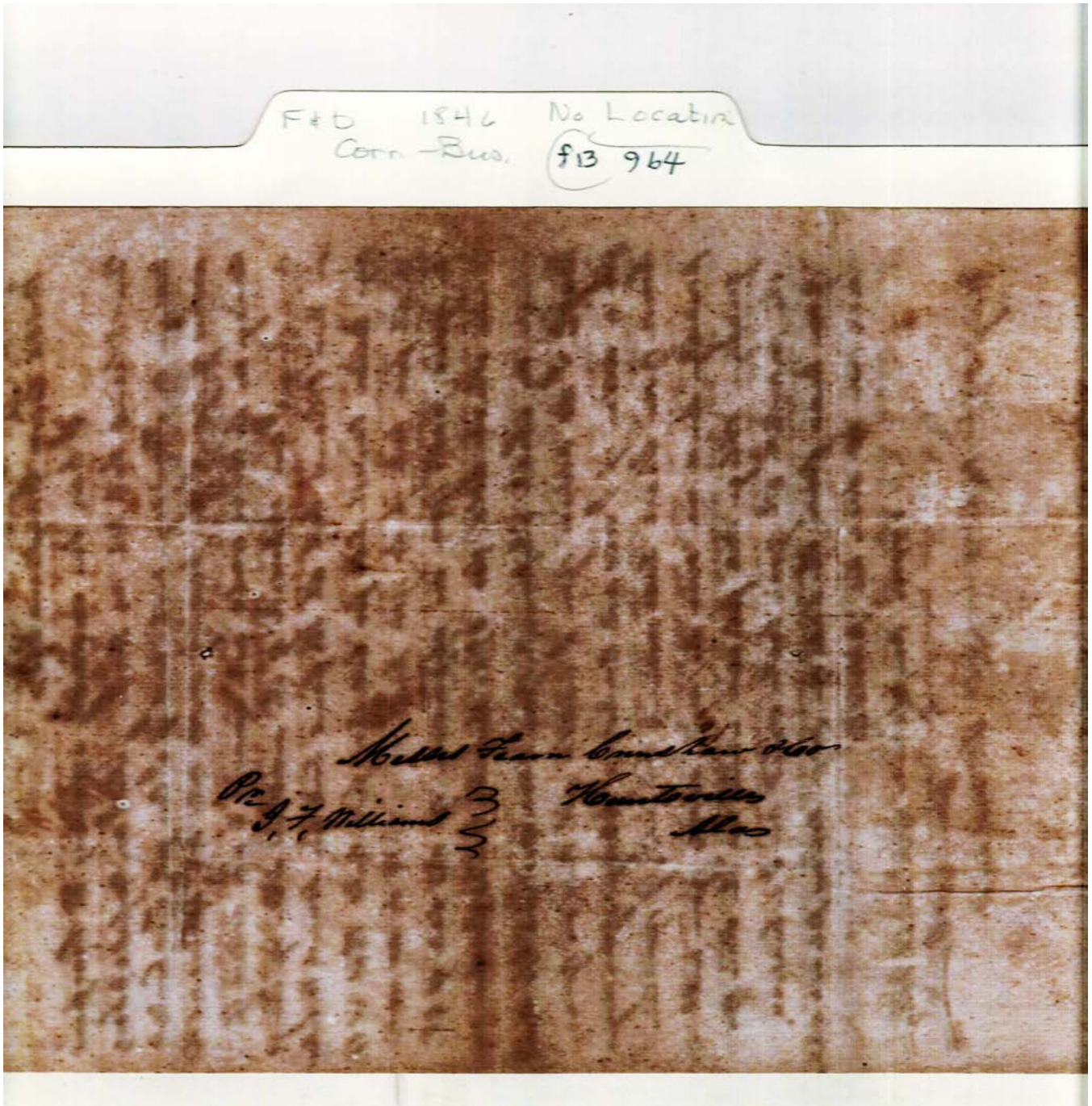

I have been anxiously expecting to hear from New Orleans but with no word yet I am compelled to have money on Thursday next and if I can get two hundred dollars of you I can possibly make out ^{my} ~~the~~ ^{my} ~~the~~ damage on the cotton would cost amount to five dollars if any thing I am apprehensive of the unsettled state of things in New Orleans but at the same time am bound to believe any cotton cannot sell for less than five cents that is to treat five here if do you know there will be no risk on your part you are apprehensive of the sale of 28 Bales which sold for 6 1/4 - subject to Classification on which on which Wharpmunt - you advanced me 1/2 a cent draft - I do assure you I would not call on you for a dollar if I was not compelled I pledge you my honor you shall lose nothing by me, if you can possibly send me over the amt. above you will greatly oblige me please write me the state of the market at your last dated and I whenever you hear from the sale of my cotton please apprise me as soon as possible

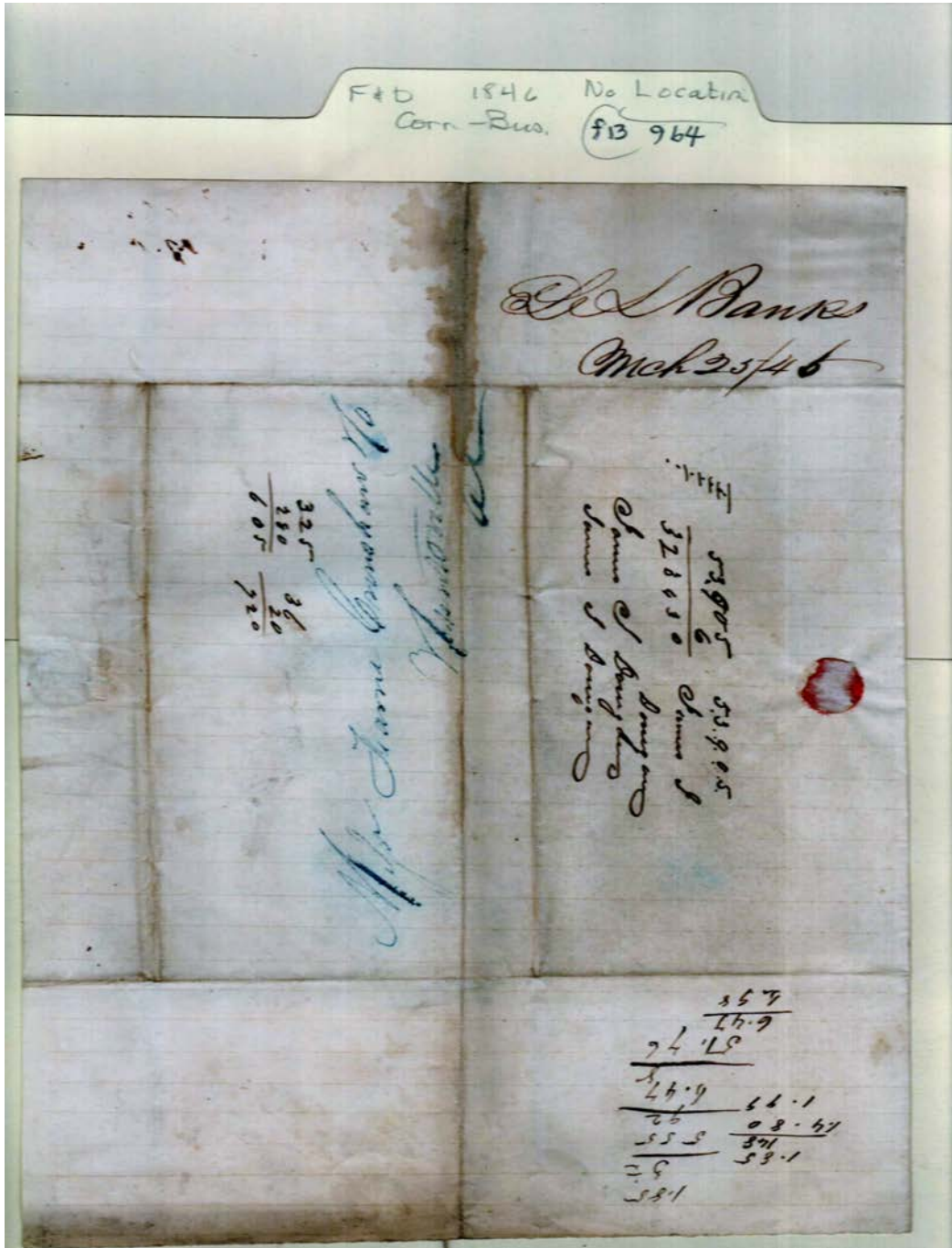

The ship by
the *Britania* is the 1st just reached Charleston
two previous to my leaving there on
day Monday. The money market in England
was uncommonly tight and there had been
several extensive failures. Cotton on the 17th ult
declined $\frac{1}{8}$ p on the 27th a further decline from
 $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ p. On the 1st inst the ship *Patrick Henry*
from New York arrived with the published
correspondence between Mr. Buchanan and
Mr. Packenham which appearing a little
more warlike than any thing previously
received from this side caused Cotton to
tighten a little, and on the 5th inst it advanced
an $\frac{1}{8}$ p.

I am now picking cotton & as well as I can estimate the quantity by comparison with former crops and by information of my overseers will make 300 bales at the South 500 at Anchuca, and 600 at Walton's Bend.

Of this, 250 I shall send to McCall Adams, and 30 to Bogart & Foley. I have every reason to believe that I shall have 800 or more to send to you, besides ^{half} of last year's growth that I was unable to gin.

I have debts yet which have been unpaid beyond their time and it is all times mortifying to be in one's especially to those who are themselves in straitened circumstances. I wish therefore to make draw drafts which can be used by those in whose favour they are drawn if accepted. I give you a statement of those I wish now to draw, or authorized to be drawn. viz. I wish to remit \$600 to Capt. Jas. Hobson of Cumberland Co. Va. as soon as you can authorize him to draw on your house for that amt. You are more conversant with the present practice of the Va. Banks than I am and can therefore tell on what time the drafts can be drawn. Capt. Hobson's P. O. is Stoney Point Mill, Cumberland Co. Va. I wish him to get the nett sum of \$600. -

due. I shall have to draw in favour of Mrs. J.P. Ban-

favour of Wm Young for about \$1500. - payable
probably by our Court (this is a balance of the amt
on which I Coburn is security. - and I owe two
debts of about \$700 & about \$2500. which I am
anxious to arrange and several small sums of less
than \$100 each, say \$13000. besides what I now owe
you - I wish all these paid by the first of January
and as soon as you can authorize me to draw for
them - Could I make my payments as early as
those to whom they are due are entitled to receive
them, I would not be disposed to anticipate the
sale of my cotton, but although no man has ever
lost a dollar by me and I have devoted my whole
income for nine years past to the debts of others
I can never feel easy when a debt is due from
me and those entitled to receive it are in want
of it - this I hope will account to you for the
great desire I have to anticipate my crops
