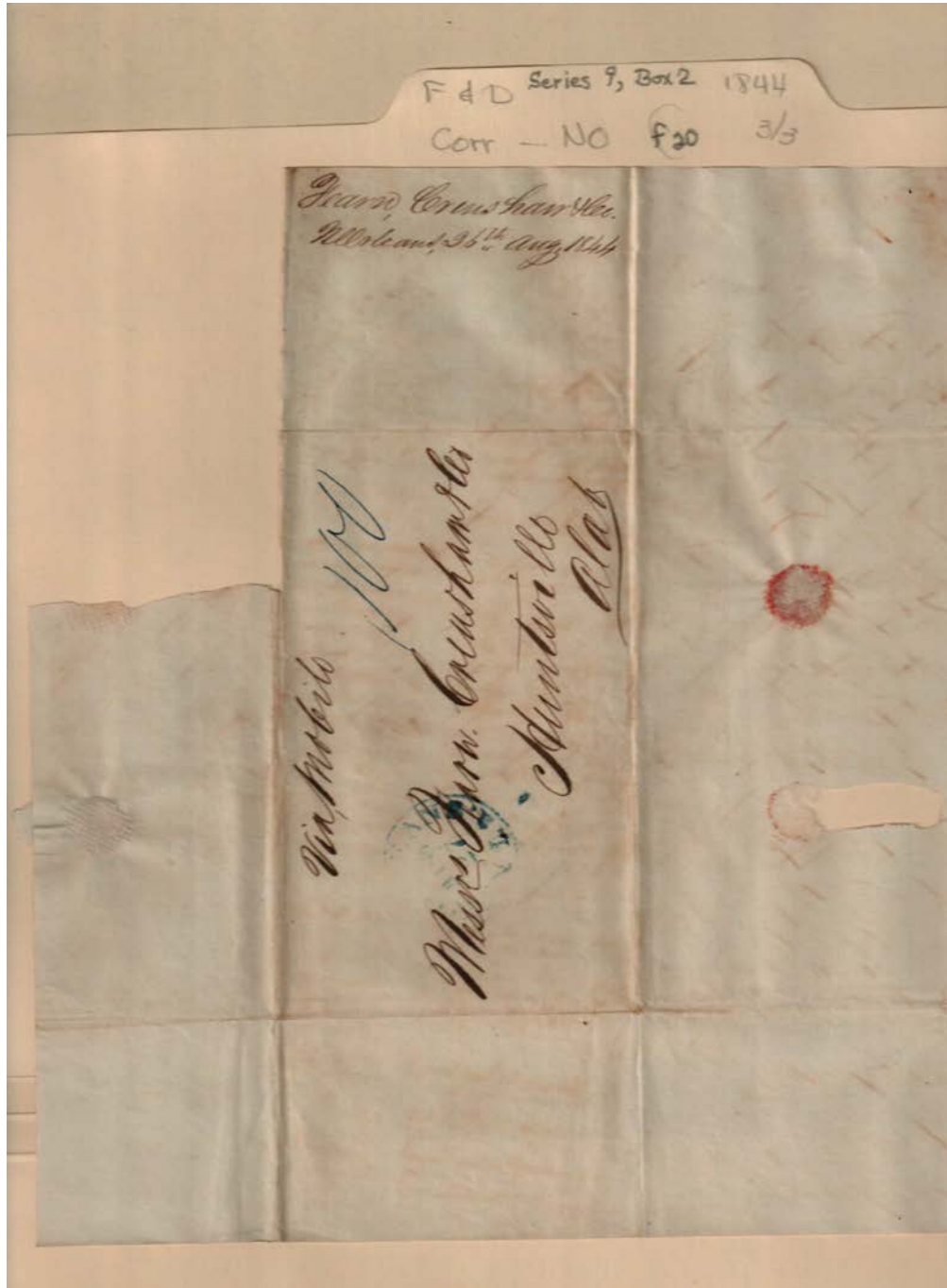

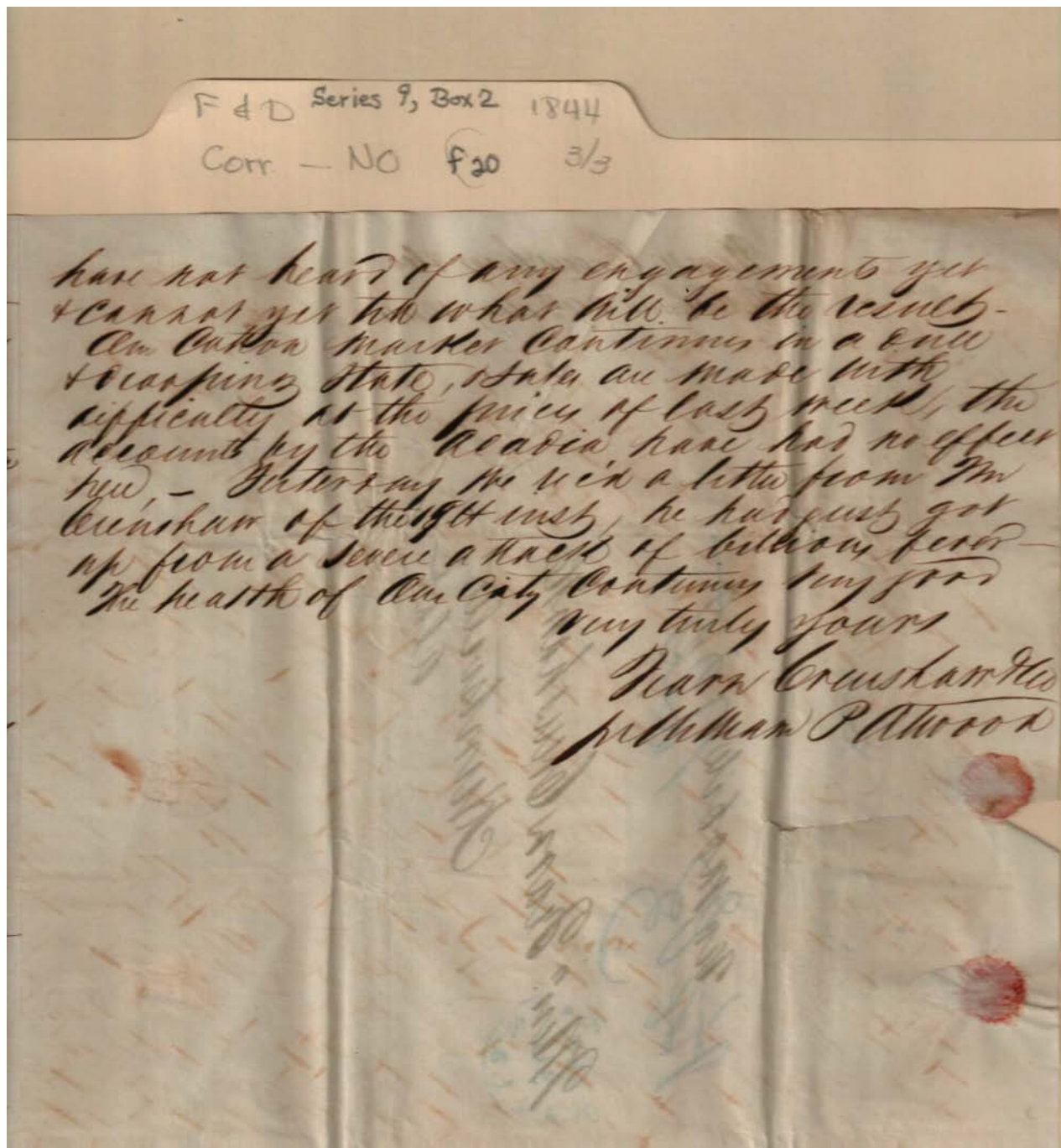

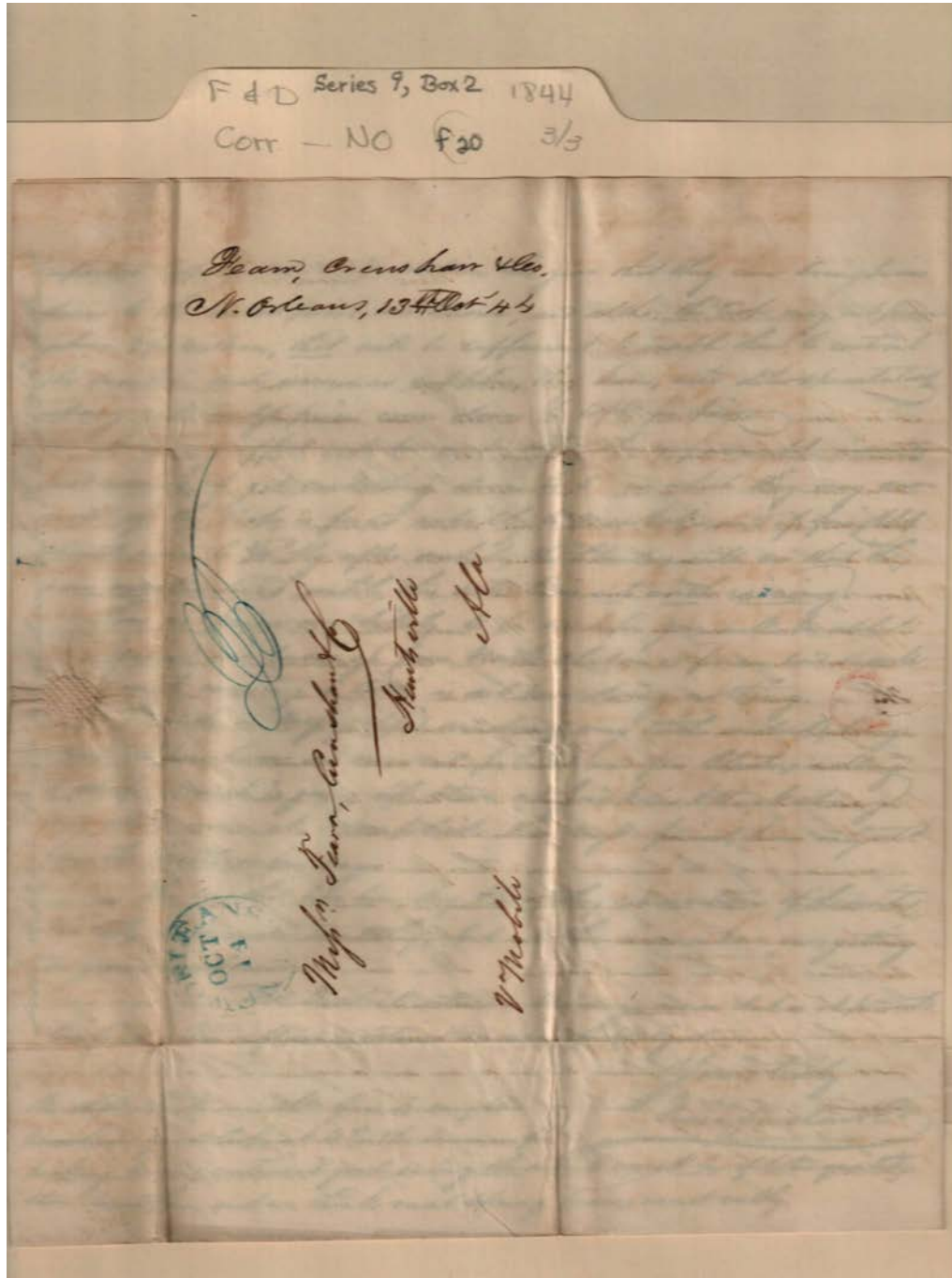

We write you 5<sup>th</sup> of the 6<sup>th</sup> and have not  
longer you, of 30<sup>th</sup> ult. The notice you sent, with regard to the  
Cotton market, and the growing Cops in your region. The prices  
were low - very low - so much so that although we felt a  
determination to sell when the market returned to the City, he has not  
been able to stomach them and he has not sold a bale which he  
can regard as the steamer Caledonia's arrival, to 19<sup>th</sup> ult. from  
Liverpool are unfavorable. We never thought we had an offer  
which we ought to accept, and yet very important one was offered.  
The accounts of the Cops from nearly every Western of Country  
are more favorable, or less unfavorable, and the belief in a large  
Cops more firmly strengthened which will account for the continued  
depression of prices. We have, to the last, but about 800 bales on hand  
- but it is important that favorable returns should go out at the  
beginning of the season and therefore we regret the more, we have  
not sold. But the quantity arriving was large, & buyers few in  
number, and there was a want of competition, which might be  
supplied by other <sup>the coming of</sup> purchasers. It is now certain that S. A. & C.  
will make a large Cops & Coston & Roberts a full average  
and the receipts at this place will doubtless be 1/8<sup>th</sup> more than last  
year. The Factors believe, so far as an acquaintance with their views,  
in a Cops of 2300 in bales at least. The Northern & English agents  
are yet holding back the manufacturers, a large loss from hand  
to mouth being seen that their stocks of 9500<sup>th</sup> in Liverpool and a

Reported Crop of 2/3 or 2 1/2 millions this year that they can bring prices  
 down to the lowest point we know; and unless the Govt. may not have  
 about 2 1/2 millions, that will be sufficient to enable them to control  
 the market, such measures as supplies they know, with disreputations  
 at any rate unless prices come down to 4 1/2 for feet.

A strong effort will be made after the unfavorable accounts  
 just received, to get marketing down to 5¢ in which they may suc-  
 ceed if the Govt. is forced rapidly to market some of its property  
 should rise to 1/4 after awhile, the planters will see that they  
 have overproduced until the article is not worth raising.

For as prices are likely to be so low, you will be able  
 to increase our business from North Alabama for an hour or so  
 at work running a little as at low being nothing.

Our friends in Mississippi are doing very little and doing  
 away to purchase at cost and for seed and for planters willing  
 to ship much is going into their abjectation. The market  
 and still more at Memphis. Our friends here say  
 from the North a few days ago.

The weather has been very healthy since return of the winter,  
 the City more so, but at this moment we are getting  
 a general shower.

Mr. Dashiell returned his day since but is at present  
 confined with inflammation in one of his eyes.

We still think our old friends might  
 purchase good crops at 4¢ in the season for  
 picking having continued good so long the article must be of better quality  
 than heretofore, and we think next spring prices must rally.

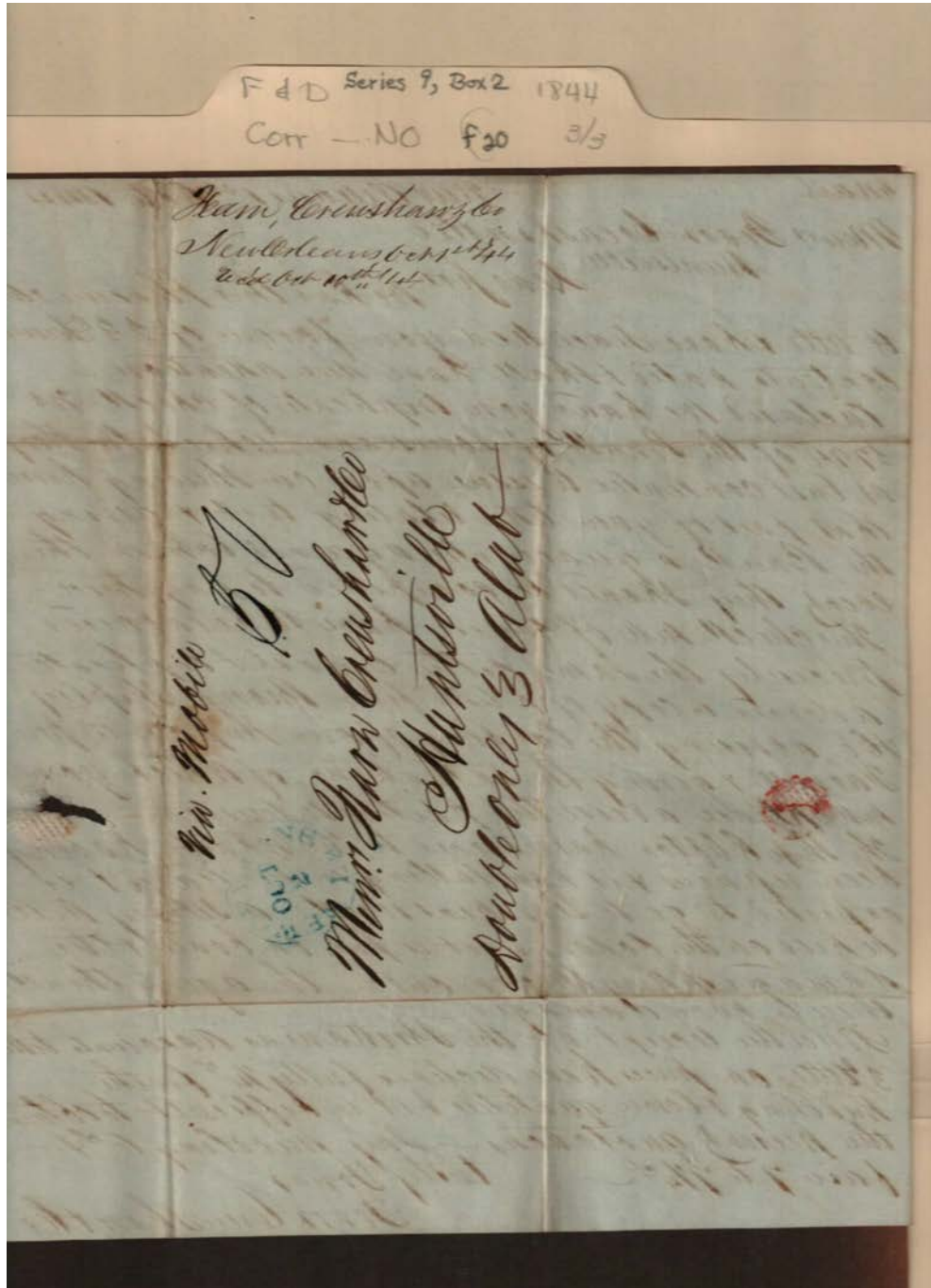

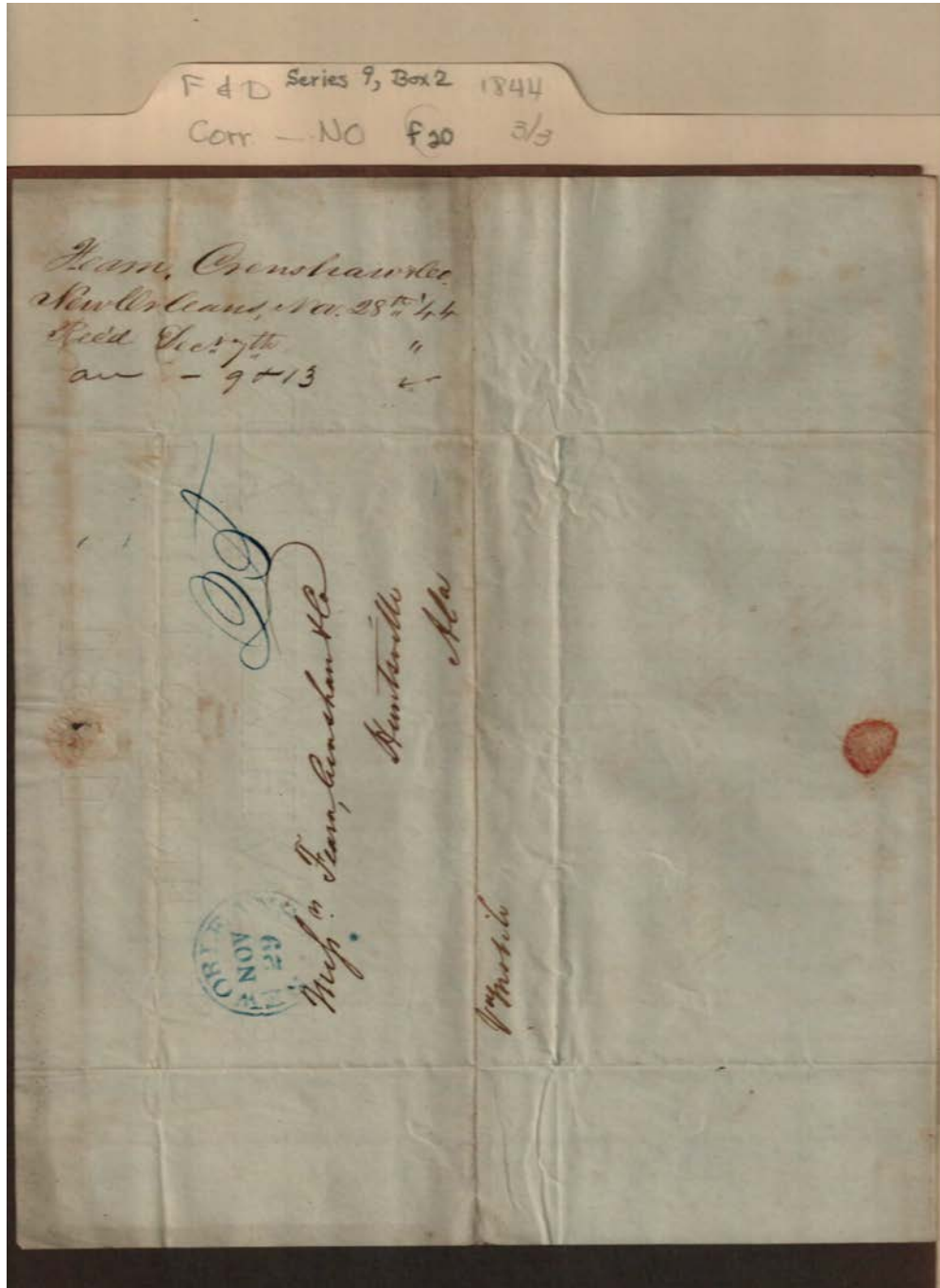

Your last to us was under date 20<sup>th</sup> inst - some which we have yours of same date, but there is nothing in it requiring a reply. Upon referring again to yours of 11<sup>th</sup> inst we notice your remark, that your Planters are making effort, for early shipment of their Cotton, but you do not say whether they will continue the flat Boat system, or adopt the Steam & Rail way course, of which you had some trial last season. It would certainly be improper to controul their movement in regard to early or late shipments, but we rather incline to the opinion that next Spring prices will be quite as good as they are now, and if the South Alabama's are brought here during the winter months, whilst the supplies from the low Country, will be in large quantity, & pressing on the market, causing an advance in freight, we may have unusually low prices. There is no such universal anxiety to sell, that prices are very irregular - varying 1/4 and sometimes 3/8 below the quotations - considering the business more unpleasant infinitely than we have seen it heretofore the greatest efforts are made by buyers & brokers to get the article before the market whilst many buyers hold off and decline against prices to those who are disposed to operate. We think it likely much Cotton will be kept back in the country all next year - but perhaps not much in your region as they can get to market only in the winter and most of your Planters we presume are in debt & must sell. We cannot believe at present prices above 2 1/4 neither bales will go to

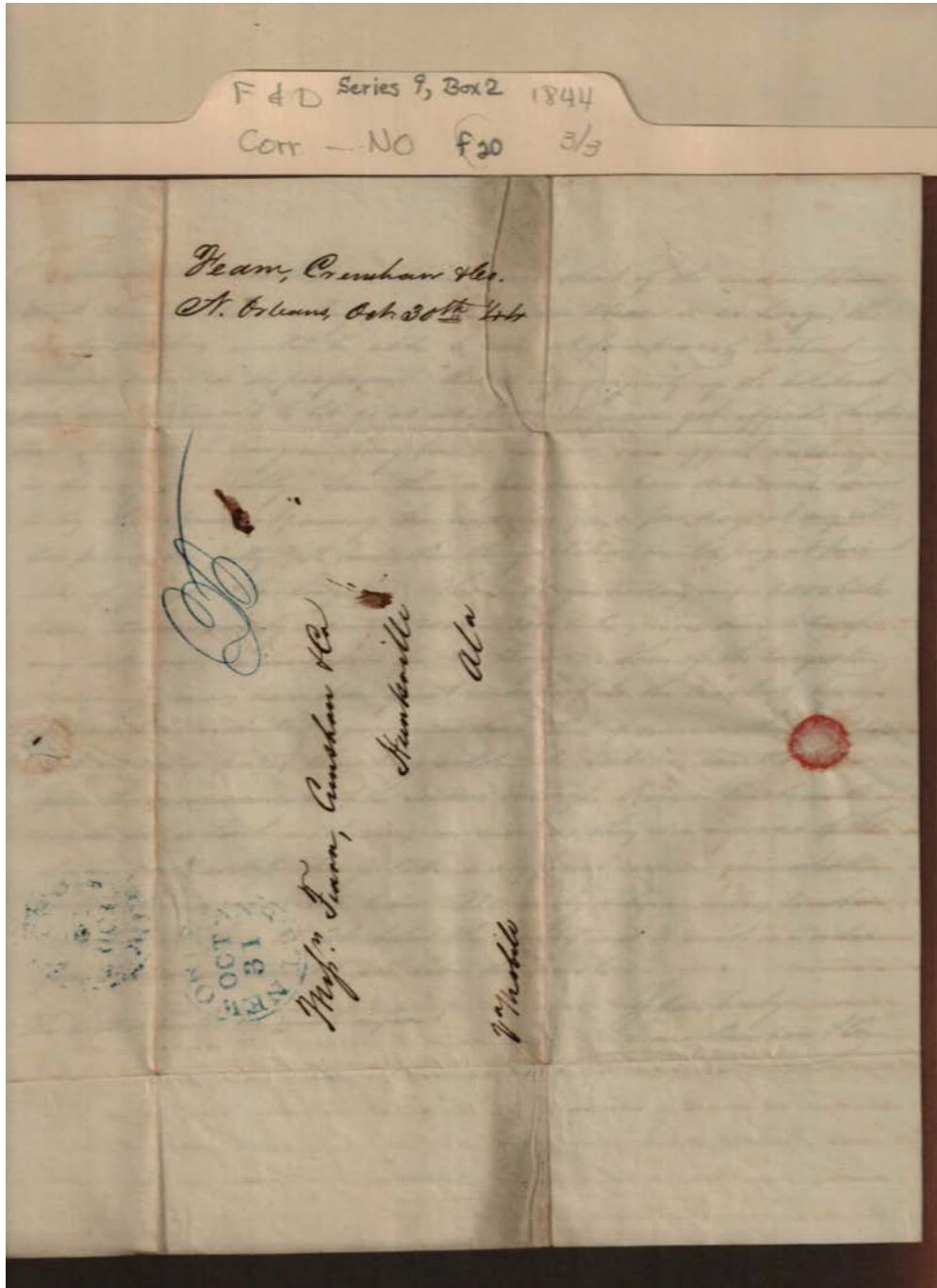

We wrote you fully 27<sup>th</sup> inst and are without any thing from you since.

We have examined your Account & find the following discrepancies  
 You are credit of our collection from Caruthers the \$ 61  
 Balance of 4<sup>th</sup> read of 11 June 1277.58 you bring forward  
 to the new account 1277.57 - over credit 18<sup>th</sup> }  
 You state of 12 Aug to credit you and J. H. Ashenford  
 \$ 403.97 (which is correct) but in your list you charge \$ 600.00  
 for a bill of 12 Aug to credit you \$ 211.25 for Mr. Fennell  
 Fennell - it should have been \$ 211.25 over debit 10  
 You will be pleased to make the necessary corrections, in your bill  
 We yesterday rejected a bill drawn by Mr. J. H. Ashenford for \$ 400.00  
 and another by C. C. Clay for \$ 444.40 - the former having been advised last summer  
 that we could not undertake for them to that extent - and the latter  
 has some Cash advance which will come near absorbing his personal  
 Crope. We need by yesterday mail the Cheasapeake accounts  
 for Liverpool - a good date to them - no change or quotation of Cotton -  
 Sales moderate, but equal to the current consumption - Specimens  
 with light stocks, working from hand to mouth. The accounts are  
 not considered favorable here - but we look on them in a different light  
 for with so small a demand, if the article had been freely & ardently  
 on the Market price, must have given way. We rather hope the real  
 accounts may bring a slight rally, probably J. H. Ashenford, as they would  
 then be in receipt of accounts from this side of the injury by drought.

P, besides the receipts would be much short of the consumption  
 stock therefore diminishing, and the consumption is so large, the  
 needy holders would be able to sell at fair prices without  
 bringing about a depression. But a large majority of the holders  
 have been determined to let go at whatever they can get offered, therefore  
 those disposed to hang on, being few in number, can effect nothing  
 in the way of a rally. Some three or four hours have determined us  
 to try the experiment, among the contracts for a few days at any rate.  
 Our friends are fully of the opinion that the quotation would pay at present  
 rates of freight & exchange. The sales yesterday were 1,000 bales,  
 being ~~approximately~~ reported 2000 or 3000 bales, prices said to be, if  
 any difference, rather easier for the buyers than of the largest  
 recurring buyers, have done great mischief to the market by  
 forcing a sale without "buying or selling" and of course others would  
 get no better prices than they could get. Such has been the case  
 from the commencement of the buyers' business. Prices in Liverpool will  
 recede to a level with ours, as soon as they are advised of the  
 situation here, unless things take a different course from what  
 we have been accustomed to see. The early future orders have been  
 executed at 1/2 & 1/4 pds below the market - it is said our orders  
 from Jamaica were done 2/4 pds below the market.  
 The London market has much improved.

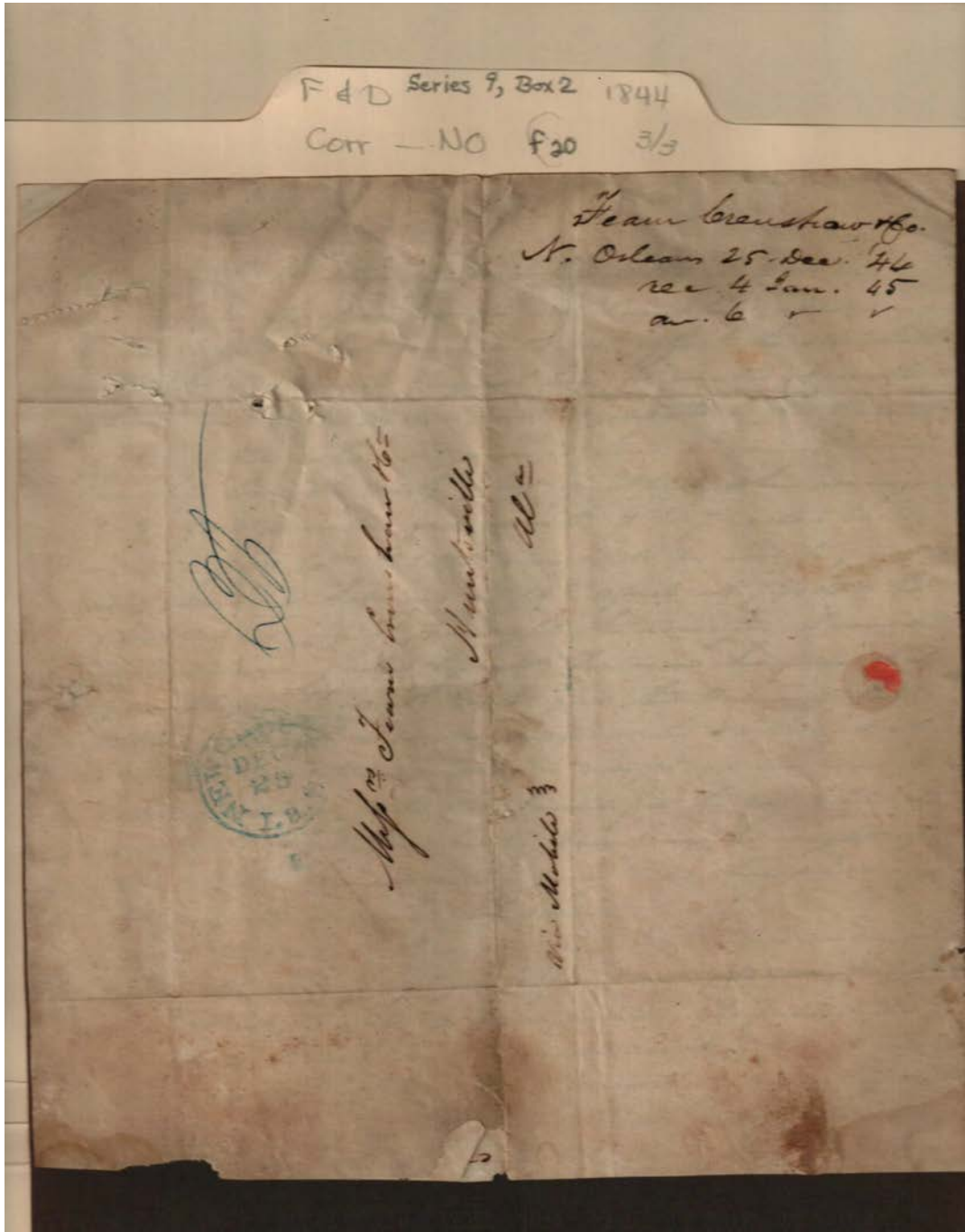

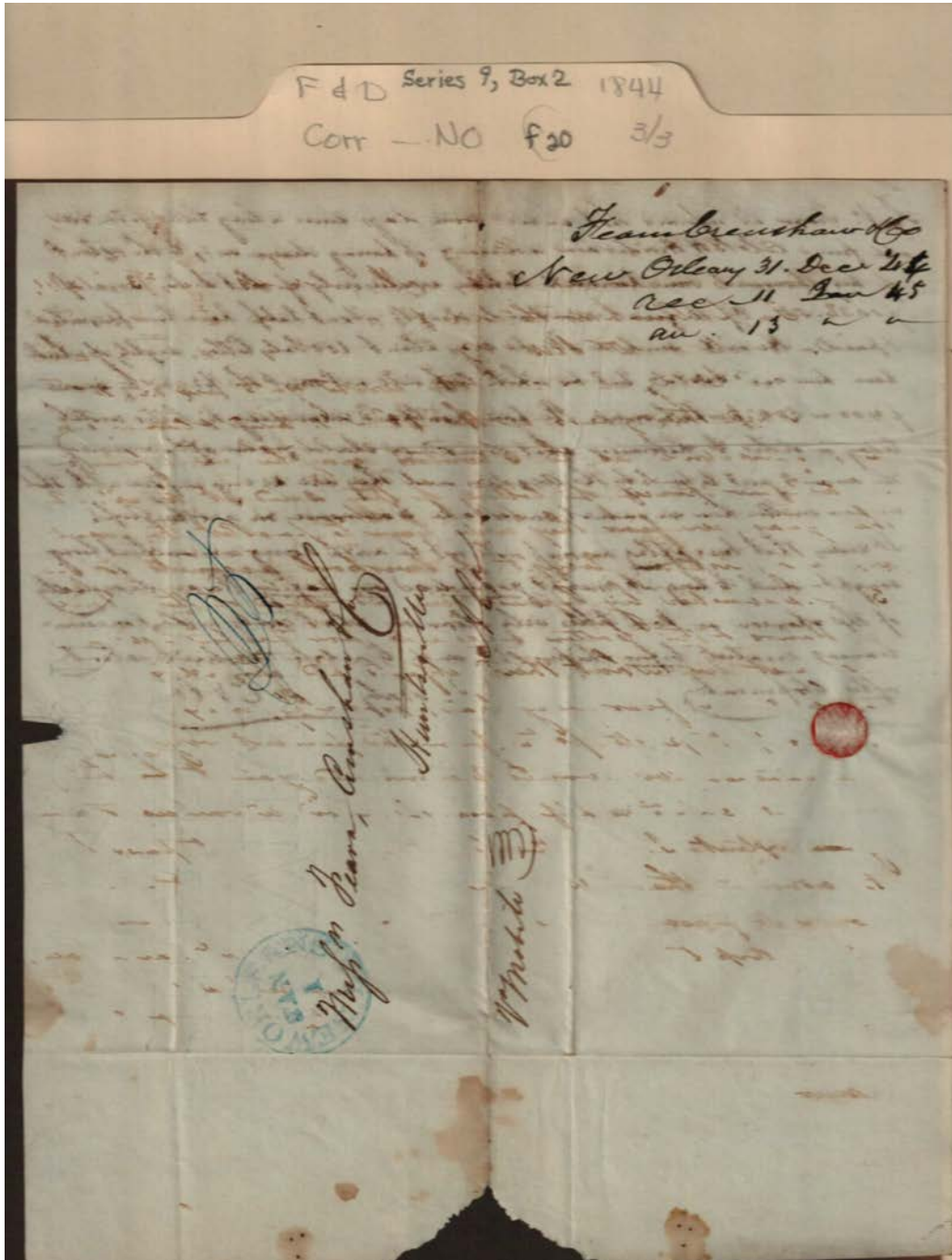

We wrote you on the 28<sup>th</sup> Inst. Since then years of the 28<sup>th</sup> is to hand & contacts made, & as the Planters may be in reference to the low price of letters, if they send it to market this year, we fear they will have to part with the result. We are just in receipt of Liverpool accounts to the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December by Express in advance of the Mail 48 hours & the Cotton accounts are awful. We cannot yet see what their effects will be, but we fear very bad, probably may be forced  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  etc.  $\frac{1}{2}$  from the present very low quotations. We would recommend you to be the greatest caution & if possible avoid advances to any one extent. It is better to let consignments pass than to advance the full value all things & what may be come to pass towards the latter part of the season of the long time out as large as present calculations for one could foresee. 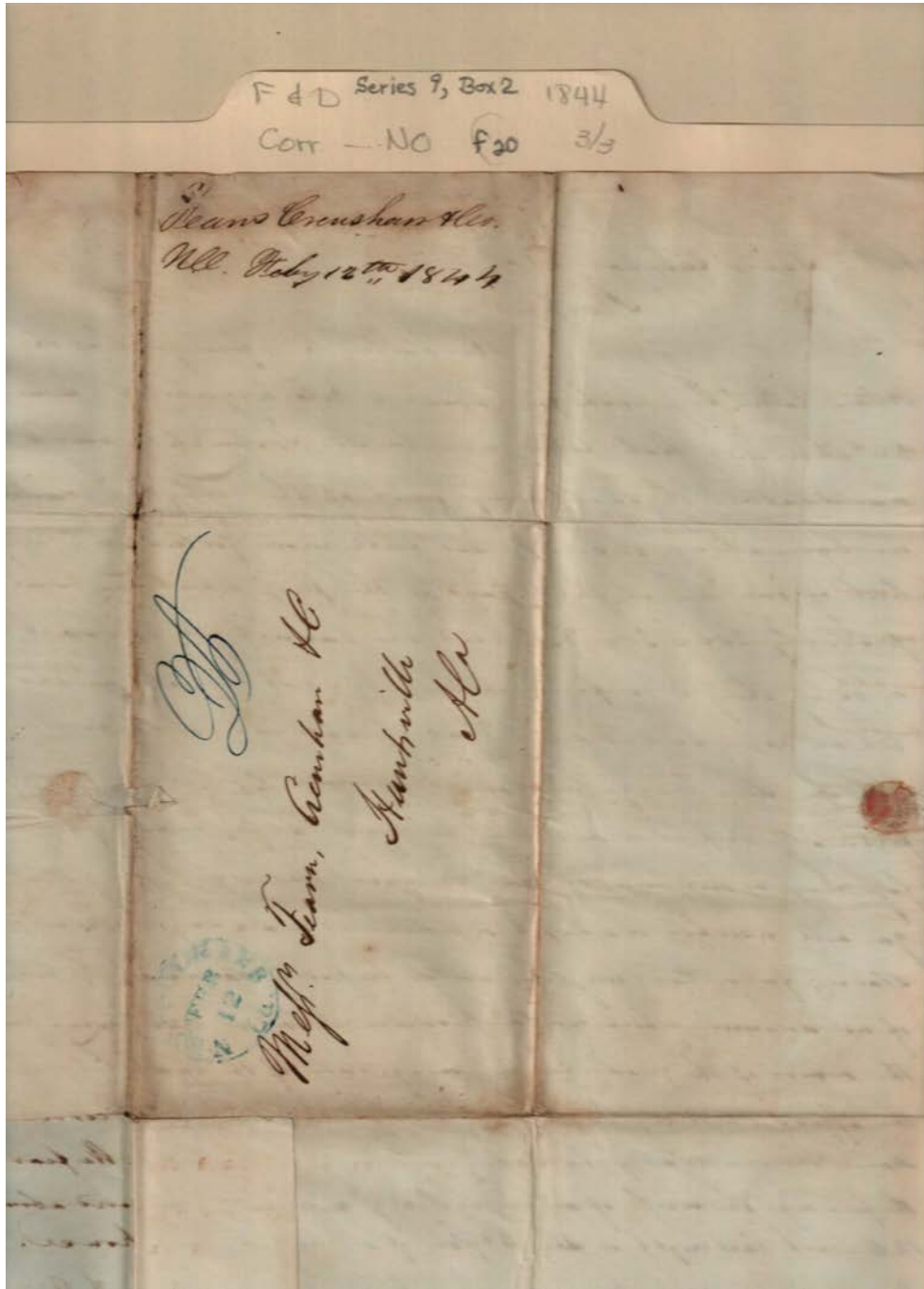

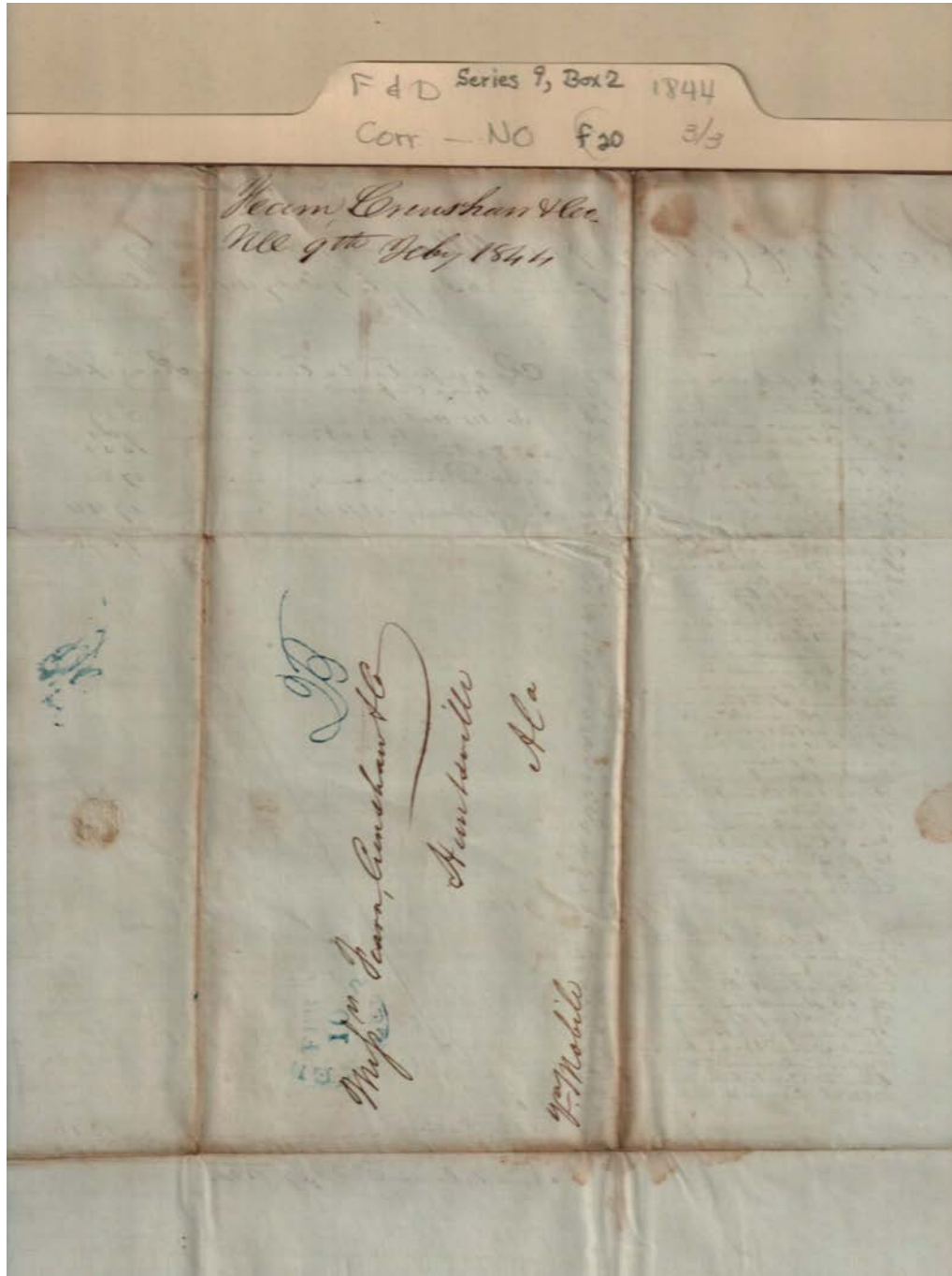

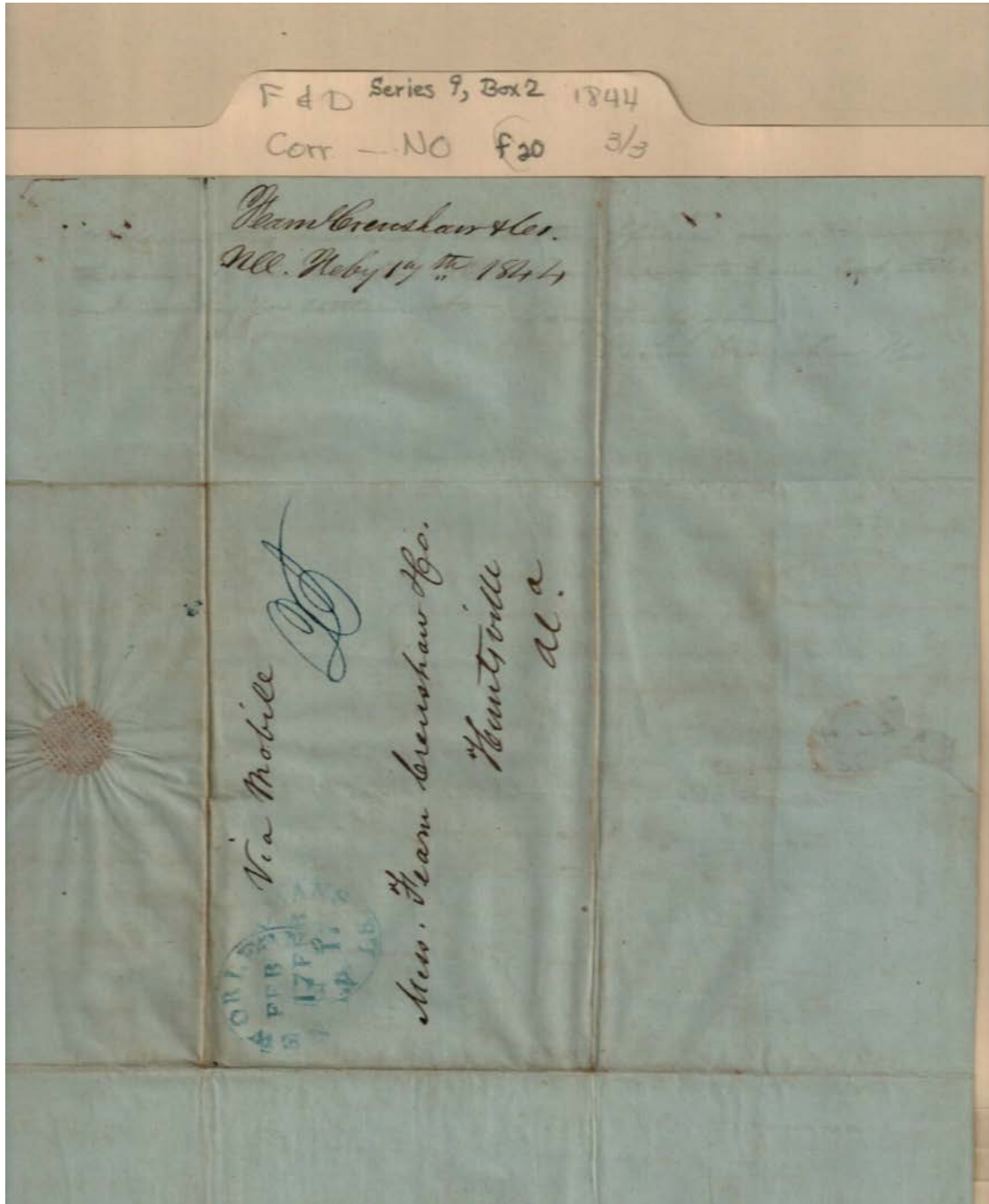

Sales of the week have been light, & prices a little lower - Speculators have run out their means, & foreign buyers, either are limited too low, or are holding back for farther concessions. Some entertain the opinion, that they may operate pretty freely just before the news by the next steamer is expected, at present rates, if no better can be had - This is all conjecture - We shall keep a look out.

This morning's mail brings a rumor, by the N. Y. Herald of a c. 5 days later from Spool, J<sup>r</sup>. Ship Montezuma, of an advance on Cotton - No particulars given.

They are proceeding with an inventory of Cotton at the Orleans Press. and in 4 or 5 days more, will be able to ascertain the extent of the loss. From farther examination we find 532 bales of ours destroyed, & there may be some other small marks. - We anticipate no difficulty in settlement. Indeed

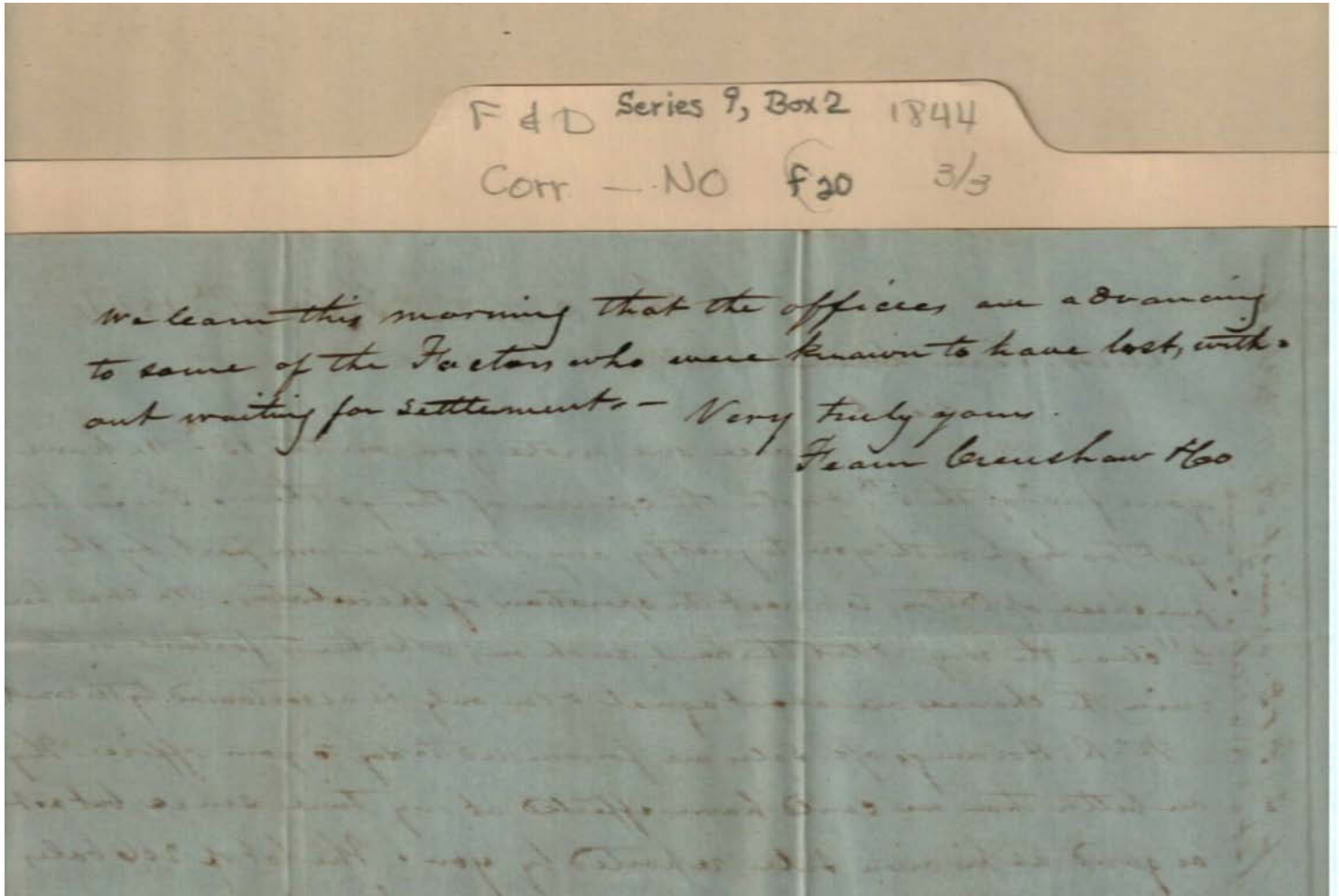

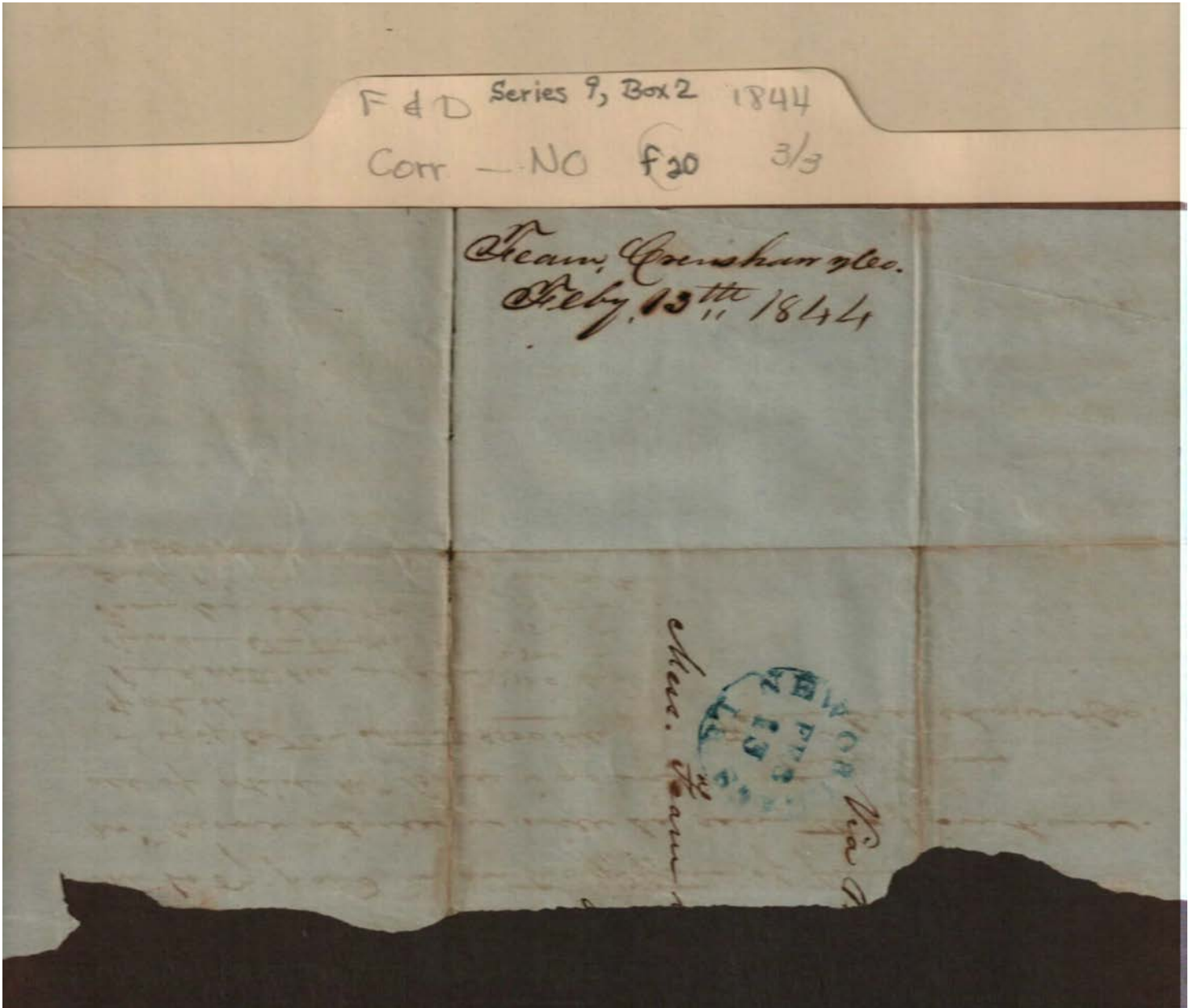

Unfortunately the "good book," as it is called, was lost in the confusion, and the only correct source of information is wanting, & the exact extent of the loss cannot be ascertained, it is thought, without turning out & taking an inventory of all now on hand. If this course be pursued, the interruption to business must be great & perplexing. The stars will be unable to offer lists, when there is a doubt about their having the cotton. The extent of our loss, so far as it can be made up from a careful examination of our list, with the aid of Keenan & Small is 452 bales - some small conveyments may be over looked - but this is nearly about the amount - No fourth Ala. Cotton of ours is lost. - The origination of the fire is yet a mystery - It commenced in a room under the Cupola, in which was some loose cotton - some fear is entertained, that it is the work of an incendiary - A house on Camp St. took fire same night, in an unoccupied room & rumor says there was an attempt at the Louisiana Press, the same night & two or three bales burned - but you will attach what credit you may think due to reports at a time of such excitement. - We think upon cool reflection, that the wheels of government will not be stopped by this event.

DEAR SIR

Mr. Isaac W. Moon having withdrawn from our House, we have admitted Mr. William P. Atwood as a member of our present concern from this date. He has occupied an important situation in our office and our predecessors, Messrs. Lockhart, Fearn & Donegan, for the last seven years. No change will take place in the style of our firm.

In reviewing the commercial operations of the season just closed, we would remark, that the importers and dealers in the products of other countries, and in the manufactures of our own, have much cause of satisfaction; and our manufacturers never, perhaps, before had more reason to be satisfied; having done a thriving business upon a safe basis, and to good profit; but the same fortune, has not, we are sorry to say, fallen to the lot of the exporters of, and speculators in, the agricultural products of our country. The speculations in Cotton which commenced here on the second day of December, and continued throughout that month, January, and part of February, were founded upon confidence of the crop at 1600 a 1700 M. bales, reduced by the supposed destruction of a large portion of the then ungathered part of the crop by heavy rains, which commenced about the middle of November, and continued with very occasional intermissions, until the last part of January; but it proved to be a great and unfortunate error, for instead of 1600 or 1700 M. bales, the crop proved to be a fraction over two millions. A quantity so great the consumption of American Cotton, that the unprecedentedly heavy supplies in Europe, of the previous overgrown crop, of the end of last year, may not be reduced at the present more than 100 a 150 M. bales.

During this speculative movement on our side of the Atlantic, on the other the manufacturers withdrew from the market, except when absolutely forced by want of stock; and many, during the previous summer and fall, laid in such heavy supplies, when prices were at the lowest point, that they were enabled to stand aloof until prices recovered. Speculators in Liverpool responded to our movements in January and February, but in March they faltered, and prices sunk gradually until the 19th June, when "fair" was quoted at 5 1/2 sterling per lb. During the two following weeks, the market rallied under a heavy demand from manufacturers, and prices were quoted 4th July, 1d per lb. higher, but in the following two weeks to 15th July, the anxiety of holders to realize, placed so much on sale as to give buyers an advantage equal to the gain in the two last weeks of June—placing "fair" again at 5 1/2 equal to 7 1/2 cents here at 1d freight, and exchange at par. The crop of last year must have given to the producers ten millions of dollars more than it will yield to those through whose hands it has passed by purchase, raising many, and crippling still more.

But it is not alone in Cotton that speculators have suffered; nearly all other articles of home agricultural produce, for which returns have been received, have failed to show profitable results; and on previous, particularly, the losses have been heavy.

While a year of profitable and prosperous business, is generally followed by another of business and uncertainty, when resulting in heavy losses to speculators from an undue elevation in prices.—So unfavorable a termination have we had of the business of the season just closed, that we may expect more cautious movements during the next twelve months. Business will be conducted with more strictness and discretion—prices fluctuate less—the Farmer be fairly paid for the produce of his labor, and the purchaser for the use of his capital. The superabundance of capital in Europe, as well as this country, and unprecedented low rate of interest will ensure due competition in the purchase of every species of the various produce of our country.

Of the probable extent of the growing Cotton crop, we do not feel authorized to indulge in conjecture, particularly as the month in which we write, (September,) is one of the most important of the growing season. We may, however, go so far as to say, that reports from the various sections of the Cotton region, induce the belief that the yield per acre may be equal to the average of former years; and the increased breadth of land in cultivation, may be sufficient to cover the loss by inundation on the Mississippi river and some of its tributaries. The value will depend as do all other articles, on supply and demand. The crop grown last year, of one million of bales, will not, perhaps, prove equal to the consumption of this year by 100 a 150 M. bales; and the stock of American, at the close of this year, should show a decline to that extent, unless the new crop should go forward earlier than usual and change the result; but you will observe that the exports to Liverpool have been proportionally larger in the last twelve months than to the other parts of Europe. If the moderate prices now current in this country and Europe should continue, the cotton system next year will be equal to this, but much increase cannot be expected, as the market of China, that the secure charges for goods furnished them are purchased at such prices as to lose a part of the profit of the outward cargo. We must also remark that the immense supplies of Cotton Goods, furnished China from Great Britain and this country, lessens the consumption of the raw material there which they import from the East Indies; which will turn a much larger portion of the East India crop to Great Britain than heretofore, where it will be brought into competition with our inferior, ordinary, and middling classes, and swelling their stocks.

The stock in Liverpool, of all sorts, on the 15th July last, amounted to one million and eight thousand bales, being an excess of 40 M. over that of the same period last year, when holders became quite panic stricken. But we do not forget that at the same period last year, the manufacturers of England held 60 a 80 M. bales, laid in at low prices, which they exhausted while prices were high in January, February and March last, rather than enter the market; and that they have since been buying but little more than their weekly requirements.

We have no doubt, the abundance of capital, and low rate of interest, as before stated, will secure to the growers a fair reward for their labors, leaving those who are straddled with old debts, not only the means of meeting their yearly engagements, but a surplus to invest in property which they will purchase at corresponding terms.
