I returned last night from Fayette County and have to inform you that I consider the crisis in regard to the Cotton crop to be nearly closed. The cold north winds and unpropitious dry weather for three weeks past has done the business for many fields of Cotton quite as well as if a frost had happened. The best has nearly seed up many of the fields, and others that were late planted have not killed so as to do much harm for fields early planted and well cultivated will give a tolerable crop but a majority of them will not give one 300 or 400 lbs per acre. I hear that the crops in quite a number of the District and from Middle Tennessee as well as North Ala are no better off. Crops in much wanted but the wind is yet from North, and no prospect of it shortly.

I have written a circular for our friends for prospect which I shall have printed at Memphis when I go tomorrow, whenever will send you a copy and you can have copies printed & distributed if you think proper. I shall send a copy to Mr. Moore but I don't know whether he will think it worth the expense. By the bye I wish you not to communicate any thing to him of what I may write you. He has taken in high enough your communication of my remarks, former of 7th Dec and from what he wrote me I apprehend he has scolded you too.

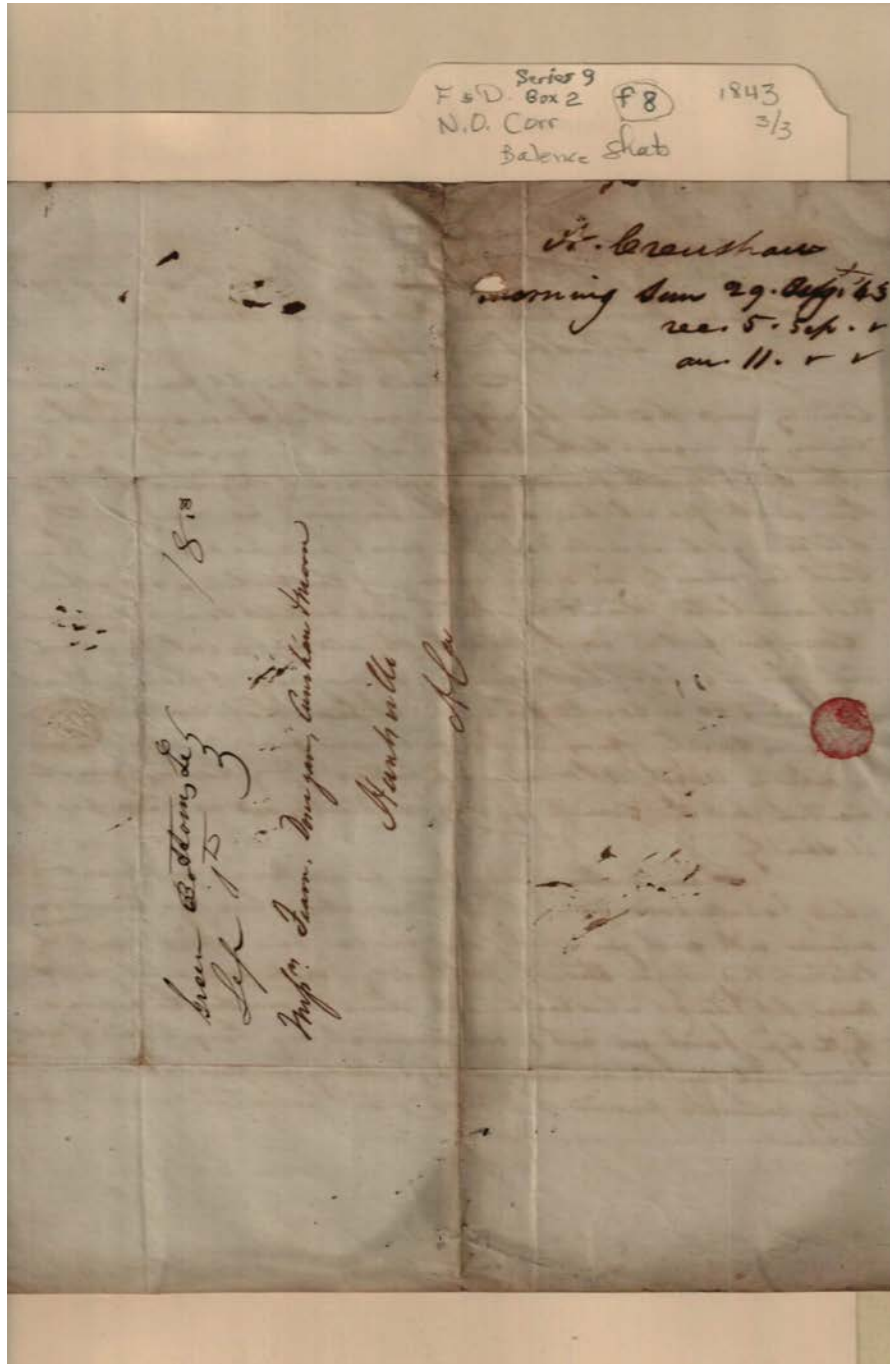

I have no business from the house in New Orleans since my last visit -
 he also dated 31st with 26th instant - the former covering of July 22nd to
 Oct 1st - Balance Sheet at 5th for which I refused 5th for same of then

The cotton market is not good, but not so bad as was generally
looked for. You will have seen the details in the papers before this
reaches you. On Saturday some few scary holders gave way to
a 1/4% fall and Buyers contending generally for this reduction
not over 1500 bales were sold. Today the demand has been gen-
eral and active, 8 or 9000 Bales, having changed hands at prices
superior last week, so that the market may be said not to have
changed, but easier to the Buyers. We think there is a general
disposition in holders to part with their stocks at current
prices, and we would not be surprised if they were cleared out
in the course of the current week. We offered a list of 1080
Bales, but could not get an offer of 5¢ which we would have
accepted - in it 6 bales worth the Alabama, as good as any we have
seen this year, but there is an insuperable objection with many of the

Prayer to touch a Bale of North Alabama Cotton at any price,
such is the careless manner they generally have of mixing all qual-
ities in the same Bale. The Planters of that section on fear
must act differently for several years before the produce
of their labors can have a fair chance in this market.
Some of them are in the habit of water packing their inferior
Cotton which is but too well calculated to bring difficulties
on their agents and losses on themselves. You cannot talk
too plainly to them on both these subjects whether you give of
peace or not. We really feel mortified at the remarks often
made by Brokers & Buyers in regard to these Cottons and for
cause of the impossibility of giving entire factory returns.
The Alabama planters stand with most Buyers here as the
Anti-Slavery Society do with the same kind of this
matter and through with the Broker, if the old C&P sent us some
time ago by C. J. Barton & Brother marks D. Vinson and he writes
a most disquieting second of carelessness, we might say reckless man-
agement that can be conceived.

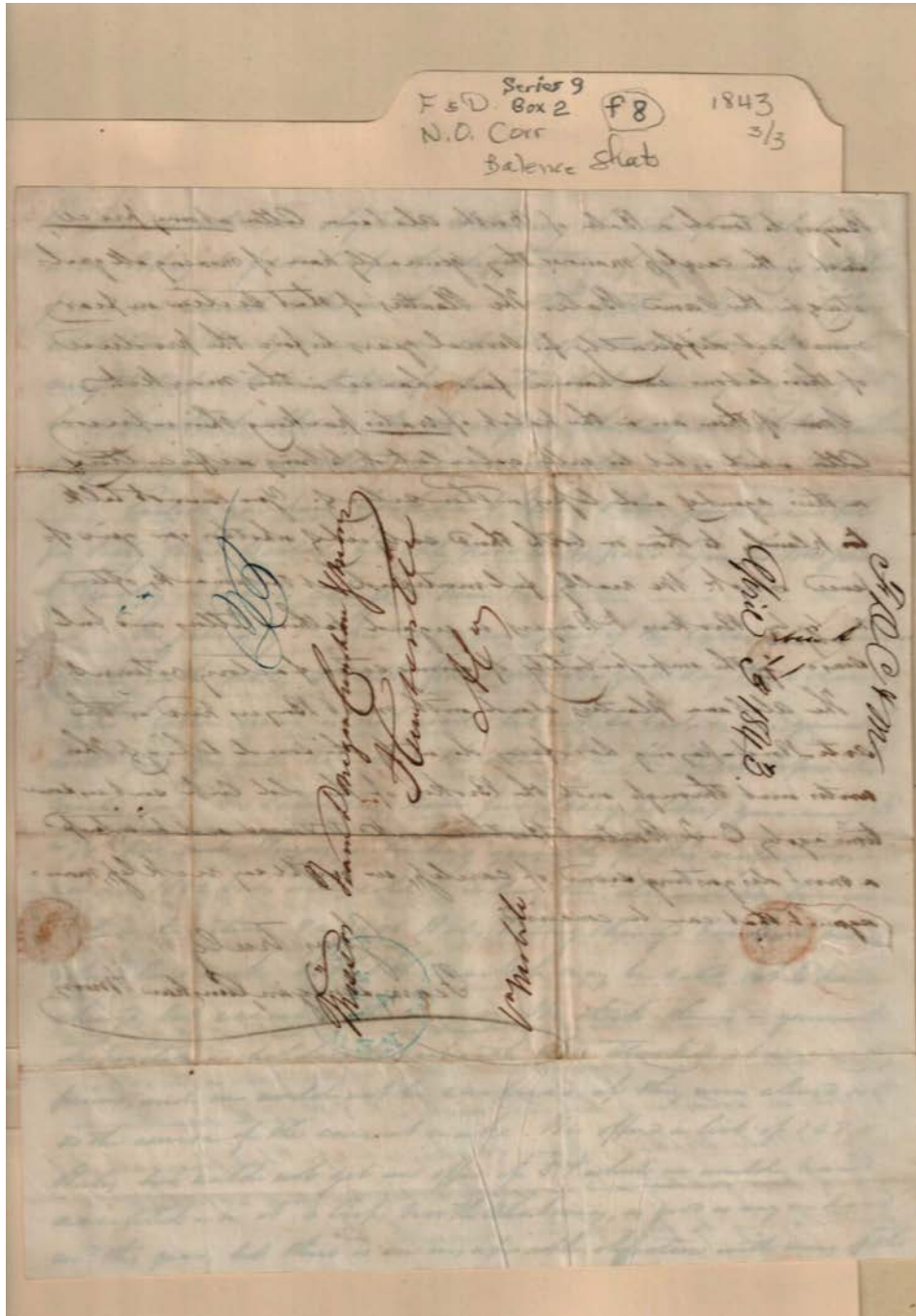

Lading for 18 bales Cotton belonging to Albert G. Henry" which

an error in stating "D. Ricketts, & Co. bill for 68 bales Cotton for
G. Greenwood". It should have been 52 bales in stead of 68.

The Cotton market has been rather quiet for a week past
and prices hardly maintained - stock on sale small, and
receipts small - indeed the business of the season is drawing
fast to a close and much earlier than usual. Circumstances
are such that for a while receipts from Europe in regard to the
demand for consumption, were without variations in prices,
which produce a considerable improvement here; and as we do
not think our present rates will be lower, we are holding our
good Alabama parcels at five cents and will not take
less before the 4th Inst are used which must be in the
next three or four days. Freight to Europe are now fully established
at 14 p/c for Cotton - and 12 p/c for wool, starting 14th 5 p/c present.

Mr D. Fearn arrived night before last in good general
health but stiff in his joints. We hope the season in other way
something to report.

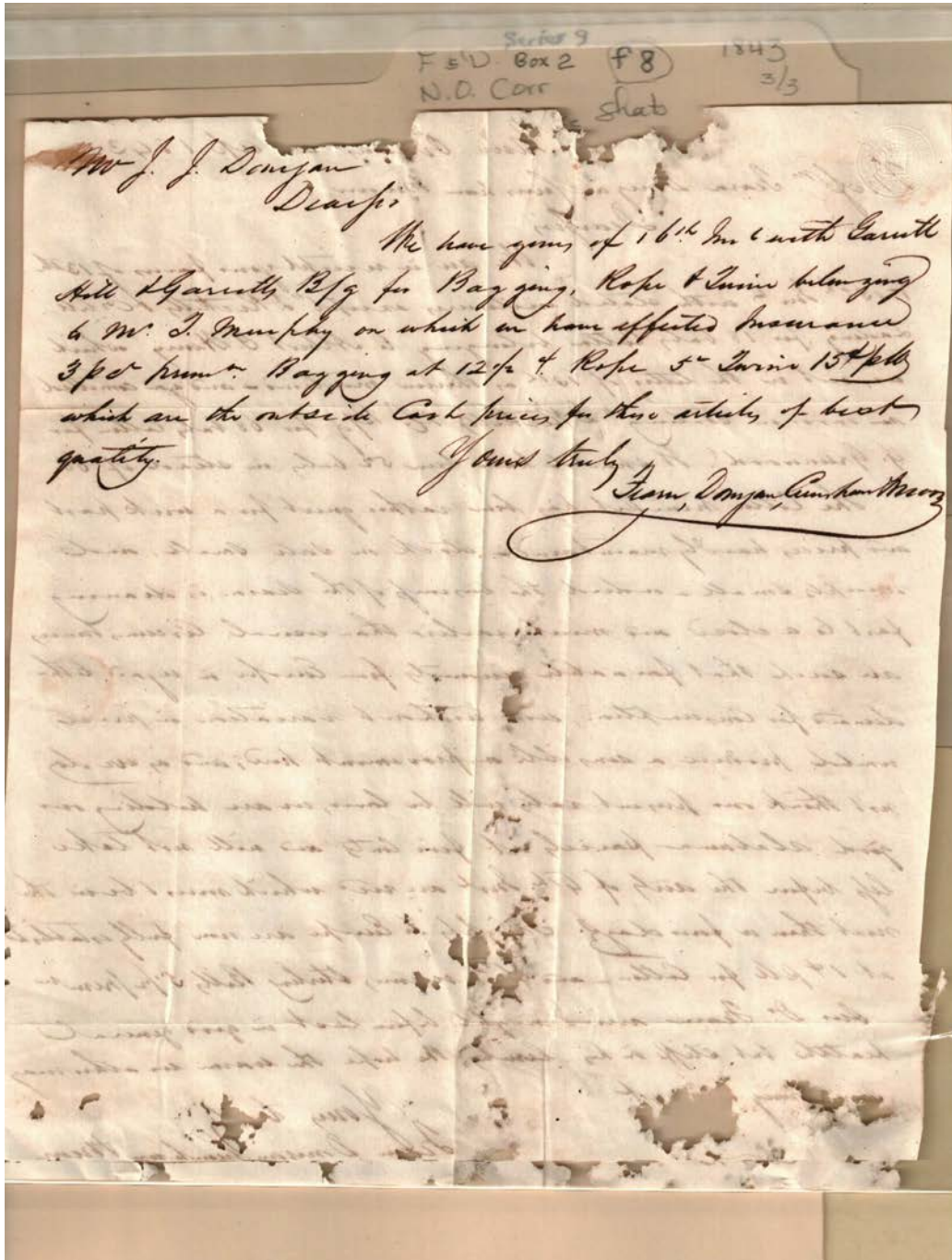

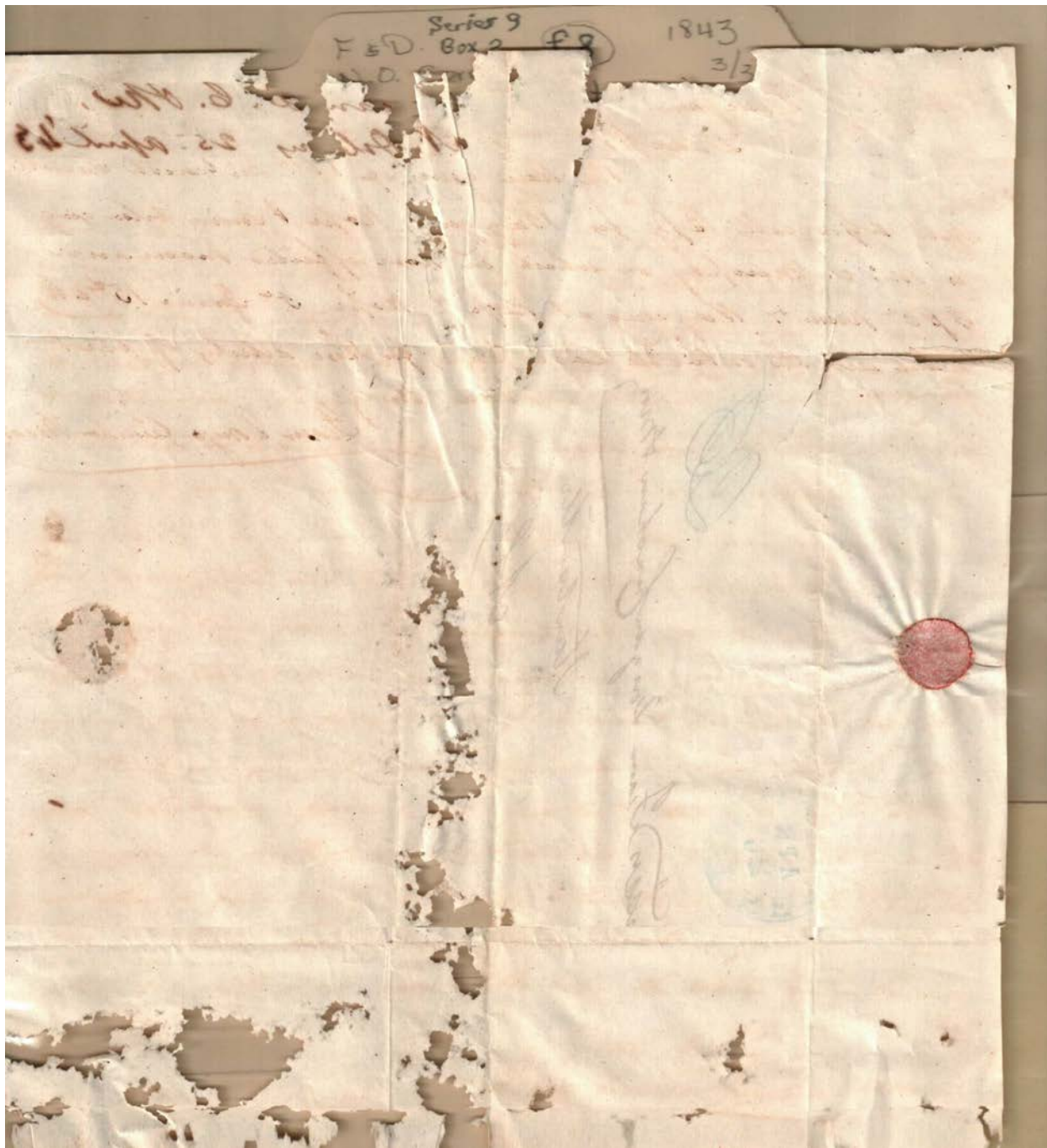

The idea is operating that the crop is under the late general estimate of 2 1/4 millions, founded on the falling off in the receipts at all the Ports, but we get think as much will come to market as in 1839 & 1840 - and if we were to should, our prices are now low enough provided the expectation of a good should not produce a panic there. All that is the market, which they can do if they will, in the present plethora of the money market and low interest.

where we have authority, rather than allow our stock to become too heavy on the approach of hot weather. It will not be many weeks before some of the large & poor shavers leave, the few out of the season presenting little worth of attention, and we would not be surprised if prices go down ahead of some pressure from this Country should we wish them to operate as speculation to work them. It would certainly be a gigantic undertaking to control prices in Liverpool when so great a weight is bearing on it, but we must not lose sight of the fact that fair Cotton is now 1 1/2¢ or 2¢ below the price (8 1/2¢) which has heretofore been considered the minimum value. The above market was, at the last date, in a peculiarly favorable situation to be operated on, stocks light, prices 10 per cent lower than at Liverpool, and the Exports from this Country less than last season. We would not be surprised to hear of a great movement in the article this Spring, but we dare not act on such a presumption, for a failure of our prognostic might seriously affect the interest of our friends as well as our own - yet it justifies us in holding out for the price of the market when we have gone and we shall continue to do so, as we have done generally.

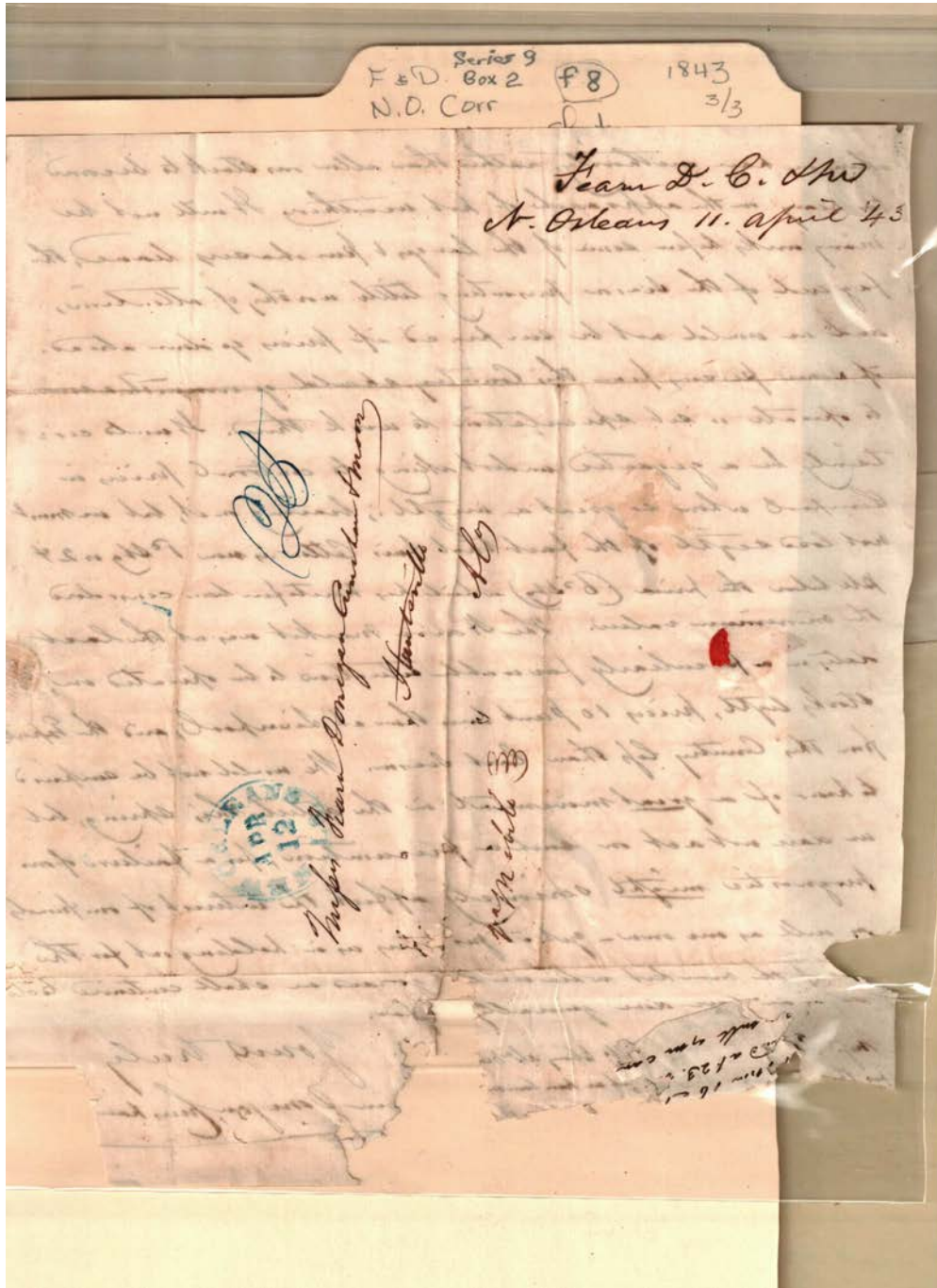
