The State of Alabama -
 To the Sheriff of Madison county, Georgia;
 Thomas Screnton, Sheriff, on the 29th day of November
 1833, Thomas B. Coleman who had been arrested by
 the Sheriff of said county of Madison upon a capias
 to answer the State of Alabama on a charge for an
 assault & battery upon John L. Gee with which he stood in
 default & produced James Sanders & John S. Coleman
 as sureties for his appearance to answer the charge and
 appearance before John R. Becklin Sheriff of said county
 by his deputy Colman J. Pool according to the Statute
 on said 29th day of November 1833, the said Thomas
 B. Coleman, James Sanders & John S. Coleman entered
 into recognizance & acknowledged themselves jointly &
 severally indebted unto John Sage Governor of said
 State & his successor in the penal sum of three hun-
 dred dollars to be void of their respective goods &
 chattels, lands & tenements, to be void if the said
 Thomas B. Coleman should personally appear before
 the Judge of the then next circuit court of said
 county, at the court house thereof on the third


