It will be seen, that we have deduced from the New-Orleans statement, the quantity received at that port from Texas being a foreign country. Our estimate of the quantity taken for consumption, does not include any Cotton manufactured in the States south and west of Virginia, nor any in that State, except in the counties of Forsyth and Hillsborough. Of the crop now standing in it may be supposed, that the previous statement shows weeks earlier than last year. An important quantity of seed was put under cultivation, and unless some extraordinary facility should occur during the remainder of the season, the quantity will probably exceed that of any previous year. The quantity of new Cotton received at the shipping ports up to the first week amounted to about 7000 bales, against only 500 at the same date last year.

that Mr Tate was influenced alone by motives of friendship
and was willing that the benefit should remain in such
a situation that he could not be injured in the event
of my not succeeding in making the payments. I
however was fortunate and to the day made the first payment
for the three I bred to Mississippi and proposed to Mr
Tate and Capt Robinson to pay the whole of the first of
two thousand dollars and arrange the other to the satisfaction
of your self and Co. James. Mr Tate refused to my pro-
positions by saying the negroes were included in the deed in
trust he had given on his property but as soon as he could
retrieval therefrom he would tell me one or all of them
now if you consider the trade made for my benefit I do
not think Mr Tate ought to have refused to let me have the
