in 1914. Mrs. Weeks was reared in this home and so was Mrs. Elizabeth Snodgrass who dated the house. It was remodeled only slightly in 1920 by architect John Bull of Chattanooga. The old kitchen was torn away and a new one added. Mrs. Weeks says the columns on the front are the originals and that very little remodeling has been done.




