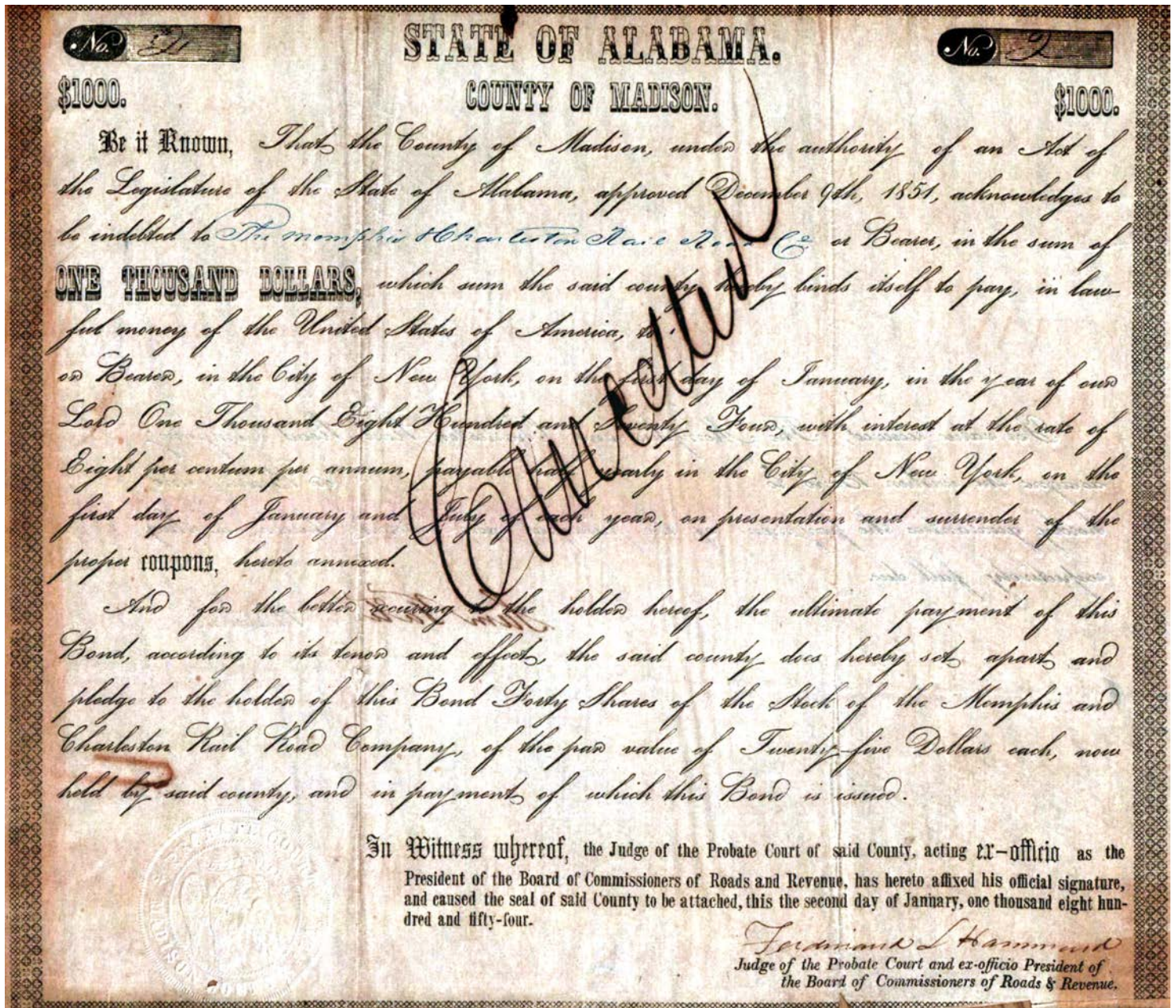

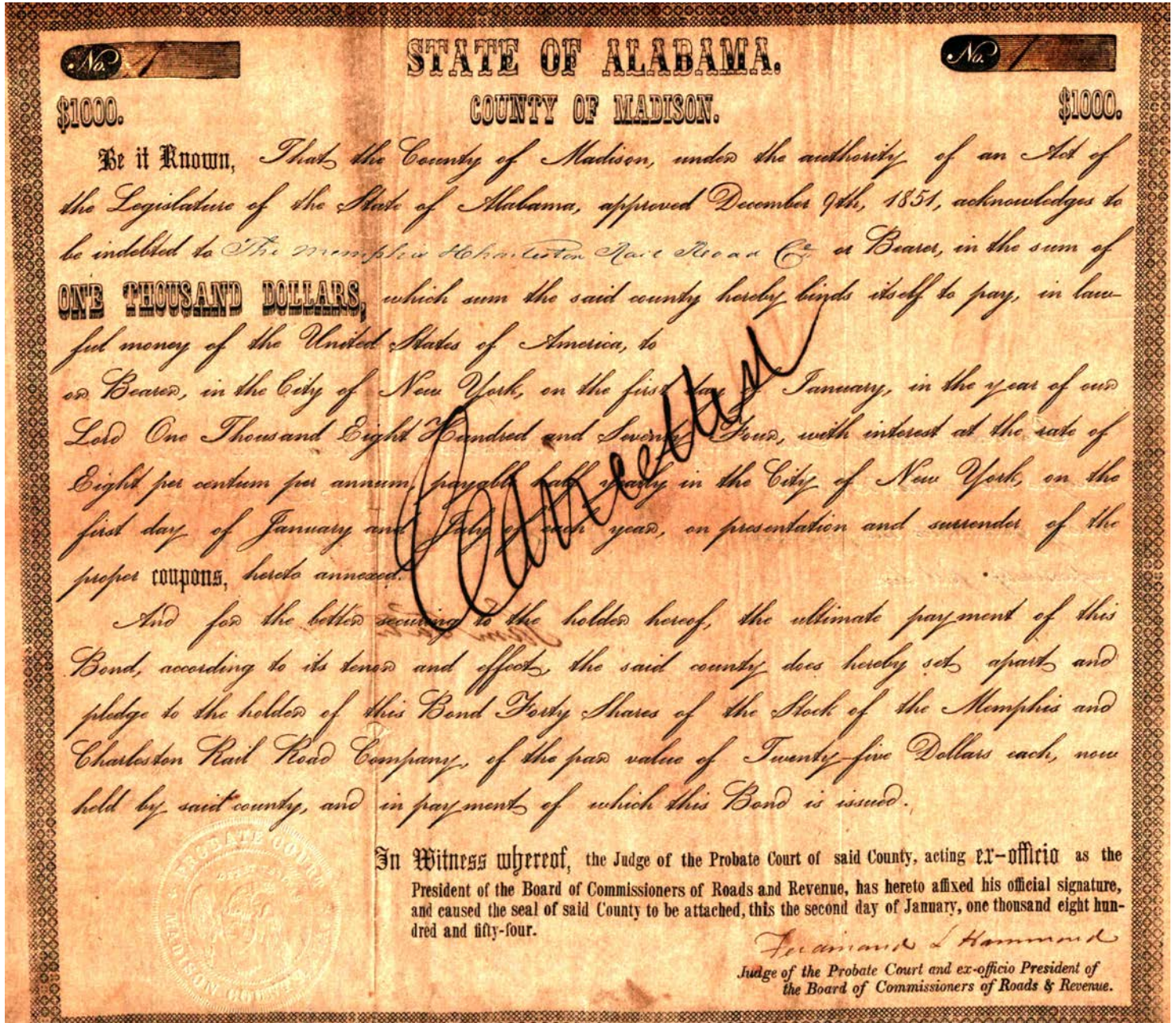

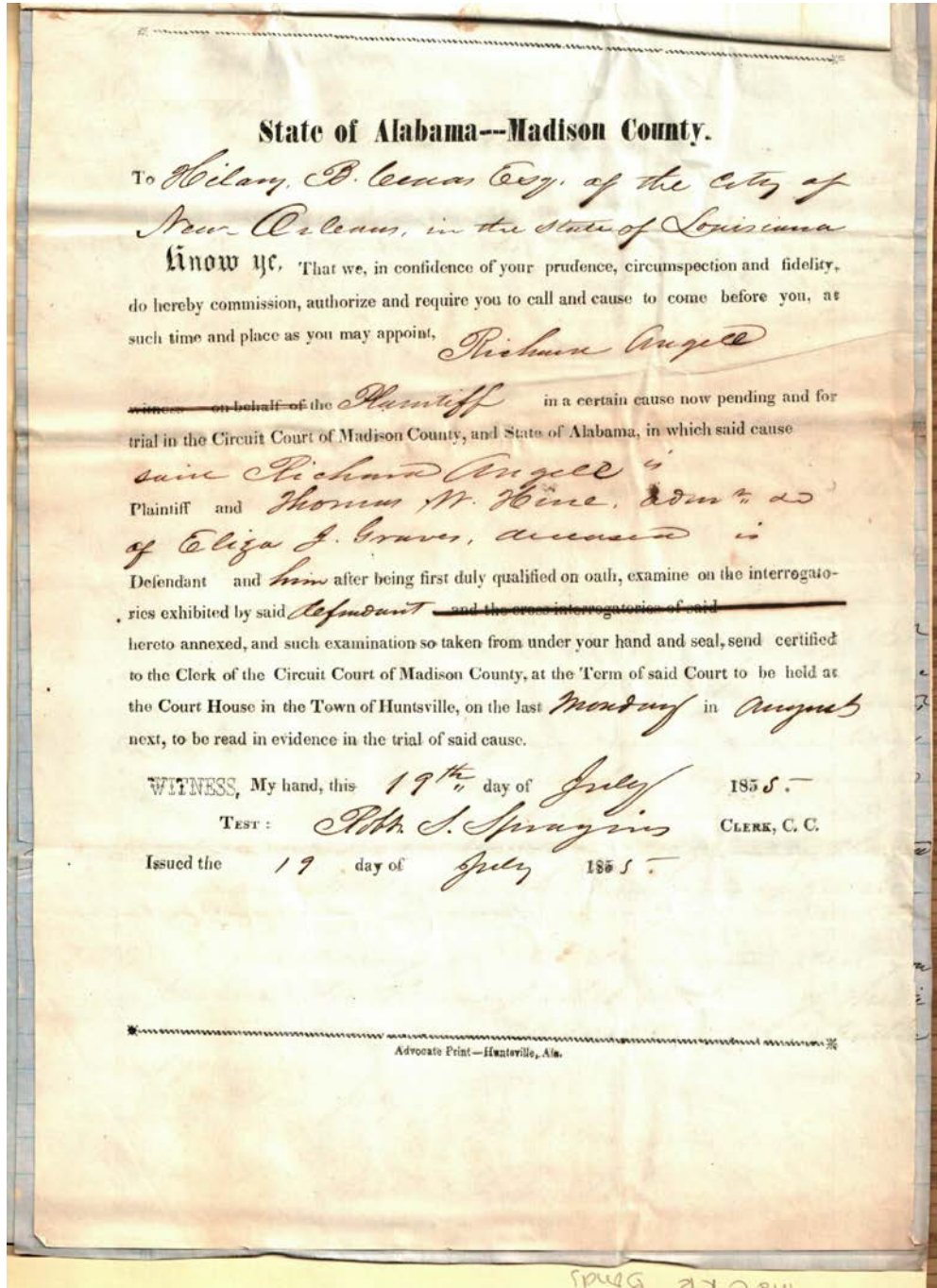

- 7 In practicing on the deceased did you pursue the Homoeopathic System of Medicine or did you pursue the Allopathic system?

on the Fourth day of August A.D. 1855. He being in
evidence on the trial of a certain cause now pending in the
Circuit Court of Madison County, State of Alabama,
wherein the said Richard Angell is Plaintiff, and Thomas
H. Hine, Administrator of the Estate of Eliza J. Graves, deceased is defendant,
pursuant to and by virtue of the annexed commission to me
directed, and issued from the Office of said Court.

The said Richard Angell being by me first duly
cautioned and solemnly sworn upon the Holy Evangelist of
Almighty God, to speak the truth, the whole truth and nothing
but the truth, did depose and say, as follows, to wit:—

To the 1st annexed Interrogatory he answered and says—
I made two visits, as per account books annexed, marked
as Exhibit A.

To the 2^d annexed Interrogatory he answered and says—
I do not recollect who came for me each time, not con-
sidering it of the slightest importance. I do recollect
that others besides J. M. Graves did come. One or more,
neighbours, a servant & I think the express came at
different times.

To the 3^d annexed Interrogatory he answered and says—
I kept but one book for charges & generally entered the
charges as I did the practice, but sometimes made
several accounts generally in pencil in a note or Memor-
andum Book, for the purpose of preserving accuracy.
