DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE						
<p>Two-story brick house, solid masonry construction, some walls 24" thick. Four rooms originally, two with wide connecting hall on each floor. Rooms about 20'x20'. Cut limestone foundation and one room basement faced with limestone. Two center end chimneys in cable roof. Regular window arrangement. Windows changed from the original, retaining original lintels.</p> <p>Brick, handmade, other construction features common to the early Federal period.</p> <p>Original entry porch was double, with columns. Entry altered to single story and widened.</p> <p>Doors were six-paneled in the style known as "Crusaders Cross". Fan-shaped transom over front door. Handcarved wainscoting in downstairs rooms. Shutters of single boards with slots, held back with handforced S-shaped catches. Federal woodwork, excepting reeded, pilastered wooden Greek Revival mantel. Staircase has elaborate stairend trim, with plain wide handplaned boards facing area under staircase. Window recesses are raised paneled. Some original box locks.</p> <p>In 1873 the old separate kitchen and smokehouse were connected to the main house, forming rear wing with end chimney.</p> <p>Wainscoting is unusual in this area, so the upstairs and downstairs treatment of the walls is notable, as well as the exterior trim.</p>

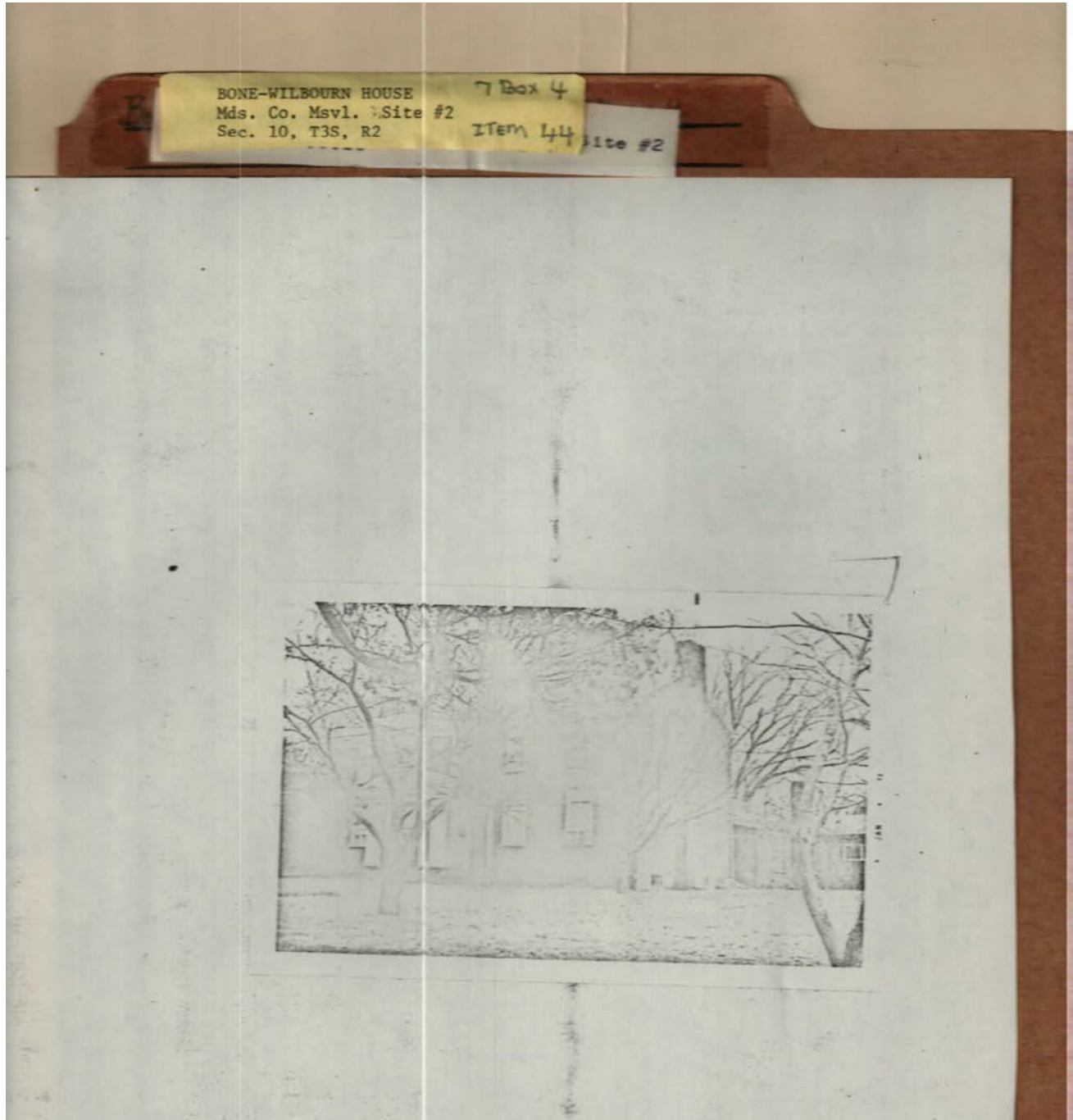

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			
<p>Situated in what was known as the Indian Old Fields, the land on which the house is situated was apparently lost in debt repayment by an Indian to James McCartney, one of the earliest settlers in the county. The house was built by McCartney when he married Martha Harvie Jordan, nineteen years his junior. Their home is an excellent example of early Madison County architecture with some of the best woodwork trim, exterior and interior, in existence. Like all those of its era, it is handmade throughout.</p> <p>The McCartney family had been one of the early arrivals in the area. James was well enough established by November 25, 1812 to have been an original trustee of Green Academy, the first institution of learning chartered in the area. In 1820 his name appears again as one of the original incorporators of the Flint River Navigation Company, with plans to bring transportation by water into the vicinity of his lands, thus saving long wagon hauls to the banks of the Tennessee River many muddy miles to the south. McCartney served as County Tax Assessor and Collector combined in 1812-1813; as Justice of the Peace 1811 -; member of the court of county commissioners of roads and revenue, 1829-until his death in 1831. <i>Charles Brownbridge 1824</i></p> <p>His widow retained possession of the house until her death through two other marriages, one to George Weaver, and on his death, to Reverend Matthew H. Bone, prominent leader of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Their marriage took place in 1842. Bone was a widower with two children. In 1829 he had been appointed to travel by the general assembly of the church. He served as pastor in Elkton, Kentucky, Lebanon, Ohio, Nashville, Lebanon, and Winchester, Tennessee, and Athens, Huntsville, and Maysville, Alabama.</p>

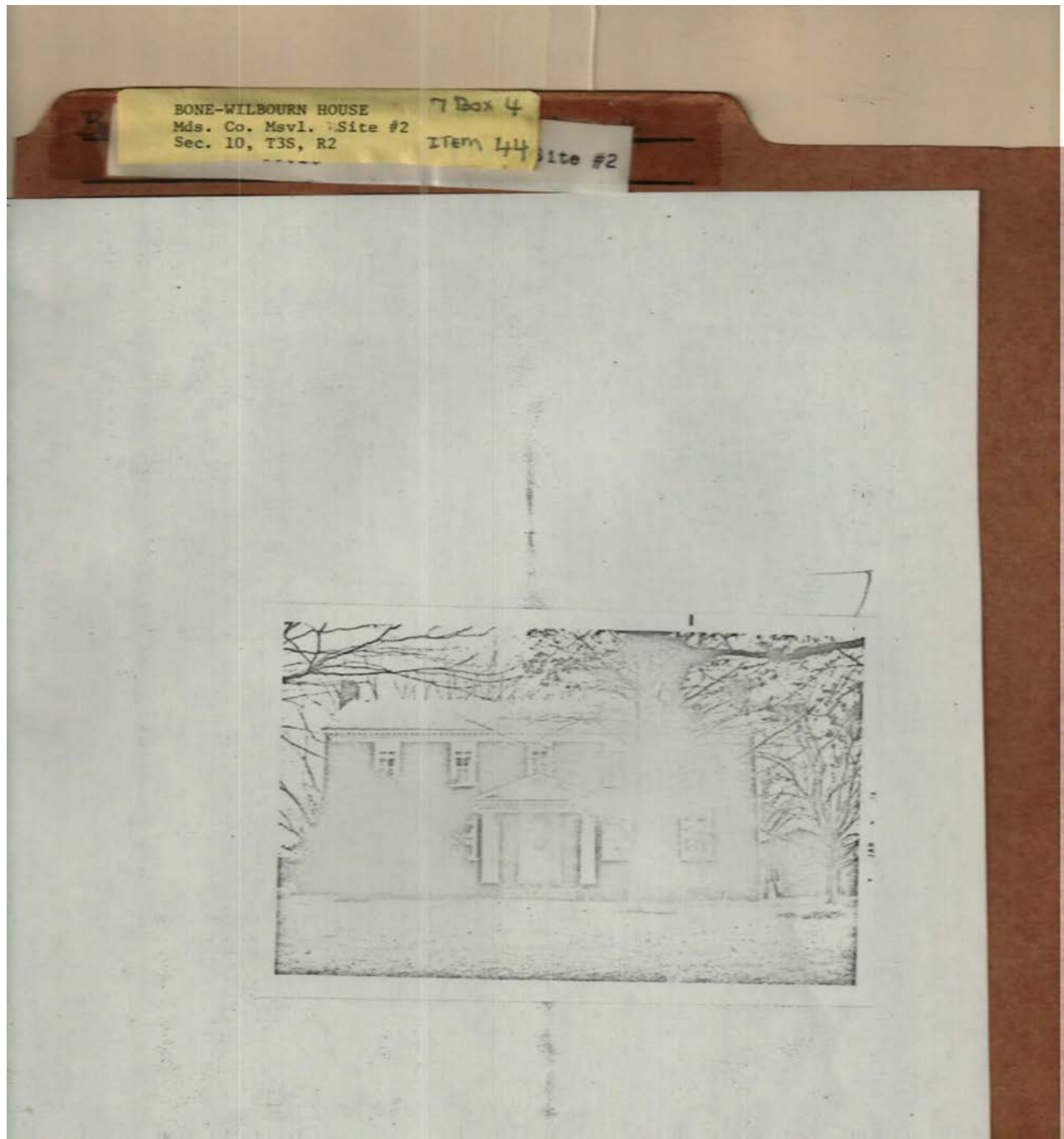

with some of the best interior woodwork in existence. It is
like all of its era - a "handmade" throughout.

McCartney was an original trustee of Green Academy, the first
institution of higher learning having been chartered Nov 25, 1812.
In 1820 McCartney was one of the original incorporators of the Flint
River Navigation Co.

He was 43 and a widower when he married Martha, 19 years his junior.
After McCartney's death in 1831, Martha married John Lee, known only
as John Lee now, Rev. Matthew H. Bone. Bone was a prominent
leader of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church for many years.

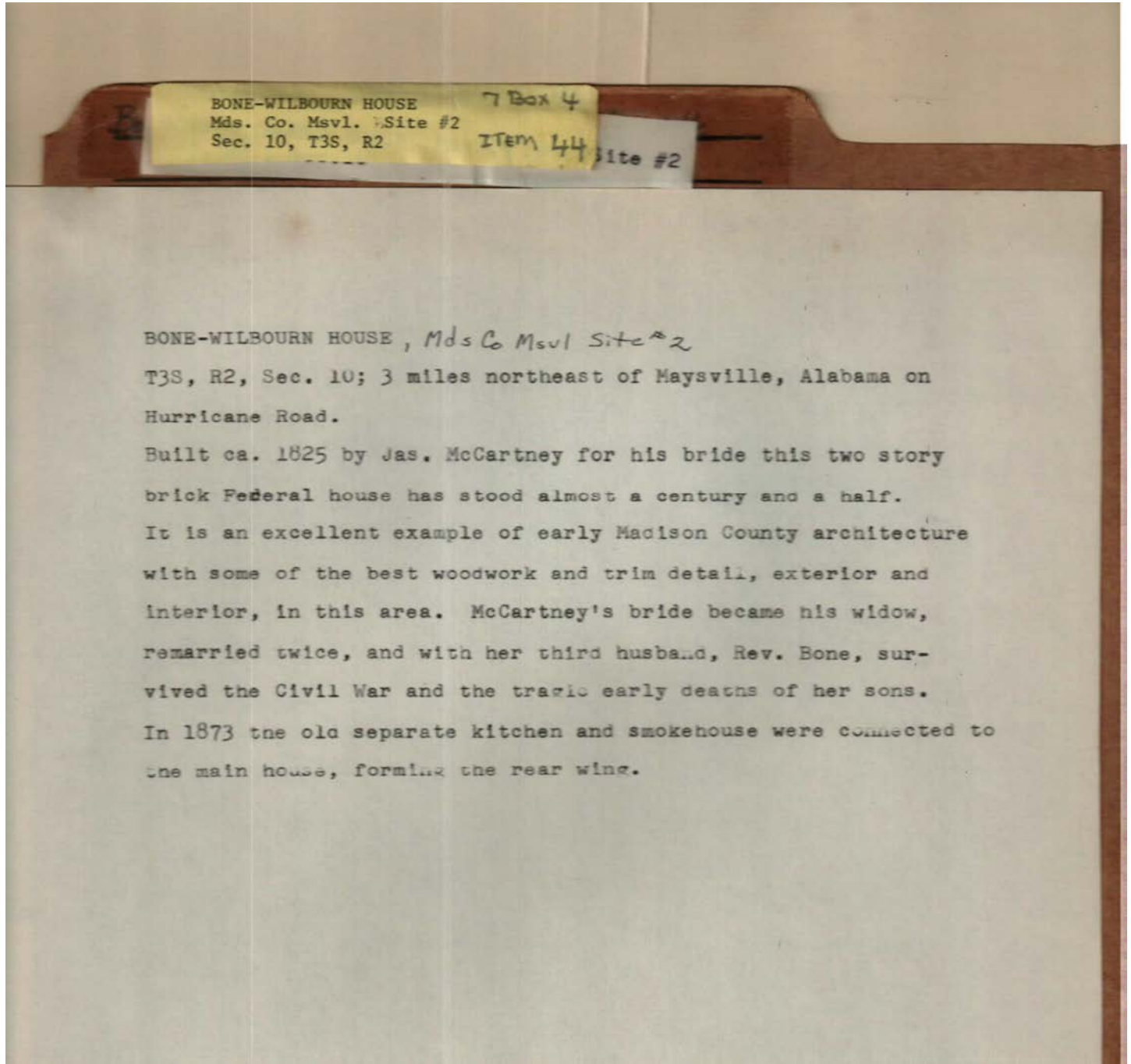

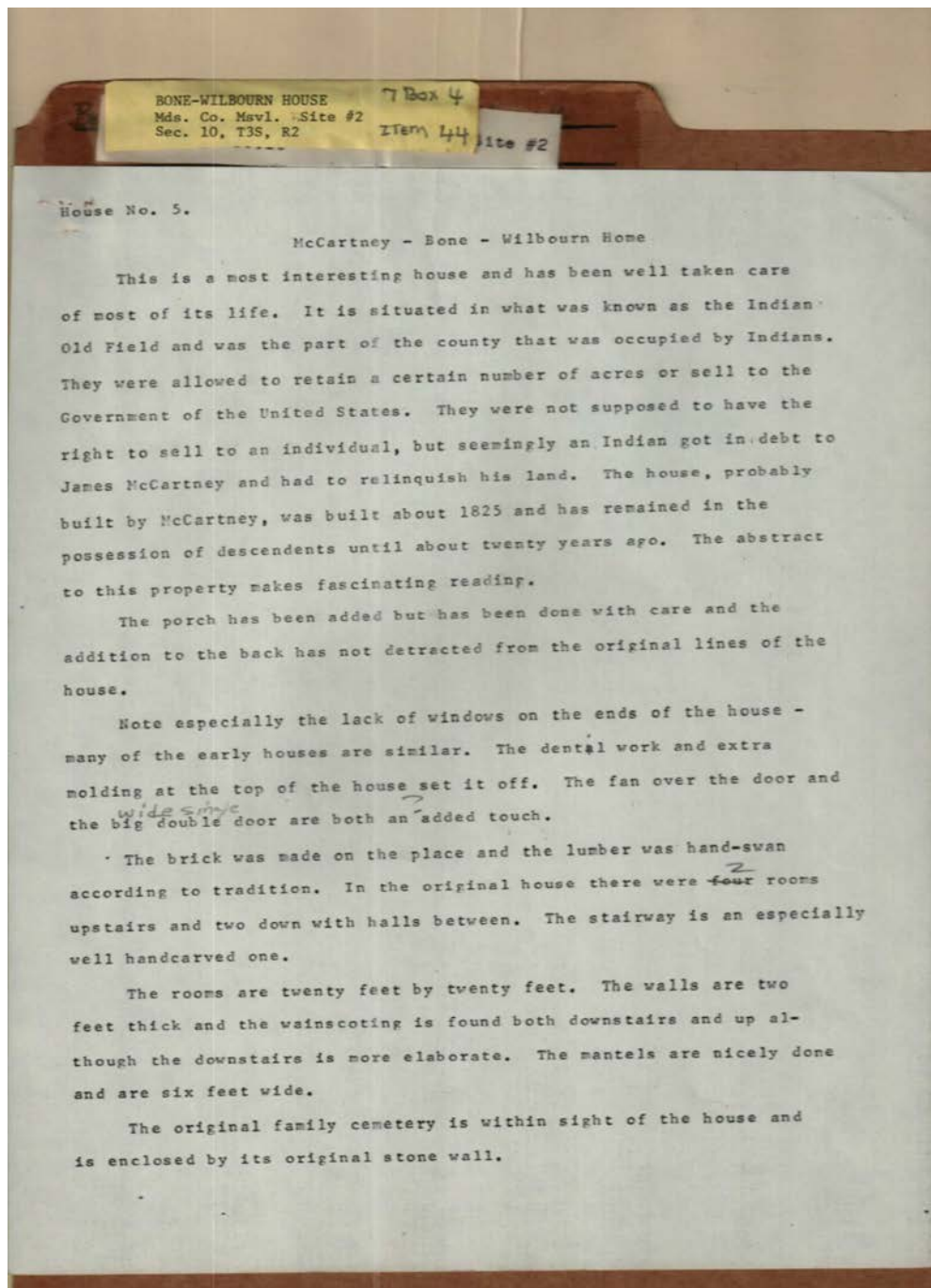
