STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house was built around 1880 (1) by Senator Charles Williams Brown, a Scottsboro lawyer before/being elected to the Senate. The house was bought from the Brown family by John Franklin Proctor, another Scottsboro lawyer and Legislator. James Moody Proctor inherited the house from his father, John Franklin Proctor. (2) John Franklin Proctor was a delegate to the Constitutional Convention of 1901 (3), and was a Circuit Judge.

Mrs. James Moody Proctor told Christine Sumner, in an interview on May 16, 1974, that she has done considerable research on this house and it was built about 1880-1884 by Senator Charles W. Brown and was sold by him, in 1907, to John Franklin Proctor. James Moody Proctor, being an only child, inherited it from his father, John Franklin Proctor.

interesting to compare this house with the early 19th century
houses on the same "Greek" theme and to observe how each is a
completely different expression of it's own time, even though
specifically the same. Neither, of course, are "Greek" but are 19th
century in style and construction.

4. Characteristics of the structure if known
Only one of it's kind still standing in Scottsboro

This home was owned by the late Judge James Moody Proctor of Scottsboro who was the son of John Franklin Proctor, a prominent lawyer and legislator. Judge Proctor followed in his father's footsteps as a lawyer and civic leader. (2)

From an interview with Miss Daisy Caldwell, age 90, Scottsboro, by Christine Sumner, May 16, 1974: This house was built by State Senator Charles Williams Brown, who also practiced law in Jackson Co. Senator Brown was son of Jeremiah and Mary (Williams) Brown and a brother of Preston Brown. He married the daughter of Gen. John R. Coffey (the marriage recorded in old Bible records in possession of Christine P. Sumner..original Coffey Bible owned by Mrs. Mary Anna Rudder of Stevenson, copied by Christine Sumner, June 19, 1970)

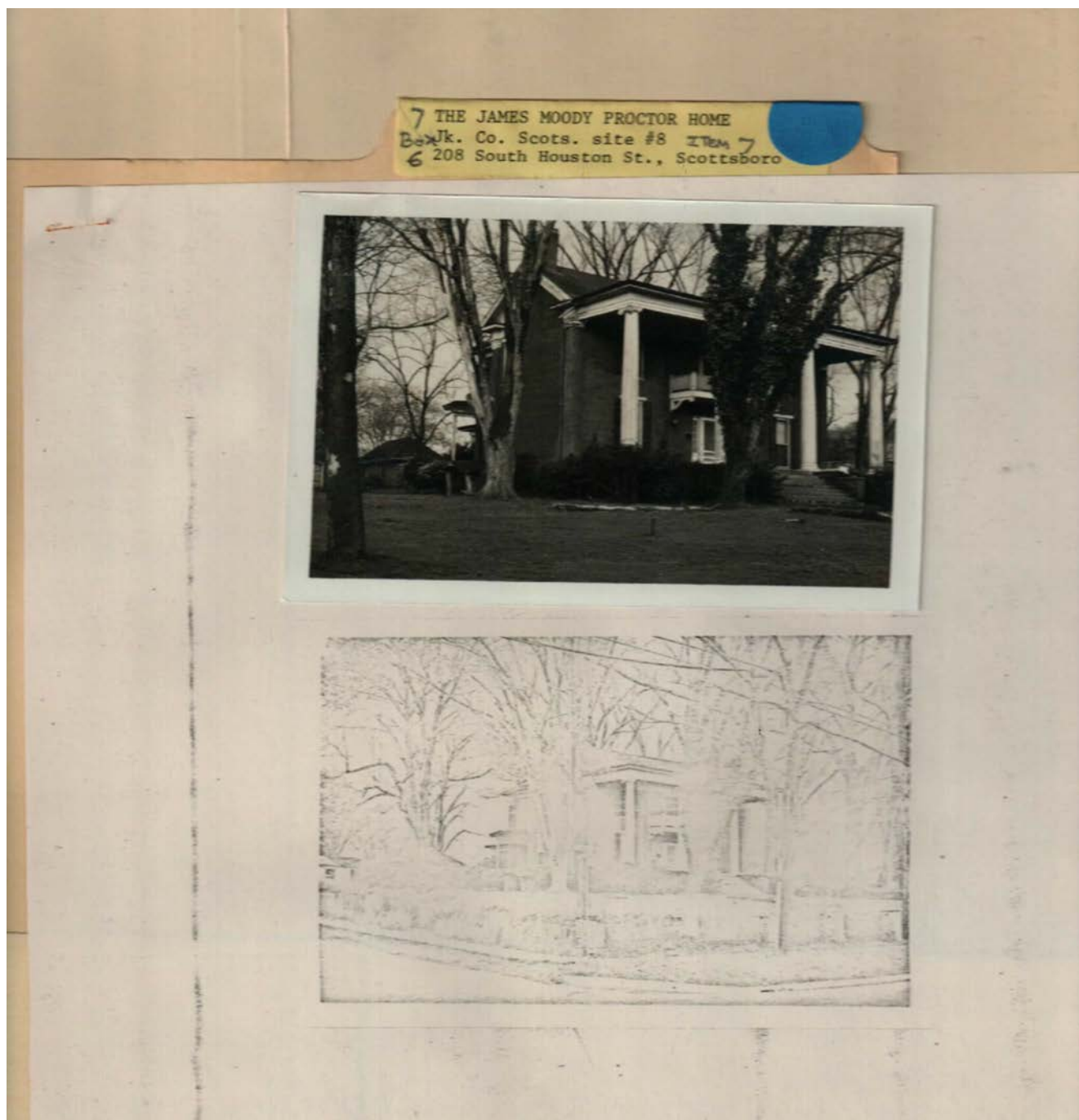

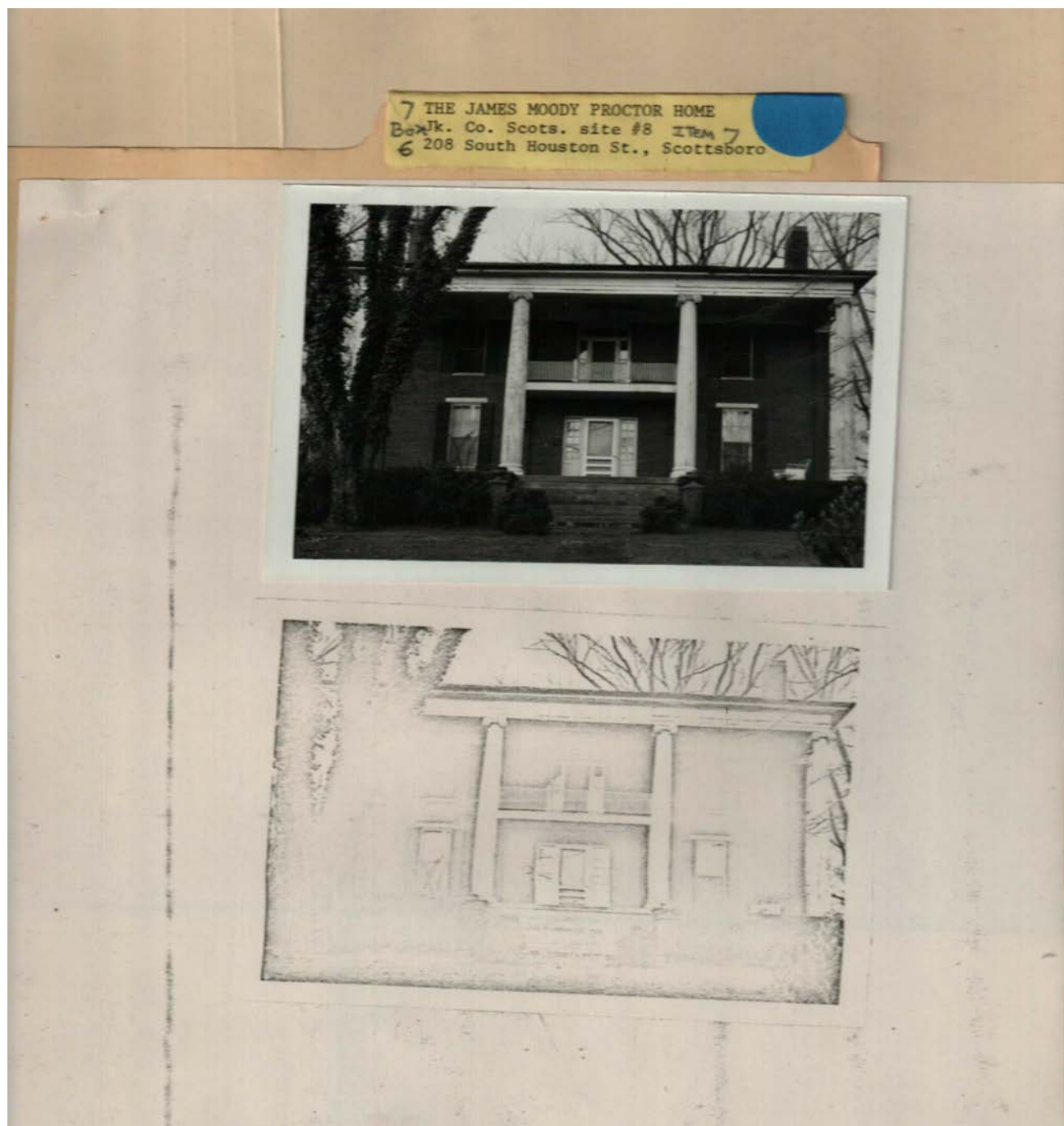

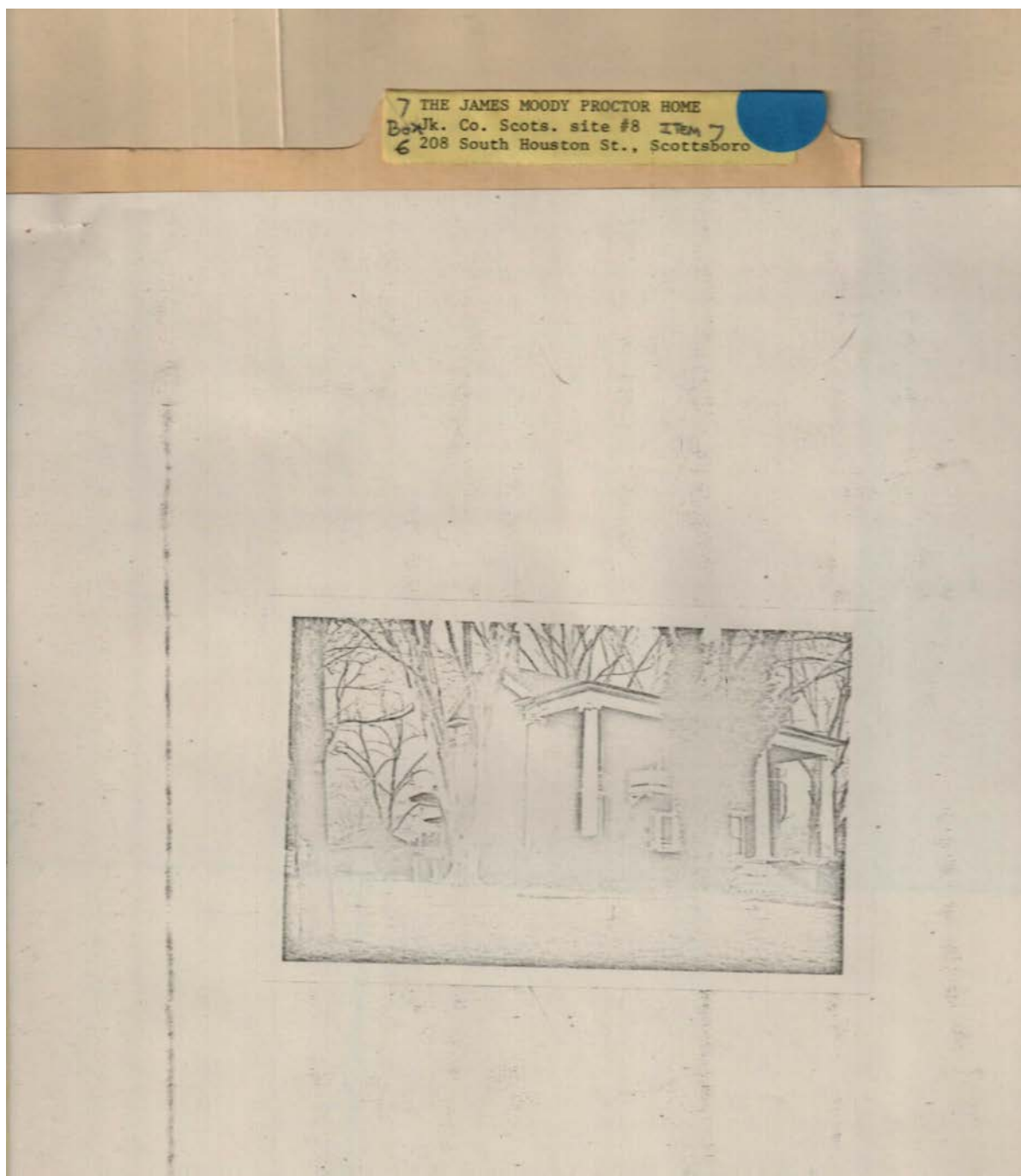
