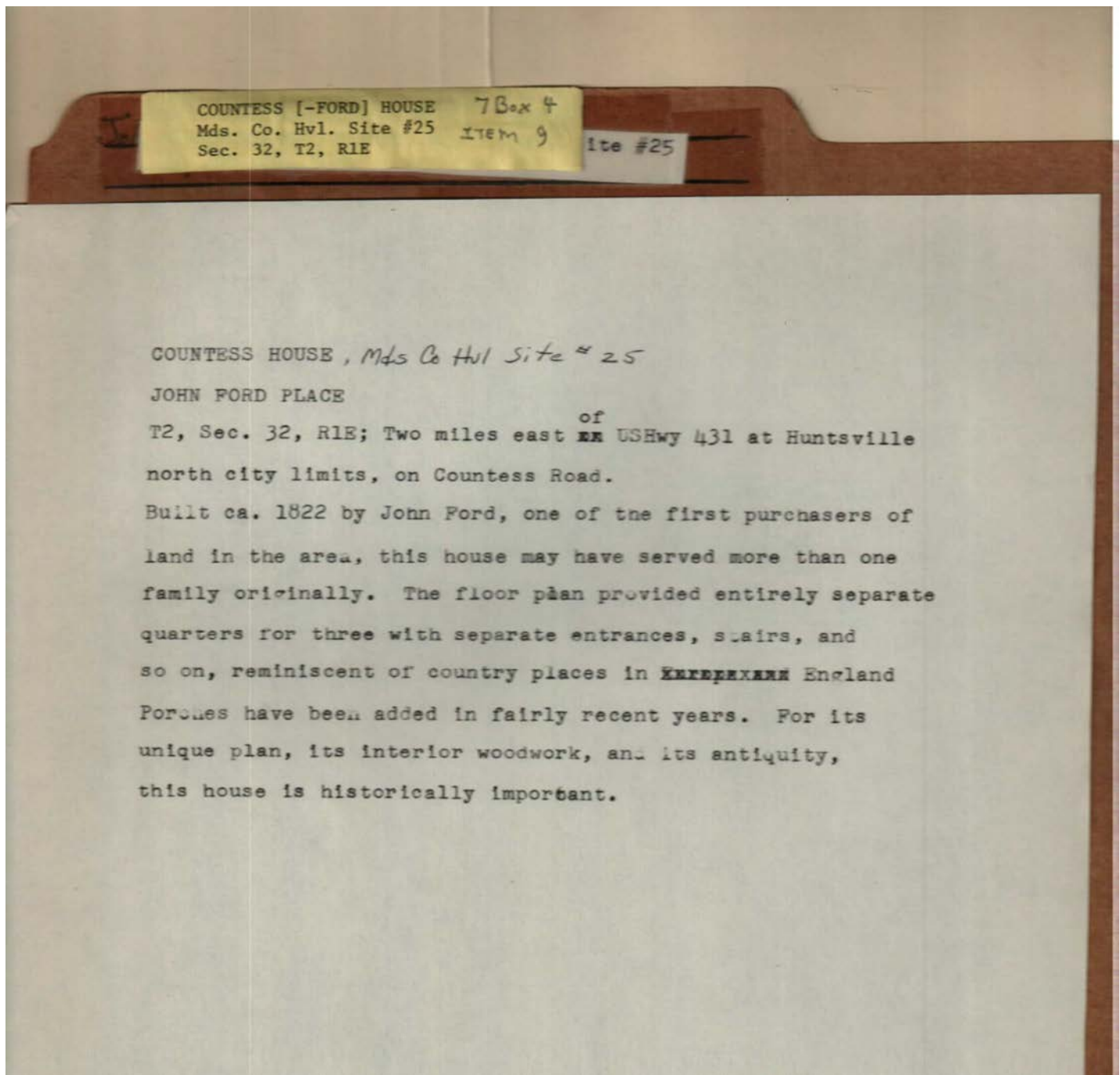

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE			
<p>Two-story brick house with attic rooms, solid masonry construction. Original house had eight main rooms built on an unusual plan. Two entrance doors on the front of the house open into two rooms, which are connected on the inside only by means of stairs and a landing. This stair opens into one of the two upstairs rooms on the front of the house. There is no central stairway hall. There are two rooms upstairs and two rooms downstairs in the ell to the rear. The upstairs rooms in the ell can be reached only by stairs from one of the downstairs rooms and do not connect with the front of the house. The roof is gabled, and there are four chimneys, three center end and one interior. The foundation is of cut limestone. Both entrance doors have six raised panels. Some windows are original with nine panes over six. Others have apparently been changed during the late Victorian period. Interior woodwork mostly Federal, although there is a Greek Revival mantel of wood. Chairrail in some of the rooms appears original. Some of the original hardware remains.</p> <p>House is made of handmade brick and made on the place, according to tradition. All walls are three brick thick</p> <p>Schoolhouse remains on the place. It is two rooms, two-storied and of frame construction. Sheds have been attached to each side.</p> <p>Present porches are not part of the original construction.</p>

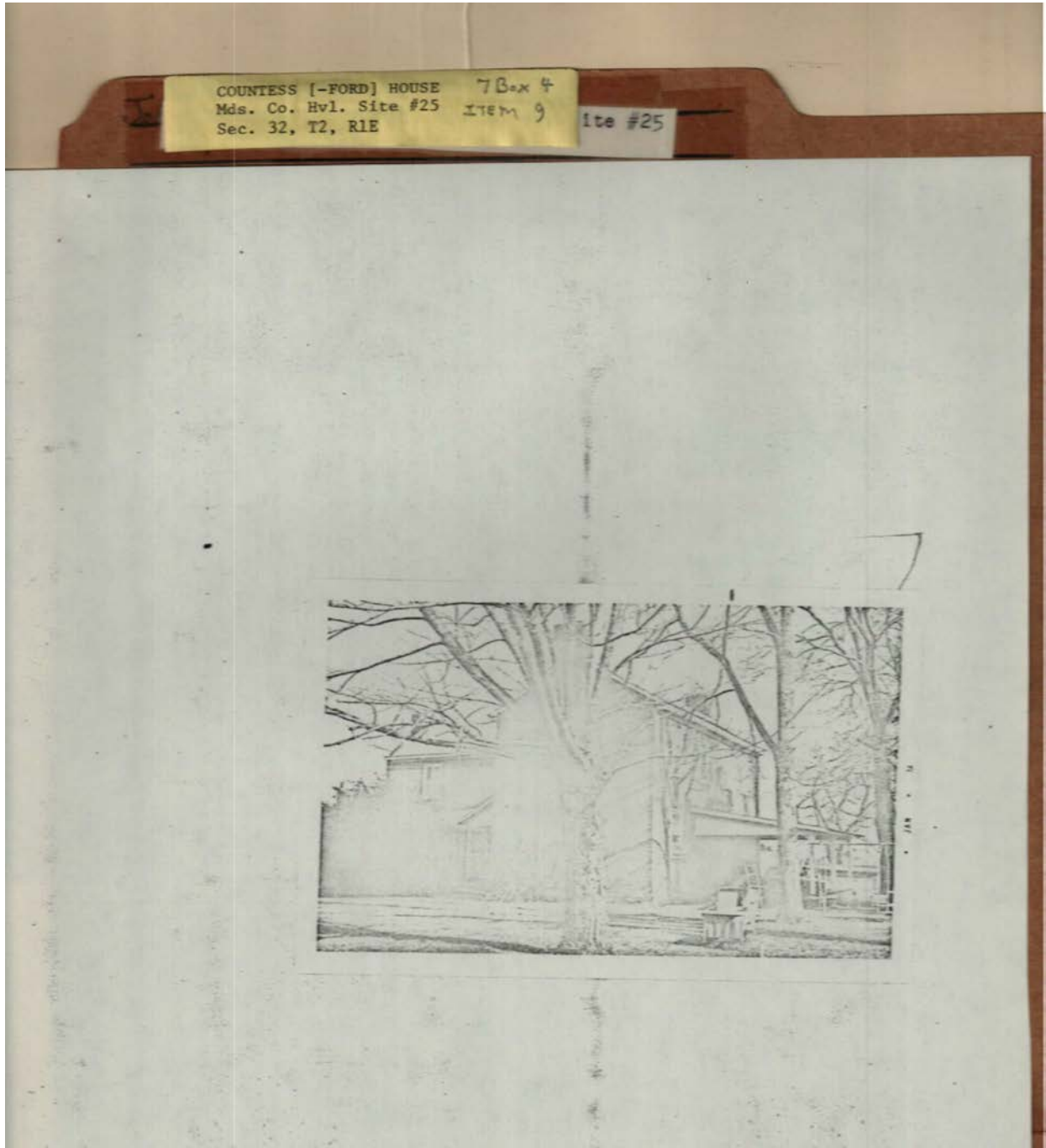

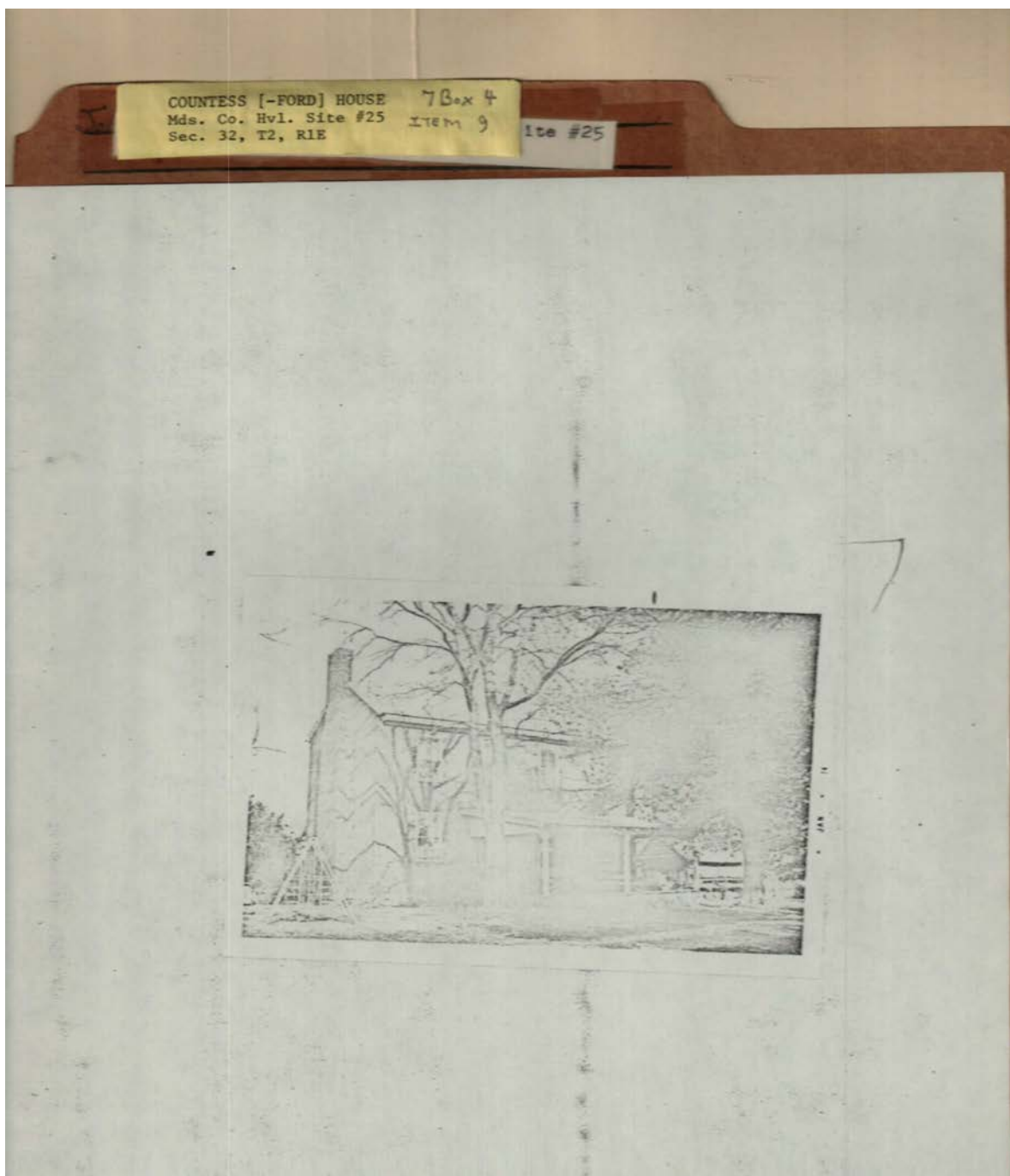

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			
<p>The house was built about 1822 by John Ford, brother of Hezekiah Ford. The Fords were among the first purchasers of land in the area. According to tradition and records in the neighboring family cemetery John Ford was born in 1788 and died in 1849. He married Marianne Roper, daughter of Capt. James Roper. Mrs. Ford died in 1872.</p> <p>John Ford held Methodist Episcopal classes at Indian Springs in 1807, one of the earliest religious exercises of record in the county.</p> <p>Built in the area of the county which saw early development, this house has witnessed much of the history of the county. With its unusual floor plan, it may even have served more than one family at the time, although no records have been found to substantiate the idea. Certainly the plan of the house makes it an important architectural example in its uniqueness, if nothing else. Additionally it has seen relatively little change since construction.</p>

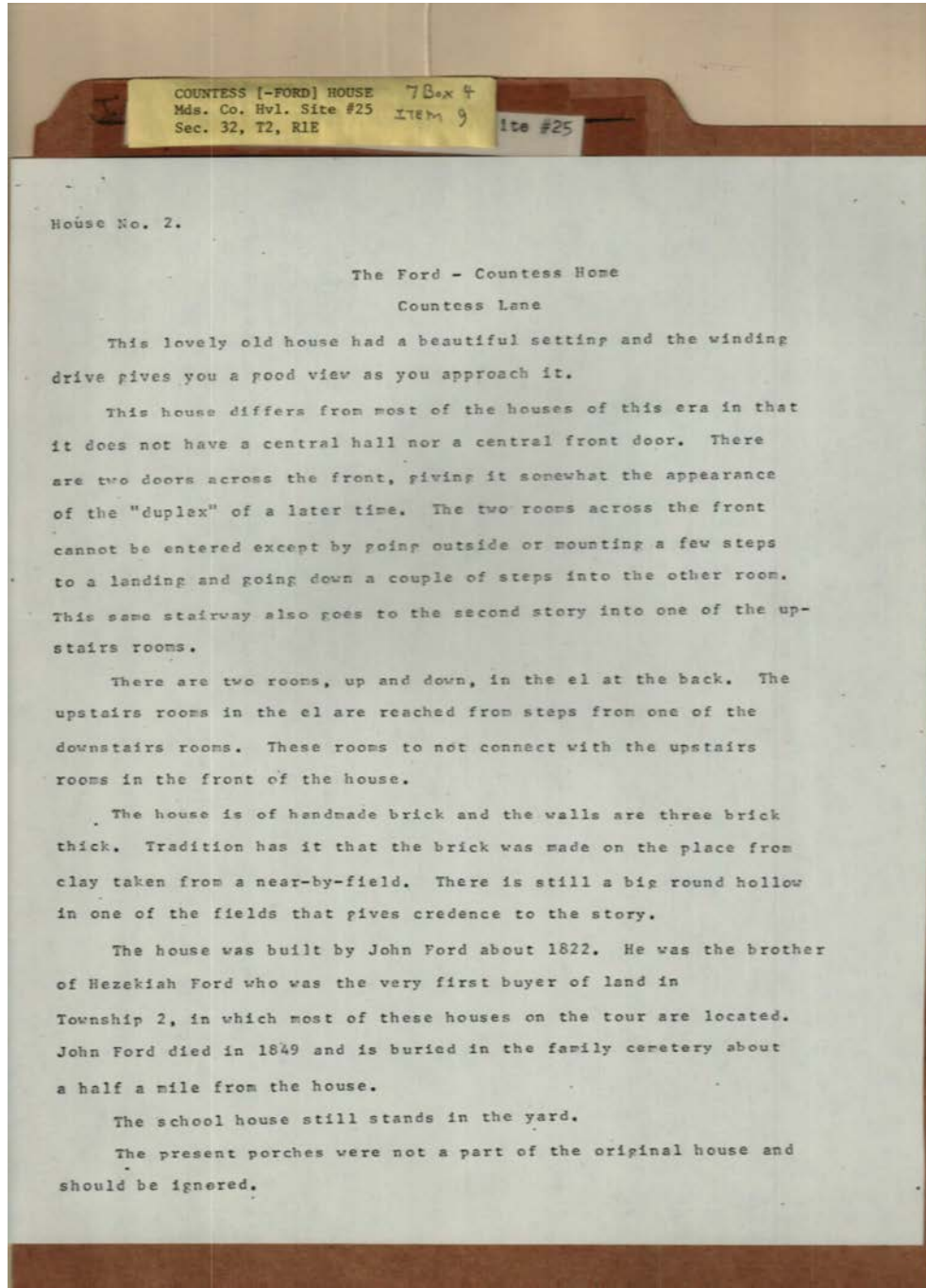
