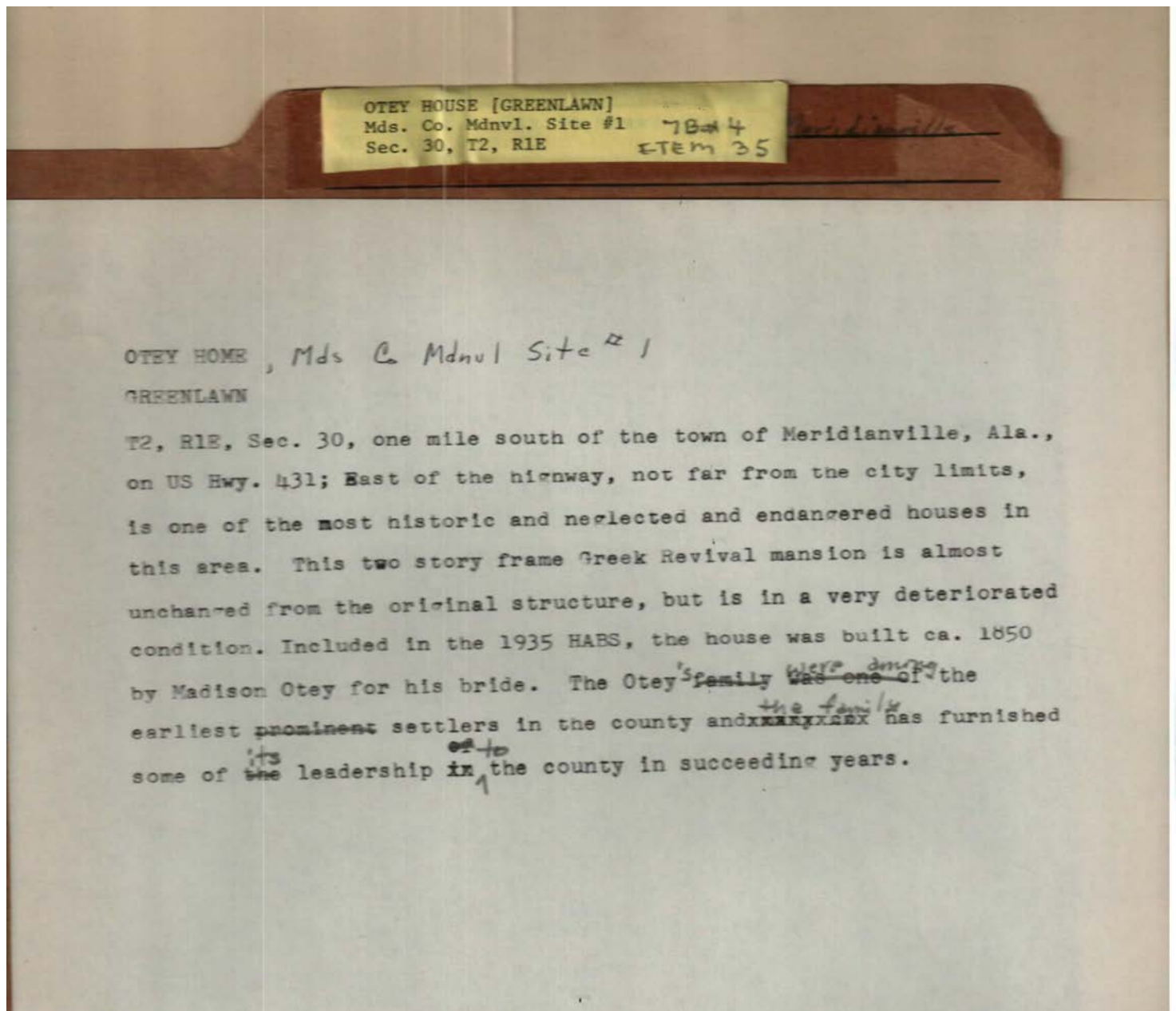

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE						
Deteriorated and boarded against further destruction, this twostory, frame house with one story wing, is probably of post and beam construction. The floor plan is typical of the era, that is four large square rooms and wide connected hallway on each floor. The onestory wing is attached on the north side. Rooms are approximately 20'x20', two on each floor. According to tradition the twostory entrance portico was added after the house was completed. Four large Doric columns rise two-stories to the gabled roof. Onestory wing and main house also have gable roofs. Two interior end chimneys on the main house and a center end chimney on the wing serviced fireplaces. Windows are regularly placed and have six panes over six. Much of the original window glass has been lost. Double entrance doors are surrounded by sidelights and fanlight in Greek Revival style. Original floors are wide, random width, quartersawn pine. Cherry bannister on staircase.

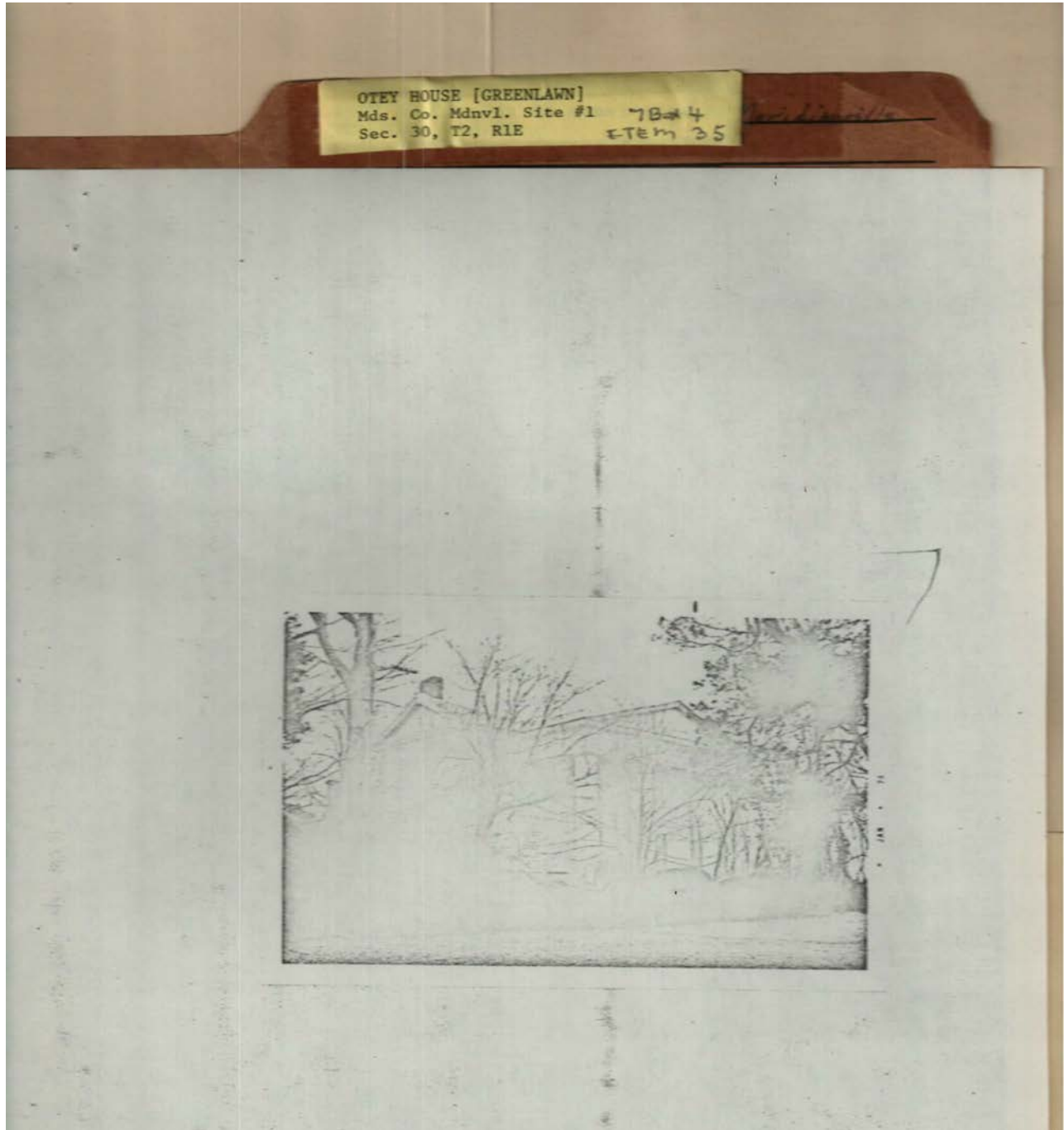

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Land on which the house is situated was first owned by Walter Otey, purchased in 1826. He raised his family in a log house at the rear of the present house. Financial difficulties prevented his building the fine home he planned.

Madison

It fell to his son, ~~Walter~~, to build the large Greek Revival house. According to family tradition it was constructed as a wedding present for his bride about 1850.

The Otey family was prominent in Madison County. Walter and Mary had the following children: John Walter, owner of an early stagecoach in the county; Bell Tavern, and probate judge (Madison County's first probate judge); Lucy Ann (Mrs. Rhoda) Horton; Mary Frances (Mrs. James) Robinson; Caroline Louisa (Mrs. John) Robinson; Eliza Otey Dillard; Armistead; Christopher; Wm. Madison; and Maria Melinda (Mrs. John W.) Pruitt.

(Mrs. J.B.)

The house was lived in by Madison's daughter, Lucille Walker. Beautiful trees and boxwood surround this decaying house, one of the few remaining Greek Revival homes of frame construction.

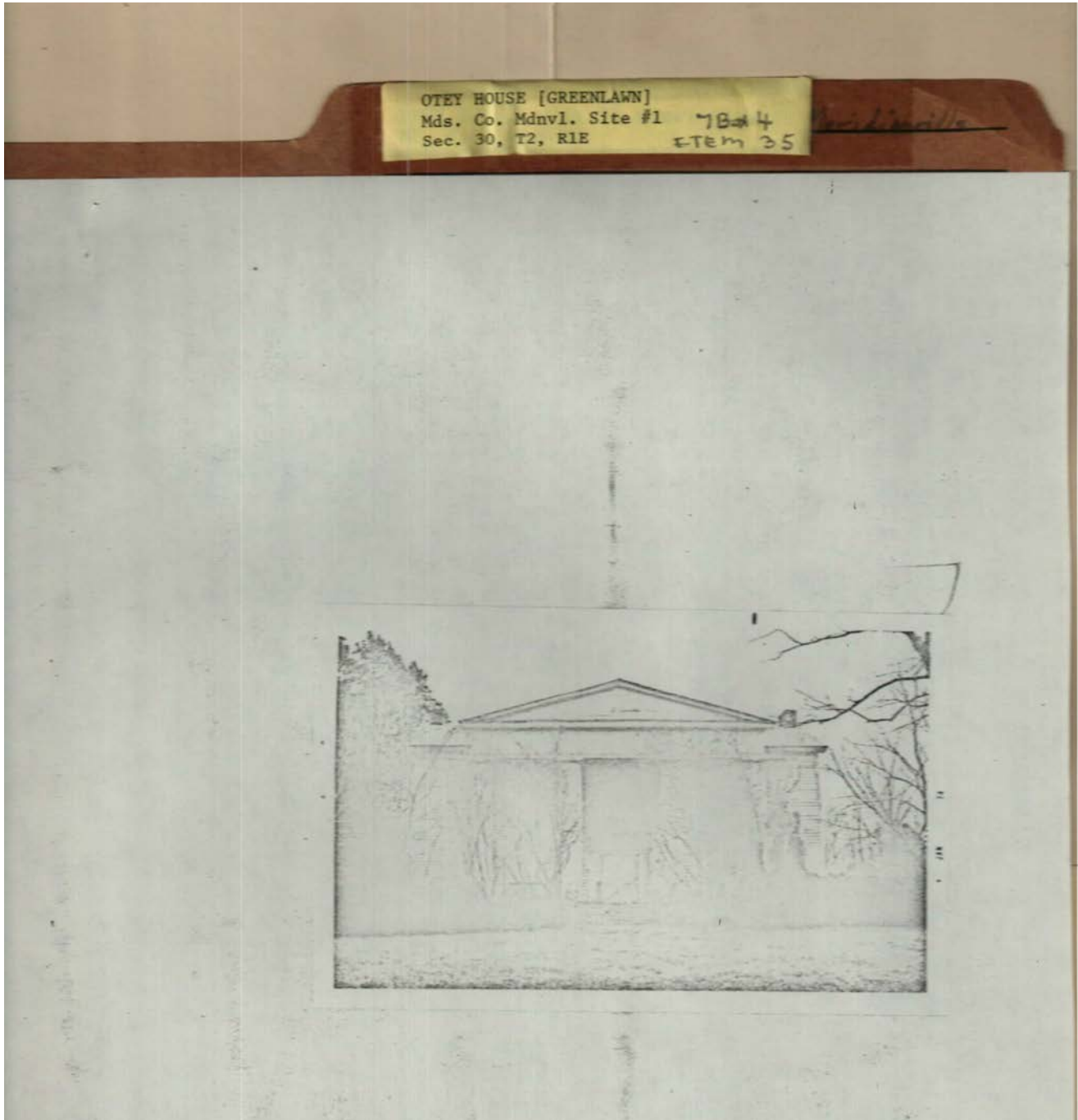

Walter Otey, son of Col. John Otey who commanded a
contingent of riflemen during the Revolutionary War, was first of
the family to settle in Alabama, arriving in 1817. Bought land 1826.
Children included John Walter, owner of Bell Springs, Probate judge,
Lucy Ann (Mrs. Rhodes) Horton, Mary Francis (Mrs. Jas.) Robinson,
Caroline Louise (Mrs. John) Robinson, Eliza Otey Dillard, Armistead,
Christopher, Wm. Madison, and Maria Melinda (Mrs. John W.) Pruitt.
Madison built the home for his Virginia-born bride, Octavia Wyche, in
1850. The grounds were especially lovely. Remnants of landscape remain.
They had six children: Mary Ann (Mrs. Wm.) Fields, Wm. Walter, Maria Rebecca
(Mrs. John) Hampton, Laura Elise, Lucille (Mrs. John Beatle) Walker, and Madison.
He found the place survived the Civil War and during Reconstruction
Mrs. Otey bequeathed it to Ku Klux Klan, making many of them robes, etc.
