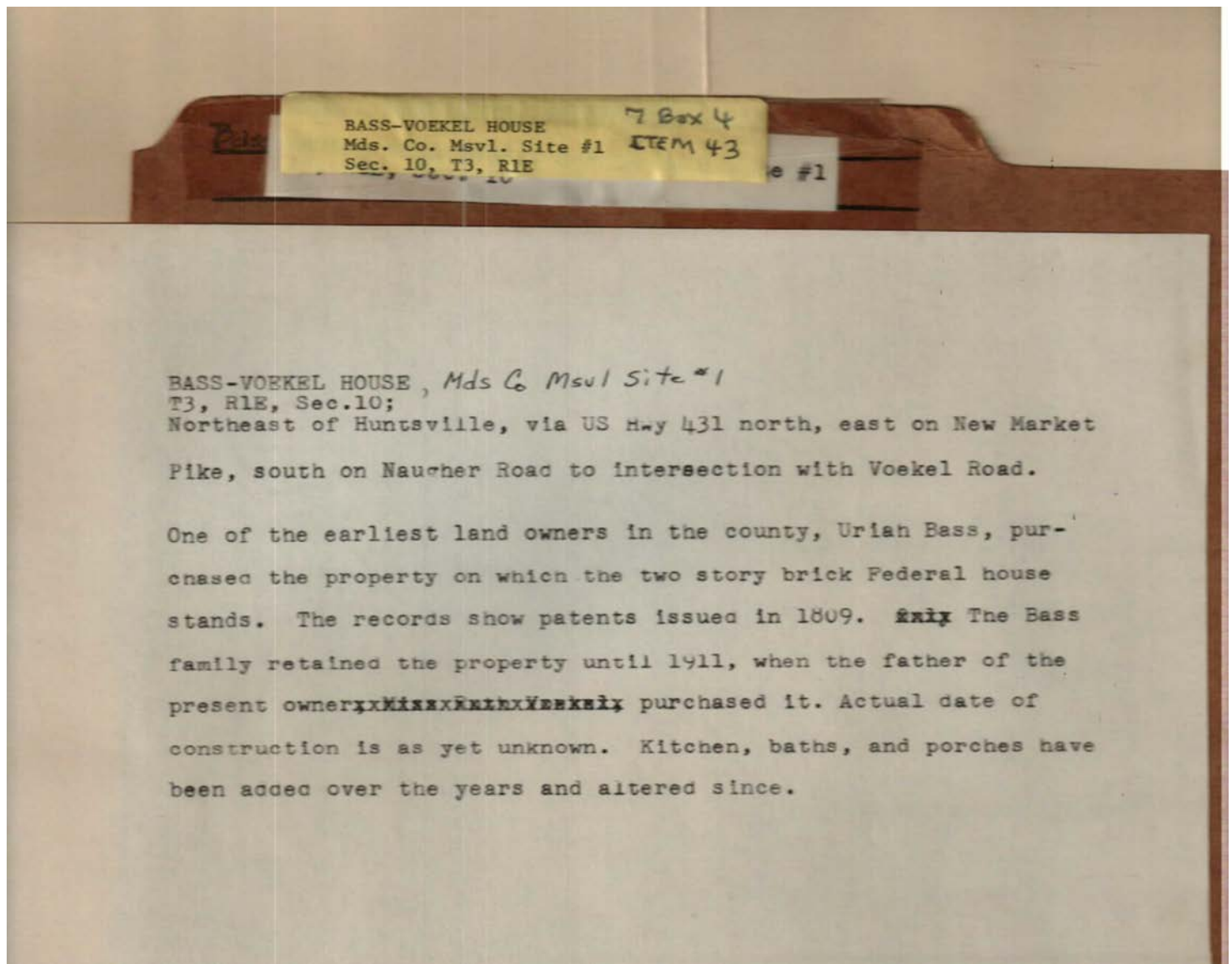

One of the earliest land owners in the county, Uriah Bass, purchased the property on which the two story brick Federal house stands. The records show patents issued in 1809. ~~and~~ The Bass family retained the property until 1911, when the father of the present owner ~~xxxxxxx~~ purchased it. Actual date of construction is as yet unknown. Kitchen, baths, and porches have been added over the years and altered since.
