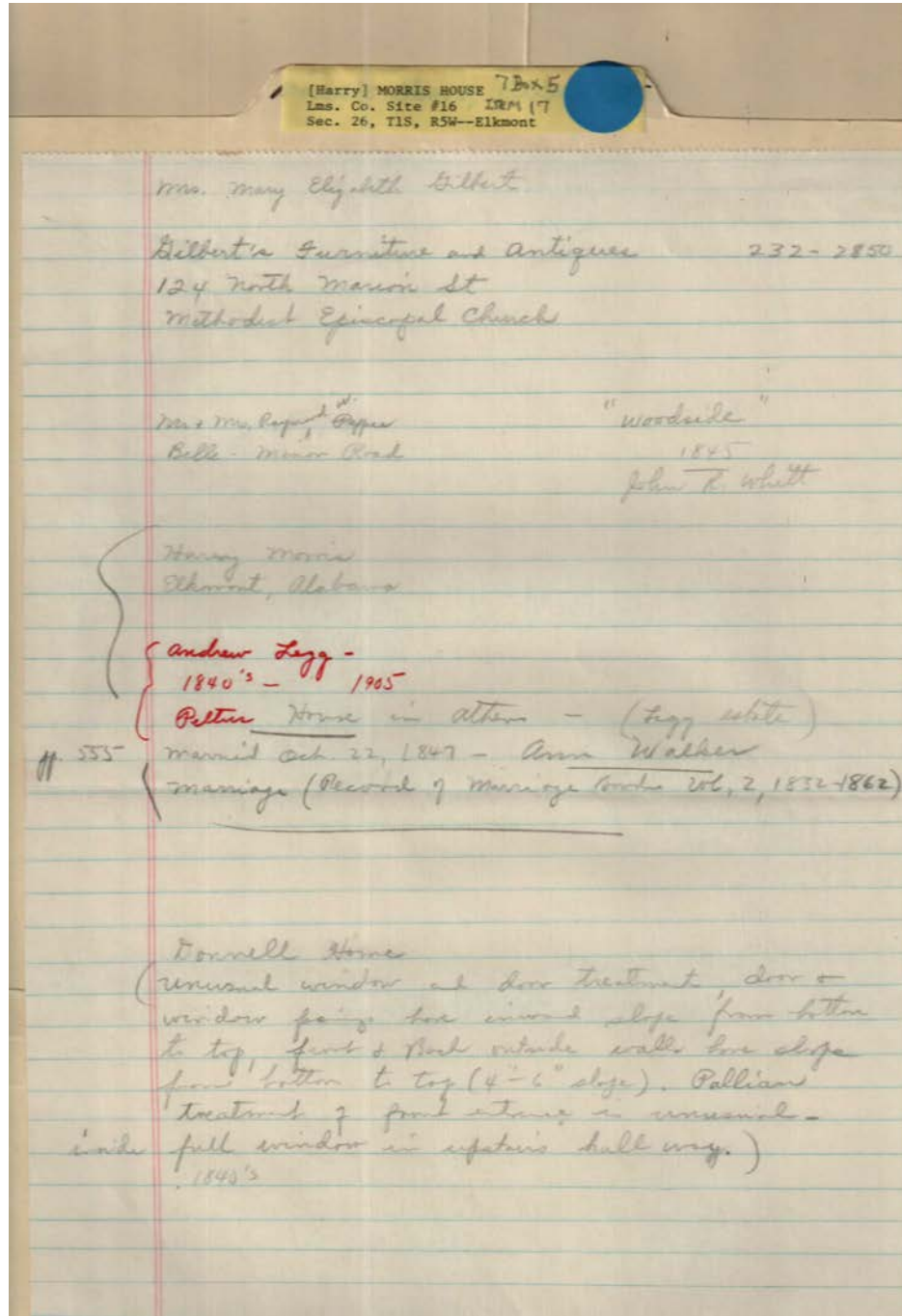

 others seen are not. Design suggests  
 construction date of 1840-55. Greek Revival  
 portico on an essentially Federal house.  
 Vertical proportions unusually short. Upper  
 sashes are 3-over-6 -- only 1 crown sash. -  
 Lower sashes are 6-over-6.  
 (Observation by Alice Hamilton & Alice Thomas during  
 time photo was taken) Bridge fenestration - 1st fl.  
 balcony, 4 square columns, 12 panes per sash in 2 front  
 windows downstairs + 9 panes per sash in 2 front windows on  
 second floor. - Top of chimney set out away from house.  
 House has original door + original stairs. Store room built  
 over entrance to cellar. - Porch wing added to left back of house -  
 original elm on right side of house - 1st original floor's woodwork.
