STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This cave was used for saltpetre supplies as early as 1812,¹ and was worked extensively during the Civil War. It was the only such works that proved profitable as a saltpetre mine during the Civil War.² It was operated by S. D. Boren and produced 700 pounds of saltpetre per day at 35¢ per pound.³ Specimens from this cave were very pure.⁴ The saltpetre works were destroyed in 1863 by Gen. O. M. Mitchell, Federal Officer in charge of the troops at Huntsville, Ala.⁵
