preserved essentially as built. The earliest available
photograph, made in 1890, shows the porch as it is
now.
The slave quarters still stand across the road
in front of the home. This is a long one-room
building, with an open-pit fireplace in the center.
The home is well preserved but the slave
quarters is in very poor condition, it needs
immediate attention for preservation.

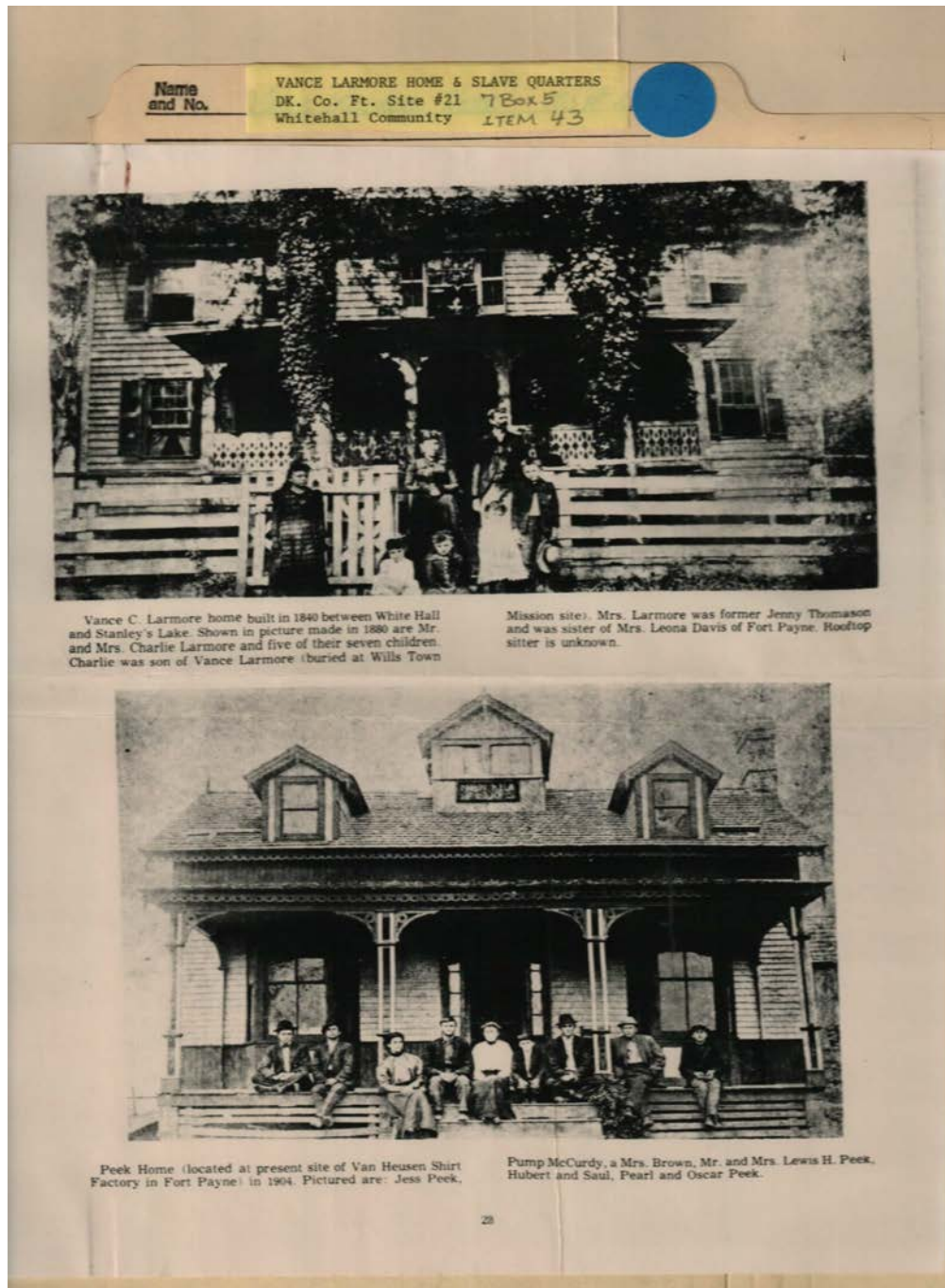

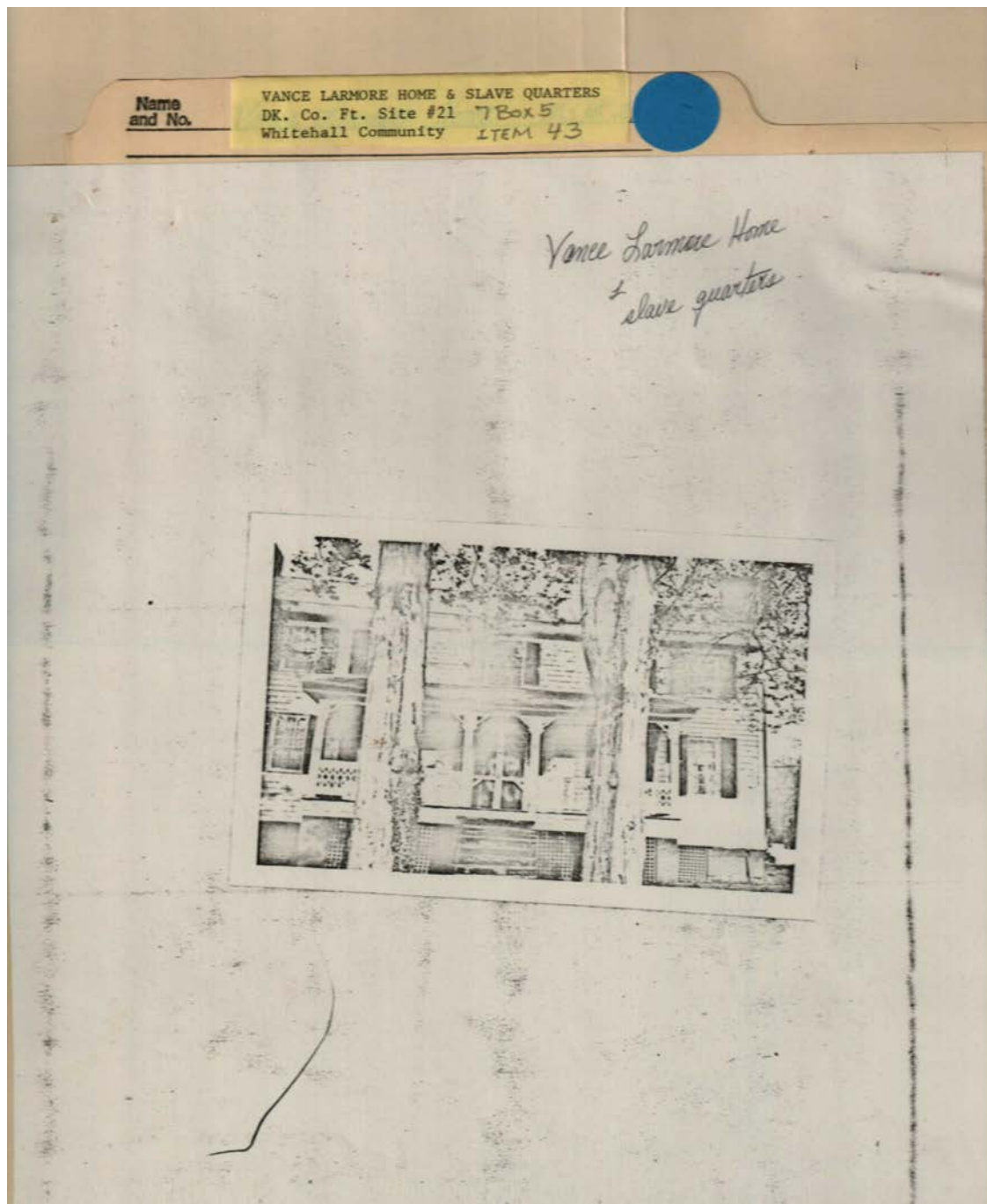

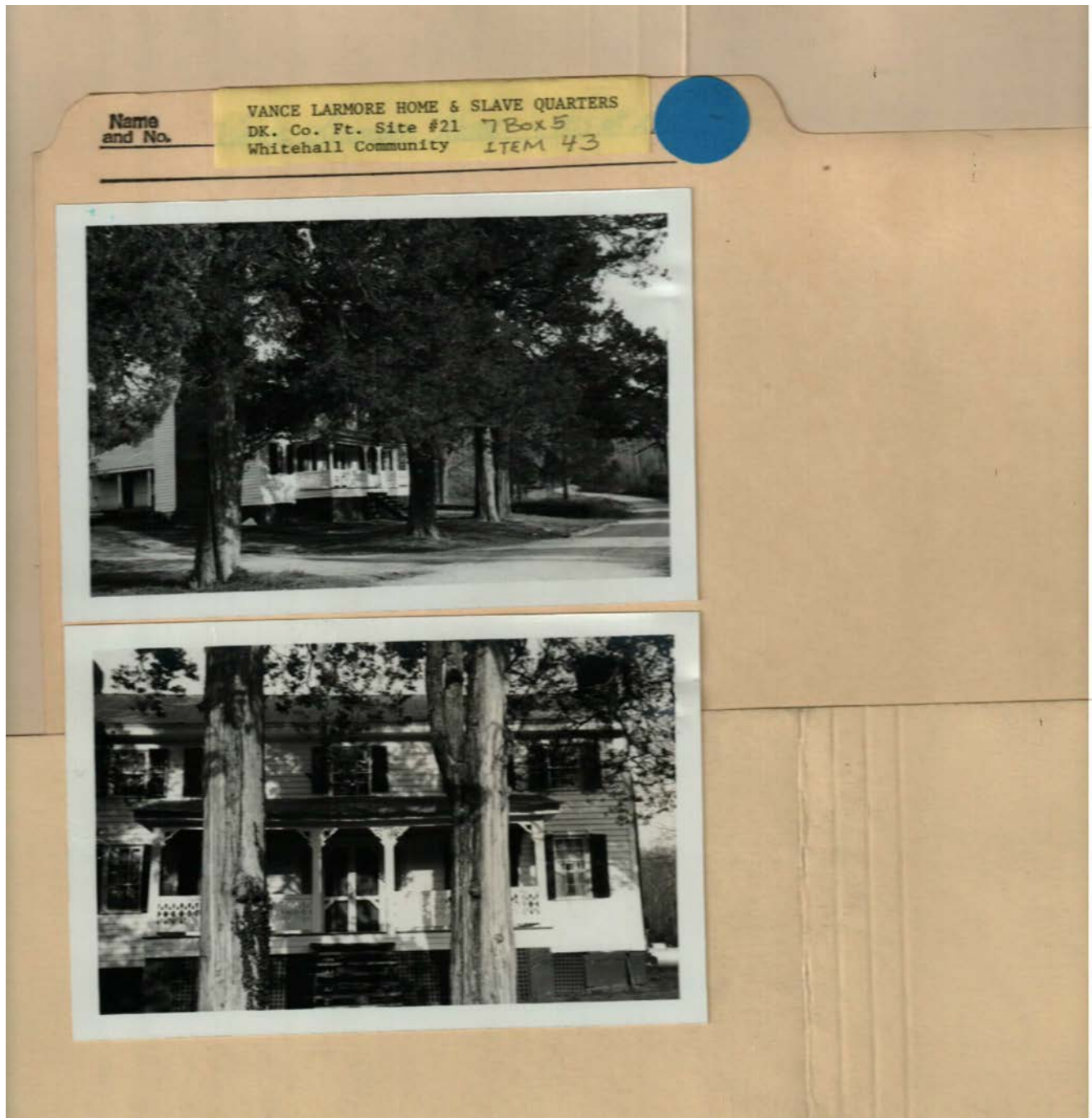
