If the funds do not come to hand by
the time Mrs. B. wishes to start you can
advance her the amount & I will have
it sent to you.

Our corn crops have suffered much for
the want of rain until within the
last week and we now have a separation
of rains. There has been scarcely any sickness
I have some idea of erecting a small cotton
factory these give me your experience on
the subject as I understand you have one
in successful operation I have a small
beautiful stream & can get about 15
feet head of water How much would it
require to purchase machinery to consume
250 Bales of cotton annually I can cut
all the buildings myself
Mr. C. Boardman gave me information
with regard to your operations he likewise
showed me a lot of an excellent
quality which you had manufactured
I am sure will be thankfully received

 in it I find I am called on to pay my proportion
 parts of Lawyer's fees paid out by you and
 for the day of \$57.20 I am at all times ready
 and willing to do what is right and just
 but the account I do not think was made in
 the proper form it should have been made
 agreeable to the number of bales considered
 false packed and then Justice would have
 reached all and every one of us implicated
 for instance my lot of cotton might not have
 had as many damaged bales in it in possession
 to the number as others did and consequently
 I may have to pay more than I should do
 if it was made out agreeable to the damaged
 bales or other might have to do the same
 I find in your letter that ~~some~~ was brought
 for 1215 Bales cotton and out of that number
 it appears that 1000 bales were owned by
 solvent ^{cash to pay} and on an call on to pay our
 proportionable parts and then to pay for
 other persons that is broke which I think
 is unreasonable and unjust I will suppose
 a case suppose all of the parties had failed but
 we would have been just for me to have
 paid the \$500 Cotton for some 20 or 25 damaged
 bales I say Justice would say not -

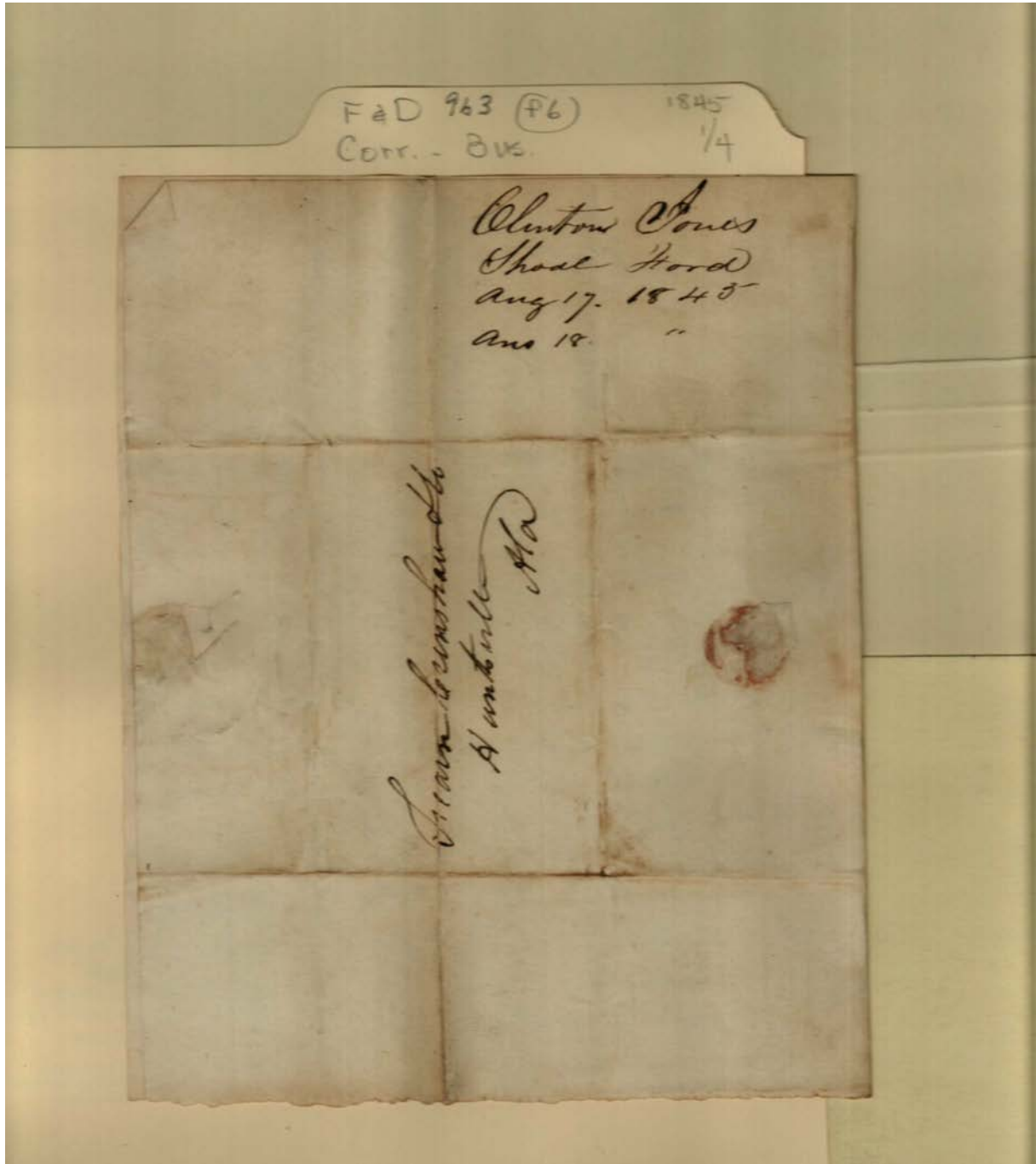

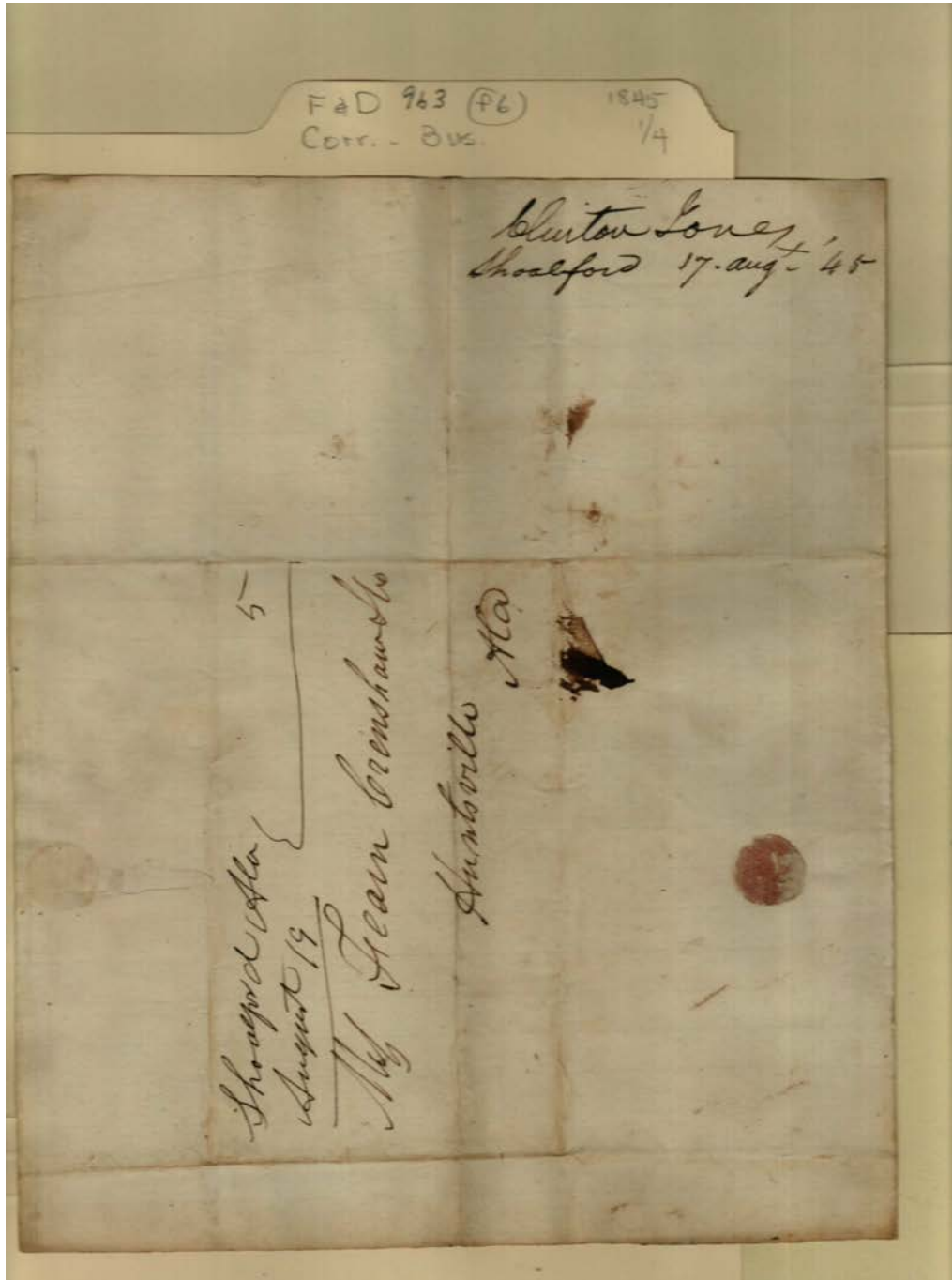

Jones and the widow Sanders can see in to it as I bought them cotton and they will have to pay their parts I want a full statement of the case as I do not the cotton was not false packed and consequently I am at a loss to know how they got a demand against us - you are

tation & made repairs amounting to some
eighty four or one hundred thousand dollars.

We sold the Carlar plantation & about eight
repairs for ninety thousand dollars. obtained
release from forty thousand dollars due on
this plantation - had another debt reduced
by a cash payment to twenty thousand

sent to cash will secured - 10000
