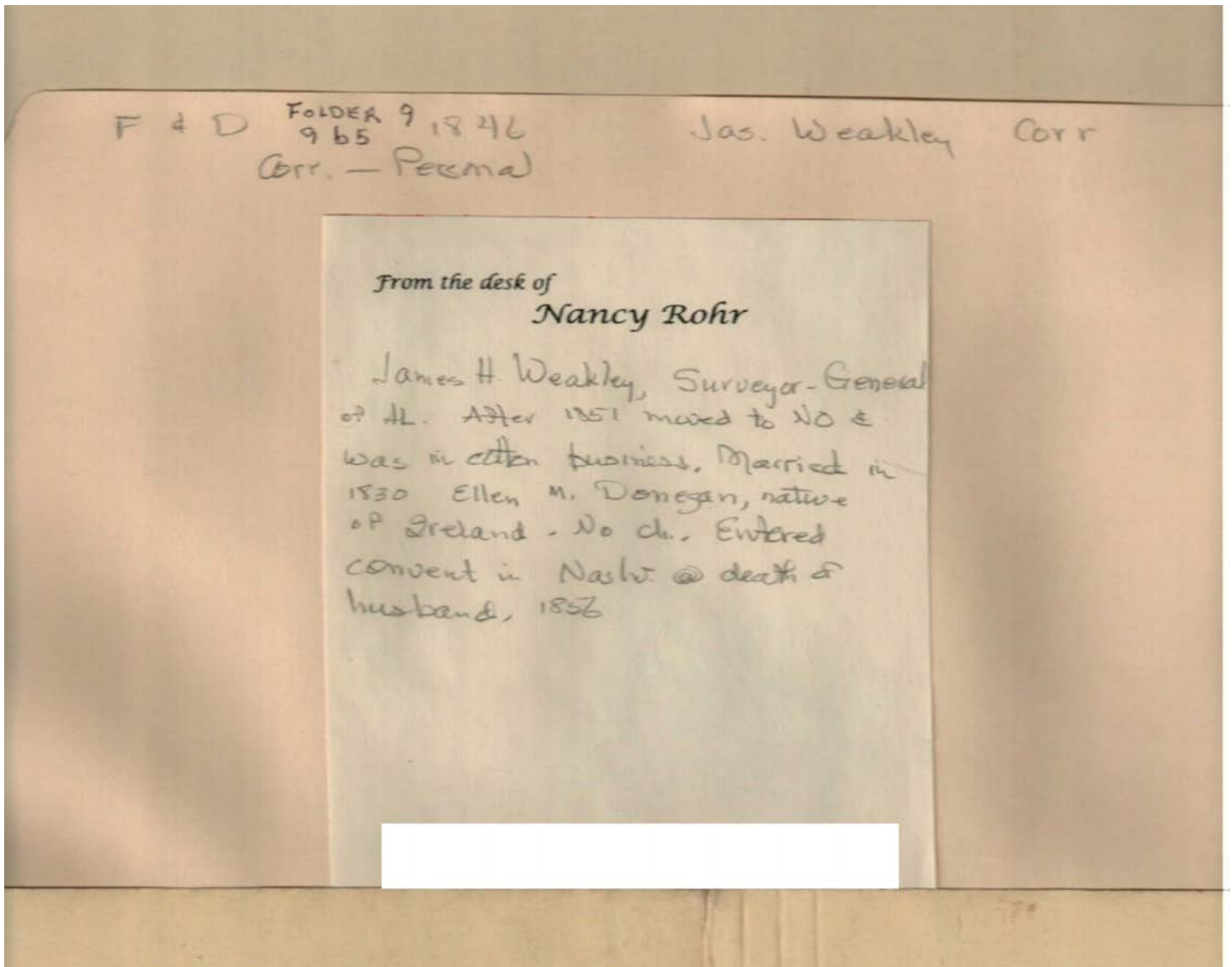

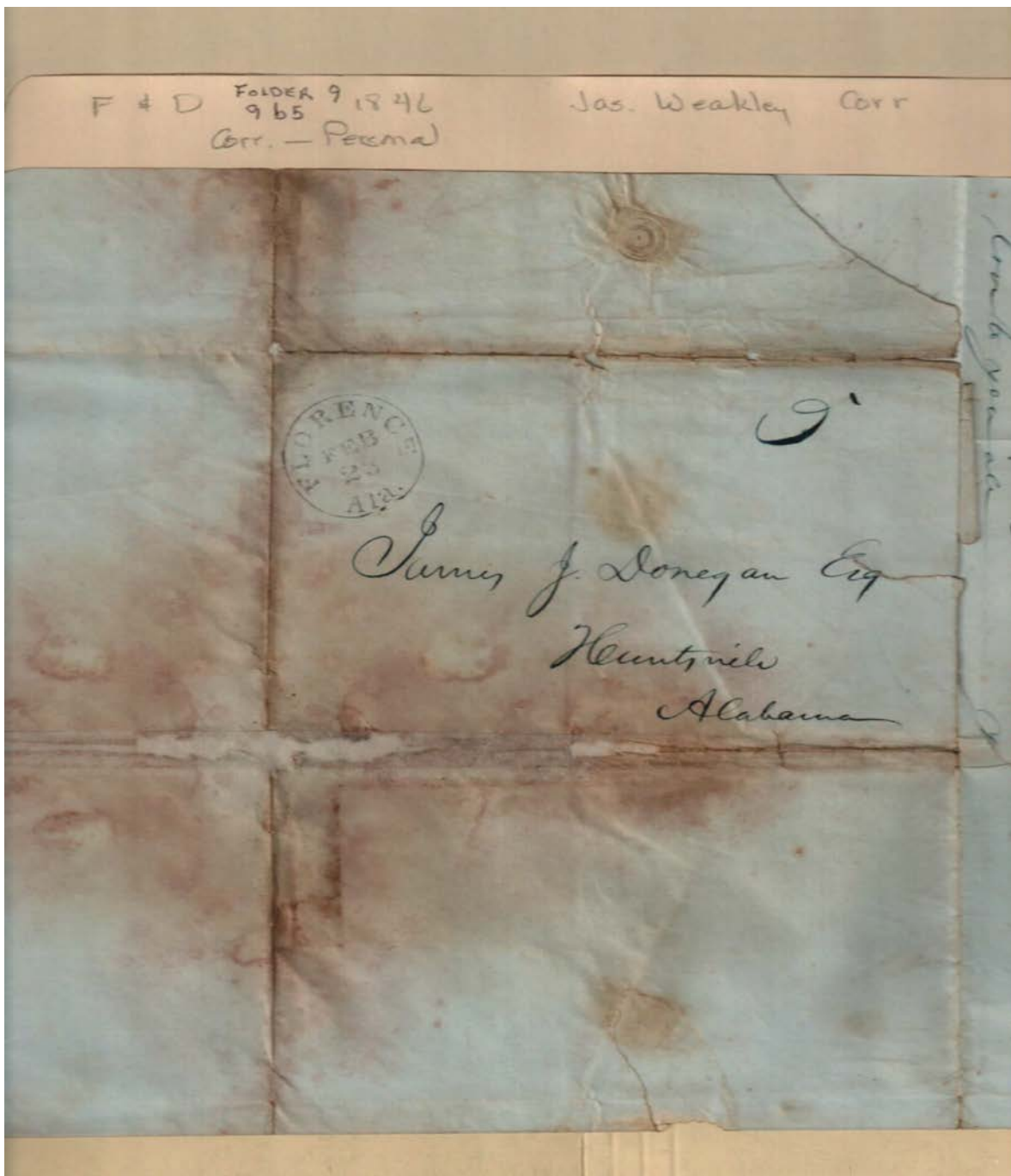

My dear James.

Your letter of the 12<sup>th</sup> Inst was duly received. Having nothing to communicate worth of notice, I find less or no days have passed off since it was written. I have now nothing of any great interest to write about. I have only to say that we are all well and enjoying ourselves, as the different families join to the young bride. Late Miss Susan Wilson, daughter of John N. Wilson, on the Strawbridge road, six miles north of town. She was married on Wednesday evening last, to Mr. Turner Saunders Foster, of Memphis, son of Robert C. Foster of Franklin. A large party was present; on whole family among the number, with the Misses Walker. Ellen unfortunately sprained her ankle very badly, <sup>in the walking</sup> I have not been able to get about since. It has been quite swollen & painful, but I hope is on the mend. On Friday night, a large party at Mr. Mathew Wilson's, and on to morrow evening Mr. John Simpson gives a large ball on Thursday evening Mr. Wood, which will give them further pleasure.

I have not yet seen young Brooke. I am told he is to be over to morrow evening at Mr. Simpson's if so with us here, and invite him to my house.

One day you have paid George Stuts for putting up the Tomb, over Mother's grave \$60, but was under the impression that I had paid it. I have not done so. I requested you at one time to have it done & would pay it, but I forgot to do so, while in Huntsville. My dear James

Your esteemed favour of the 14<sup>th</sup> came duly to hand. Having nothing to communicate of any interest, I am delayed in reply until I could see Mr. Clarke, the person who builds cisterns. I have had a conversation with him on the subject. He is now very much engaged at his business, plastering & has plenty of work to do. Perhaps he may be idle after a while; if so, he is willing to go up to Keenwells, provided he could get a job of several cisterns that would employ his time, for some day or weeks. Should he be able to go up, he would prefer that the person wanting cisterns built, would furnish all the materials necessary & a hand to wait upon him, while at work. In order to which, it will be necessary that you have them dug, regardless of the depth & width, you like, say 15 feet deep & 10 feet in circumference, or ten or 12 feet each way, as you may prefer. Send to Louisville, for a quantity of water lime, called Hydraulic Cement, to do the jobs. For a cistern 15 by 15, will require about 5 barrels, one of 10 by 10 about 2 barrels. These are all the materials necessary. The brick work, or arch, can be done by the bricklayer in Keenwells, which he pays for or not as the contract is made. I gave him for money which is about 10 or 12 feet each way & did my boys

My dear James,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter, by last mail, of the 2<sup>d</sup> Inst, and am glad to learn, that you all escaped home, safe, but sorry, to hear of the sickness of Billy, that, as we had made an arrangement to get off in the Pickaway, previous he (Billy) had got down on yesterday. I hope they will be well again in a few days. On Wednesday last I got Saml. W. Patton to ride out & value the two families of negroes, which we own jointly, which valuation, you will find enclosed. They find the difference to be \$875 in the families; one half of which seems to be \$437.<sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> with the sum of \$50 difference between Charly, Lucy & Child, making together the sum of \$487.<sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> which I will owe you. I propose, that you take Dennis, that, at valuation amounting to \$1375, from which deduct the sum down you leave, \$237.<sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> which amount be pleased to give me credit for, with the understanding that I am to pay you interest on the valuation of that, until Christmas as here. As the division has now taken place, you taking Bently, Hannah, Buck, Lucy & Child, May, Bently, John, Mishack, Caroline, Emily, Clara, Ann, Austin, & Nat & Dennis (16) & I retaining Ned, Clara, Edward, Harry, Saml. Davis, Alexander, Rebecca, Margaret, Eugene, Hortense, Paralee, Narcissa & Charles (13) as my portion, with the understanding, that if any of the negroes die, the property to whom they belong, is to be the looser. This I believe is the understanding or conclusion to which we arrived, at least, it may prevent hard thoughts. I hope, however, that none of them will die. If sick, they shall be well taken care of.

We have nothing new here. The weather is very hot &

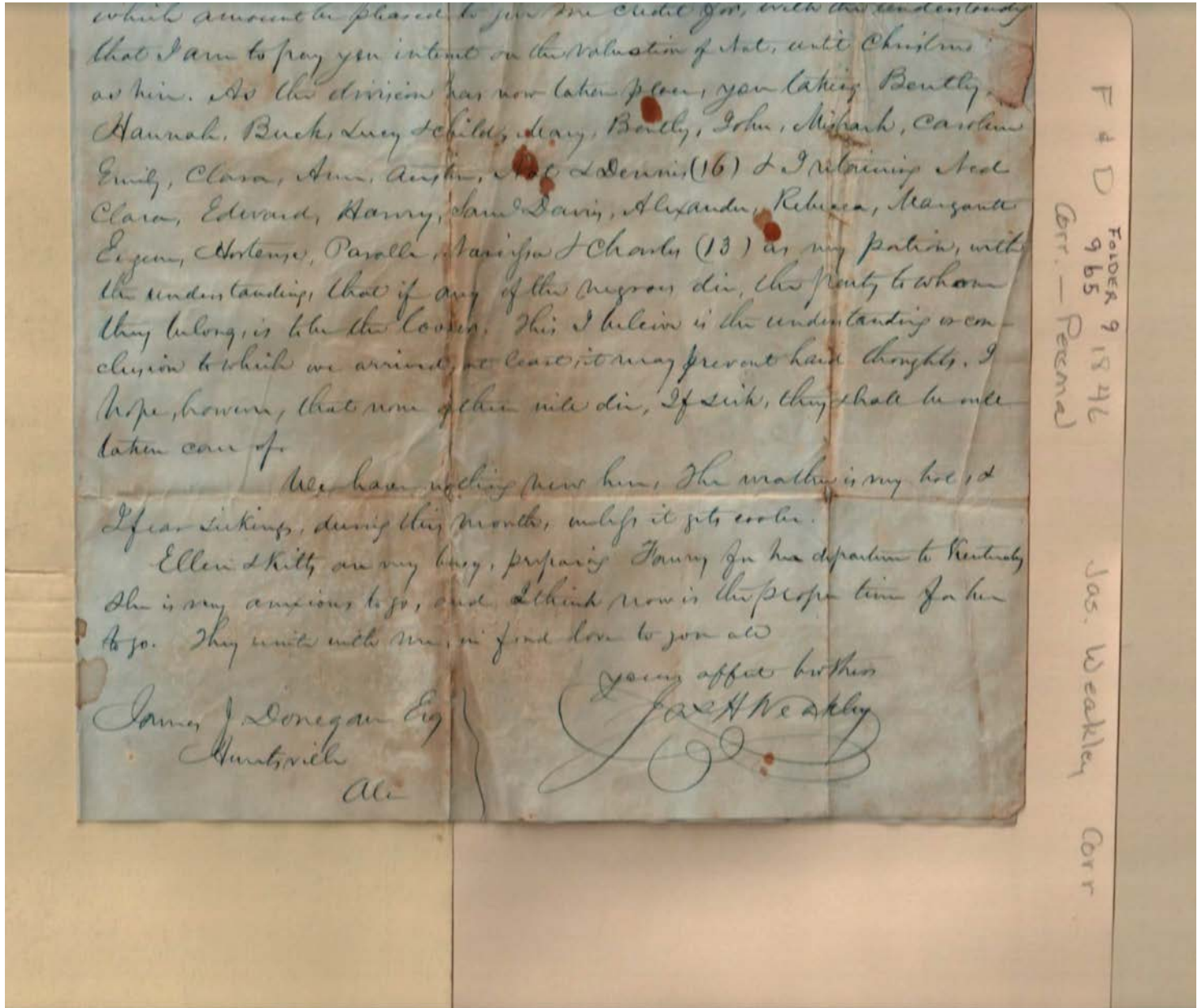

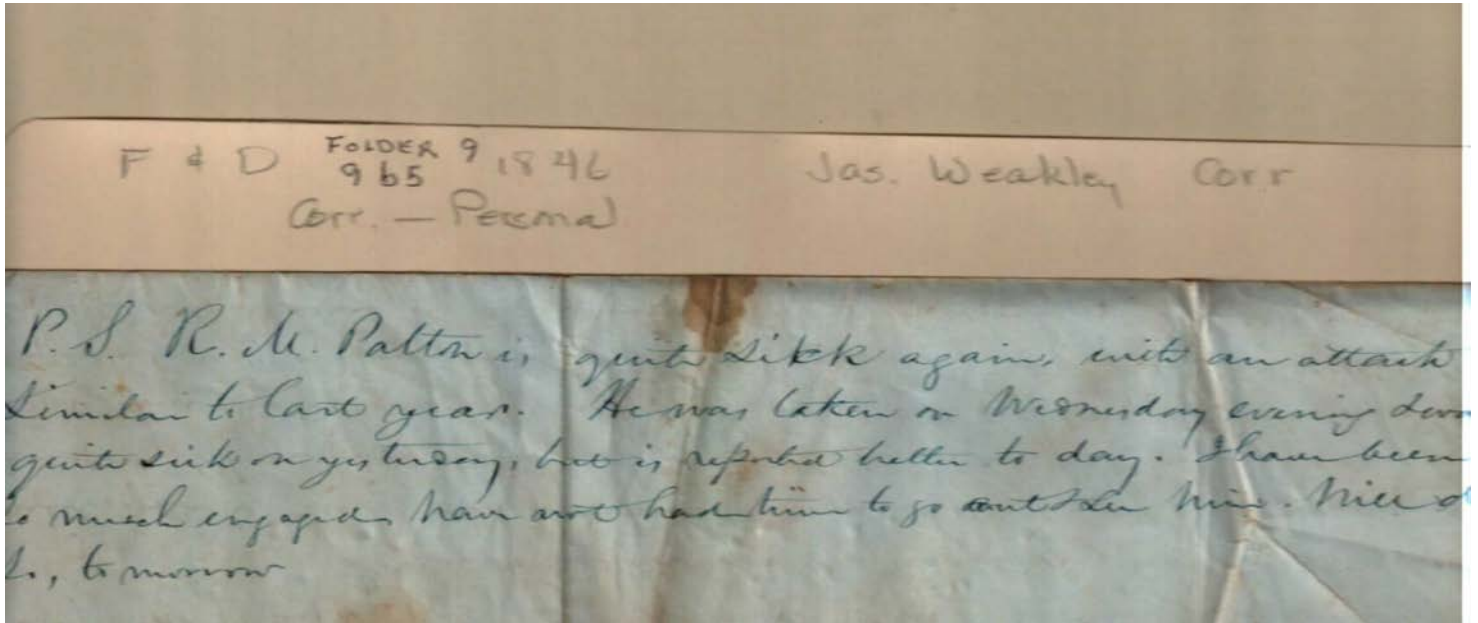

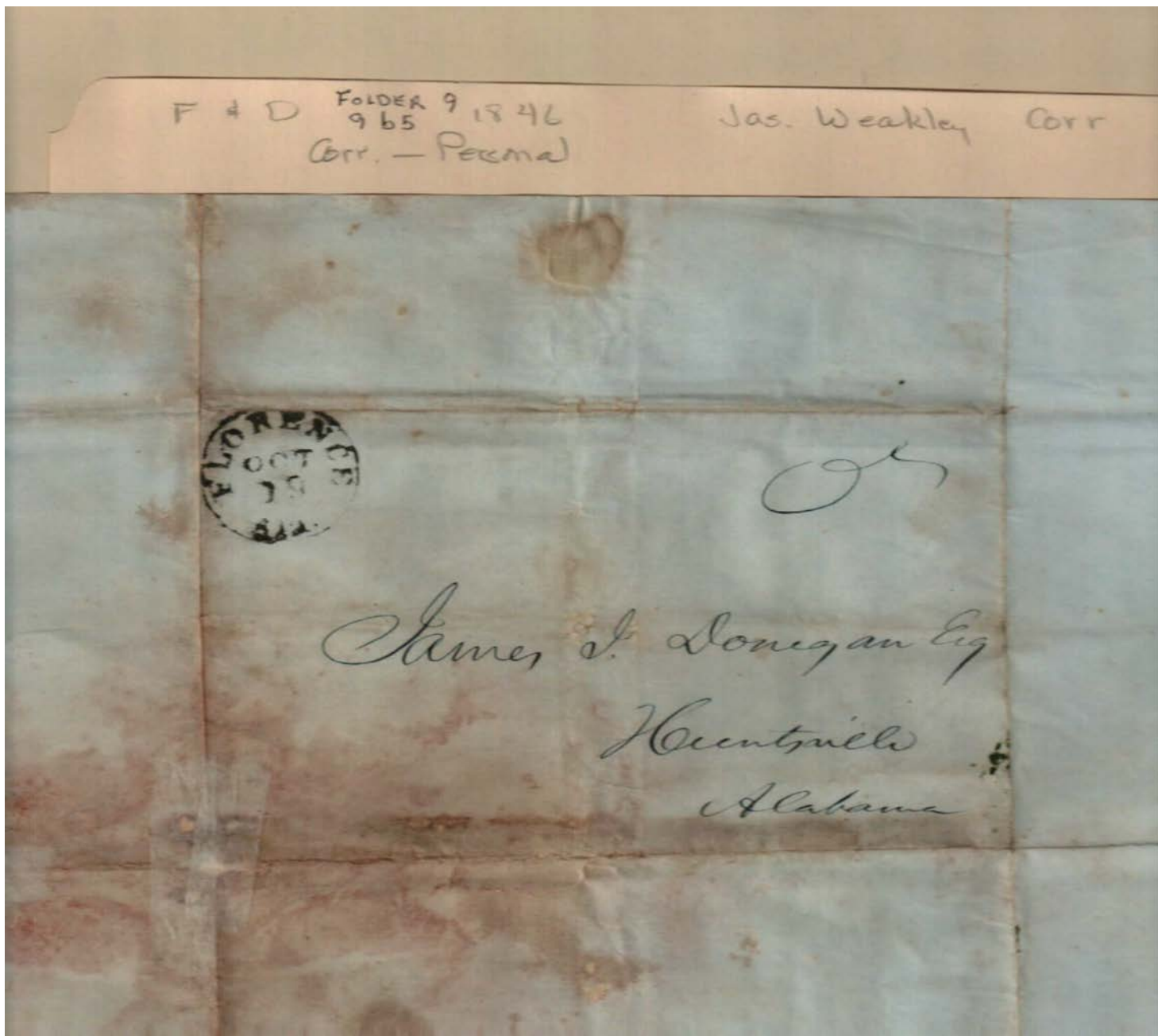

My dear James

19. October 1846

I have the pleasure to acknowledge the receipt of your long and interesting letter of the 16<sup>th</sup> Inst. I am pleased to inform you that, although the weather was quite hot & unpleasant for three or four days, and that after we arrived at Louisville, yet we had a very pleasant and agreeable trip to Louisville. The day after we arrived, Fanny complained a little of acid stomach, threw up the contents of her breakfast, but, by keeping quiet & taking a few pills, she was content, & she did not show any further signs of disease. We remained in Louisville four days, during which time Dr. Sommerby plugged five teeth for her, and one or two for Billy.

I write you from Louisville a full account of the Institute at Nazareth. It is my pleasant duty, and I have no doubt Fanny will be happy to hear that she will learn more there, than at any other place, as the emulation will be greater, & with the number of girls, Sister Columba, under whose guidance and direction Ellen flourishes, is one of the most accomplished and ladylike women, I have ever seen. She has the air, carriage & manners of a queen. I am told she possesses the rare faculty of endearing the children to her, beyond any other lady in the school; indeed all the sisters seem to possess this faculty, in an eminent degree. Should Fanny be profited by the change, Ellen doubtless will be satisfied & contented. I have no doubt she will be greatly benefited. As you have justly remarked, there were many reasons why she should be sent from home. In her letter of the 16<sup>th</sup> Inst. (my recital to her) she says, she is studying, Reading, Grammar, Writing, Arithmetic, Geology, & French. Sister Columba examined her, before she left, and said that she was a very good Geographer & Arithmetician, but an indifferent Reader, and did not know much of French.

of the two hundred dollars, Mrs. felt Cady gave you  
draft, I expended about \$195 dollars, a memorandum of  
which I will render you, when I see you. Ellen purchased some  
articles for Henry in Louisville, I paid the sister on of the  
Board, which is \$135 I gave them \$5 for pocket money, when  
they said was enough. The terms of board, which amount  
to about \$130 per annum, but then there are some extra charges  
for Messrs. French, painting the plantation, the annual expenses  
including clothing sale expenses, will exceed some two hundred dollars  
probably, but not more than fifty dollars.

We are getting along very well in gathering our cotton crop,  
so we have not my usual, better than I expected, or hearing the  
disturbance caused by the worms, while at Louisville. We hope to  
get it all over by Christmas, if the weather continues fine.

I am in hopes, that Elizabeth will not suffer as much  
with hot wet weather, as she usually does, with her children. She  
better plan will be to get a nurse for her, at once.

I shall write to James Henry in a few days. In looking over  
my letter since my return, I find that I have not answered his last  
letter.

Mr. Kirkman received the money you sent him. They  
had left for his Iron works, but his wife got the letter and money.  
I am glad to hear that Mr. Murphy, his family have  
all recovered. We have so far, had uninterrupted good health,  
in town & country.

I am busily engaged in getting my servants  
off for the woods. That done, hope to have the pleasure of paying  
you a visit early in November. Mrs. Baxter is got with us &  
will remain this week. I am joined by Ellen, she is but wishes  
to you all.

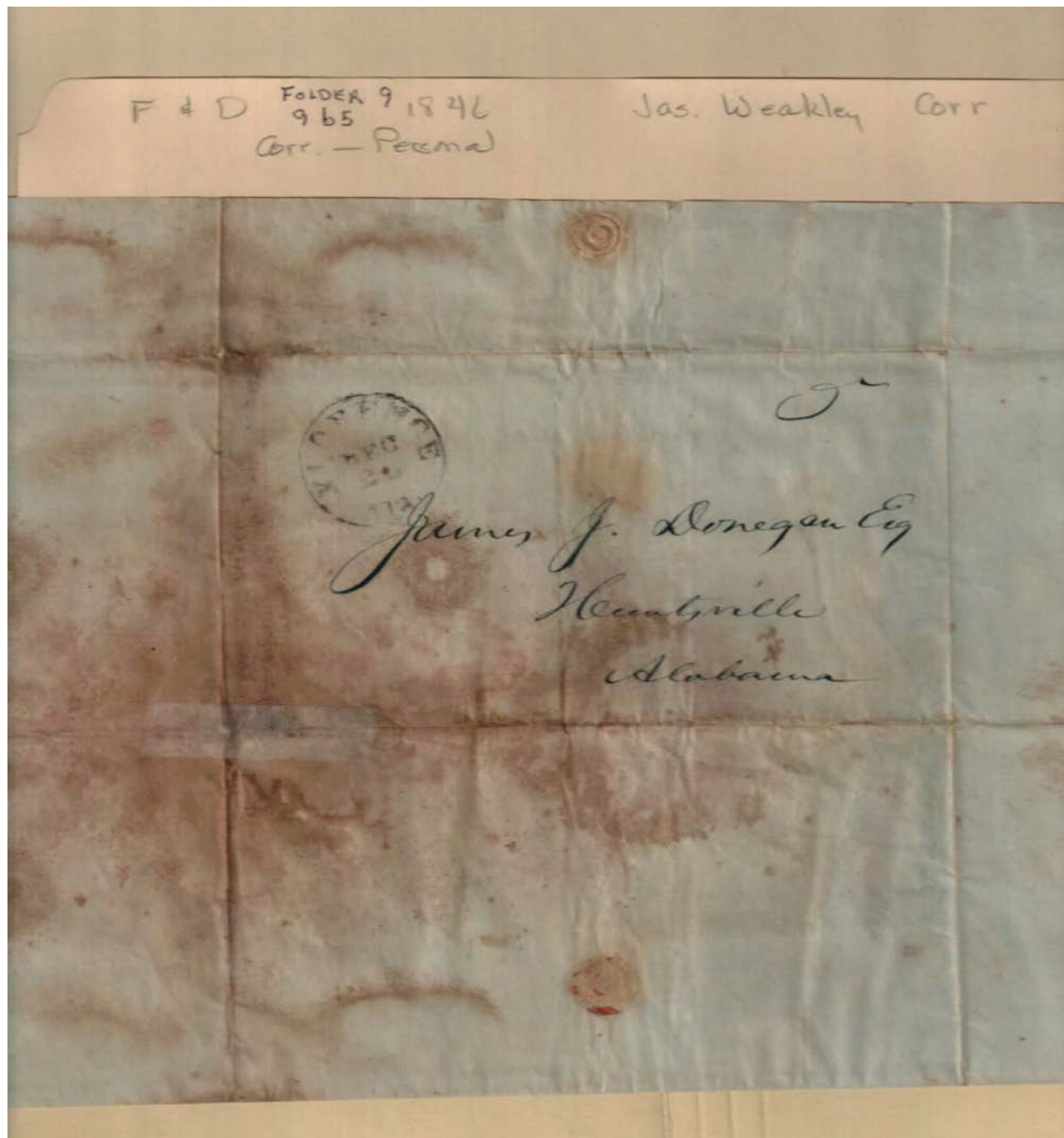

I enclose to you a money draft on Mr. Cruse, Receiver of public moneys, for one thousand dollars, which I please to deposit for a certain premium you can get, pay yourself of the balance I owe you on my note, borrowed of you in August last; then remit the balance to me by mail.

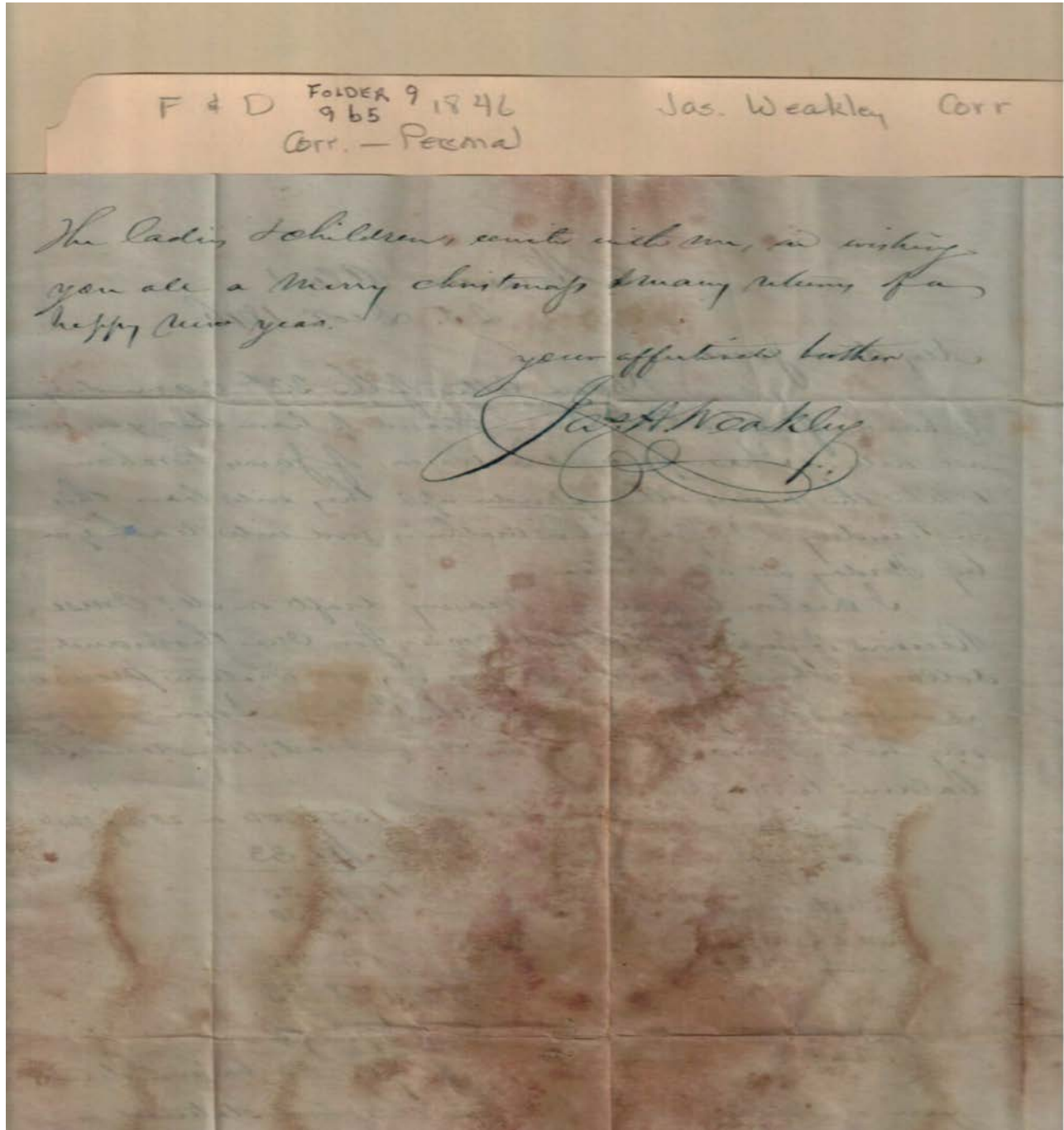
