- Description The passage cave, running deep into the cliff ~~etc~~ was dry the year around, and would be approached by path or dirt - road - called "Jackson's Cave" by people who lived in vicinity - now under water of Lake Guntersville.
- Historical significance of site or structure if known Here Col. John Coffee stored ammunition and supplies. The Jacksons' army, in October, 1813, and First Cavalry troops rode here from Huntsville, to meet Jackson on his way to Talladega and later Horse Shoe Bend. It was marked with a deep inscription, cut into cliff wall over the cave entrance, by the Alabama Society D.A.R. in 1914.
